CAMBOURNE TO GET A POST OFFICE SERVICE POINT

I am delighted to advise that, we will be opening a new Post Office facility at Lloyds Chemist 9 High Street, Cambourne, on 12 January 2009

I am pleased to advise you of our plans to introduce a new concept for delivering Post Office services from the premises of an

established outlet in the area. The service will operate from newly formatted open plan counter that will offer a wide range of postal services alongside retail transactions.

We will be trialling this exciting new project over the

next twelve months. During this time Post Office Ltd will be carefully monitoring the situation to ascertain if this service meets the needs of the local community and would provide a commercially viable alternative to the way our services are currently offered.

Customers will be able to transact a broad spectrum of the Post Office services including

automated banking services, bill and budget payment schemes, Post Office Card Account, Postal Orders and postage: inland letters/packets up to 6kg (including recorded delivery and special delivery), international letters/packets, to a maximum 5kg, or the individual country limit for small packets or printed papers.



The success of this trial is, to a great extent, reliant on customers using the service on a regular basis and we will be reviewing the situation, and any feedback received, over the coming months.

I know that the

local community will join me in welcoming this good news and hope that you will encourage local residents to support this new joint venture.

Hairy Potter

The Garden Wizard



If you would like to ask Hairy Potter a garden related question, please email editorial@cambourne.info

I was fairly dismissive last month of December in the garden and you may think January is much the same. Not so. It is true that you are probably still relying on the evergreens to keep your pride and joy looking acceptable but look closer and you will see things are starting to move. Winters are getting warmer so look out for those snowdrops as they do sometimes flower in January. Be careful not to damage the shoots of all the other bulbs as they will also be making an appearance. Now is the time to start planning. Spring will be here sooner than you think so start thinking now about what changes you would like to make from last year.

Top 10 jobs

- 1. Recycle your Christmas tree
- 2. Prune apple and pear trees
- 3. Keep putting out food and water for hungry birds
- 4. Complete planting of roses if weather is better and ground is dry
- 5. Clean up any dead tops of plants in your borders
- 6. Continue planting shrubs and trees
- 7. Vines are best pruned now before they start to wake
- 8. Think about which seeds you want to plant
- 9. Check tree ties and tighten or replace if necessary
- 10. Start maintaining tools. Clean and oil them ready for the work ahead.

Now, a little word about lawns. It might not be looking its best but now is not the time to completely ignore it. If it is frosty, keep off it and if there are any puddles forming after rain then give it a good spiking to improve drainage. Cutting is not an option but think about getting the mower serviced, you will at least miss the rush when everybody realises theirs doesn't work in April!

In the Vegetable garden

Again it is about planning. Think about your vegetable crop rotations for the coming season and dig over any bits that have not yet been done. You can start forcing rhubarb with a large terracotta pot and think about putting up cloches to warm the ground (probably best to wait until the end of the month for this though). If you want to introduce new fruit bushes then these can be put in now as long as the ground is not too wet or frozen. Oh yes, don't let last years efforts go to waste, check any stored vegetables and throw out any that are rotting before they ruin the lot!

Keep your sprits up, it will get warmer soon!

'Green' commuting on the increase at Cambourne Business Park

Cambourne Business Park's latest Travel for Work Survey has revealed that more commuters than ever are walking to work at the Park, or travelling by public bus.

"This is great news not only for carbon emissions, but also for congestion on the roads. Individuals will benefit too as their health will improve from more exercise," comments Lesley Scobell, Green Travel Co-ordinator for Cambourne Business Park.

The Business Park is also pleased to see that commuting by car as a single occupant is steadily reducing and is now at its lowest figure since the surveys started in 2003.

"Cambourne Business Park's Green Travel Plan is certainly making a difference by encouraging more people to walk, car share and use public transport. As the Cambourne settlements continue to grow, it should be possible to reduce car use even further as more individuals will both live and work at Cambourne," adds Lesley.

The Travel for Work Survey is carried out each year in association with the Cambridge Travel to Work Partnership. In 2008 372 people completed the survey giving details of one week's commuting. This equates to a good response rate of 30%.

As always, we are trying to decide how to prioritise what we do with limited funding, so we want to find out what is most important to the people who use the green spaces. We would really appreciate it if you could fill out the questionnaire and return it to the address on the form. If you don't know where the green spaces are or how to get to them, the Wildlife Trust has produced a leaflet with a map of all the green spaces in Cambourne. As a new resident and a new Parish Councillor, I would like to exercise my democratic right to respond to a letter from one of your readers and an article by a County Councillor published in the December Crier.

I would also hasten to make it clear that these views are entirely my own (expressed as a resident and a parent who is also an independent Parish Councillor) i.e. not on behalf of nor representing the Cambourne Parish

Letter titled: "Last Month's Front Page"

I agree with your view regarding Cambourne's temporary Primary School, the antics of McA Developments and the fact that the tone of the ex-Chairman's article seems to be "self-congratulatory". However, I would like to clarify that there was enormous pressure from various parties including legal experts which may have influenced Clayton Hudson's wordings in the article. As Chairman (at the time), he had to put aside his own personal views and consider input from others including solicitors and advisers from other Councils. If members of the public had attended the Parish Council Meetings on the 7th and 21st October 2008, they would have witnessed a "lively" debate regarding this matter. You are correct in saying that some parties appear to be "pandering to the spoilt antics of McA Developments" and indeed it is time for Cambourne to show some people power and urge the Planning decision-makers NOT to give anymore development rights in Cambourne and other new settlements to the members of this McA Consortium, who have left Cambourne high and dry in the middle of completion of the original Masterplan commitments. Cambourne's long overdue Sports Centre may fall victim again to this land-grabbing monopoly if government officials do not show the courage and step in quickly to correct the imbalance of negotiating power in the enforcement of the developers' obligations under the existing S106 Agreement and the work-in-progress S106 for the extra 950 homes application in Upper Cambourne. Let new companies have the rights to future developments because healthy competition ensures new settlements get the best facilities- including new schoolsoffered by competing developers; which leads to the next topic of Competition for Schools.

County Councillor's Notes by Cllr Lister Wilson

First of all, I am glad that CIIr Wilson gave members of the public an insight into the reasons leading to the County Council's decision to set up a Secondary School in Cambourne. It is also honest of him to point out that he is also one of the Governors of Comberton Village College. That is the duty of Councillors' Code of Conduct. Another code is for councillors to keep an open mind on Council matters". Hence I presume Cllr Wilson is merely expressing his own personal views (like myself) on the government's directive of Competition for Schools.

As a parent (like all parents/carers), we strive to get the best education possible for our children. Many parents make lots of sacrifices to be part of the "7% who opt-out to go to private schools in Cambridge". No one likes to pay thousands of pounds each year to a private school, especially now in times of recession. So why do they do it? A prime reason is a shortage of good local schools such as CVC and the traditional Grammar schools. Another is the lack of choices offered by a State-run system. There is an argument for Competitions for Schools because competing providers offer different Education packages such the IGCSEs, IB and now the homegrown Pre-U by Cambridge University. If children are to leave school and compete for good jobs in the real world, they should be allowed to choose the kind of qualifications which best suit their learning abilities and best potential. The Parkside Federation is going to offer the IB and A levels for their proposed 6th Form. So hopefully, CVC's 6th Form may offer the IB and the Pre-U in the future? Hence, new Education experts in IB, Pre-U etc should be allowed to compete for the new 6th

Form extension of CVC? By the same principle, Cambourne's proposed Secondary School would also benefit from options offered by others besides CVC? There are IB equivalents for both Primary and Secondary children which enable them to "feed" into the IB at 6th Form. So please, keep an open mind and give Competition for Schools a fair chance. Let it be a level playing field so that other providers are not deterred from bidding for Cambourne's Secondary school. I was at a Competition presentation and the potential candidates said to me. " We will try our best but we all know that CCC will get the contract. No one has beaten CCC's own preferred State school". So why waste money indeed if it is not going to be a sincere competition? But to parents, a good education suited to the needs of each individual child is "priceless". So they continue to pay thousands of pounds to get the competitive edge for their offspring's in the job market. But the majority of the families in Cambourne may not have that financial option and they trust the Councils to offer the same advantages for their children so that they too can compete for the well-paid jobs coveted by the private school students. It is sad that so much is already "decided behind closed doors" and that the general public are not involved in consultation and decision-making until the last moment when it is too late to have any influence on the plans made by Council officials. Question: who were the 50 people who signed the petition indicating that the new school should have a formal link with CVC? Would the CVC students and their parents venture to say anything against their own school ? Savvy parents know that the demographic profile of a catchments area can "make or break" good schools. When motivated families move away and go to other better schools, the catchments composition changes and the so-called good schools become downgraded. Each year's cohort is different.

Finally, complacency and over-confidence will also be the downfall of good schools because they are not open to new ideas and innovations from other Education providers. If Governors of new schools are "inherited" from existing Boards of schools run by the same people in the same area, then barriers to new concepts and methods will be created because the new school is not allowed to be an "upstart" of the flagship school. Can the same "tried and tested" formula work its magic on new settlements, such as Cambourne, which already defies the Council's logic by showing abnormal population trends in uncharted waters? Cambourne is also part of a new government initiative to provide up to 40% affordable housing for future years which will dramatically change the demographic profile of the existing Comberton catchment area as illustrated by CIIr Wilson's data projections of 1,350 Cambourne Secondary school age children compared to only 650 children from other villages in the same catchment. Hence there is no guarantee. But new inventions are created because the inventors are not afraid to "think out of the box" and challenge the status quo. So please, give new providers/new governors/ new principals a chance to introduce new ideas for new schools. These new providers are smart enough to include existing CVC experts on their Boards to learn and exchange ideas. Fair competition is part of good Sportsmanship!







Christmas comes to Cambourne Business Park




