"New Primary School Head Appointed"

APPOINTMENT OF HEADTEACHER FOR NEW PRIMARY SCHOOL


The temporary governing body of the new primary school for Cambourne (to open in September 2009) is delighted to announce the appointment of its headteacher. Sarah Humphries was offered the post on Thursday 12 February and readily accepted it.

Sarah Humphries knows Cambridgeshire well having spent most of her teaching career here. Most recently, she had an extremely successful headship at Kettlefields School in Dullingham between 2000 and 2007. She is now working at the International School in Jakarta but is keen to take up a senior post again back in Cambridgeshire. Establishing the third primary school in Cambourne is precisely the exciting opportunity that she wanted to bring her back to this area and the governors of the new school were very keen to appoint such a high-quality and appropriately experienced candidate.

Sarah Humphries will be involved now in the appointment of all the new staff required for the school to be fully operational for September with its first intake of children in foundation classes and in Years 1 and 2. Advertisments have already gone out and selection processes will take place before and after Easter. We anticipate recruiting an outstanding team to join Sarah Humphries and thus ensure excellent educational provision at the new school from the outset. This will thus mean the community of Cambourne will be wonderfully well served by all of its educational providers: all three primary schools and the partner secondary school of Comberton Village College.

STEPPING STONES - We have exciting news about a project to celebrate the 10 year anniversary. Cambourne has a rich heritage. People have lived here since 800 BC and more recent residents have brought their own culture and history with them. The community is renowned for its diverse wildlife. We will hold a series of free workshops over the summer to explore, explain, celebrate and record this natural and human heritage. We will focus on archaeology, history, development, wildlife and personal stories. The workshops will be in the Hub, the schools and the great outdoors, and will be run by professionals in their own fields. Hairy Potter

The Garden Wizard

Wakey wakey! All you fair weather gardeners out there, it is time to rise and shine. You may have noticed the days are starting to get longer and we have had a few sunny days. Bulbs are up and that means only one thing. Spring is as good as here so rev up that enthusiasm and dust down those tools. It is time to get those green fingers back. There are plenty of jobs to do and no time to waste. Here goes then;

Top 10 jobs

- 1. Prune roses and autumn flowering clematis (remove all frost damaged wood)
- 2. Apply feed to boarders and then mulch them
- 3. Watch out for slugs. They are back!
- 4. Last real chance to divide perennials
- 5. Plant summer-flowering bulbs
- 6. Cut back colourful winter stemmed shrubs
- 7. Keep on top of the first flush of weeds
- 8. Start feeding pond fish if the water is warming up
- 9. Plant seeds (too many variations so read the packet!)
- 10. Divide snowdrops

There is plenty more to do though. If your lawn has started to grow and it is a dry day, set your mower for a high cut and give it a trim. It will make a huge difference to the garden. New turf can be laid now, providing there is no frost, but if you intend to sow grass seed then March is a great month to prepare the ground. You can also feed roses but now is your last chance to get bare rooted trees / hedging plants in to the ground.

In the Vegetable Garden

All that hard work over the winter will pay off now. It is not too late to dig though (I still have plenty to do!). As we are reasonably southern, it is time to start getting things in the ground. This month you can start the vegetable patch off with onion sets and early potatoes. Chitting early potatoes is vital for a good crop. Top dress fruit canes with compost or manure and if you have a heated greenhouse, there are plenty of seed you can get underway. Leeks, lettuce and summer cabbage can all be sown now. Mint, sage and thyme can go directly in the ground though.

Time to spring into action then!

CHEAP AS CHIPS

St Neots & District Cats Protection is your local rescue charity for cats and kittens. We re-home in excess of 150 cats and kittens anually, run the local Lost and Found register, feed manage and contol over 200 outdoor and feral cats and offer a free and reduced cost spaying/neutering program. We are manned completely by volunteers and raise 95% of our funds locally

Many cats go missing or are involved in road traffic accidents every year. If they are not microchipped, their owners may never know what has happened to them. If you have lost a cat or have found one, please contact us as soon as possible.

In the first instance, we check our register for cats matching the description, we will then arrange for the cat to be scanned for a microchip which is the quickest and easiest way of re-united lost pets with their owners.

Lastly, we will place a collar on the cat asking "Is this your cat" with a telephone number on the collar. If no owner comes forward, the cat will be placed on our waiting list to be re-homed.

Many cats have been bought into the branch which have been traced through their microchips and some have travelled huge distances, Norwich and Chatteris being the most recent cases and one cat had been missing for 4 years. A cat can easily get into a vehicle and be transported out of their area and without a microchip would never be returned home. We offer a microchipping service in Eynesbury (minimum suggested donation is £12). Contact us now and ensure your cat can be traced should it go missing.

We always have a number of adult cats and cats with special needs who need loving new homes so if you are thinking of getting a cat or kitten contact us now.

CAT FOOD URGENTLY NEEDED

We are experts in the management of large cat colonies (we are feeding over 200 this winter) so if your cat numbers are getting out of control or you know a property where there seem to be too many cats or kittens let us know. There are many local drop off points where you can leave donations of cat food, ring to find out where is nearest to you.

We offer a free and reduced cost neutering and spaying service. This is the best way to control the spread of infectious diseases through mating and fighting and keeps the unwanted kitten numbers down too. Ring now for your voucher which can be used at a local vet.

Wildlife Review March 2009



During all the snow it has been easier to see a lot of the wildlife that stays out in winter. Birds have been visiting gardens in search of food and animal tracks can be seen in the snow. Debbie Wallwork sent me this photo of a fieldfare seen in front of her house in Cambourne. She says "I have lived here now for 8 years and have noticed over this time an increase in the number of species. In the last year I have seen a lot of reed buntings, reed warblers, meadow pipits, skylarks and yellowhammers and more recently snipe and woodcock; and not forgetting the green woodpeckers." Fieldfare, waxwings and other winter migrants often come over to Britain when the weather is harsh on the continent in search of food such as hawthorn berries.

Do let me know if you spot any unusual wildlife in Cambourne.

Hedgelaying

Thank you to everyone who came out to help with the hedgelaying on Crow Dene bridleway during February. We layed three sections at the top, middle and bottom end of the hedge. We will probably leave this hedge for a few years now to let the layed sections grow up.

Green Spaces Survey

We have had a fantastic response to the green spaces survey sent out in January and we are still inputting and analysing the responses. I would like to answer some of the common comments and questions that we received.

"Can we have more benches/landscaping around Lake Sirius?"

This area is in the master plan for Cambourne as part of the golf course. The Wildlife Trust will eventually look after the lake itself but not any of the surrounding land or paths. I will pass on your comments about this area as there were quite a few. The fence around the lake is to keep in the great crested newts, to prevent them getting squashed on the building sites in Upper Cambourne. It will be removed when the building work nearby is complete.

"Can something be done about the all dog mess/litter?"

The dog mess is not nice. It is especially disgusting for us when we are mowing in the summer and the tractor tyre runs over some, the smell follows you around for the rest of the day! Dog and litter bins can only be positioned within a short distance of a road so that they can be emptied frequently by SCDC waste collectors. We will try to get them put in at every entrance near a road, but dog owners must be encouraged to bag up their dog's mess and carry it until they come to a bin. Leaving it hanging in a tree is not a good idea! Does anyone have any good ideas on how to tackle this problem?

"I cannot get my pushchair/wheelchair/elderly relative along some of the paths"

We have been made aware that some of the path surfaces are not very good. This is what prompted us to carry out the survey to find out which areas people used most and how we could improve them. We hope that we can get some funding to improve the paths, but this may take a while. Benches were also a popular request and we will try to put some more in during the year.

Events

The survey has also given us lots to think about for events and we are working on a new programme for the year. There will be events for different ages and interests and they will be on different days of the week so that everyone can make at least some of them. Keep an eye out for posters and in the Crier for details.


A Heartfelt Plea to The Villagers of Cambourne.

Anderson Telegraph!! News from Monkfield Park Primary School School is not just for the children

We have recently had several occasions where we have welcomed parents and carers into Monkfield Park to find out more about what their children are learning.

The first of these involved parental contributions to the development of the school's disability equality scheme. A questionnaire was first circulated to parents and carers, inviting comments and interest, and this generated an encouraging level of response – both from parents and carers with a disabled child of their own and from people with experience of working in the disability arena. A group of staff, governors and parents/carers was then established and they came up with recommendations for enhancing provision around disability issues e.g. improvements to car parking arrangements and developing appropriate information sharing with parents and carers. We hope that the improvements suggested will enhance the school for everyone who visits.

On the same theme, we have organised one of our regular Curriculum Evenings with a focus on disability and discrimination. The evening offered parents and carers a carousel of workshops to visit on autism, dyslexia-friendly classrooms and the schools anti-bullying strategy.

Other Curriculum Evenings have covered numeracy, foreign languages and phonics. The numeracy element was so popular that an event was held devoted purely to this subject. The emphasis was on enabling adults to experience what maths lessons are actually like nowadays. The evening was over-subscribed and feedback very positive with parents and carers asking for more.

The evenings start at 6.00 pm and attract parents/carers of both genders. Anyone unable to attend can access the information on the school's website or request a hard copy if they don't have web access.

A spin-off from the enthusiastic response to the numeracy evening has been a series of family learning workshops on numeracy. Ten sessions have been held with the Sunflower Nursery kindly providing a crèche which removed one of the potential obstacles for attendance. The workshops took attendees through how numeracy is taught nowadays in schools. This enabled parents and carers to give their children more help with their work whilst, for some, it also improved their own numeracy skills. One parent reported "It has been a refresher course for what I learnt all those years ago!" and another said that they have a better understanding of numbers now."

As a school, we are very pleased that many of these initiatives stemmed primarily from what parents and carers themselves had said would be useful to them in helping them help their children improve their understanding of learning; one parent said they were "more relaxed about maths" as a result of the course. The investment of time and money has been most worthwhile as everyone concerned has clearly derived tangible benefits from it, and we hope to be able to run similar events over the course of the year.

COMBERTON VILLAGE COLLEGE: A NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

"To close or not to close: that is the question, dear Principal". It might well be the question, but it was the answer that I needed! The weather in February proved challenging for all of us in various ways. At the college, we had to cancel several drama productions (some of which will now be in March). However, the biggest issue of all was whether to open the school at all on certain days. Such decisions are made even more exciting by the fact that everyone has a view on the matter (and not unreasonably so).

The principle is simple: the school should stay open if at all reasonably possible. The difficulty is, of course, in determining what is 'reasonably possible'. There are two key issues for us:

- Is it safe to be on the school premises?
- · Can pupils and staff reasonably be expected to get both to and from school?

If both of these questions can be answered positively, then clearly the school should be open. If either of them cannot be answered positively, then we are probably obliged to close. The second question is especially pertinent for a school that has over 900 of its pupils relying on a school bus to be able to get to and from school.

This decision-making process is made even more interesting by the fact that any decision really has to be made before 7.00 a.m. (preferably as close to 6.30 a.m. as possible) for it to be meaningful. Anything after that time and it is really too late. Messages cannot be got through in time to local radio, our website administrator and staff to inform people of what is happening before they have had to set off for the school. The routine is thus a clear one: switch on the television, the local radio station and the computer (for the relevant websites) at 5.45 a.m. Go outside to look around at the ground and the sky. Phone several staff, especially those living very close to the college. Try to pick up all relevant messages and work out whether to believe the weather forecasters. Once all these things are done, a decision has to be made. We all then hope that it is the right one!

In the event, we closed twice in the first two weeks of February. We clearly had to do so on both occasions: travel to and from school would have been both extremely difficult and potentially dangerous. The bus companies were also not operating on both mornings. We came extremely close to closing on another occasion, but fortunately the forecasters were right about the improving conditions for the afternoon!

Such weather thus has its challenges. I have also noted that nothing is said about these things in the training courses that headteachers are obliged to undertake! However, standing back from it all, these are often the things that make school life memorable. Not being able to come to school and playing in the snow all day, or coming in and helping to clear snow from the paths are all part of life's meaningful experiences. It will give us something to tell the grandchildren!

When new Yellow Pages directories hit South Cambridgeshire doorsteps in March, for the first time, householders will be able to recycle their old ones using South Cambridgeshire District Council's (SCDC) green box kerbside collection.

Until now, high ink concentrations have meant that Yellow Pages were hard to recycle, but a reduction in the colour ink wash intensity has made recycling much easier.

SCDC's contractors can now turn Yellow Pages green by recycling them into high quality newsprint.

In 2007/08, South Cambridgeshire residents sent over 4,900 tonnes of paper for recycling. The average Yellow Pages weighs in at a hefty 1.5 kilograms, so, if every household recycles their old directory through their green box, SCDC could potentially recycle an additional 88 tonnes of paper this year.

Cllr Sue Ellington, environmental services portfolio holder said, "We'd like to encourage as many households as possible to recycle their Yellow Pages through their green box collection. Thanks to the dedication of our householders, South Cambridgeshire is one of the top recyclers in the country, so I'm sure that we will get a great response."



Each day, an officer from our friendly and experienced planning service will provide:

- · general planning advice
- · general advice on householder development proposals for applicants or neighbours
- · answers to technical planning questions
- help to complete application forms
- · information on fees and other charges
- · guidance on interpreting plans and drawings
- · confirmation of the validity of applications delivered to the Council's office

Calls should be kept to general planning queries and take up no more than 15 minutes.

Specific enquiries about registered applications will continue to be dealt with by the relevant planning officer. Key information about registered applications - including status, timescales, consultations and decisions - can already be found online at www.scambs.gov.uk/planning

Rubbish Charges



At the end of November, laws which allow the Government to impose new charges for household rubbish collections received Royal Assent. Ministers have confirmed that the Office of National Statistics will classify these new charges as a tax. Although bin taxes will be trialled in a series of so-called pilots, the small print of the legislation allows the Secretary of State to roll out and impose the taxes on all local authorities by Order, without any vote in Parliament.

The Government's own impact assessment has predicted that, in due course, two out of three homes will face the new taxes.

Official technical documents reveal

that the bin taxes will take one of four forms:

- Bin bag tax: Households must pay for special bin bags. Rubbish not placed in a paid-for bag will not be collected.
- Bin size tax: Households will be charged for the size of their bin: with families requiring a bigger bin paying
- Weekly collection tax: Households needing a weekly rubbish collection will pay an extra charge.
- Bin chip tax: Households will receive a bill based on the weight of the contents of their bin, with microchips in the bin feeding through to a central billing database.

Yes, we need to do more to encourage less landfilling, but when it comes to consumers this needs to be through carrots rather than sticks - for example by making it easier to recycle. And the biggest part of the solution needs to come from manufacturers and suppliers reducing waste and packaging levels, which is out of the direct control of consumers. I warned of this two years (See: ago.

Labour's planned new bin taxes will increase taxes on families (who already tend to pay higher council taxes); will raise the overall tax burden due to the costs of levying and enforcing a new tax; and will harm the environment by fuelling fly-tipping and backyard burning.

Indeed, the Government has stated that Civic Amenity Sites will remain free for household waste. This will lead to the bizarre situation of families being encouraged to drive to their local dump, adding to congestion and carbon emissions, to avoid higher taxes. As the recent Manchester congestion charge referendum showed, voters do not want to pay new stealth taxes at a time when millions face losing their jobs. The Government should be working instead with councils to help extend recycling collections, and make it easier for all households to go green. There is certainly a role for incentives, but not for new taxes or new charges. Councils should also be properly compensated for the new burdens imposed on them by Whitehall and from EU directives.

If Labour were to win the general election, in their usual style they will probably just force these changes on families across the country regardless of decisions by local Councillors, but if there is anything I can be doing locally to oppose these charges in Cambridge, then I will be opposing them.
