SEPTEMBER

As much as we try and cling on to summer, the unmistakable characteristics of autumn arrive this month. Nights are drawing in and it is a bit chilly when the sun is not around. On the warmer days though it can still be a great month to get in the garden so get in there and start tidying up. Remove any summer bedding that is past its best and replace with winter bedding. Why not try planting winter flowering pansies and primulas? Don't put off the jobs below as the end of the month will no doubt be unsettled with plenty of rain. Now the dreaded word, frost! I am afraid it may strike so please move houseplants, cacti and other tender plants (geraniums, fuchsias etc.) to their sheltered over wintering spot.

Top 10 jobs

- 1. Prune & Dívide herbaceous perennials
- 2. Collect and sow seed from perennials and hardy annuals for spring flowers
- 3. Protect your pond from leaves and other debris and if you have fish, start their autumn feeding program
- 4. Clean out the shed, cold frames and greenhouses so that they are ready for storing things over the winter
- 5. Plant spring flowering bulbs like crocuses, daffodils, narcissi and snowdrops in borders and patio pots (tulips are better left until October or November though)
- 6. Scatter sulphate of potash on your rose beds and fork in
- 7. Plant / transplant evergreen shrubs in the latter part of the month
- 8. Continue to water the garden during dry spells
- 9. Now is a great time to sow or turf a new lawn
- 10. Sow sweet peas and over-winter the resulting plants in a cold frame for early spring flowers.

Thinking about indoors for a minute, you should now be reducing the frequency of houseplant watering and hyacinths can also be planted now so that they flower at Christmas time (not much more than three months away!)

September is an important month for your lawn. Firstly remove unwanted weeds. Then scarify the grass using a lawn rake or a special mechanical scarifier to rake out the thatch (this process can also be done in springtime). Aerate with a fork to counter compaction and bad drainage, filling the holes with a sandy soil mix to help the process. Next give it a good autumn feed that is low in Nitrogen. Re-turf or seed any bald patches and wait for spring!

in the vegetable garden

It is important to dig up main crop potatoes before the frost and slugs get at them. If you think all is over, then think again! In early September things like lettuce and salad leaves, Chinese cabbages and winter spinach can still be sown. If the temperature gets colder then a cloche or frame should be used. It is also a great time to get garlic, broard beans and onion sets (for spring) in the ground.

Off to get my fleece now... see you in October!

CAMBOURNE GARDEN CLUB



Non-attendance at Cambourne Parish Council Meeting 21st July 2009

Dear Cllrs. Morgan, Morgan and Loynes,

I wish to express my grave disappointment at your non-attendance at the Cambourne Parish Council Meeting on 21st July 2009. As the three elected representatives of the residents of Cambourne, you have exercised poor judgment in failing to appear at a meeting at which a key agenda item was the possible siting of a Gypsy and Travellers Site within Cambourne.

You will learn no doubt that last night's meeting was well-attended by the residents of Cambourne. Approximately 250 people turned up at The Hub in Cambourne to express their concerns at the proposals. Although clearly an emotive issue on which many residents spoke passionately, we can all be proud of the citizens of Cambourne for holding forth strong, reasoned and well-researched arguments against such plans without recourse to stereotyping or name-calling.

That said, I feel it is shaming that none of our District Councillors appeared at this meeting nor sent their apologies or comments to the Chairman of the Parish Council to be read out. You are our elected officials, you should be there to listen to and represent our views and fight for our community. That you were absent appears to speak volumes and further undermines the people's belief in elected bodies, a view put forward repeatedly by several residents in last night's meeting.

Firstly let me apologise for myself and my Wife for not attending the Special Parish Council Meeting we simply could not attend at such short notice, I received notice of this meeting on the 16th July 2009 and there was no agenda item for District Councillors so therefore it was taken we were not invited, however SCDC Officers had attended to explain the process of the Consultation and I hope every one understood this. I am pleased that the Public turned up in good numbers and I hope that the Parish Council will ensure they represent you in the correct manner.

Had I not been working I would of attended this meeting, however it was not a meeting to put my point of views forward.

Also it is for the Public to respond to the Travellers and Gypsy Consultation rather than voice their views to a District Councillor and by doing so and not using the consultation method only one voice will be heard, so it is imperative that the Public respond in the correct manner by October 2009.

Now moving on, if you wish to know my views on a Travellers site in Cambourne, I have made my position very clear Publicly, from the information I have researched to date I don't believe Cambourne will meet the needs of the Travellers and Gypsies and therefore Cambourne should be rejected as an Option Site immediately, as due to the period of economic uncertainty we are facing it is inappropriate to name Cambourne as an option site now.

I trust this reply helps you to reconsider your views, Also I would like to point out that some times things do get a little political at meetings.

As I am very aware, we are all probably having the same feelings towards the proposal of a suggested traveller's site in Cambourne. As a very new (3 months) resident of Cambourne, I just wanted my perspective to be heard.

My partner and I saved for almost 3 years, for a deposit for our first home together. We finally chose a lovely little village that we both adored. Great Cambourne. With its huge open spaces, its so lovely and quiet, however plenty of activities to be involved in if you so wish.

It just has everything going for it, and we are so pleased to be here, with our fantastic view of the lake, and when the geese fly over our house... it is just so perfect.

I cant really imagine anything more upsetting to a unique village like this, to agree to have unruly, untrustworthy and generally unpleasant community of travellers settling in such a idyllic place.

I guarantee this would greatly put off anybody wanting to live here, and with so many empty houses all around Cambourne, I'm sure the council would not want gypsy squatters moving in and wrecking the place.

We worked so hard, and saved for so long to earn our place here. It is disgraceful, how the travellers can come along, as they so please to disrespect, and destroy everything around them and then to just casually move on to some other poor village and do it all over again. I will be writing to the council about this, and I have logged on and signed the petition at number 10 and I urge anyone who feels like I do, to please join in and do everything we can to stop this from happening.

Once they are here, it will be hell to get them to move on.

If we stay quiet, we will never be heard.

I felt I had to write to express my shock and disappointment on reading Councillor Lister Wilson's letter to the Crier about the proposed Traveller site.

I am concerned that there exists a tolerance of casual racism where travellers are concerned.

I accept people may have concerns and I know from chatting to friends within Cambourne that there are a lot, but I think facts need to be discussed, and not just assumptions and hearsay, in order to have a valid consultation on the matter.

The Children's Society report that nearly 9 out of every 10 children and young people from a Gypsy background have suffered racial abuse and nearly two thirds have also been bullied or physically attacked. (November Report 2007) I feel if Cambourne continues in its current vein we will soon be adding to these statistics.

I would also like to know where Councillor Wilson is getting his statistics from - as the only info the asterix gave was to 'some' - who are these some who make these estimates?

Most alarming is the final reference to 'Maybe the time has come to bring [the travelling lifestyle] to an end'. There are some obvious comparisons here which I'll restrain myself from using however as a society and even as a small community in Cambridgeshire we have a responsibility to stand up when a suggestion is made to bring a culture/lifestyle/race 'to an end'.

I fully believe people have a right to express their opinions in the consultation, however I do not think racism is acceptable in any situation and would hope the new community I live in would strive to keep racism off the agenda.

It is close to a hospital and generally most of what one needs is available and the quality of life is good. If we were to ask people how they get out and about I sense that whilst know that whilst there are many benefits to living in a rural area that can be difficult at times.

When we are able to use our own car this is not such a problem; but consider for a moment those who are no longer able to use their own vehicle or get on public transport. How does someone get to that all important GP or chiropody appointment? Ask a neighbour? Well yes, but few people want to be 'pestering' people and asking favours of them all the time. They also worry that it costs someone else money to do this. If someone cannot get to such places it does not take long for them to become less well, to not get out to see people and to be excluded from what is going on in their community. This may be due to deterioration in health because of a long term health condition or to changes as a person gets older. There are often people who are interested in how they may be able to 'help out' to keep people included and in good health. Wouldn't it be good if there was a way that these 2 sets of people together?

Wouldn't it be good if someone could

- · Help out for a set number of hours a week or just now and again?
- · If they could offer to drive their own car but not be 'out of pocket'? Could help even if they do not drive?
- · If they could help out even if they do not drive?

Well there IS a way! It is called a Social Car Scheme! There are 23 Social Car Schemes in the South Cambs District, South Cambs District Council and Care Network Cambridgeshire would like Cambourne to be added to that number. 

Pastoral Thoughts Dear Friends,

Anniversaries are interesting things. We use them to mark and remember significant events in our lives. Sometimes when we are young the anniversaries may be a little silly; like celebrating one month of dating someone, or something similar. My wife and I are celebrating 15 years of marriage. Wildlife Review September 2009

In response to my request to know what is going on in the back gardens of Cambourne, Joan Reynolds from Chaffinch Walk emailed me with this story about greater spotted woodpeckers:



I have dual nut-feeders and one afternoon a parent woodpecker was feeding its youngster which was perched nearby on my runner bean canes. Another adult woodpecker came to the second nut-feeder accompanied by two nestlings perched on branches nearby. This was an absolutely lovely sight and all went well until one of the second youngsters decided to fly onto the runner-bean canes which frightened the first one already perched there. General mayhem broke out with lots of fluttering around and squawking before they all flew off into the wood. The young are now feeding themselves and I'm happy to say that they are all continuing to visit my garden but usually one or two at a time. I have visits from all kinds of birdlife and small animals - life is never dull in my garden - and I'm spending a fortune on buying peanuts at the moment!

Joan also mentioned seeing black squirrels. I have yet to see them in Cambourne but I know they are in the area, so if you see them please let me know.

After having been stung a couple of times by wasps this summer I was wondering why there seem to be so many all of a sudden. I discovered that wasps' pattern of obtaining food changes at this time of year. During the summer they hunt for insects to feed to the larvae in the nest and the larvae provide a sweet saliva in return. Once their queen stops laying eggs and the food incentive has gone they move onto other sweet substitutes, such as the sugars of fallen fruit or our lunch!

As I write the swan family are still doing really well, with all five cygets hatched still alive. I'm keeping my fingers crossed that they will all make it to beautiful adults this year. If you see an injured swan or other wildlife remember you can call the RSPCA on 0300 1234 999.

We are not normally around in the evenings and weekends when these things happen, so really appreciate the help local residents can give.

Generosity is the New Political, curated by Lotte Juul Petersen, explores the complex and ambiguous concept of generosity. Rooted within a system that merits symbolic value over market worth, acts of generosity contradict the accepted notion of production and exchange. By challenging the existing structures of contemporary society and by establishing a new level of engagement, Jacques Derrida argued that generosity has the potential to be a political force. Following research periods at Wysing Arts Centre five of the artists will create new commissions especially for Generosity is the New Political. These include Christodoulos Panayiotou's performative work involving a conversation with Jean Verdeil on the pedagogic legacy of socially engaged theatre.

Bik van der Pol's research into sociological experiments such as the Ultimatum Game, aim to observe the borders of altruism and egoism and to test the limits of generosity.

Three artists will show existing works: Libia Pérez Castro and Ólafur Árni Ólafsson's 2005 work *The Caregivers*, previously presented at Manifesta 7, is a music video which explores the dense history of female labour and the exchange between caregivers and their elderly clients. In the darkly humorous *I Love My Job*, 2008, Tellervo & Oliver Kochta-Kalleinen's offered the workers of Göteborg a chance to act out everything they ever wanted to do or say during the darkest moments of their work life. Kateřina Šedá's drawing and video installation *It doesn't matter*, 2005-7, is the result of a series of exercises aimed to encourage the artist's recently widowed grandmother to do something other than watch television. During the film it becomes clear that this is far from a therapeutic exercise and demonstrates the complexity of the act.

The exhibition builds upon and expands the artistic integrity of Wysing Arts Centre, which has been developed over the last four years through the work of its Director, Donna Lynas, previously of South London Gallery. Essentially, Wysing is a research and development centre for visual artists and approaches exhibition making as an extension of that research. Generosity Is The New Political will be followed in 2010 with a major research project and exhibition on the notion of the Improbable.


Stepping Stones

Monkfield Medical Practice

Message from your new Nurse Practitioner Sally Barltrop

As some of you may know, I joined Monkfield Medical Practice team in April. The Cambourne people have made me feel very welcome, and I am very much enjoying my work here. It took me a while to understand the way the appointment system operates here at the practice, and for others new to the village, I thought I would clarify.

The booking system allows some pre-bookable appointments, but these are in the minority because so many people prefer to be seen on the day they phone.

Our triage system, which is run by specially trained nurses or doctors, allows people to seek advice for self management, or to be offered same day appointments if appropriate. This often has to be in our 'sit and wait' session, but we try to offer approximate timings depending on how many people need to be seen and how many doctors are available. All of the doctors and the nurse practitioner share the sit and wait appointment list.

The triage system does mean people need to wait for us to return their phone call, but we try to make the calls in priority order, to ensure the higher risk problems are dealt with first.

We do have a problem with our pre-booked appointments when people fail to attend. For example we currently have a waiting list for our baby development check appointments, so if you are unable to attend, please phone and let us know in good time, so someone else may take advantage of the appointment.

During the peak of the Swine flu pandemic, the phone lines and the surgeries were very busy, and we would like to thank you for your patience at this time. We hope that those of you using the Flu helpline have found it helpful.

We hope you are enjoying your summer, and remember if you want any advice concerning travel health and vaccinations, sun protection, healthy eating and fitness, smoking cessation etc our team are here to support you. Please enquire at reception or make an appointment with the nursing team.

The Like Anglers of Cambourne

Over the past few weeks we have been back fishing the Cambridgeshire Fenlands again. Our first call was to the River Delph at Welney. This is a village that we have visited on many occasions in the past, also the area is regularly seen each year on our local news channels for its flooding. The Old Bedford River runs parallel to the River Delph, so we had the opportunity of fishing there if the Delph failed to produce. Whilst we hoped to catch a few pike, we also had a good chance of bumping into a zander. Unfortunately, the latter failed to materialise, but we caught pike all the same. After quite a successful morning, we decided to hop onto the Old Bedford, and it was a good job we did. After a short walk to the other drain, I hooked into a small jack pike on one of my favourite surface lures. On landing the fish, I was horrified to discover another set of trebles on a wire trace had been left in the pike. This was caused by an incompetent angler using inadequate line unfortunately, on closer inspection, it appeared that both trebles had sewn up the pike's stomach. This, in a short time, would have caused a premature and, no doubt, very unpleasant end to its life.

Well, after many

years of extracting hooks in similar situations, I felt that I could give this fish some hope of survival. After a few minutes had passed, the hooks were safely put to one side, and the fish was then returned, hopefully to recover. If it didn't, then at Least I gave it a better chance than it might have had. Anyhow, I did return to Welney a week or so later in hope of more pike. I did find it tough going this time around, but I did not go home without catching. Out came my trusted surface lure, and within minutes of the lure being in the drain a pike suddenly shot out from the thick nearside vegetation and homed in on my lure. The result was a

pristine and lean pike of around 13lb.

A couple of weeks later saw us

travel back to Welney, the only difference this time was that we were joined by our new fishing companion, Paul Bagshaw. We were hoping to help Paul catch his first pike, so we felt that the River Delph was a good a place as any to start. We encountered a much better day than normal; we managed to land 11 pike between us. The biggest of the day was a smidgeon over 11lb 20zs. Most of the other fish were between the 5 and 8lb range. I am sure that we may have caught more fish as many more takes were missed. This was probably due to the fact that the fish frightened the living daylights out of us everytime they struck our surface lures. Such was the ferocity of the strikes. Eventually, after a lot of hard work and determination, Paul finally caught his very first pike. After coming so close earlier on in the day Paul tempted his pike with a spinner bait type lure. His fish weighed in at exactly 6lb. Hopefully, this will be the first of many...Oh! And before we go, the Cambourne Pike Anglers would like to thank the Crier team for their very kind donation to our club. Our team brought a new set of digital scales which we have all enjoyed using on our most recent outings. Thanks again. **until next time, take care**
