

Pastoral Thoughts

I recently purchased a new toothbrush, which is one of those electric rechargeable ones that some dentists recommend. The reason why I did this is because of a recent visit I made to the dentist where I suffered some degree of pain that is to say afterward that it even hurt to breathe through my mouth. This is not a reflection upon the dentist, but upon my own negligence. I made another appointment in a few months time. In the certain knowledge of this coming re-inspection by the hygienist, it prompted me to make some changes, a new toothbrush and using tiny inter-dental brushes. I was not motivated by the need to have bright and shining white teeth nor even the possibility of losing a tooth. My motivation is simply to avoid that type of pain that I had only previously experienced when having the broken off barbed spines of a sea urchin pulled out of my foot. The dentist recommended spending 2 minutes when brushing my teeth. Now that does not seem a lot of time, but it is important to take that time each day to keep your teeth cleaned and it will help you in the long run. This also means that next time you visit the dentist there will probably be far less pain involved. But I wonder how much time do you spend each day making sure that your soul is clean? It cannot be brushed clean, it cannot be dry cleaned, it is stained with sin and just keeps getting dirtier and when the final inspection comes it will be painful. There is a song we sometimes sing

What can wash away my sin? Nothing but the blood of Jesus. What can make me whole again? Nothing but the blood of Jesus. O precious is the flow that makes me white as snow, no other fount I know, nothing but the blood of Jesus.

Another chorus of a different song says Jesus paid it all, all to him I owe, sin had left a crimson stain he washed it white as snow. Which is based upon, Isaiah 1:18 Come now, and let us reason together, saith the LORD: though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool.

I wonder if this month you would take the time to check your condition. I'm not talking about if you go to church, or if you do good things or if you seem respectable, because none of those things can cleanse your soul from sin. No deed you can perform or service you can undertake can purify you. If it could then there would have been no reason for Jesus to come if we could make it to heaven by ourselves. Do you know Him, have you been to Jesus for that cleansing power? If not, maybe you could spend 2 minutes giving that sorted out? It will make that final check up far easier and will literally change your life.

We have had a very good start to the year already, and it's only October!

Following on from our 10 year celebration, disability awareness day was held on the 25th September. It provided a real opportunity for all of us in the school to consider what a disability is and different ways that people live and excel with physical and mental impairment. Rebecca Gilbertson from Living Sport came in to tell us about her achievements in disability sport such as the Paralympics. We were all inspired by her story. One year 5 said that she learnt that 'even people who are disabled can break a record'. As well as this, we learnt some sign language and are now keen to show this off to everyone! Key stage one spent some time hearing about and stroking a guide dog for the deaf. Key stage 2 found out about Dogs for the Disabled and Guide Dogs for the Blind, including how puppies are trained into such capable dogs. The whole day was a great experience. One year 6 commented that they learnt that 'disable people can achieve big things' and a year 4 said they learnt that people with a disability can still do what people with no disability can do, but in different ways.'

Book Week has been from 5th to the 9th of October. It is great to have this opportunity to enjoy and celebrate reading. This year's book week was focused on words and pictures. In year 5 we have learnt that picture books can explore some big themes and have been challenged and amused by various authors including Anthony Browne and John Burningham.

In year 5 we have been learning about the Victorians, and especially about Victorian children. On the 22nd October we will be transporting the classrooms and pupils back in time, into a Victorian school. This will help us to learn about what it really would have been like to have been at school then.

Although Christmas may seem a long way off - and we don't want any snow yet! - we have already been thinking about getting into the festive spirit. We have designed our own Christmas cards and these are going to be professionally produced very soon. We're bursting to see how good they look when they are finished. You may even receive one yourself when Christmas comes!

We are also looking forward to making bread next half term. We hope we don't burn it and that we can bring some home in one piece for us to taste - and not just crumbs for the birds to eat!

Architect Workshops

On Thursday 24th September architect Workshops were held at The Vine Inter church Primary School. Year 5 and 6 rose to the challenge of working in teams to build a shelter. The children returned from the Summer holidays to discover that they had been "Shipwrecked" and all half term the children's learning has been linked to that theme. The latest problem to solve was "Where will you live on your island?" The children made some fantastic shelters and learnt how to solve problems in a team and how to build a strong structure.

The architect workshop

On Thursday 24th September a man and a lady called Martin and Katie came from the architect workshop to teach us how to make shelters. They brought some large, medium, and small sticks with them and some elastic bands. First of all we made tripods with 6 sticks and some people were struggling with the elastic bands but it was still fun. Next we got into groups of 4s and 5s. They gave us 4 different climates to choose from and we had to make our shelter suitable for those climates. The climates were arctic, desert, jungle and ocean. One group chose arctic, two groups chose desert, most of the groups chose jungle and one group chose oceans.

Martin gave us 9 large sticks that were really high and 12 medium sticks to build a shelter and all of us had to fit in the shelter. The best shelter got a prize and it was made by Chloe Lawrence, Alexander Lewis, Jack Collins and James Gibson. The prize was a triangular based pyramid.

Alexander Lewis in year 6 said "it was a very interesting experience because we could build any design you wanted"

The Architect Workshop Came To the Vine

On the 24th of September 2009 the Architect Workshop came to the vine.

First we went in a learned how to create a tetrahedron out of sticks and rubber bands. The sticks were about as big as our heads. After we had discussed the stability of different shapes, we formed groups of four and joined our mini tetrahedrons to make a new, larger tetrahedron.

Martin (from Architect Workshops) picked one group of four to come out and demonstrate how to make a new, interesting shape. The group picked up three long sticks and one extra mini tetrahedron. One person from the group held each end of the three sticks and the remaining three people bent the sticks open while keeping the ends of the sticks attached and placed the mini tetrahedron inside the cage like structure created by the three sticks. It looked a bit like a small boat.

Later we decided on four different environments in which to build our shelters, they were: - arctic, ocean, desert and jungle. Each group chose one of these environments to build their shelter in. We then went out to break and thought about our ideas for adapting our shelters for the set environment. I thought of adding windows to cool the shelter down in the day and keep it warm at night.

As soon as we got back in we collected some long, short & medium sticks and got building! We all started from the bottom shape going up to the roof, and we had to measure to see if we would fit in it. Some groups made pyramids, some made tent-like structures and some bent the sticks and made a curved shelter. The strongest structures were those built with triangles

Yr 5/6 Architect Workshop

On Thursday 24th September at "The Vine Inter-church Primary School" an architect workshop came to the school to teach the pupils how to build a strong structure out of wooden sticks and rubber bands. They showed the pupils how to make a tri-pod. The pupils also made a tetra-pod and a tetrahedron.

The pupils had to get into groups of 5 or 4 and make life-size dens to fit an environment such as the Antarctic, a rainforest, a desert or an ocean. There were ten structures in total made by the pupils. Many of the structures broke when one of the instructors shook them but the ones that were really strong and built well didn't. The secret for a strong structure is use triangles! The structures that were built using lots of squares were the ones that broke! Pupil Tom Upton was interviewed; he said "Most of the structures that had triangles in them were more stable."

Jacob Myers said "It was really hard building them but it was great fun at the same time! Luckily my one stayed up!!"

The sticks that the pupils used were 7 feet tall!

NOVEMBER

Remember, remember the weather in November – rain, fog and frost are your lot! However, despite the fact that this is one of our wettest

months of the year the last of the autumn leaves and berries are still hanging on in there. The theme

for November is very much the same as last month. Tidy up and dig! There are of course some other jobs to be getting on with.

Top 10 jobs

- 1. Clear up fallen leaves
- 2. Plant conifers
- 3. Dress heavy soil with lime
- 4. Plant tulip bulbs (as soon as possible!)
- 5. Prune your roses

- 6. Plant out winter bedding
- 7. Insulate the greenhouse to protect from frost
- 8. Stop feeding pond fish
- 9. Put out food to encourage birds into the garden
- 10. Take hardwood cuttings

In such economic times it is always good to save a few pounds. Many woody plants such as roses, trees and shrubs can be purchased bare rooted for planting out now. You not only have to dig less of a hole but they are cheaper too. Always prepare the soil well and if planting out roses mix in some bone-meal or peat to the surrounding soil.

In the Vegetable garden

Finish weeding your vegetable areas, put on plenty of manure and dig over for the weather to do the work. Hardy perennial seedlings can be planted out and remember to cover brassicas with netting (pigeons are a problem as they start getting hungry). Prune established fruit trees and bushes. After the first frost pick some Brussels and dig a parsnip or two for a fantastic Sunday lunch.

As the frosts take hold now is the time to pick sloes from the hedgerow. Best wait a few days though (just to give me a chance of getting there before you!).

At least here's one good thing about winter weather. When the snow falls, it makes your lawn look just as good as your neighbour's!

Stepping Stones Project

Cambourne is ten years old, but the first residents moved in 2800 years ago.

This summer, more recent residents have learned about the history of the area, the wildlife, and how the modern settlement came into being. They also discovered about each other and what they brought with them to their new homes.

Cambourne All-In ran a series of discovery sessions for the pupils of Monkfield Park and the Vine schools, and for the general public. All residents could suggest ideas for the surface decoration of ten hexagonal stepping stones. You rose to the occasion, supplying over 1000 images, as well as text and oral history.

Robyn Llewellyn, Head of Heritage Lottery Fund East of England said:

'Stepping Stones is an excellent project that will connect a new community to the social and natural heritage of the area, celebrate it and open it up to the widest possible audience.

Two professional artists (sculptor Andrew Tanser and children's author / illustrator Anna Nilsen) are currently mashing the ideas together to produce the designs for the stones, which will be grit-blasted and installed on the footpath between Great Cambourne cricket field and Jeavons Wood School.

Everyone will be welcome to the Grand Public Unveiling on Saturday 5th December, 12-2pm. We hope the celebrations will commence with a parade from the Bloco, singing from at least three choirs, with food and mulled wine or soft drinks. Admission free.



Every year critically ill children come through our unit, ranging in age from birth to 16. They come from all over East Anglia, as Addenbrooke's provides the only specialist Paediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) in the region. The children we see may be suffering from an injury after an accident or are in need of intensive care after major surgery or fighting infection, such as influenza or meningitis. As specially trained staff, we pride ourselves on providing the highest standard of nursing and medical care to meet the child's individual needs.

The NHS provides significant funds to run a hospital like Addenbrooke's and PICU is just one of the many departments competing for these. For PICU to maintain its reputation as a centre of excellence and remain at the forefront of technological development, we need to support our services and facilities, which these children deserve. My daughter Holly was very sick with influenza last Christmas and spent a week in the Paediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) at Addenbrooke's Hospital. It was touch and go for a while, but thanks to the amazing work of the Unit, Holly made a full recovery (and can now be seen running around Cambourne at top speed!). It was the professionalism and kindness of the staff, which helped us through this very difficult time. We also had use of a counselling service and a place to stay in Acorn House (so we could a few minutes away from Holly's bedside during the night and we had a place where our other little girl could come and visit us). When you have a seriously ill child, sometimes the little things can make a difference to you: for example, the Unit provided brightly coloured children's bedding which made Holly's room seem more homely. Many of these additional services rely on donations but make a huge difference to the sick child and their families.

In addition, the Unit currently needs to replace the trolleys, which are at constant use at patient's bedsides, but at the moment the NHS cannot fund this. I asked several of my very good friends from Cambourne to help and we set up the CSPICU fundraising group (A huge thanks to Claire, Helen, Kieran, Sarah P, Sarah O and Tanny), with the goal of raising £1500 to buy one new trolley.

The CSPICU held an 80s disco on 10th October at the Hub. A great night was had by all, and a massive £500 was raised. With the profit from a previous car boot sale, and generous donations from Amgen in Cambridge and the Careers and Tots Group, we now have enough to buy a trolley. I think this achievement shows what a great community there is here in Cambourne, with many friends, neighbours and businesses donating cash and prizes and buying raffle tickets to help our cause.

The month of October was, for many, the start of the official pike season. A great number of pike anglers around the country will have waited months for this time of year to come, having had no desire at all to pike fish during the summer months. Personally, I enjoy fishing the summer months, particularly with surface lures, but I must add that great care must be taken when catching these summer fish.

Recently, more pike came my way during a short session after work one evening at Milton Country Park. Both fish again fell to my good old reliable surface lure, the biggest of the two weighed in at 12lb 2ozs. I am afraid there is no photo this time as I did not want to keep the fish out of the water for too long.

Anyway, a couple of days later I was out there again and this time I managed to bank another 4 pike. Three of the 4 pike were relatively small, but the fourth weighed around 10lb. I always prefer to get the fish back as soon as possible, so an estimated guess on this occasion was more appropriate, unless of course the fish had been of a specimen size.

At the third time of asking this particular fish was safely in my grasp. My first encounter with it came when I was using a Fox Pro Shad "Perch pattern". The pike struck only yards out from the bank, and in a short time of being hooked threw my lure. After repeatedly casting over the same area I decided to give it a break. I gave it 10 minutes, then tried again. This time though I chose to use the same lure but a different pattern instead. With my second cast, "WHALLOP" she was hooked once more, but again this only lasted a matter of seconds as she threw my lure.

Then, with the very next cast, the same fish came back for a third time. On this occasion, it was to be third time lucky for me, so it goes to show that perseverance is often the key!

More recently, the Lake District was to be the scenic holiday home for me and my family for a week in September. By reading many books, I knew that the following Waters held some really big fish: Grasmere; Esthwaite; Ullswater; and of course Lake Windermere. Unfortunately, on this occasion, I did not have enough time to try the big waters, but hope to return in the not so distant future. I did get to fish a couple of smaller venues including Rydal Water and Loughrigg Tarn. For those of you wondering what a Tarn is, it is another name for a mountain lake or pool. This is more commonly heard of in the North of England, deriving from the influences and language of the Norse invaders all those years ago...

In total a maximum of three hours was fished at Rydal. The first fish I hooked, I lost. But then I did manage to finally catch my first South Lakeland pike, this fish was caught with a brass coloured spoon and weighed around 6lb. My second choice of venue was Loughrigg Tarn which also holds some reasonably-sized pike, but I only had around a couple of hours in which to fish it, and was unsuccessful this time around.

Well, having enjoyed my short stint on holiday, I still had one more opportunity to fish before having to return to work. So, an early morning start of 6am saw me venture out to one of my favorite venues. This was also to be my first dead baiting session of the season. After setting up my first dead bait rod with a float fished Mackerel, I then began to concentrate on my second. This was fished with a juicy 8" Smelt which was then attached to a dead bait pencil float.

I began to tighten up the slack line to cock my float, when a big old pike came crashing out of the shallows and clamped its jaws around my float. Yes, it really did take my float!

The fish then took off, taking at least 30 yards of my braid with it, but then the pike finally realised it had a piece of wood in its mouth, then let go. It was not until sometime later that I had a more conventional take, and my float fished Mackerel was finally picked up. After a good five minute battle, my first dead bait fish of the season was beaten and in the net. She weighed in at 16lb 1ozs, a great start to my winter pike fishing. After a couple of days, I was back for another try. This time the fishing was as slow as the previous session, but just as I was packing up, my float fished Skimmer Bream dead bait was taken. This resulted in another fine looking fish of 14lb 5ozs. Hopefully, before long, I might just bump into one of the lakes real big 'uns!


