THOUSANDS OF YOUNG PEOPLE TO CELEBRATE 150TH ANNIVERSARY OF CADET MOVEMENT

The UK's cadet movement is celebrating a century and a half of support to young people with hundreds of events all over the country throughout 2010, all designed to promote the movement and encourage people of all ages to get involved. The year of celebration is entitled Cadet150 and Her Majesty The Queen is Patron. With origins dating back to 1860, the cadet movement is one of the oldest and most successful voluntary youth

organisations in the world.

A force to be reckoned with, today it numbers 131,000 young people led by 25,000 adult volunteers in well over 3,000 sites across the country. Cadet150 honours the role the Cadet Forces play in assisting young people towards responsible adulthood through learning new skills and developing self-confidence, and recognises the contribution the young people themselves make to their local communities. Central to the national commemorations will be a royal review of the Cadet Forces in central London in July 2010, but celebrations will be ongoing throughout the year, all reflecting the spirit of fun, excitement, adventure and community service at the heart of the cadet movement. 60 specially selected cadets will be embarking on a unique expedition to southern Africa during which they will work with orphans and vulnerable children in Lesotho, while dozens more will be challenging themselves on treks and expeditions all over the world, including one to Mount Everest. Back in the UK there will be competitions showcasing first aid and a wide array of sports, as well as a special residential camp for cadets participating in The Duke of Edinburgh's Gold Award.

To represent the lasting legacy of the cadet movement and its continued appeal to young people, cadets across the country will be planting 150,000 trees in partnership with the Woodland Trust. The national events will conclude with formal tributes during Remembrance weekend in November.

Within Cambridgeshire Army Cadet Force Cadet150 celebrations are also being planned to take place throughout 2010 and will include a Parade and Service at Ely Cathedral on 6th June 2010 and an "At Home" Open Day at the Cadet Centre, Waterbeach for all Past and Present Members on the 11th September 2010. It has been brought to our attention that someone is coming into Cambourne and is selling Shopping Vouchers to residents. We are unsure who the provider is at the moment.

This could be through either:

- □ Provident
- ☐ Greenwood
- Shopper check

These 'Door step' lenders are regulated, but their APR is extremely high and can be around 300/400%.

Their system works by them offering shopping vouchers the first time that they knock on your door. After you have taken this offer up, they can then come back and offer you a loan. Again, the APR interest will be very high.

If you are offered anything from a door step lender where:

- You have been offered a cash loan without paperwork
- Been threatened when you couldn't pay
- Had your benefit or bank card taken from you
- Had a loan which keeps growing even though you are making payments

WYSING LAUNCHES YEAR OF THE IMPROBABLE Saturday 16 January, 4-6pm

On 16 January 2010 Wysing Arts Centre will officially launch the centre's year of the Improbable with a solo exhibition by London based artist Mark Aerial Waller.

Waller is a film-maker, sculptor, installation artist and occasional writer and editor. He has an encyclopedic knowledge of cinema and brings cinematic references into the gallery through his immersive installations, screenings, events and elaborate films; in which action has been improvised by the cast in fantastical settings, such as a foam cave or a half completed housing development in Dakar. Papworth Astronomy Club News

In November, Dave Eagle FRAS from Bedford Astronomical Society gave us a presentation on Charles Piazzi Smyth, a native of Bedford and former Astronomer Royal for Scotland. We heard that he resigned as Astronomer Royal in 1888 in protest at the chronic under-funding and age of the equipment at his facilities, subsequently pursuing an interest in the pyramids. Dave also told us about the opportunities for amateur astronomy on Tenerife and has promised to come back to show us some of his images from the island.

On **Wednesday 2nd December**, we will have a night sky meeting, with (weather permitting) an observing session. In the event of inclement weather, there will be an alternative presentation indoors.

Our first meeting of 2010 will be held on **Wednesday 13th January**. Keith Tritton, president of the club and (until recently) with the Open University, will talk about extrasolar planets. The number of known extrasolar planets has now passed the 400 mark. How are they being found? What are these planets like? Will we ever find a twin to the Earth?

All club meetings are held in the Vinter Room, Papworth Everard, at 7:30PM. Entering Papworth Everard from the south, take the first left after the traffic lights into Elm Way, past the fire station, then take the second left into Vinter Close. From the north, take the first right after the library into Elm Way, past the fire station on your left, then take the second left into Vinter Close. There are thieves in Cambourne.

About a year ago I myself have had property stolen from our carport. I was annoyed and angry that some one had taken it, and was annoyed with myself for thinking that the items would be safe.

Following the story of last issue i believe there is a bigger problem with thieves in Cambourne than than people or the police are aware of.

No i did not report my theft to the police, this was a mistake and now find myself being visited by a neighbour in distress after they have just had some property stolen.

As with pervious articles, the chance of anyone responsible for these crimes actually reading this or giving a damn is unlikely, but as owners we must act to remove the opportunity for thieves.

P.S. do not believe your gardens or sheds are safe either.

MAGPAS now have 4 volunteers (including myself) who are willing to give up their time to attend urgent 999 calls before the ambulance arrives to give potentially life saving treatment; within Cambourne.

All that is required is a full clean driving licence and MAGPAS provides the rest, no previous healthcare/first aid experience necessary.

All is needed is 1 more volunteer and the group can begin its life saving work. This volunteer could also be a non-responder but could organise the group and rota etc.

Less then 3% of all Cardiac Arrests that happen out of hospital, survive, but the sooner treatment can be given, the better the chance of survival.

BUS SERVICE CUTS

From 29th November, Stagecoach plan to cut all Sunday Citi4 services after 6pm, which will leave many people stranded e.g. people who work at the West Cambridge site, those who live in Cambourne and Hardwick, and/or work at Addenbrookes. Sneakily, Stagecoach aren't publicising the cuts at all, except in one place on their website - presumably to prevent the orchestration of complaints. If this would affect you or anyone you know, complain to Stagecoach at cambridge.enquiries@stagecoachbus.com in Cambridge, 100 Cowley Road, Cambridge, CB4 ODN and email the local councillor, Fiona Whelan, fiona.whelan@cambslibdems.org.uk who is preparing a dossier of complaints to bring before the council which might force Stagecoach to back down. If this change goes ahead I think it will have a serious effects on many people's finances. If anyone living in West Cambridge/Hardwick/Cambourne has any meetings etc. scheduled to end after 5.30pm on a Sunday, they will have to fork out for a very expensive taxi to get back home. From my extensive experience travelling on post 6pm buses on Sunday, these are generally well-used, so it seems arbitrary in the extreme for Stagecoach to cut the Citi4 evening buses while simultaneously introducing a better service to Haverhill. As far as my experience goes, there has been no public consultation whatsoever on this issue. None of my friends who work at Addenbrookes and live in Cambourne knew about it either, until I mentioned it to them. No posters have been put up at bus-stops on the route advising people of the change, the only mention I have seen of changed bus times in the past 2 weeks is a poster on a few busses which state that changes to timetables are happening on a number of routes, and to consult the Stagecoach website for further details.

In any case, I imagine, many people assumed that the change would mean improvements to the existing timetable, as is the case with a number of other services rather than drastic cuts. I myself only ended up following the link because I was looking up another bus service, and I would imagine that by the time a lot of people who find the Sunday evening busses useful realise that cuts have been decided upon, they will already be in place at which point Stagecoach will probably claim that there was no public opposition to the cut, therefore it must be fine. This is not the way that a bus company which purports to care for its customers should behave.

Wildlife Review December 2009

Moving some of the wood around in our yard the other day we found a hedgehog sleeping under one stack. As he (or she) seemed to be large enough we tucked him into one of the hedgehog houses we have in the wildlife garden with plenty of leaves to keep him warm. Hedgehogs have to hibernate because their main food source, insects and other creepy crawlies, are not so easy to find during the cold months. You might have hedgehogs looking for places to hibernate in your garden right now, so make sure you check any bonfires or leafy corners before doing anything. To find out more visit the British Hedgehog Preservation Society website.



We have also had lots of feathered visitors to our garden as food is getting harder to find for the birds as well. We have two seed feeders, a peanut feeder and a niger feeder, to cater for all tastes. The shapes of

each bird's beak reflects what it usually eats, so goldfinches have very narrow beaks for getting teasel seeds out of the flower heads, and they like the niger seeds which are a similar shape. The greenfinches have much heavier beaks for eating bigger seeds, such as sunflower seeds. Great spotted woodpeckers are made for hammering holes in trees to get at the insects, but during the winter we also see them occasionally on our peanut feeder where they are brilliant at chipping out the bits of nut. We have recently taken on more of the green spaces around Cambourne including the eastern half of Crow Hill, the Fen Greenway near the Belfry, Lake Lambert and Great Common Wood (on Eastgate). As with the areas we already manage, we will be trying to make these areas really good for wildlife and for people to visit (where appropriate) too. If you have any questions about these areas please get in touch.

Hairy Potter

The Garden Wizard

Now I am not going to pretend that December is the prime gardening month! So unless you have some holly to cut, need to feed the birds or grab something from the shed, most of you will not venture out too

much. Well the weather is often cold, wet, windy and even slushy so I don't blame you! The best

you can hope for is snow so get the mulled wine on in preparation for the jobs below.



- 1. Check plant protection is still secured
- 2. Make sure greenhouse heaters are still working
- 3. Ensure your outside tap is protected against frost
- 4. Prevent ponds from completely freezing over (keep a hole in the ice to let gasses escape)
- 5. Any deciduous trees and shrubs can still be planted out as can other trees in containers.
- 6. Take hardwood cuttings
- 7. Mice-proof anywhere you are storing bird food / grass seed or produce
- 8. Reduce watering of indoor plants
- 9. Keep Digging!
- 10. Remove snow from plants after any heavy falls

You can also be pruning apple and pear trees (but not if trained against a wall) acers, birches and vines. In the Vegetable garden, harvest leeks, parsnips, winter cabbages, sprouts and any remaining root crops.

Readers Question – A Crier reader has asked me if I can explain why her climbing roses do not want to flower. Well, as I have said before, I find roses very high maintenance and there are several factors why any rose does not produce that wonderful display of flowers promised on the label. You may need to be patient. They can take three to five years to fully establish and flower. Next on the list is food and water. Feeding needs to be done every six weeks but ensure the nitrogen content is not too high otherwise this will encourage foliage and not flowers. If roses dry out they are prone to stress and therefore disease and this will also affect flowering. Another thing could be the pH of your soil. A pH of 6.0 – 6.8 is OK but outside of this and the rose will have trouble in getting nutrients out of the soil. A test kit is inexpensive and easy to get hold of. Lastly position is all important. Roses need plenty of sun to flower. Less than five hours and you could struggle but aim for eight to be sure.

If you are lucky on Christmas morning you may be able to keep those reindeer droppings for your roses!

*Merry Christmas to you all - bring on spring!!

YOUNG PEOPLE IN SOUTH CAMBRIDGESHIRE SPEAK OUT ON HEALTH

Young people from the Cambourne Youth Partnership (Cambridgeshire South) shared their views and concerns on health with their local MP, Andrew Lansley, on 13 November 2009 as part of a national youth health campaign.

Make Space for Health is run by national children's charity 4Children and supported by Nestlé UK. The programme delivers health advice and activities in youth clubs and facilitates better 'joined-up' health support for young people at a national and local level.

Marathon Challenge 2009

If you went down School Lane on Saturday 7th November, you might have spotted some people with a tent tying themselves in knots, and seen lots of walkers wearing high-vis jackets and neckerchieves. You might understandably have wondered what they were doing! The answer is that they were taking part in Marathon Challenge, an incident hike run by Cambridge University Scout and Guide Club (CUSAGC).

Marathon is an annual event, and this year it was was based in Bourn Village Hall. Twenty four teams, all members of Scouting and Guiding aged fourteen and above, were given grid references for twenty six checkpoints (hence the name Marathon) to find in nine hours. The checkpoints were spread over a wide area around Bourn, from Cambourne to Toft to the Wimpole Estate. It was estimated that the shortest possible route taking them all in was twenty four miles, and four teams managed this impressive distance. At some of these checkpoints there was a group of helpers offering the teams hot drinks and a challenge to gain extra points. The challenge at Cambourne was for the walkers to instruct blindfold members of their team to find the ends of a rope and tie a knot, which explains why passers-by might have seen Scouts tying ropes around road signs.

All the walkers returned within their allotted time, and were rewarded with a hot meal in the village hall. The day was declared a great success, both by young teams for whom it was their first time navigating in the dark, and by old hands who were pitting themselves against the clock, and each other. Many people remarked on how good the footpaths are in this area, and some were surprised to find that this part of Cambridgeshire is not all flat. CUSAGC are very grateful to the local landowners who tolerated so many walkers across their land, and to the Wildlife Trust, who let us pitch a tent on their nature reserve.

A significant proportion of those eight years is spent at school so it is crucial that in establishing a new primary school we do absolutely everything we can to get it right! What does 'right' mean? Well, initially it is about creating an environment in which children can become enthusiastic and competent learners. But actually it's about much more than that. It's about creating an environment where everyone can succeed and where children are enabled to become confident in themselves and independent in their thinking. As always, at this time of year, the Cambourne Pike Anglers would like to wish everybody at the Crier team, and the residents of Cambourne, a very Merry Christmas, and a Happy New Year.

On the 26th of September, we made a trip to Stoneleigh in Warwickshire, this was for the Pike Anglers Club of Great Britain's annual convention. This year, the guest speakers were: Mark Barrett; Ian Weatherall; Denis Moules; Mike Green; and Graham Booth. Mark Barrett and Denis Moules were selling and signing copies of their new book, "Fenland Pike". I have not had a chance to read it yet, but I am sure it is a must for all pike anglers. Maybe it could end up in my Christmas stocking? who knows...

Other famous anglers were also to be seen on the day, these included: Eddie Turner; Neville Fickling; Mick Brown; Gord Burton; and John Watson, who was selling and signing his new book, "A Piker's Progression". This is a second edition of the much enjoyable and collectable "A Piker's progress", which was first published back in 1991.

Also, on the day was the draw for the PAC event on The Lake of Menteith, this takes place next February and can be found on the north east side of Loch Lomond in Scotland.

The draw this time was made by the very much liked T.V fishing pundit Mick (The Duke) Brown. It was not long before Mick pulled out mine and Nigel's application. This was to be a first time for us, so we were delighted to be fishing such a prestigious event and venue. This year, the draw was to be held in front of everyone in the hall, rather than behind closed doors. The new format was decided by the newly formed PAC committee members, who thought it fairer for everyone.

We were drawn on the second date of three, with some of the biggest names in the pike angling world, such as: the famous "piking pirate" Gord Burton; Scott Davidson; Steve Rodwell; and Phil Wakeford. This event will be fished with 30 boats on the day, 2 anglers per vessel, using lures only.

On a more personal note, my fishing has slowed down somewhat since the summer months. I have concentrated more on my dead bait fishing recently, hoping to track down some of the lakes' much bigger fish. But, on my last 7 outings I have only managed to bank 2 pike, both of these fish were caught on mackerel tails, and weighed around 8lb apiece. As for Nigel, he has been doing rather better than me. Fish of 6lb, 8lb and 12lb, were caught on sardine and mackerel dead baits during a recent session on the same pit. Other sessions since then have produced more fish for Nigel, although no big fish have been landed yet. He is still optimistic that something bigger will be along soon.

Anyway, last month we decided to try somewhere completely new for us, Anglian Water's Rutland. Although this reservoir is only 45 minutes up the A1, we thought we needed a little more experience before tackling such a big venue. To give you some idea of the task that faced us, Rutland has a shoreline of approx 25 miles. In the 1970's, Rutland lost its independence as a county, and became part of Leicestershire. This was fiercely opposed by many, but remained so until 1997, when Rutland regained its independence.

We now feel that we have gained enough boating hours to finally try this water. In the past, this vast expanse of water has produced one or two pike over 40lb, also many others between 20 and 30lb have also made an appearance. Unfortunately, Rutland is only open for a short time in the year for pike anglers, these dates run from Oct 12th through until Nov 29th. For our first visit, it did turn out to be very tough going. But we had heard from other sources previously that it was not an easy water to fish, so it came as no surprise that we did struggle.

During the day I did manage to tempt two fish back to the boat, although these looked very much like a couple of Rutland's smaller-sized Zander. I was pleased that my chosen lures had worked to some extent. On two other occasions, I did come very close to catching my first Rutland fish. Again, my hunch told me that they were probably Zander or Trout, just snatching at my rather large soft baits and spoons. Perhaps using smaller lures would have been an option, but Anglian Water do have a policy on all of their waters, that no lures are to be used under 7", and all lures are to be barbless.

On a final note, I should like to remind readers that Zander Ace, Steve Younger will be guest speaker at the Cambridgeshire's PAC monthly meeting. This will be held on 2 December, at the Bottisham British Legion club at 8pm. Maybe see you there?


