Dear Cambourne residents.

Over the past two months, several articles have appeared in the media about plans to build a new community fire station on land to the south of Back Lane in Cambourne.

Some of the reports I feel have been

future – requiring its own operational fire station and fire engine.

Why will the station not be operational (ie – not house a fire engine)?

At present, the amount of incidents in Cambourne is relatively low and it would not make economic sense to locate an operational fire engine there, when Papworth (which has a lot more incidents) is close by.

However, as Cambourne grows the risk profile for the area will inevitably change and become a greater risk than Papworth. We will then look to move the fire engine from Papworth to

Like other fire and rescue services and many other public sector organisations in the UK, Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service has gone through a period of modernisation in recent years. Now our firefighters not only fight fires, but they also carry out community safety activity, such as fitting smoke alarms and advising residents on the best way to prevent fire. This work is carried out by our firefighters and also dedicated community safety teams within the fire service.

Cambourne Community Fire Station will be used primarily as a base for the South Cambs district offices, specialising in preventing fires in the community and working with businesses to protect their staff and visitors from fire. It can also be used as a community facility with meeting space for local residents and groups.

The community of Cambourne should benefit greatly from having this kind of specialist community safety resource on its doorstep.

We are committed to continually improving the service we provide to the people of Cambridgeshire and Peterborough in a way that is most cost effective for us, and you, now and in the future.

unbalanced so I wanted to take this opportunity to contact you directly and provide you with more detailed information as I am sure you have many thoughts and questions regarding the developments.

History behind the decision to build the station

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service (CFRS) was allocated the land in 1994 as part of the Section 106 agreement between Cambridgeshire County Council and MCA Developments. As part of this agreement, the fire service was given the site free of charge and also received a total of £588,000 towards the building costs of a new fire station. The total cost of the build is envisaged to be £1.1 million, which means we will be able to provide a new fire station for just over £500,000. We have identified Cambourne as a growing village and one that will almost certainly pose a greater risk in the

Cambourne. It is better to have the station in place now at low cost to the taxpayer, than to have to pay a vastly inflated price for the same facility in the future - especially as we can utilise the building now as part of our wider role in the community.

The changeover from Papworth to Cambourne will only happen when the

risk profile of the areas change and we will monitor this on an annual basis.

So what will the station be used for?

May

At last the weather did get a bit better for us in April so things are catching up fast from the slow start. May is the prime planting month for just about anything! This is when spring turns into early summer. That is in theory anyway but anything is possible I guess. While the keen gardener is itching to get going and the garden centres fill up with enticing plants a word of warning! May can be a cruel month. In reality the weather is often very changeable. We gardeners may have to contend with everything from frost and strong Cambourne winds, to heat waves and thunderstorms. Thoughts though need to be turning to lawn care, planting out your summer bedding and containers so plan to stock up on fertilisers and compost.

Top 10 jobs:

- 1. Watch out for late frosts. Protect tender plants
- 2. Get a fresh Mulch layer on boarders ready to plant out summer bedding at the end of the month
- 3. Think green! Investigate ways to collect and recycle rain water for summer irrigation
- 4. Keep on top of those weeds with regularly hoeing
- 5. Apply a weed killer and fertiliser combination to established lawns or seed new ones and cover to keep birds away. Turf can be laid as the soil warms
- 6. Start to harden off bedding plants by putting them outside during the day.
- 7. Protect susceptible plants from slugs. Use slug bait or pour beer in a jar lid to trap them.
- 8. Finish sowing hardy annuals: the later they are sown, the later they will flower
- 9. Start caring for your roses with a good maintenance programme.
- 10. Prune spring-flowering shrubs to prevent them from becoming overgrown

There are plenty of other jobs though to keep you busy. Watch out for pest and disease on all plants, they also like the warmer months! If you have any plants with a floppy habit then now is the time to get the support frames into borders ready for them to grow through. You can plant your hanging baskets but keep them protected until the risk of frost has passed. Also ensure recent introductions to your garden are kept watered in dry spells.

In The Vegetable Garden:

Time to get motoring as most vegetable crops can be sown now but if the soil is still cold and wet hold off until things improve. If you have early potatoes showing, earth them up and get planting any main crop varieties. Keep on top of the weeds here too. Fruits of your labour this month will be from harvesting those Asparagus spears that are showing and any early Rhubarb.

So, cold winter, wet start to spring, long range weather forecast says very hot summer. Your guess is as good as mine and probably anyone else's.

Dear Mr Wilson.

The recent exchange of letters, in the 'Camboume Crier' between yourself and a Cambourne resident concerning road gritting has been illuminating.

Scotland has, according to the correspondence been the recipient of salt diverted from Cambridgeshire. Thank you! However, whether that is the case or not, we too have been short of grit etc.

Mind you, the cold weather in Scotland has stretched in various degrees of severity, from December to the present day.

We are frequent visitors to Cambourne our family live here. They are seeking to get us to move to the area. However there is a deeper concern than road gritting that the correspondence raises, and that is the relationship of the community to the developers' consortium. From the tone of your letters you appear to imply that the development consortium is holding the community to ransom as regarding the education of our children.

How is this allowed? Surely a monopoly situation as Morrison's and the Consortium are in, is against the law of the land, as is blackmail. One cannot get even a newspaper anywhere else, or a cup of coffee [up to now] apart from Morrison's. Similarly the Consortium has control of the land, of the kind of houses that are built, and seemingly when and where the schools are erected.

Furthermore, in these days of energy efficiency, anyone, including myself, who is looking for a house built to Code 6, cannot find one, nor is there even a plot of land to self-build to such a standard, for the consortium have all the land in their control. Is it right that they should block enterprise?

Furthermore, now, the education of the children is in the control of the Consortium, to the extent that the existing primary schools are full, and newcomers' children are going to Hardwick or Bourn schools, because the consortium is refusing to release land for the Jeavons' Wood school. Is this right?

Does it not behave the district and parish/community councils to stand up to the Consortium, and do something about this situation, and say, "up with this we will not put" This state of affairs appears to be an illustration of mediaeval feudal Lordship.

Furthermore, would you agree that the inadequacy of the sewage pumping station is an added example to the lack of care for the community exhibited by the Consortium. Being a Consortium, it begs the question whether there is true competition between the constituent building companies.

I put it to you that the council should take direct action, to remove these anomalies; unless of course planning and the council are in cahoots with the consortium. Then, where do we go for fairness?

We have been learning about Bible stories across the curriculum, so have dramatised Abraham's journey; we have written letters from Pharaoh to Joseph and of course Joseph's reply; we have rewritten the dialogue between God and Moses at the Burning Bush. In P.E. we learnt four Israeli Folk dances (and made year 5-6 jealous with our snazzy moves), learnt to sing 'Close every Door to me' and 'Shalom, Shalom', in a round and we have investigated what form sadness takes. In art we have used our knowledge of tone to paint some emotionally mature pictures of Moses, Joseph and the plagues.

All these things have been put in to a production by the year 3-4 team, which built around the Passover meal and the questions which are asked. The children dance their entrance to an Israeli folk tune; they sit in their ancient Hebrew costumes round the four sides of a rectangle acting area and share their learning. The production included acting in two plays – 'Let my People Go' and 'The Ten Commandments'. I think we have some future Oscar winners at the Vine!

Our school hall has been transformed into a huge learning area with the Red Sea parting in one corner, origami frogs and locusts crawling over the wall and the display boards full of children's learning. Out in our entrance hall the display is Ancient Sumeria – with ziggurats, cuneiform tablets and papier mache pottery amongst the children's Fact- Files and maps.

After the performance, our audience are invited to stay for our version of a Passover meal: lamb meatballs, unleavened bread, green salad, boiled eggs, cucumber relish, a drink of water and all finished off with apple sponge drizzled with honey. The food is all made by the children and served onto tables which hold a menu, an explanation of the food, and why these foods were used. These are also made and decorated by the children.

At the Vine we are proud that our children engage so fully with their learning and that they enjoy sharing it. We've done a Tudor Banquet and a night in an Underground station during the air-raid. The children are already asking, 'What's the next year's going to be?'

Wildlife Review May 2010


What a busy month it has been! Lots of people have been reporting their bird sightings to me, including a red kite that was spotted over Lower Cambourne during Easter Monday. I have also had several reports of frogspawn in the ponds all around Cambourne.

The amphibian evening was very successful with three great crested newts being spotted, plus lots of smooth newts and a few frogs and toads. The frog and toadspawn seen earlier in the month had turned successfully into tadpoles.

Fishing Club

You may remember back in September last year we were proposing to set up a fishing club at Lake Ewart to improve the angling there and try to stop people abusing the facility. It has taken a little longer than we anticipated as we had to get approval from a few places, but it is finally going ahead.

We hope the club will help resolve some of the antisocial problems that have been associated with the lake over the last few years, and help to improve the facilities for anglers. For example they may contribute towards restocking of the lake and improving the platforms. We will also be able to provide fishing coaching for young people.

We will be meeting with them to help get everything in place and appoint bailiffs to patrol the lake. Much of this month I have been making arrangements for some of our church to attend a single's retreat in Germany. I also got a Sat Nav unit, (and thanks to the people on the Cambourne forum for the advice), so I can drive when I get there without ending up in the wrong place. 
Papworth Astronomy Club News
