The Great British Summer and the World Cup, what more could you want. Some more sun I hear you cry. Well July is reportedly the hottest month of the year so enjoy it while you can. Providing you have done your gardening earlier in the year your garden will be bursting into a riot of colour. Now it is time to protect what you have, pest and disease will pray on the pep plants well fed and watered.

ering is the order of this month and this is what you can be getting on with.

Top 10 jobs

- 1. Pick up any beer cans from the last world cup party!
- 2. Deadhead flowering plants to ensure continuous blooms
- 3. Spray Roses to control black spot, mildew and aphids
- 4. Water and feed containers well (morning or evening is best)
- 5. Continue to mow grass raising the height of cut in dry weather
 - Tie in and train new growth on climbing plants
- 7. Clean paving or decking to remove any algae
- 8. Lift spring bulbs if required and store them for planting in the autumn
- 9. Give the lawn a summer feed
- 10. If you have fruit trees then give them their summer prune

If you have a pond now is a good time to give everything the once over. Remove plant material that has fallen into the pond and any blanket weed (by twirling it around a stick). Check filters on pumps to ensure that they are not blocked. Continue to feed the fish and keep it topped up with water.

If you have any spare planted up pots, slot them into gaps in your borders for an instant fix.

In the Vegetable Garden

Keep sowing salad crops every couple of weeks for a continuous supply. If you haven't already done so earth up main crop potatoes so they will produce you a better yield. Keep an eye on your courgettes and pick every other day to prevent them becoming marrows! Strawberry runners can be pegged down into the soil or pots to produce some free plants. Remove flowering spikes from Rhubarb and give the plants a good mulch. Pick raspberries regularly, if you can get there before the birds that is and keep digging those early potatoes. Not all vegetables need as much water as we often think but salad crops and onions will reward you if you do.

Wildlife Review July 2010

This is a great time of year to get out and spot some of our most beautiful and amazing insects, dragonflies and damselflies. The lakes and ponds around Cambourne provide fantastic habitat for them. They also need areas of woodland to hunt for their prey, so the new trees that are growing up will be fantastic. Some new species that we spotted this year include red-eyed damselfly, black-tailed skimmer and four-spotted chaser. If you are interested (or you have keen youngsters) I would strongly recommend visiting Wicken Fen and the new Dragonfly Centre there.

Last time I asked for your sightings of bee orchids. I have not had any in yet from residents, but we spotted some in the 'ridge-and-furrow' area (aka the bumpy bit) in the Eco Park, so keep your eyes peeled. I'm sure they will turn up in other areas too.



We have been continuing to record the ground nesting birds on Crow Hill. Many of them have successfully raised their chicks to the stage where they leave the nest and run around in the grass, so they are much harder to spot! Thank you to everyone for keeping your dogs out of the long grass.



Sheep

For those people who walk around the eastern boundary, you may have noticed that there are sheep in the small square meadow near the new allotments. These are a mixture of manx loughtan (brown), hebridean (black) and Norfolk horn (white) that are on loan to us from one of our Bedfordshire nature reserves, Pegsdon Hills. They will help to improve the condition of the meadows, making them better for all sorts of wildlife. The sheep will be moved between the small meadow and the larger meadow further south depending on where they are most needed. We have created a new route around the larger meadow for those that do not want to walk through livestock. You can still walk through the meadow to enjoy the wildflowers, but please make sure that all gates are shut and if you take your dog it is on a lead.

Reception Unit go wild about animals!

This half term Reception Unit at The Vine has been learning about animals and their habitats. Jeavons Woo Primary School Growing Together A year to remember... by Sarah Humphreys, Headteacher

What an amazing year this has been! Twelve months ago, our blue school was in the process of being constructed, I was still living on the other side of the world and Rachel Walsh, our Administration Manager was busily coordinating everything from her sitting room! Fifty-two excited children were expecting to join us in September and it seemed a mammoth task to have everything ready in time. Can you imagine how we were feeling on September the 1st 2009, the day before we welcomed our first pupils? Well, now I can admit it... petrified! As a team, we had all worked so hard over the summer to try and get the essentials in place - our classrooms were welcoming and bright, we'd planned a creative and pupil-led curriculum, the policies and systems were in place to make sure the children would be safe and secure but there was still so much to do!

Our first few days were slightly surreal. On the day we opened, we expected some interest from the local press but we were rather surprised when, later on in the day, journalists from The Independent and The Sun arrived. It turned out that our opening coincided with the news that Cambourne had one of the highest birthrates in the world! Despite the rather unexpected media attention, everything seemed to work out fine. The children settled remarkably well and the first day morphed comfortably into a first week, first

month and then a successful first term.

'Comfortably' is, maybe, an exaggeration... for those first few months we were like swans, our legs flapping wildly under the water whilst we pretended to swim serenely through each day. Despite the pressure, I always felt very happy with what was happening in the classrooms. We have a fabulous staff at Jeavons Wood and our two Curriculum Leaders, Jo Burke and Em Flitton have



a real passion for learning. Our shared vision is that Jeavons Wood School should be a place where children are enabled to achieve their academic potential in a way that also helps them to become independent, respectful and confident people. We want children to be excited by their learning, to feel they have some control over how this learning

takes place and to see school as 'their' place, a place where they are respected and loved.

Cooped up in my office, I sometimes feel a bit left out of all the important stuff that is happening in the classrooms but the teachers are very good to Every day, children are sent to the headteacher's office for all the right reasons they arrive, clutching work, big smiles on their faces, so proud of their achievements. Often, I'll get a call from one of the classrooms... "Miss Humphreys, come quickly, I think you'd like to see this...". I'll arrive and there might be children under tables, wearing goggles and swimming caps pretending to be Michael Angelo painting the Sistine Chapel, or there'll be a small group working intently creating an enormous giraffe using junk materials, or maybe there will be there simply be some fabulous pieces of writing to coo

Where will the next year lead us? Well, by September we will have more than doubled in size and we'll be introducing three new classes. The Bumblebees, Dragonflies and Butterflies will be joined by the Ladybirds, Hedgehogs and Woodpeckers. These class names were chosen by the children in the Butterfly Class - originally they suggested that the Ladybird Class would be called the Moles... I'm so glad they changed their minds! The new children who are coming to the school in September have already started visiting and the builders are back again creating the space we'll need in order to accommodate everyone. We've appointed some lovely new staff who are all excited about the prospect of becoming part of the Jeavons Wood team and all is looking very promising. So, have our 'new school nerves' settled then? Not quite... ask us again in another couple of years! Editorial: page 7

Over the last few weeks older children were making "getting to know you" visits to the primary schools they will be attending from September; we have supported them in this in order to make their transition to primary education a positive step forward.

Thank you to everyone who donated the Morrison's Let's Grow vouchers to the Care and Learning Centre. 

RASY PRZZAS (FOR 4 PEOPLE)

This recipe celebrates some of the wonderful, seasonal fruit and veg on offer at the moment like tomatoes, sweet peppers and courgettes. Also, if you have trouble getting vegetables into your children this is a fantastic solution that they're likely to relish!! Make it fun by getting them to assemble the pizzas themselves – they'll be more interested and eat it.

You will need:

- 2 small ciabattas cut in half
- Olive oil
- 1tbsp tomato puree
- 1 bulb garlic plus 1 garlic clove
- 1 tsp sugar
- 800g tomatoes (approx 8 tomatoes)
- 2 sweet peppers (not green)
- 2 courgettes
- 3 red onions
- 1 bunch basil
- 1 tsp mild chilli powder
- 100g mature cheddar/parmesan grated (stronger cheese means more flavour and you'll use less)
- Plus a selection of toppings (Anything you like mushroom, ham, pineapple, tuna, pepperoni, sweetcorn etc.)



Toast the ciabatta lightly, drizzle a little olive oil over the cut side, rub the garlic clove lightly over the top. Spoon some tomato sauce on the top, add your toppings, a sprinkle of cheese and bake in the oven until golden brown approx 10 mins. Serve with



Cambourne Resident Engineer's Report

- Maurice R Gordon

It has been some while since I produced a report for the Cambourne Crier so I felt this would be an opportune time to do so and bring everyone up to date with progress, particularly in respect of the work currently being undertaken to tackle the drainage infiltration problems.

MCA have acknowledged that after excessive rainfall, groundwater is getting into the foul drainage system. The Anglian Water Terminal Pump Station in School Lane is then unable to cope with the extra flow and has in the past lead to flooding to the neighbouring streets and property.

I can report that all the Primary Foul Sewer network (ie along the main roads) throughout Lower and Great Cambourne has been inspected visually and surveyed internally by CCTV cameras. This has produced a small number of defects eg leaking manholes or leaking redundant connections which have been repaired and sealed. There are also a few displaced joints and cracks in the pipework most of which have been resolved. Those remaining are located beneath the roads and a solution avoiding the excavation of the road will be developed with Anglian Water who will eventually adopt these sewers. In addition the individual Developers have undertaken similar investigations and repairs to their own Secondary Foul Sewer network (ie within Estate Roads). A third tier of drains ie those within private property are also being investigated with the co-operation of residents and which may involve dye testing local connections to ensure they are outfalling to the correct sewer.

The investigative work is substantially complete and so allows the teams to now progress in earnest with the repairs. This is anticipated to continue until the end of July when a programme of final checking will begin.

A revised tankering strategy is also now in place to deal with any flooding. This will ensure that although tankers will still need to visit the Terminal Pump Station in School Lane, others will be deployed to the satellite pump stations. This will reduce the impact on residents in School Lane. In addition, Anglian Water are investigating the operation of their Terminal Pump Station and are considering means to store more surplus foul water in the system during times of high volumes of flow if this should recur.

Regular meetings are held by the investigative team and close liaison is maintained between the team and SCDC officers and councillors and the action group RAFT.

Meanwhile the growth of Cambourne continues at a somewhat increased pace than this time last year albeit still reduced from its peak. Upper Cambourne is progressing and work has begun on the Village Green just north of the Vine School. The temporary Primary School at Jeavons is being extended and the Police Station can now be clearly seen, OK if you like green! The plans for Sports Centre, Fire Station and BMW site in Sheepfold Lane are well advanced.

Finally as is normal at this time of year, with warmer weather and lighter evenings, parents are asked to warn children of the dangers of Construction Sites. All residents are also reminded to take note of signs referring to 'Works and Out of Bounds Areas' where access is not permitted especially along the contractor's Haul Roads.

BOWLS - FOR EVERYONE

On a very chilly Mayday Bank Holiday afternoon some 25 Residents braved the showers of rain and sleet to celebrate the opening of the Bowling Green in Back Lane. The formal opening was carried out by Cllr David Tilley. Bowling Club members from local Clubs were on hand to help and coach those Cambourne residents who hadn't played before and we were very grateful for their help and time. It was soon discovered that Bowls is a game that can be enjoyed by young and the not so young and is great fun too. Despite the weather there were a lot of happy faces who not only enjoyed the refreshments in the warmth of the Hub afterwards but the social side of this sport.

The Bowling Green is now open on a 'Play and Pay' basis to any residents in Cambourne and bookings (along with a loan of bowls etc.) can be made via the Parish Office on 01954 714403. 

call they are alerted by the Ambulance Control Centre at the same time as an ambulance. They are trained to give advanced first aid and can be on the scene within minutes, which can make big difference in cases where early treatment is crucial - heart attacks, for example.

CFRs are all volunteers who are trained, equipped and co-ordinated by MAGPAS and take it in turns to be on call. Nine volunteers from varied backgrounds including nurses, academics and housewives have been trained so far.

Papworth Astronomy Club News

Astronomy clubs from the east of England complete in an annual quiz for the Admiral Smyth Trophy. This trophy was originally presented by the Bedford Astronomical Society in 1991, the winners in that year. It is named after the astronomer William Henry Smyth (1788-1865), Gold Medallist of the Royal Astronomical Society. After retiring from the Navy, Smyth built and equipped an astronomical observatory at Bedford, where he carried out observations of stars for many years and published works on astronomy.

As current holders, Papworth Astronomy Club hosted this year's event, which was held at the Conservatory on 19th May. Papworth were once again victorious, beating challengers from Bedford, Sawtry and Nene Valley clubs to retain the trophy. They scored 31 points, well ahead of second-placed Bedford, who scored 17.

Papworth were represented by Ed Zanders, Janet Vialls and Gordon Carter. The questions were set by Keith Tritton, president of the Papworth Club and an astronomy tutor with the Open University. Light relief was provided with the "fictional planets" round devised by Chris Jones, which tested everyone's knowledge of Star Wars, Star Trek and other sci-fifilms! Since this was Papworth's third win in a row, the participants agreed that it would be nice for Keith to have a rest from writing the questions. Bedford therefore generously agreed to host next year's quiz.

The club is now taking its summer break and the next speaker meeting will be on Wednesday 1st September, when Dr Andy Martin from Cambridge University will give a talk called "Beware Invisible Cows"! In October, Professor Tony Hewish (winner of the Nobel Prize for Physics) will present "Radioastronomy, Inflation and the design of the Universe".
