Dear Editors,

I am writing to make a plea! My dog was attacked while returning home from our usual walk by an out of control, dangerous Staffordshire terrier. While my dog was on a lead, this dog was 'released' from it by its irresponsible owner, who upon seeing what their dog was doing simply ran away. As a result my dog has had to undergo an operation, is psychologically traumatised and I am hundreds of pounds out of pocket. At Cambourne veterinary practice I was told that there had been several incidents of this nature.

Can I therefore please make a plea – if this happens to your dog please do report it to the police. Irresponsible owners cannot be allowed to get away with irresponsible, dangerous and criminal actions. Next time it could quite easily be a child that is hurt or worse. While what happened to my dog is now the subject of criminal proceedings under the Dangerous Dogs Act, I am convinced that this is not the first time this dog has done something similar.

Can I also take this opportunity to thank all of my wonderful neighbours in Dovecote Avenue who stopped to help me and my dog. Without their intervention my dog would have been killed.

Cambourne Kitchen

Tomato and Onion Tarte Tatin

This recipe is a fantastic, summery dish that can be enjoyed as a starter, light lunch or supper. It's perfect for using the fresh English tomatoes currently in season and is simply delicious. You can use shop-bought puff pastry but making your own is very rewarding so I have included the recipe for a very easy 'rough-puff'. There's an added bonus that you can prepare it ahead of time and leave it in the fridge until you're ready to bake it. It's quite impressive if you want to use it for a dinner party. (This will be suitable for a pan roughly 9 in round.)

For the tomato and onion topping:

1 medium to large tomato (medium sliced) 1 medium onion (medium sliced)

1 tsp caster sugar

½ tsp salt

½ tsp pepper

100 ml water

10 g cold butter

Freshly grated parmesan and basil leaves to decorate (optional)

Put the sugar, water, and seasonings into a frying pan (the pan must be fully oven proof, so no rubber, plastic or wooden handles) and place over a medium heat until all the sugar has dissolved (without stirring). Once the sugar has dissolved whisk the butter into the syrup until it has fully emulsified, then turn the heat up to high until

the mixture is bubbling. Whilst it's simmering vigorously, carefully (!) place the tomato and onion round the pan in a spiral until it comes into the middle alternating between the two and so that they overlap. Let it cook for 5 min's until it has reduced and you can see that the onion and tomato have started to caramelise. Turn off the heat and allow to cool.

For the pastry:

125 g salted butter frozen (but out of the freezer for 10 min's)

4 heaped tsp plain flour

Enough water to bind (approx 6 tsp)

Place the flour into a large mixing bowl and use a fork or whisk to stir it round – (this introduces air into the flour). Then grate the butter into the flour (stir occasionally with a fork so it doesn't clump together). Once all the butter is grated in, slowly add water bringing the mixture together with the fork to form a dough. When you can see it coming together, then gently use your hand to incorporate all the flour. (I cannot emphasise enough how important it is to be light with your hand and also try to have cold hands!) Wrap the pastry in cling film and chill in the fridge for at least 20 min's or until ready to use.

Preheat the oven to 180°C. Then roll the pastry out to approx 2-3 mm thick using a rolling pin and a dusting of flour to stop the pastry sticking. Cut out a circle, slightly larger than the pan you are using. Lift the pastry over the top of your prepared tomatoes and onions. Pop the whole thing into the oven for about 15-20 min's until the pastry is golden brown.

Take the tarte out of the oven, run a knife around the edge, place a plate over the top of the pan and carefully flip the whole thing over so that the tarte has the pastry on the bottom. Decorate with some basil leaves and a grating of parmesan if you wish. Serve by itself or with a salad. Then eat!!

Wildlife Review July 2011

I had a phone call recently from someone in Cambourne that had found a grass snake curled up in their living room! Grass snakes like Cambourne because of all the water bodies in and around which they can hunt for frogs and fish (they are good swimmers). They also like all the grass piles that we



leave from cutting the grasslands, where they can lay their eggs in the warmth generated by the decaying vegetation. They are easy to identify by their greeny-brown colour and the yellow and black 'collar' just behind their head. They can grow up to a metre long, but are not dangerous to humans as they are not venomous and will only try to bite if provoked. It is very unusual to find a snake inside a house, I think it must have been looking for somewhere safe to shelter. Some people think they have seen an adder when they see a snake, but they mainly live on heathland sites so it is very unlikely they would be in Cambourne. You can tell an adder by the dark zigzag stripe down the



Bee orchids

Every year these beautiful flowers appear in the ridge-and-furrow area of grassland next to Oaks Wood. This year we have had a record count of 68 flowering spikes. It seems that bee orchids don't mind the drought too much! They will come up in all sorts of surprising places so let us know if you see them in any other parts of Cambourne.

Summer safety

As we come towards the summer holidays and with evenings light till late, we unfortunately see an increase in anti-social behaviour in Cambourne. One problem is people playing with the orange or yellow lifesaving throwlines by the lakes. These are very time consuming to repack if we manage to retrieve them or expensive to buy new ones if we don't. More importantly they will not be there to help someone in an emergency. If you see an unwound throwline that has been taken from the red cabinets around the lakes, please either bring it to the Manor House or put it in one of the cabinets and call to let us know where it

Please remind your young people that swimming in the Lakes in Cambourne is not safe. There are lots of hidden dangers in the lakes that they might not think of on a hot summer's day. Waterweeds, Morrison's trolleys, and very cold water in the deeper parts. Cuts or grazes also have the risk of allowing you to catch Weil's disease which is transmitted by rodent urine. So please stay out of the water.

If you see anyone swimming in any of the lakes or any other dangerous or anti-social behaviour around the green spaces then please call the police non-emergency number 0345 4564564. Please also call us to let us know, but remember that if it is in the evenings or the weekends we will not get the message until the following working day.

or call 01954 710510 Pastor Donavan Bangs Over the past few years, I have had people come to me and ask if our church preformed christenings for infants. This is something we do not do, as one of the primary distinctives of Baptists is the teaching of believer's baptism. Now we can have times to pray for the parents of a new child that they would do that which is right in teaching and caring for the child, but that in no way guarantees the child will grow up to be a Christian. Some groups teach that sprinkling an individual with water even if it is something they did not agree to (as with infants) brings them into God's family. That is the tradition of those groups. However, when we look at the scripture we see something else.

Who was baptized?

From what the scripture records we see adults and people old enough to be able to confess their sins and repent. Matthew 3:5-6 Mark 1:4-5. And obviously an infant is incapable of understanding the meaning of repentance, nor do they have the capacity to consciously turn from sin and seek Christ.

When were they baptized?

They were baptized after they repented of their sins and placed their faith in the promised Christ, the redeemer of Israel. (Remember they had been expecting the Messiah for a long time. So even prior to His coming people had placed faith in Him. Job 19:25). Acts 8:35-38 And John was preparing the way for the Messiah John 1:23.

Baptism also was needed prior to church membership, Acts 2:41. (Another distinctive of Baptists is a saved church membership. Anyone may attend, but to actually join you must profess Christ as Saviour and baptism follows as a step of obedience after salvation). It is important to remember baptism itself does not save you. It is only through repentance and faith in Christ that one is saved. Baptism is an outward profession of an inward change like a wedding

ring itself means nothing without the internal commitment to the one you love.

Where and how were they baptized?

They were baptized at places with water by immersion. John 3:23 (This was on the west bank of the Jordan river) The word baptize is not a word of English origin, but Greek meaning to dip or immerse. John baptized in the river, Matt 3:6. But baptism did not start with him. It had also been used with proselytes converting to Judaism in a ceremonial cleansing from past idolatry to the living God, always by immersion. There were many pools and such similar places throughout Israel as well as rivers and lakes. Again in Acts 8:35-38 they went down into the water and came up out of the water.

Why were they baptized?

To publicly declare their repentance and faith in Christ. It follows the example that Christ set, Matthew 3:13-16, Romans 6:3-5.

Now what?

The question is not should I have some ceremony for my child that they cannot understand, but rather what is my standing before God? If you want your child to have a faith in the Lord, do you have faith? If you want your child to receive the forgiveness of sin when they are old enough to understand, have you received that forgiveness through repentance and faith in Christ? If you want your child to follow you in good paths, you need to make sure you are in them yourself.

Hints. Tips and Info for Runners From the Run Leader of Cambourne Runners
