Cambourne Keynes? 3000 homes grew to 4236 homes - now possibly 6500

Although the latest consultation underway is for 1200 extra homes the original developer submission was for 2250 on the full site. The current site is only around half of the developer site (in terms of housing areas).

They are not replicating Cambourne as densities would be far higher and contributions to facilities limited.

Cambourne was planned at 22 homes per hectare but grew to 32 per hectare. The starting figure for the new site west of Cambourne is 40 per hectare.

South Cambs should have delivered Northstowe but even reducing the community contribution to 25% of the original figure they have not yet built a single house.

This has left a huge gap that has to be filled somewhere. Without a 5 year plan for homes it would be a free for all everywhere. **But it does not mean we have to lie back and accept it.**

The community made its views known last summer firmly rejecting the proposal, South Cambs say they have listened to those views "**but don't agree with them**".

We need to show that South Cambs have failed to properly investigate all the options by merely allowing developers to put forward sites, and not investigating sites south of Cambridge.

It is not providing homes where jobs are and is too car reliant. I urge you to respond to this consultation which runs until 5pm on 14th October as there may be no further opportunity. You don't have to do it on line the form is far simpler than the "loaded" questions of the on line submission. SCDC are planning a simpler revised submission form with their magazine in September.

Be careful to give good planning related reasons, sadly emotive issues do not count. More information is available on www.cambourne.info

SUMMARY Policy SS/8: Cambourne West

The method of selecting sites relies entirely on developers continually putting forward those that they have options on. South Cambs have failed to properly investigate the suitability of other sites, in particular to the South of Cambridge.

Upper Cambourne still has 900 homes to build and the effect of this extra capacity has not been taken into consideration and is as yet unknown.

Policy DP/7 states that in such locations only development for agriculture, horticulture, forestry, outdoor recreation and other uses which need to be located in the countryside will be permitted. Policy NH13. Development of the application site for residential purposes will have the effect of eroding the countryside along this stretch of the road to St Neots, to the detriment of the character of the area, and the erode the gap which currently exists between the settlements of Cambourne and Caxton in which Parish the site is located,.

Policy NH/3 It is a green field site which should be protected from **correspondence. SEE ALSO PAGE 5 Bourn airfield** further development.

The transport strategy consists of a bus lane at Madingley Hill which is not even yet supported by County policy.

Buses in Cambourne were initially successful while they were subsidised by the developers but when the subsidies ended the bus company reclassified the fare beyond the affordable Citi fare structure. The virtual doubling of the fare resulted in lower use and the loss of an hourly service to St Neots. No national bus services stop in Cambourne for example the Stagecoach X5 service Cambridge to Oxford refuse to consider stopping when it passes Cambourne even after the local service was withdrawn.



The proposal would result in a form of unsustainable development due to heavy reliance on the private car for access to services and facilities, contrary to the aims of Policy TI/3 and HQ1 that promotes sustainable development that minimises the need to travel and reduces car dependency.

Residential amenity - There would be an unacceptable increase in traffic within Cambourne against Policy NH/10 adverse impact on the character amenity and tranquility. The site will have an adverse impact on residential amenity to those residents who specifically were attracted by a village environment. The Cambourne Masterplan design was intended to provide high densities near the central area and thinning to Lower densities on the boundaries. This cannot be achieved with this proposal.

HAVE YOUR SAY IN THE FUTURE OF THE AREA

Many people will now aware that South Cambridgeshire District Council's Local Plan Plan Submission features proposals to build a new settlement of 3,500 houses on Bourn Airfield and 1,200 additional house in West Cambourne. Residents in Cambourne, and the other affected villages, need to understand the negative impact these developments will have on the area. The plans are not sustainable, have not been thought through properly and will seriously impact the quality of life for those of us living nearby.

The Stop Bourn Airfield Development (StopBAD) campaign has been set up to vigorously fight both these developments. We are concerned that 37% of all the houses built in South Cambridgeshire in the last 10 years have already been built in our area and that these proposals will create a ribbon of development along the A428, joining up villages and effectively creating a new town.

In addition, the housing plans make no sense as there are no accompanying plans to create new jobs in this area; indeed one of our only big employers, Papworth Hospital, is due to move to the new Biomedical Campus near Addenbrookes. The truth is that the substantial majority of future job growth is focused on Cambridge City and in areas to the the south and south east of the City. This means that the people living in these proposed new settlements will join the thousands of others commuting eastward on the A428. There are no plans for additional transport links and we estimate that the area will have to cope with an additional 6,000 journeys to work each day. Furthermore, we all know that our local schools, healthcare and other public services are already overloaded. 5000 new houses will place an intolerable burden on our local infrastructure. Many are also concerned about the effect

the developments could have on property prices in the area.

If you would like to make a representation, or comment on the Local Plan, you have until 14th October to do so. Response Forms are available at SCDC offices and online at www.stopbad.org.uk. In addition forms will be included in the SCDC Newsletter which will be distributed in early September.

The inclusion of these sites in the Proposed Submission Local Plan has caught us all by surprise; me included. Had I been a Councillor for longer than 2 years, and Cllr Hawkins for longer than 3 years we would have objected more vehemently earlier. All the indications were that other sites were far more likely to be included and I took that at face value. Several of the other Councillors who have been around for 10 years or more lobbied secretly for sites in their own Wards to be removed from the very beginning and they have been. Hindsight is a wonderful thing. I will not be caught out like this again.

The sites that were pulled will be a good starting point to prove that this plan is not sound or justified and I believe the StopBAD group are working on providing just this information along with suggestions on how to object. South Cambs have not made this very easy, but we can pull together and do it.

All this means that we now have to convince the Inspector that the process resulting in the decision to chose Bourn Airfield and West Cambourne was flawed – this is the important thing as 'not in my back yard' objections will not make it to the Inspector for consideration. All replies to this current consultation will be shown to the Inspector provided the replies object to the plan on the basis that it is not 'Sound' – that the content has not been positively prepared, the conclusions are not justified, it will not be effective and it is not consistent with national policy. But we have to say why we think this – help will be provided in due course.

If you haven't yet seen the extent of the proposed development, pop along to either Caxton Village Hall, (unstaffed display) on either Thursday 5 September 10am to 7.45pm or Friday 6 September 10am to 4pm; or Bourn – Church of St Helena & St Mary, Church Lane

(staffed event) on Friday 6 September 2.30pm to 7.30pm. I'm intending to be in Caxton from about 5pm on 5th and most of the day on 6th in Bourn to help with how to object.

<u>Camourne Kitchen</u> Layered Veg Terrine with Hot Crust Pastry

The beauty of this recipe is that there are no hard and fast rules about the filling - simply use whatever veggies you have/prefer and if like me you have a bit of ham or other left over meat you could throw that in to the mix too. The only rules are with the pastry and even here, please don't be put off making your own. It's so simple and unlike most pastries it's very forgiving and doesn't need such a gentle touch.

Ingredients:

- 1 medium onion
- 1 sweet potato
- 1 potato
- 1 tomato
- 1 courgette
- 3 medium mushrooms
- 1 sweet pepper
- 1 leek
- salt and pepper to season
- (slice all veggies thinly)

Pastry:

- 200g plain flour
- 300g strong white flour
- 2 tsp salt
- 1tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 2tsp black pepper
- 125g lard/shortening
- 25g butter

Method:

Roughly chop the onion and add to a pan of boiling water with the potatoes (just enough to cover them) and a tsp of salt. Add an additional knob of butter or drizzle of oil - it adds flavour and nie sheen. Cook for about 7-10 (depending on the size of potatoes) until they are cooked half way through. Remove the potatoes and set aside to cool before slicing thinly. Don't discard the water at this stage.

Keep 300ml of the potato and onion water and melt the lard and butter. Put all the pastry ingredients into a large mixing bowl. Once the water has come up to boil pour it immediately over the flour mix and use a fork to stir quickly to combine all the ingredients. Once it starts to from a dough like mixture it should be cool enough to handle. At the stage use your hand to knead the dough until all the water is absorbed and the mixture is coming clean away from the sides of the bowl.

I used a 10 inch loaf tin. You can either roll the pastry out onto a lightly floured surface of simply mould the pastry directly into the tin using the tips of your fingers to evenly spread the pastry over the tin keeping some aside for the top.

Once you are happy that the pastry is evenly spread start layering up the chopped veg seasoning lightly between each layer. Really squash it down (it will reduce slightly during the cooking). With the remaining pastry either with the flats of your hand or a rolling pin flatten it out and place ove the top of the pie. Push the pastry down the edge and press together the edge of the pie crimpling it together with the pastry bottom-this is rustic and doesn't need to be perfect just create a seal. Use a knife to create a few slots in the top. Important at this point to place in the fridge to let the pastry cool down and harden before placing on a preheated oven at 190 degrees celcius for about 40mins to an hour or until golden and crisp. Brush with milk or egg wash half way through to get a nice sheen if you desire.

This can be enjoyed hot or cold and is perfect for the last of our summer picnics. Get cooking and enjoy!

Stack fires can quickly spread and not only endanger people and livestock, but also life-long work on farms. Stacks burn very slowly meaning crews are committed for long periods of time, making them unavailable for other emergencies. Don't forget, many of the firefighters attending incidents like these in rural parts of our county are on-call personnel and their retention at a stack fire impacts directly upon business and services in their community.

We're working with police, neighbourhood watches and farm groups to drive stack arson down, including installing covert cameras to help bring those responsible to justice.

What can you do? We're urging residents and those passing through rural areas to keep a careful watch. Do you see someone acting suspiciously around stores of hay or straw? Is there an unusual vehicle near farm buildings? Become a community member of Arson Watch and keep an eye on stacks in your area.

Wildlife Review September 2013

A purple hairstreak butterfly was spotted on the edge of Oaks Wood recently. We have a record from a few years ago, so they may have been around for a while but as they spend most of their time around the tops of big oak trees it can be difficult to see them. The adults feed on honeydew produced by aphids and the caterpillars feed on oak flower

buds and young leaves. It was spotted on a regular butterfly transect that is walked through the nature reserve at Cambourne through the summer to monitor the butterfly population. It also feeds into national figures to look at changes in butterfly populations across the country.

I also had a report of a grizzled skipper butterfly on the southern boundary. They like the mix of short and long grasses with flowers for nectar that we maintain around the grasslands. Do let me know if you spot anything unusual around Cambourne Nature Reserve or in your gardens, especially if you have a photo.

Other wildlife surveys in Cambourne include monitoring the bats, amphibians and dragonflies, as well as the ground nesting birds which I have talked about before. Many of these are done by expert volunteers and we are very grateful for their time to help us learn more about the wildlife in Cambourne.

The protected species in Cambourne, including badgers, great crested newts, water voles and nesting birds, are monitored at any building sites by ecologists. If there is likely to be disturbance to any of these a licence has to be obtained from Natural England that will say how it must be done and what alternative habitat they must provide. If you are worried that any activities you see may be causing disturbance to wildlife, get in touch and I can check it is being done properly.

Swimming in the Lakes

Just a quick reminder in case the warm weather continues into September that swimming in the lakes in Cambourne is not safe. There can be lots of hidden debris under the water and any open cuts run the risk of letting in infections which can be in the water of relatively static lakes. They are not like clear mountain streams to swim in. If you see anyone swimming in the lakes, please report it to the police on 101 as lives could be at risk.

Underwing and a Prayer

Cadets and Staff from 2484 (Bassingbourn) Squadron and 2484 (Cambourne) Detached Flight visited RAF Waddington for their annual International Air show.

The weather was perfect for the day with a Great Flying Program planned, including the Chinook, Apache, Lynx, Merlin, Tornado, Typhoon 2000, E3 Sentry (the Airborne Early Warning And Control System) and the prestigious Royal Air Force Red Arrows with their usual stunning display. An emotional flypast was flown by the Lancaster flying as Thumper II (which replaced one of those lost on the Dams raid) and a 617Sq Tornado with its Tail art depicting the 70th Anniversary of the raid. There were also manyaircraft from other countries at the show including the French Patruille de France display team, the legendary Saab Viggen and it modern counterpart the Saab Grippen.

But for the cadets the icing on the cake was an under-wing tour of XH588 the only flying Vulcan in the world, kindly hosted by Bob Jackson from the Vulcan to the skies trust. Bob kindly donated a Vulcan Pin badge to all the cadets and staff. Shortly after the tour the mighty Vulcan announced it presence with a trademark roar as it thundered down the runway to start its display. It is fair to say that no other aircraft captured the attention of the 70,000+ crowd as did this Aircraft.

Sergeant (ATC) Rupert Sage said "A well hosted event, fabulous displays and a thoroughly enjoyable day."

Cadet Walls commented "That it was a fantastic show" and along with all the other cadets that went, has said he wants to go again next year. 2014 will see 2484(Bassingbourn) Squadron celebrate its 50th birthday.

Wysing Arts Centre

Artists are announced for Defining Pi; a an innovative new educational research programme using the Raspberry Pi computer

Wysing Arts Centre is collaborating with the Crucible network at the University of Cambridge on a new programme, Defining Pi, which aims to test the potential of the new Raspberry Pi computer and spread understanding in coding.

The five artists who have been selected to work on the programme, which runs thoughout August and September, are Richard Healy, Kate Owens, Rob Smith, Chooc Ly Tan and Dan Tombs. All the artists are embarking on learning new skills in computer programming in order to enable them to make new work with the Raspberry Pi. Rachel Drury, Defining Pi Project Manager says " Defining Pi aims to give artists the opportunity to develop new coding skills and produce new work using extraordinary technology that has yet to be tested in this way. It is an experiment that seeks to explore how artists adapt to programming and how it affects their artistic practice. We hope that the results, which will be shared online and through a series of talks and workshops in Cambridge during autumn 2013, will inspire other people of all ages to try it for themselves."

The Raspberry Pi was developed in Cambridge as a charitable, open source venture aimed at giving young people affordable equipment in which to develop computer programming skills. It has become a global phenomenon. The Raspberry Pi is providing a new generation of low cost and extremely portable equipment and alongside the computer itself a camera and sonic module have been developed.

The artists are working with the support of Dr. Sam Aaron, Research Associate at the University of Cambridge Computer Laboratory and the Raspberry Pi Foundation. All works and coding developed will be widely disseminated in order to share the experiences of the artists. This programme is being delivered in partnership with the Raspberry Pi Foundation and with funding from Arts Council England.

Dr. Aaron will also be running a Raspberry Pi workshop during Wysing's annual festival of art and music Space-Time as well as performing live coding with his band Meta-eX. More info on Wysing's website http://www.wysingartscentre.org/whats on/annual music festival

The Running Man Hints, Tips and Info for Runners From the Run Leader of Cambourne Runners – Run in England Group



Have last month's Athletics World Championships and the performance of athletes like Mo Farah left their legacy with you? Well if you have been inspired to get fit or try a new sport then why not give running a go? Not only is it a great exercise in its own right but it can also provide an excellent base fitness for a range of sports. Running will build a strong cardio vascular system while easing you into exercise and aid weight loss if required. It is the perfect exercise to fit around any time restraints, with the added bonus that you can do it for free and you don't have to be tied to a gym to take part. So what do you need to do to get started?

You can just pull on a pair of trainers, shorts and t-shirt and start running. But, if you want to take this seriously, it is worth investing in a good pair of running shoes. Get along to your local running shop and ask for a GAIT analysis to help select the perfect shoe for your running style. This is an investment that could protect you from injury and increase your running pleasure. Later you can look at buying some good lightweight technical running clothing too. When you start running don't try to run as fast and as far as possible right away, follow a plan that builds up slowly. Try to set out three days of the week that you can easily find half an hour to go out and run. Doing this will encourage you to keep to your running plan and not find excuses to avoid it.

If you are an absolute novice it is wise to set out on a walk/run programme, email me at: cambournerunners@gmail.com for a training plan. Following this schedule and you should find that in a couple of months you will be able to run 5km non-stop. As you increase your running time, search the web for dynamic and static stretches as this can improve your flexibility and reduce the risk of injury.

If you don't enjoy exercising alone, try to run with a friend or perhaps come along to one of our Saturday morning group runs (times listed below). So, take that inspiration, get out there, run and get fit. Remember, if unsure; please consult your doctor before undertaking any new exercise plan.
