# STOP B.A.D.

# Update

As 2014 gets well under way one could be forgiven for thinking that Bourn and the surrounding area represents some kind of El Dorado to housing developers, with new proposals seemingly popping up everywhere. A quick review of approved and proposed housing developments in our area now includes:2,200 proposed at West Cambourne, 3,500 proposed at Bourn Airfield, 3,000 approved in Madingley/Huntingdon Road, 250 on Cambourne Business Park, 4,000 proposed in

Cambourne North ("Harbourne" near Knapwell), 10,000 approved at Northstowe, 1,400 new homes at Loves Farm, St Neots, South Cambs District Council's own estimate for the amount of traffic generated by the Bourn Airfield development alone is an astounding 29,750 trips per day. [This figure is provided in their assessment of the Bourn Airfield site in the SHLAA (Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment).].

It is baffling to see how the planners can fudge the impact of this new development on traffic congestion, as thousands of people take to their cars to travel across the district to work. Many of you who currently travel into Cambridge, Royston or towards the A14 or M11 will already know how busy these routes are during the morning and evening rush hours. An increase in traffic levels to the extent expected

is clearly unsustainable - remember, that when the planners and developers have made their decisions and walked away, we will be living with the result.

If this concerns you, do make your opinions known to your elected parish and district councillors and to our local MP, Andrew Lansley. Email details are shown below.



# WHAT'S HAPPENING - KEY DATES~

11 February 2014 – 10am: Planning Policy and Localism Portfolio Holder Meeting at South Cambridgeshire District Council. The meeting will consider the issues raised in representations and assess whether the plan is ready for submission to the Secretary of State for examination. It may be necessary, as a result of representations received, to make minor changes to the plan. If anything more than minor changes need to be made to the plan it will require a further round of public consultation which would extend the Local Plan adoption timetable. If the Portfolio Holder (Cllr Pippa Corney) considers that the plan is ready to submit for examination, she will recommend this to a meeting of full Council on 13 March.

13 March 2014 - Full Council Meeting - submission of the Local Plan to the Council for agreement to progress to independent examination (a sort of public inquiry). Once the Local Plan is submitted, an independent planning inspector will be appointed to hold an examination to consider the 'soundness' of the Local Plan. This will include considering the representations received by the Council to the recent consultation and holding a series of public hearings where the Inspector considers that more information is needed. If the Council agrees in March 2014 to submit the Local Plan, it is anticipated that the examination hearings will be held in summer/autumn 2014.

You can support the campaign by attending both of these meetings and making your views known. In addition to these two 'target' meetings, we are currently writing to every South Cambridgeshire district and parish councillor to ensure that they understand why the local plan is poorly conceived and fails to meet local needs. We are meeting

with Andrew Lansley, MP, on 28 February and hoping to meet a number of the district councillors over the coming weeks. Follow our newsletters to see how our elected representatives respond.

# Parking on Verges and Paths

Parking is a major issue with a number of vehicles parking and driving on the verges in Cambourne. The damage this causes to the grass and kerbs, especially in the current spate of very wet weather, contributes to the delay in transferring the roads to the County Council. If the situation continues after the verges are transferred to the County and Parish Council it will be you as Council Tax payers of Cambourne who will have to pay for their repair. Parking on the verges causes inconvenience to neighbours and residents using the footpaths and is a safety issue for children.

# Post Office

We recently received the following press release from Everyone Active, agreed with the Post Office, regarding the possible siting of a new Post Office within Cambourne

"We can confirm that Cambourne Fitness and Sports Centre are investigating the opportunity to host a post office within the facility. Part of the application process is a public consultation which is hosted by the Post Office. As this has not taken place yet we cannot make any further statement as we do not want to jeopardise the protocol in making the application".

The Parish Council has been actively working with all parties to seek the return of the Post Office to Cambourne. The Parish Council did look into the possibility of locating the Post Office in The Hub but there was insufficient space to safely accommodate the fixtures and fittings required. There were also insufficient staff hours to cover the opening hours.





Children have used a variety of materials to make collages of the characters from the story.


"I like the brown fluffy bits", "We need orange for his eye" and "My hands are all sticky now"

# The Running Man

Hints, Tips and Info for Runners From the Run Leader of Cambourne Runners – Run in England Group



We've certainly had our fair share of wet weather and windy conditions to run in lately but winter training is a necessary evil especially if you are entering a spring distance event. It's been really good to see so many hardy souls hitting the roads and trails of Cambourne recently. I don't think anything can beat getting out there, running and experiencing the weather. Running machines just can't hold a candle to it!

If you are new to running this year and the bad weather hasn't put you off running perhaps consider investing in a GPS sports watch. Along with the basic stopwatch functions, if you need a challenge while running some have a virtual training partner function that allows you to 'race' against an opponent on your watch. Many allow you to set up interval training sessions and give reminders when you are running over or below your target pace. Additionally it is possible to see the route run, calories burnt, speeds and heart rates. This data can be uploaded to your PC and allows you to observe progress and improvement. GPS watches come in a variety of styles and prices, often the best deals are to be found online. Look at what you need from the watch, research and then decide on the right one for you.
