# Papworth Astronomy Club

Since I last wrote, the Papworth Astronomy Club has hosted two enjoyable talks. In March, Dr. Christopher Lester from the Cavendish Laboratories gave us the insider's view of the Large Hadron Collider. Cavendish Labs is jointly responsible for one of the key instruments and he was able to give us an update on results to date. In April, Rob Sandford from the University of Warwick presented a novice's guide to rocket science, following by a survey of new countries and commercial entities entering the space race.

On Wednesday 7th May, we have our final meeting of the 2014 spring season. The speaker will be Dr Robin Catchpole from the Institute of Astronomy in Cambridge. This will be our last meeting before the summer break. Activities will resume in August with the club picnic. We are also planning a special event to celebrate the club's 20th anniversary and more information will be provided once the details are confirmed.

As usual, the meeting will be at the Vinter Room, Papworth Everard at 7:30PM. The Vinter Room is at the entrance to Vinter Close (it is the building with the clock tower). I'm writing this on the Monday of Holy Week, but of course, you'll be reading this after we've celebrated the events of Good Friday and Easter Sunday. The truth is though that we have all been affected by these events, in fact, since Jesus died on the cross and rose from the dead the world has never been the same and people's lives have been changed not by a story but by a reality that happened all those years ago. Modern forms of education, welfare and healthcare all have their roots in the Christian Church and in fact in our own time the Christian Church is again rolling up its sleeves and getting involved in running food banks and debt advice projects and credit unions. Behind these projects is the message of Easter, where we celebrate that Jesus offers individuals, communities and nations a message of lifetransforming love. This love is real, it is lived out by the church through the type of projects I mentioned above. In John's Gospel (John 10.10) we read the words "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I {Jesus} have come that they may have life and have it to the full." And the 'they' in that verse is you and me, because it is us and our lives that God wants to reveal his love to, that love which death could not suppress, that literally burst forth from the grave. Perhaps you're asking big questions about life at the moment, questioning what Easter is really about and how that has any relevance to your life. Can I suggest that if that's you, the do get in touch with us or come along to Church one Sunday? You don't have to come with all the answers sown up in your head but if you have questions, come and explore what Easter means for you!

## RECIPE FOR MAY Baked Ricotta with a chilli kick

We should now well and truly be into the season where we crave lighter, brighter food and I think this recipe hits the brief amply. Served with a salad it'll make a great lunch or dinner or you could place amongst accompaniments for a barbecue if the weather allows. Oh and did I mention that it's incredibly simple to put together and is delicious – it shouldn't be this easy!!

#### Ingredients:

250g pack of ricotta 1 fresh chilli minced 1-2 cloves garlic thinly sliced 1 sprig fresh thyme 5 whole cloves (though you could sprinkle some ground clove) 1 cardamom pod of seeds 1 tsp cumin seeds Olive oil 50g finely grated parmesan cheese Salt and pepper **Method**:

Preheat the oven to 180°C/210°F. Lightly grease a

small ceramic dish or non-stick tin. Tip the ricotta out of the pack into the dish keeping it whole and intact. Stud the ricotta with the herbs and spices and scatter over the fresh chilli. Sprinkle over the parmesan cheese and drizzle with olive oil and season with the salt and pepper. (Take care not to use too much extra salt as the parmesan is quite salty already.) Place it in the oven for about 15 mins until the cheese has melted and is bubbling slightly. And that is it!

The great thing is (as I try to do with all my recipes) this really is a matter of personal taste and you can try using a range of different herbs and spices. Why not try removing the more savoury elements and add some chopped up dried fruit like raisins, apricots, sour cherries and a drizzle of honey for a sweet alternative. Serve with fresh fruit for a quick pud. Everything can be prepared ahead and popped in the fridge until ready to bake. Go on – give it a go! Louise Wilson

Please don't forget to cancel an appointment if you no longer need it! - On average 250 appointments are wasted each month due to patients failing to attend. Again, you can cancel by telephone, in person or online and the appointment can then be offered to someone else.

\*To use the online system you will need to come in person with photo ID to collect a username and password from reception (for those aged 16 years and under, we need to see parent/guardian's ID)

Please note: Nurse and Phlebotomy clinics are not available for online booking.


This event has been consistently successful, it is a very professional race with chip timing, great prizes and high quality support from trained marshals with the added attraction of an attractive off road and rural course.
