As a new member of the Cambourne community having recently moved from Hardwick, I'm hoping I can offer a fresh perspective on matters in Cambourne.

Presently employed locally within a business serving Cambourne, I have previously held high level including board reporting level within the retail sector and I believe both commitment to the community and my work experience would be of benefit to both the council and the community as a whole.

Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

At the annual meeting the Parish Council also elected a Chairman and Vice-Chairman for the forthcoming municipal year. Cllr Simon Crocker was elected as Chairman and Cllr Joe O'Dwyer as Vice-Chairman. Both are experienced councillors having served for a number of years. A statement from Cllr Crocker outlining the aims of the Parish Council going forward will appear in the next edition of the Crier.

Yellow Line Consultation outside Vine Inter-Church Primary School

The proposals were prepared in consultation with the Vine Inter Church Primary School and Taylor Wimpey to address The Parish Clerk will normally be in the office between 9.30 issues with child safety around the school. It was identified that unlike Monkfield Park Primary School the issue mainly arose at drop off and collection times. Therefore it was

agreed to carry out a consultation on the implementation of No Waiting restrictions at limited times.

The consultation on vellow lines outside the school has concluded. The results have been analysed and the comments summarised so the Parish Council could consider the results and agree a way forward. The Parish Council consid-

ered a report at the meeting held on the 20th May 2014. 69.4% of respondents were in agreement with the installation of Yellow Lines in the vicinity of the school.

The Council in making its decision put the safety of children attending the school as a paramount consideration. areas which required a traffic order to be put in place. Also taken into the impact of the restrictions and the following had been agreed:

- That two accessible parking bays would be installed on Brace Dein outside the show homes with two further accessible parking bays adjacent to the staff Car Park for dropping off and collecting.
- There are no markings on the school side of Brace Dein between the keep clear markings and the temporary zebra crossing so this can be used for dropping off and will have appropriate signage.
- The school would include an item in their newsletter regarding parking near the school.
- The village green car park would be marked with bays to ensure more effective use of the space.
- Additional signage to the car park would be provided.

The Parish Council is also carrying out the counts on Sterling Way to enable a request to be made to the County Council to install a crossing adjacent to Lancaster Gate. Taking all of the above into account the Parish Council agreed to request the County Council to implement traffic orders in line with the consultation. It was felt that the safety of children attending the school should be the paramount consideration.


