Why '19'?

Cambourne was built as a new settlement comprising three villages and the roads were initially all private roads.

The striking and unusual speed limit of 19mph was put in place across the developing community. It was remarked that drivers drove slower but this may have also been down to the particularly winding roads. This speed limit was something particular to Cambourne and as such seemed an ideal symbol/name for the community cafe.

As the roads were adopted these signs were taken down and some were donated to the church. Some were auctioned off but a couple were kept and these can now be seen outside the church during opening hours of the cafe.

Once again the community has produced a couple of new volunteer editors, next month we will hopefully welcome - Zsuzsa French and Kathy Jensen



Medical Practice Update.

After the report on last month's edition, representatives from Monkfield Medical Practice attended the August Council meeting with a view to explaining the staff funding position in light of the forthcoming planned extension to the building. Of the 9569 registered patients, less than 5% are over the age of 65. The weighting of the current funding formula is geared toward older populations.

A proposed change to the funding regimen could see the Medical Practice's funding cut by as much as 50%. The Parish Council will offer support and apply pressure where necessary as developments come to light.

Development Update.

As of August 2014 Cambourne has 3632 occupied homes. The figures breakdown as follows: 1811 in Great Cambourne, 1005 in Upper Cambourne and 816 in Lower Cambourne.

Of the 950 extra homes approved in 2011, approximately one third are occupied.

Sports and Social Club.

The Sports and Social Club, currently hosted in the Sports Pavilion on Back Lane, closed on August 30th. The Parish Council would like to express its thanks to those that ran it.

The Sports Pavilion is owned and licensed by the Parish Council and will remain available to residents and community groups alike as a venue for functions.

FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE

HARVEST is upon us and we're calling on local residents to help our fight against straw stack arson.

Stack fires can quickly spread and not only endanger people and livestock, but also life-long work on farms. Stacks burn very slowly meaning crews are committed for long periods of time, making them unavailable for other emergencies. Don't forget, many of firefighters attending incidents like these in rural parts of our county are on-call personnel and their retention at a stack fire impacts directly upon business and services in their community.

What can you do? We're urging residents and those passing through rural areas to keep a careful watch. Do you see someone acting suspiciously around stores of hay or straw? Is there an unusual vehicle near farm buildings? Become a community member of Arson Watch and keep an eye on stacks in your area. Report suspicious activity to police on 101 and dial 999 if you see a stack fire.



Wildlife Review



September 2014

July and August have been a fantastic months for dragonflies around Cambourne. I have seen lots swarming over the lakes and ponds. They will have been busy laying eggs in the water ready to hatch out into the next generation of flying jewels. They will overwinter as either eggs or larvae depending on the species.

Birds become much quieter at this time of year as they are moulting after their breeding season is over and getting new feathers ready for the cooler months ahead. They don't need to defend territories or attract mates anymore, and they would rather not attract too much attention while they are not able to fly so well, and so the woods and hedgerows seem much quieter for a while.



As autumn approaches, keep an eye out for interesting fungi in the woods. Send me a photo if you need help identifying any that you see, but please don't

pick them as many are poisonous.



South Cambridgeshire Local Plan Examination - Pre-Hearing Meeting



In April we informed you that we had submitted the South Cambridgeshire Local Plan to the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government for examination. Information on the Inspector and the examination process was also enclosed with that letter.

The next stage is for the Inspector who is carrying out the Examination to hold a Pre-Hearing Meeting. This meeting will focus on the administrative procedures for the examinations into the Local Plans for South Cambridgeshire and Cambridge. It will not address any issues raised in representations. The start date of the hearing sessions will be confirmed at the Pre-Hearing Meeting but the Inspector has indicated that they are not likely to start before mid October 2014. "Matters and Issues for Examination" will be issued before the hearing and published on the Council's website.

The Pre Hearing Meeting will start promptly at 2pm on Thursday 11th September 2014 at the Guildhall, Market Square, Cambridge CB2 3QJ.

Lake Ewart is Cambourne's only fishable lake with an average depth of 4 ½ ft. Located in Cambourne Country Park there are 31 marked pegs to fish from. It is stocked with Rudd, Roach, Chub, Bream, Perch, Barbel, and also Carp of mirror, common and crucian varieties. The largest reported Carp so far has weighed in at 19lb. Float, leger, pole, method and fly fishing techniques are welcome.
