Remembrance Day Parade

Cambourne Parish Council would like to extend their congratulations to everyone involved in the Remembrance Day Parade and celebrations. It is hoped that this event will become part of Cambourne's annual calendar with even more of the uniformed groups taking part next year.

Anglian Water

This Christmas, and into next year, Cambourne Parish Council continues to work with Anglian Water and other organisations on a long term initiative to encourage residents to think about what they put down their toilets and sinks to help reduce sewer pump and pipe blockages and protect the environment.

A network of pumping stations takes sewage safely away from homes and businesses in Cambourne. However the pumps were repeatedly blocked by household waste such as baby, make-up and household cleaning wipes which should be binned, not flushed. This waste stops sewer pumps from working effectively which increases the risk of sewage flooding back into homes and causing pollution and nasty smells.

Following a significant investment to resolve historical issues at the main pumping station, Anglian Water launched a community partnership working with Cambourne Parish Council to help cascade out long term awareness. Initiatives over the first 16 months have included 'do not flush' posters in community buildings, a letter to all residents jointly sent from Anglian Water and Cambourne Parish Council highlighting the issues of blocked pumps and pipes and industry-leading point of sale notices in Morrisons to remind shoppers buying cooking oil and wipes to dispose of the waste correctly. The good news is that, as a result of the partnership work, there has been a dramatic reduction in the number of reactive pumping station jobs to fix blocked pumps. Previously there were 90 blockages a year, around two a week, and in the first 12 months of the campaign there were 22 blockages in the year, less than two a month, and no sewer flooding incidents. **Allotments**

There are currently a number of vacant allotment plots at the Brace Dein Allotment site in Upper Cambourne. The plots cost £20 pa.for a full plot (approximately 25m X 5m) and £10pa for a half plot (approximately 12.5m X 5m). Upper Cambourne Play Area Extension

The works to the extension of the Upper Cambourne are now complete. In order to allow the turf to fully settle and due to the fact that the water play feature will not be operational over the wintern until the spring. The opening has been scheduled for the week beginning 23rd March 2014 and until this time the perimeter fencing will remain in place.

Christmas Tree Recycling

As in previous years there will be a Christmas Tree recycling point created on the land adjacent to The Hub. Christmas Trees may be left here from Tuesday 6th January 2015 until Sunday 18th
