At the December meeting, Cllrs George Cooper and Ruth Betson were co-opted onto the Parish Council. The Parish Council now once again stands at its full complement of 13 Cllrs. We welcome George and Ruth to the team and look forward to working with them in the future.

A look back at 2014

The start of the New Year is a good time to reflect back on the work of the Parish Council during 2014. Some of the work undertaken includes:

Public open spaces and play areas

Repairs were been undertaken to equipment in the Great Cambourne Play area and the Eco Park Play Area has been resurfaced and new equipment added.

Traffic matters

Following a public consultation yellow lines have been installed on Brace Dein and Lancaster Gate in the vicinity of the Vine School. The yellow lines were installed following concerns regarding children's safety during school drop off and collection times in consultation with the Vine School and the developers. The Parish Council has also worked with the developers and Cambridgeshire County Council to progress the programme of road adoptions in Cambourne.

Events

The Parish Council once again organised successful visits from both the Fun Fair and the Circus and has supported the BBQ Feast, Fireworks and Christmas Lights Switch On events.

In 2014 the Parish Council took on an Apprentice Groundsman and an Apprentice Office Administrator. Both roles have recognised qualification whilst earning with the potential for a full time role at the end of the apprenticeship period. The staff continue to update and enhance their skills by attending training courses and conferences.

Volunteers

In 2014 the Parish Council began a Volunteer Litter Picking Scheme in response to requests from members of the public. Volunteers are asked to read and sign a risk assessment and provided with a hi vis vest, a litter grabber and protective gloves. The scheme currently has 10 volunteers who litter pick in various areas of Cambourne. The introduction of the scheme has seen a dramatic reduction in the litter around Cambourne and has freed up the grounds staff time to focus on other tasks. 

Our job is to make sure you have a say when important decisions are made about local health and care services. We are interested in any recent experiences you have of local health or care services that you are happy to share with us.

The big health story in the news this new year is about pressures on our local hospitals. We know that these are linked to other issues like getting to see a GP when you need to and getting care in place when you are coming home from hospital. We have two new projects which will look at some of these issues from a different viewpoint.

In our First Steps to Health project we want to find out about the first thing you would do to solve different health issues. Would you work it out yourself, see a pharmacist, call NHS 111 or see your GP? Knowing what you do can help our local GP practices and the people who make decisions about local health services plan better care. Please do take part in our survey either on our website or by contacting our office.

We also need you to help us develop our local Care Home project. We want to use our statutory duty to enter and view local care homes. We have a legal right to visit places that provide public health or care services, to see what kind of care they are providing. We need to recruit volunteers to be authorised representatives. Your role will be to go into local care homes and talk to the people there about the care being provided. This might include talking to residents, their relatives, friends and care home staff. You will get lots of training and support.

Do you have any recent experience of a local care home, or do you know someone who has? Please tell us about it. We will use what you tell us to plan which homes we will visit and what to look at. We are also talking to the County Council and the Care Quality Commission, to help us plan where we should visit.

New Foodbank Opening in Cambourne

New Foodbank Distribution Centre for Cambourne.

From 5 February Cambourne will have its own foodbank distribution centre. Based at The Ark it is being opened with the strong support of Cambourne Church as part of the Cambridge City Foodbank (CCFb). The Ark will be CCFb's seventh food distribution centre but is the first to be opened outside the city.

The Ark will be open every Thursday between 10.00 and 12.00 to distribute food to anyone with a CCFb voucher. Vouchers can be obtained locally through Children and Young People's Services and the Housing Benefits section of SDCD in Sackville House, The Vine Primary School, Papworth's Children's Centre and Bedfordshire Pilgrim Housing Trust. A wide range of other agencies such as Citizens Advice Bureau, Centre 33, Cambridge Women's Resources Centre, social services, some medical centres and many others also hold vouchers.

Clients receive 3-days food provision for each member of their household in exchange for a voucher and may have up to 3 vouchers in a 6-month period. Volunteers from Cambourne will be running the centre to provide a warm welcome to clients.


My career in publishing has spanned newspapers, books, magazines and the web; I've

There will be a few bits of work happening in Cambourne over the next two months. The two meadows on the south and

east boundaries are being re-fenced. The fences here are coming to the end of their life and need replacing so that we can continue to use grazing to maintain the meadow habitats. The bridleway that goes through skylark meadow will be separated from the grazed area, so there will no longer be gates to go through when sheep are grazing. Please be careful when walking, cycling or riding in this area while the work is being carried out by our contractor.

Wildlife Trust staff will be laying part of the hedge along Crow Dene bridleway. We have done sections of this in the past but not for a few years, so it will be nice to get back to this traditional craft again. This is an important technique for renewing hedges to give thicker growth at the base and by laying staggered sections there will always be hedge at different heights and ages to provide suitable conditions for a variety of different wildlife.

We will be leaving the bits of bramble and shrub we cut out of the hedge in piles alongside the bridleway while

we work, but will return with a chipper once we have finished laying to get rid of it all.



Lake Ewart is Cambourne's only fishable lake with an average depth of 4 ½ ft. Located in Cambourne Country Park there are 31 marked pegs to fish from. It is stocked with Rudd, Roach, Chub, Bream, Perch, Barbel, and also Carp of mirror, common and crucian varieties. The largest reported Carp so far has weighed in at 19lb. Float, leger, pole, method and fly fishing techniques are welcome.
