

In memory of Roger Hume

Roger Hume passed from this life on 2 February 2015.

Roger was a much loved and respected figure. For even if you did not agree with him, no one could doubt his dedication to this community.

From the outset of his time in this place he was involved. Welcoming new folks, assisting the community and checking up to see promises were fulfilled by developers. I could go on and on about how instrumental he was in shaping this community and all that he has accomplished, which includes this very publication. But a man is more than the sum of his accomplishments, greater

than his tasks or achievements. And frankly I am not sure he would want a huge deal made of what he has done, as really the work was just a by-product of who he was.

Roger grew up in a generation which got things done because they needed doing, rather than whine about it for ages or sit in a circle and discuss your feelings about a difficulty. He simply got stuck in and sorted it out then moved on. He was not looking for fanfare or publicity and although he got a fair amount, it was not his motivation. His involvement was far beyond mere necessity and showed a caring that is rare in what some would call a public figure. As I contemplate this it reminds me of a Bible verse.

Philippians 2:20 For I have no man likeminded, who will naturally care for your state.

In the context of service for this community, I know of no other who has done more naturally, voluntarily and without any larger agenda, but the fact that the work was there, than Roger. In an excerpt from the e-book of Cambourne Roger himself said: "Cambourne has achieved a magnificent community which I am proud to have played a small part in."

Hundreds of people have conveyed their sentiments about his life and the great impact he had upon their lives and upon this community. One message said that Roger told them he was never too busy for anything Cambourne.



IF YOU HAVE DIFFICULTY GETTING AROUND - UNABLE TO USE A BUS AND NO ACCESS TO A CAR

Taxi Card - a little used benefit to Cambourne residents is the developer-funded taxi card scheme. It gives access to a taxi at 30 per cent of the normal fare. Buying vouchers in advance, they are used in the same way as cash.

The taxi company get the full fare later, not all taxis are able to offer the service but you will get a list of participating companies. Typical fares in brackets: Histon £22.00 (£6.60), Cambridge £20.00 to £25.00 (£6 to £7.50) (depending where), Barton = £20.00 (£6), St Neots £18.00 to £25.00, (£5.40 to £7.50) (depending where), Addenbrooke's £25.00 (£7.50). SKATEPARK EXTENSION

Back in June 2013 the Parish Council was approached by a group of local young people, led by Ben Keppie, who use the skatepark, requesting that the Council consider building an extension.

The council were impressed by their initiative and have worked with them to bring this about. As well as funding from the Parish Council, a grant of £20,000 was obtained from the Amey Cespa Community Fund and a further £1,500 grant from the South Cambs District Council Community Chest fund. The Amey Cespa Community Fund award panel were impressed by the involvement of the young people who had put together a presentation explaining why the extension was necessary, Ben also wrote to Andrew Lansley MP who gave his support to the grant application.

The equipment, chosen and sourced by the young people, has just been installed and we are hosting an Opening Ceremony on Saturday 21st March 2015 starting at 2.30pm. Details are to be finalised but it is hoped that there will be a BBQ and a display of skateboarding. Everyone is welcome. APPOINTMENT BOOKING

Routine/Non Urgent appointments with a GP or Nurse Practitioner are pre bookable and can be booked by phone, in person or online*.

Requests for on the day appointments (which should be requested by 11am) will be allocated by the Duty Doctor after they have carried out a telephone triage to assess the urgency of the problem. Please only use this service if you feel that your condition cannot wait until the next available appointment.

*to use the online booking system you will need to come in person with photo ID to collect a username and password from the practice (for those patients aged 16 years and under, we need to see parent/guardian ID). This is to ensure we issue the correct log in details to the correct patient thus protecting your medical records.

Appointments for the following <u>cannot</u> be booked online: Nurse, Phlebotomy (Blood Tests), Midwife, Baby Immunisations, Clinical Pharmacist.

ONE APPOINTMENT - ONE PATIENT

Our clinicians are often asked if they can 'take a quick look' at another family member during an appointment. This results in the consultation taking much longer than planned and long waits for other patients. Please remember that an appointment is only for the patient in whose name it has been booked – if more than one family member is

unwell, you will need to book a separate appointment for each of them.

The NHS Friends and Family Test

The NHS Friends and Family Test is a way of gathering your feedback so we can continually review our service. It is based on one simple question "How likely are you to recommend our GP practice to friends and family if they needed similar care?" with five possible responses ranging from 'Extremely likely' to 'Extremely Unlikely'. There is also space for you to add a comment to explain your answer. Your feedback will help us learn more about what you think about your experience – what you like and what you think we could improve. The feedback forms are available in reception with a box to post it in once completed. Data will be published monthly on our website and within the practice. We are pleased to report that the results for January were very positive! Out of 25 completed responses, 24 answered 'Extremely Likely' or 'Likely' to the question, with only one negative response. There were also some very kind and positive comments about the practice which have been passed on to all staff. We hope that the coming months remain as positive and of course will aim to address any constructive feedback received.

The practice will be closed from 1pm on Thursday 19th March for Clinical Governance Training. We will re-open as usual on Friday morning. If you require urgent medical care during this time, please call the surgery number and you will be automatically diverted to the out-of-hours service.

Preparing for Easter - Reflections for Lent

The 40 days of Lenten prayer, fasting and giving to the poor are designed to turn our hearts to God and to the needs of others especially the weakest around us.

Pope Frances encourages us to rediscover the joy of the Gospel, which will help us to experience a personal encounter with Jesus by reflecting on his words and actions. Above all, are our actions a witness to the true spirit of Christianity?

During Lent we read how Peter, James and John had their special encounter with Jesus when they took time out of their daily concerns. Just as we arrange to meet a friend to discuss their joys and sorrows, so we can create time and space to meet Jesus even in those times when we can't get to church.

During this period we also read about how Jesus was tempted to make himself special, how to lord it over others but chose the path of humility. Are we moving in the footsteps of Jesus or are we letting the quest for power, prestige, pleasure and

economic security stop us from fulfilling our mission? Fasting is a way of discovering what we really need so that our appetites don't just lead us to consume ever more.

During the third Sunday of Lent the Gospel invites us to stand with Jesus as he speaks to a woman who was seen by many as a 'bad' person. In the same way Jesus calls us to make our community a place of welcome and inclusion so that people can experience



the joy of the gospel in their lives. Giving to the poor has to go beyond giving a pound to the homeless person so they'll go away. Being a disciple means being constantly ready to bring the love of Jesus to others, and this can happen unexpectedly and in any place: on the street, in a city square, during work, on a journey. It may be a kind smile, a word of encouragement or simply taking the time to listen!

way to Bramley Barn to create our very own clay tile using our drawings to help us. After the tiles had dried overnight, we each had a unique souvenir to take home! *Activity* 3

Toni, one of the Burwell staff-led this session with lots of different games; there was the sky eye walk, where we used mirrors to explore the sky and trees around the grounds. We also made use of the Burwell herb garden to create our very own smelly cocktails; some of them were particularly potent! After this there was still time to play musical trees in the orchard. *Activity 4:*

Mrs McBride and Mrs Jones ran their own eight-point compass activity, using a compass to navigate around the gardens to find carefully hidden clues. This was quite challenging but also very rewarding.

Delicious food throughout the day included a tasty roast dinner and later on homemade fish fingers! *Evening activities:*

The lounge was transformed into the Burwell Bingo Hall and the winners were Asha, Tye and Jason.

Of day three's activities, the Burwell Challenge was a favourite, where you had an obstacle course to complete, blindfolded, whilst the rest played Smugglers Run then we swapped over. Our final activity was Burwell Fox which was like a giant game of hide and seek while completing a quiz!

Polar explorers take over Jeavons Wood

The start to 2015 has been a busy one for the children at Jeavons Wood. In particular the children in Key Stage One have been excited by starting their new year with our 'Frozen' topic.

This term we have turned our role play area in our classrooms into a 'Polar Explorers Base Camp' and, having found out from the children what they wanted to learn, planned a jam packed topic!

The spell of cold, wintery weather was certainly useful in helping the children to find out more about what it would be like to live in the Arctic and Antarctic.

The children have loved science this half term! We have been busy investigating with ice and hot chocolate. They have received lots of letters from the Inuit people and explorers in the Polar Regions asking for their help in finding out the answers to the questions 'What is the best way to keep hot chocolate hot?' and 'How can we stop our igloos from melting?' To find out these answers the children have carried our science investigations – they are getting really good at predicting and carrying out fair tests.

In geography we have been working on our map skills and planning our route to Antarctica.

We have been thinking about what items we would pack in our suitcases if we were to go on an expedition to the Polar





Regions and have located where hot and cold places are on a world map.

The sprinkling of snow we have had has been a great addition to our topic! The children loved wrapping up warm in their coats, gloves, scarves and snow boots and playing on our school field in the snow. We used the winter weather as inspiration for our own poetry and story writing. It definitely helped the children to create some fantastic descriptions of cold, blistery conditions. We are hoping to share our own 'Lost and Found' stories with the residents of Cambourne when we take a visit to our local library.

We are looking forward to developing our knowledge of the Polar Regions further next half term where we will be learning about the famous explorer, Captain Scott as well as finding out about how certain animals are adapted to the cold, harsh environments of the Polar Regions.




