### Skatepark extension officially opened

Saturday 21 March 2015 saw the official opening of the Cambourne Skatepark Extension, a journey that began 21 months ago in June 2013.

Led by Ben Keppie, a group of local skateboarders set up a Facebook page and petition, wrote to the Cambridge News, who featured them equipment from the AmeyCepsa in an article and to the Parish Council, requesting that consideration be given to extending the existing Skatepark. Impressed by their initiative the Parish Council decided to work with them on the project, subject to grant funding being obtained in order to support the cost.

Ben continued to work on the project, sourcing the equipment, producing reports and writing to the Rt. Hon. Andrew Lansley MP requesting support for the grant application. In September 2014 the

Parish Council was awarded grant of £15.000 towards the cost of the Community Fund.

The AmeyCespa Community Fund awards grants to support community, environmental and heritage projects run by non-profit organisations based in Cambridgeshire, within 10 miles of a landfill site. The fund is managed by Cambridgeshire Community Foundation and is part of a voluntary environmental tax credit scheme called the Landfill Communities Fund. A grant of £1,500 was also awarded by the South Cambridgeshire District Council's Community Chest Fund.

A new tarmac base was laid by D. A. Cant and the equipment, two half pipes, two grind boxes and a grind rail was installed in February 2015. Taylor Wimpey East Anglia generously assisted by unloading the equipment from the container it arrived in from America.

The official opening was attended by a large number of the local skating fraternity, invited guests and the Rt. Hon. Andrew Lansley MP who cut the ribbon with Ben Keppie. A barbecue was provided by the Parish Council and enjoyed by all whilst watching demonstrations of the art of skateboarding.

### TAXI CARD SCHEME

If you have difficulty getting around, are unable to take a bus and have no access to a car, the developer-funded Taxi Card scheme is a little used benefit to Cambourne residents. It gives access to a taxi at 30 per cent of the normal fare. Buying vouchers in advance, they are used in the same way as cash. The taxi company get the full fare later. Not all taxis are able to offer the service but you can get a list of participating companies.

Typical fares in brackets: Histon £22 (£6.60) / Cambridge £20-25 (£6-7.50), Barton £20 (£6), St Neots £18-25 (£5.40-7.50), Addenbrooke's £25 (£7.50).

and will give the nominee a chance to win exciting prizes, including £500 towards a well-deserved holiday.







### **Epic Journeys**

A few weeks ago, I went with a group of friends to watch the film Selma. The film depicts the true story of a dramatic three month period in America's deep south. Centering on the town of Selma, Alabama, the film chronicles Dr. Martin Luther King's non-violent campaign to secure equal voting rights in the face of violent opposition. The film invites us to follow two marches planned from Selma to Montgomery, over the Edmund Pettus Bridge, one ended in extreme violence perpetrated by the state troopers, the other saw the marchers crossing the bridge and continuing their march to Montgomery. These three months culminated in President Hoover signing into law the Voting Rights Act of 1965.

Jesus too undertook an epic journey from Palm Sunday when he entered Jerusalem, to the courts of Pilate where he was flogged by soldiers, to rejection by the crowds who had been stirred up by the Jewish authorities to demand Jesus' death. And then Jesus is crucified on the heights of Golgotha and as the crowds dispersed, this epic journey from Jerusalem to Golgotha must have been deemed a failure. But the story is not over - the journey continues, as the tomb in which Jesus had been laid is found empty. Suddenly Jesus begins to appear to people and word spreads that Jesus is alive, He has triumphed death and risen!

What is significant about this journey, is that it has no end point, Jesus rose and revealed himself to his followers and has been revealing himself to people ever since that first Easter. In encountering Jesus ordinary people, like you and me, find love, grace and forgiveness in a life transforming way - come and celebrate that reality this Easter.







Dear Friends,

This month we will be celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ. This year that is on 5 April. Now some of you might think what is the big deal. Some guy was unjustly accused and crucified by the Romans in Jerusalem. The Romans crucified a lot of people in Jerusalem.

One of the big differences is everyone else the Romans crucified and killed stayed dead, Christ did not. Now some say oh he didn't really die, just passed out but you need to know something about soldiers especially the Roman ones. They were well trained and disciplined. If they certified someone as dead they were dead and Jesus had been certified dead by a centurion, a professional officer and reported this to

Pilate, the governor and you don't lie to him, or the penalty is death.

Some say oh his body was stolen whilst the guards slept but, you also don't fall asleep on guard duty or the penalty is death. Do you see a pattern here? There was obedience and efficiency or you would be killed. So, when they said he was dead, he was dead. He died in our place, for you and me because of our sin.

The Bible is clear about that in John 1:29 The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world. And in Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

You see the lamb was sacrificed to pay the price for sin so that we would not have to, and we simply need to

receive him to accept that payment on our behalf. Remember the resurrection is vital as it shows his victory over sin and death.

So, what do we need to do about this? The bible says in Romans 10:9 That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead. thou shalt be saved. 10 For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

In science we have been considering how materials change form, and whether or not those changes are reversible. We have conducted different investigations to test out our ideas, and we used lots of technical vocabulary and even some particle theory along the way!

Moving onto this half term our topic has been Space! You may have seen some flying objects round the sky near our school the other day? Well if you did these were rockets and had been launched by us! We made our very own foot pump rockets! Firstly the children were put into design teams to design an aerodynamic rocket which would fly through the sky, the children had to think carefully about the size and

what would make a successful rocket! After designing their rockets the children then took to construction. After a few lessons we were finally ready to launch!

This was a fantastic event, we had children getting very wet, questioning why their rocket wouldn't launch and the winning team celebrating with their rocket reaching a staggering 23 metres!!

In English the children have really enjoyed finding out about different Scientists and their theories on how the Universe began! We have also enjoyed sharing our own personal views and opinions on this. This has allowed us to gain lots of knowledge in order to write an explanation text on an aspect of Space! There is a wide range of different texts, including: how stars are formed? What is a black hole? How did the Universe begin? Why is Mercury blue? You are sure to find out a thing or two by reading them! We were all really excited about Friday's solar eclipse and had a whole morning of fun activities based on it.





# Superheroes team up with parents at the Blue School



We have had a busy term and it certainly finished on a high with our Year 1 and 2 ending their Superheroes topic with an opportunity for parents to come in and work alongside the children.

The children were very excited and keen to show off what they had been working on. We shared the Superhero stories we have written full of danger, excitement, evil villains and perilous escapes! We also created some fantastic artwork together, Superhero pictures created in the style of Pop-Artist Roy Lichtenstein. It was wonderful to see the children working in collaboration with their parents to create these pieces.

Our next topic is called 'Be Wild' - including a trip to Bewilderwood in Norfolk - and based around the stories featuring the characters that live there.

Our Reception classes have enjoyed learning about the different habitats and ecosystems that exist around the world. Most exciting perhaps were 'Jungles

and Rainforests' and 'Under the Sea' where they developed their own stories based on 'Monkey Puzzle' with added characters and situations. They were also very excited to have a visit from the Cambridge University Department of Zoology, who came and discussed 'Marvellous Molluscs'! As part of their visit, the children were sent out to collect snail shells which will form part of a permanent collection at the museum itself!

A few updates concerning the school as a whole; we have recently changed our name to 'Hardwick and Cambourne Community Primary School' as this clearly represents the communities with which we serve and work. We feel we are in a privileged position to have such strong links in these two great villages, and look forward to continuing to work within and across both communities.

Construction for the new school build is going very well so far, and all is on

schedule for a handover during the summer holidays. We are busy ordering furniture and equipment so we have everything we need for September when we can welcome all the children to their new classrooms. The second phase of the project is being brought forward a year, so the builders will still be on site for a while, but by this time next year we will hopefully have a completed building that we can grow into over the next 3 years until we are finally full!

We are also very pleased to announce that we will be opening up a new nursery class operating from the new building in September. This will initially offer spaces for up to 26 3-4 year olds for mornings only Monday-Friday, but we are planning to extend this provision into afternoons too in the coming terms. boys can wear tailored shorts next term. We're looking forward to welcoming our next cohort of students in September and Year 6 pupils will be taking part in a range of induction events next term.



Just 20 minutes north along the A1198 lies an old gravel pit site that the Wildlife Trust plans to transform into a stunning nature reserve that will benefit both wildlife and people. Godmanchester Nature Reserve was managed by Lafarge Aggregates until 2012, when the Wildlife Trust took over the lease. The reserve is a fantastic site with a wide range of habitats - lakes, meadows, reedbed,

woodland - and very popular with birdwatchers

conservation mornings and family activities at the site and have made small improvements recently such as clearing scrub and putting in some new gates, and are fundraising for the cost of its purchase and larger-scale improvements such as clearing islands, digging scrapes for wildfowl, which will cost us £400,000 over the next three years. ### Ground Nesting Birds (late March to August)

Now is the time when birds are making their nests and starting to raise chicks. Not all birds do this up in trees, many species, such as wrens and dunnocks nest quite low down in

shrubby vegetation and some species nest on the ground. We are lucky to have a good population of some of the species that do this in Cambourne, such as the skylarks which you will have heard singing above Crow Hill and other parts of the Nature Reserve. Please help these birds to nest successfully and continue to treat us with their song by keeping out of the long grass areas during nesting season and keeping dogs under close control, preferably on a lead if it won't stay on the path with you.
