

Who will get your vote? Gavin Clayton (Labour), Des O'Brien (Conservative) or Marcus Pitcaithly (Green)?

ON 7 MAY, Cambourne residents will be voting for a district councillor for South Cambridgeshire District Council. Here, the three local candiates pitch for your vote:

Gavin Clayton (Labour Party)

CRIER COMMUNITY FUND

Cambourne Community Car Scheme

The community car scheme provides door to door transport for people who cannot make the journey by bus or do not have access to a car. We provide a 7 day a week service for residents of Cambourne, Caxton and Papworth.



To request transport please either:

Send an email to <u>cambournecommunitycarscheme@gmail.com</u> or phone the car scheme mobile on 07858 933230. If there is no response leave your number & we will return your call.

The service is run by local volunteers & we cannot guarantee to meet all requests so please give as much notice as possible. Our aim is to give preference to essential visits to Hospital, Doctors, Dentists & Opticians but we also cater for visits to social clubs. Typical costs for journeys from Cambourne are: Addenbrookes £9, and \$t Neots £6.60. Local trips within Cambourne are £2.50. We will normally wait for up to one hour at your destination but this can be extended by agreement. Please also advise if you need to take a walking aid. *Joint Co-ordinators Paul Belo/ Eric Cawkill*

TAXI CARD SCHEME

If you have difficulty getting around, are unable to take a bus and have no access to a car, the Taxi Card scheme is a benefit to Cambourne residents. It gives access to a taxi at 30 per cent of the normal fare. Buying vouchers in advance, they are used in the same way as cash. The taxi company get the full fare later. Not all taxis are able to offer the service but you can get a list of participating companies.

Typical fares in brackets: Histon £22 (£6.60) / Cambridge £20-25 (£6-7.50), Barton £20 (£6), St Neots £18-25 (£5.40-7.50), Addenbrooke's £25 (£7.50).

Annual Parish Meeting

May 2015

Cambourne Parish Council will be hosting its Annual Parish Meeting on Tuesday 5 May 2015. The Annual Parish Meeting is a meeting that town and Parish Councils are required to hold as part of their accountability to the local electorate.

The meeting is open to anyone but only electorate of Cambourne may participate by asking questions and raising issues with the Parish Council. The Parish Council and its Committees will present reports on their activities over the last 12 months and local organisations, clubs and societies are invited to present reports on their activities.

Police and Crime Commissioner Sir Graham Bright will be in attendance to answer any questions you may have. The meeting will take place in The Hub Community Centre starting at 7.30pm, please do come along.

Dog fouling

The Parish Office continues to be inundated with complaints regarding the persistent problem of irresponsible dog owners. Dog fouling on the sports pitches is a major cause for concerns. Fouling on the pitches is a real health risk to those playing on the pitches, both children and adults alike.

The sports pitches are not a suitable area to exercise dogs; there are many far more suitable open spaces around Cambourne. Do not allow your dog on to the pitches. Another area that we receive regular complaints about is footpaths that are used by parents on the school run.

The number of children using these paths means that dog mess often finds its way into the schools, clearly another health risk. More dog bins have been provided, please be a responsible dog owner and bag it and bin it!

Household rubbish

Recently a Cambourne resident has been issued with a fixed penalty fine of £75 by the South Cambs District Council Environmental Health Officers for the placing of household waste in and adjacent to a public bin. Please note that it is an offence and any occurrences will be reported.

Allotments

We have few allotment plots at the Brace Dein allotment site in Upper Cambourne available to rent. The full plots are approximately 25m x 5m at a cost of £20 per year and the half plots are approximately 12.5m X 5m at a cost of £10 per year.

POLICE CONTACT POINT LAUNCHED

Cambourne Police Station has announced the launch of a new Police Contact Point at Morrisons. This contact point will become a regular fortnightly feature (forthcoming dates: Saturday 2 May, Wednesday 13 May, Wednesday 27 May, Friday 12 June and Friday 26 June). Other dates will be posted via the e-cops website, the Cambourne Forum and Cambourne Crier and shown on the Contact Point.

The Contact Point will be staffed by one of the local officers, who can give advice or take details of local incidents. The officers will also be able to give information on crime prevention and Operation Oakland. Window and shed alarms will be available as will a limited amount of SmartWater. When not staffed, post cards are available for you to write your details for later contact by an officer. The cards can be left in the post box at the Contact point.

TAKE IT TO THE TIP - DON'T BURN IT

Spring is here and lots of households are clearing out and sprucing up the garden. The majority of Cambridgeshire's residents take extra rubbish and garden waste to their local waste and recycling centre. However, Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue crews are still getting called to households and businesses that are choosing have a bonfire instead. They're urging you to avoid burning waste and instead dispose of it responsibly. If you do decide to have a bonfire, please follow these essential tips:

- 1. Check the weather never light bonfires in windy conditions.
- 2. Don't leave bonfires unattended.
- 3. Build bonfires well clear of buildings, fences and hedge.
- 4. Never use flammable liquids to start the fire, and never burn dangerous rubbish such as aerosols, paint, foam furniture, rubber tyres, and batteries.
- 5. Before you light the bonfire, check that children and animals are not hiding inside and are a safe distance away.

Make sure fire safety still stays at the forefront of your mind in May – and don't forget to test your smoke alarm and the smoke alarms of the vulnerable and elderly in your neighbourhood. Members at Everyone Active in Cambourne have raised over £350 for sick children at Great Ormand Street Hospital, after taking part in a gruelling charity exercise class.

The dedicated Les Mills Body
Combat class was held at the centre
after the class instructor, Liz Dunklin,
decided to help raise funds on behalf
of members, Anne and Carl
Buckingham. Anne and Carl sadly lost
their baby daughter, Hollie Anne
Buckingham 18 years ago, after
suffering from a virus at just a few
weeks old. Hollie received treatment
at Great Ormand Street Hospital and
would have celebrated her 18th
birthday in April 2015.

The class proved a huge success, with 75 members turning out to take part and help raise money.

Shane Railley, general manager at the sports centre, said: "It's important that facilities such as ours show their support for these types of charitable activities. Without community support, charities would struggle to deliver the level of support and care



that they do."

Anne Buckingham said: "Great Ormand Street is an extraordinary place that needs our help. It provides inspirational care to hundreds of sick children every day. They believe in caring not only for the children, but the whole family. In 1997, we experienced that care first hand.

"We were completely devastated when we lost our daughter and since then, there really hasn't been a time or family event when she hasn't been in our thoughts. Without our family and friends, it would have been completely unbearable. Our other saviour was Great Ormand Street Hospital.

"We are touched to have the support of our friends, Liz Dunklin and the Everyone Active team."

PAPWORTH ASTRONOMY CLUB

At our April meeting, Mark Hurn from the Institute of Astronomy in Cambridge gave us an interesting presentation on supernovae and how they were regarded in previous centuries.

He focused particularly on SN 1572, which was observed by Tycho Brahe in that year and remnants of which can still be seen today. Some researchers believe that this supernova is mentioned in Shakespeare's play Hamlet!

Professor Andy Fabian OBE from the Institute of Astronomy will speak on "Observing Black Holes". Andy is head of the x-ray astronomy group at the IOA and also a past president of the Royal Astronomical Society.






