The report highlights the potentially huge impact of infrastructure on the countryside if old and new homes remain energy inefficient, and illustrates the dearth of funding for improvements, especially in rural areas. Cambs police campaign: Report it, stop it

Cambridgeshire police ran a campaign in May encouraging people to report concerns about vulnerable adults. Vulnerable adults tend to be more likely to become a victim of crime or abuse but are often less likely to report it.

The force has been urging anyone who has concerns about someone – a relative, neighbour or just someone they know - to "Report it, stop it".

It is the latest strand of the force's Get Closer campaign, which aims to communicate with the public about key issues. The force receives more than 6,000 reports of adults at risk of abuse each year.

The Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH) provides a safeguarding response where vulnerable adults have, or are at risk of being abused. It sees a wide range of partner agencies working together to deliver coordinated safeguarding activity in line with requirements under the Care Act.

Additionally the force has a dedicated team, the adult abuse investigation unit (AAISU), based at Chord Park, Godmanchester, which is responsible

for investigating adult abuse in cooperation with partners.

Detective Chief Inspector Neil Sloan said: "vulnerable adults who are victims of crime or abuse often do not report it because they may feel ashamed, embarrassed, upset or may not even realise they are a victim.

"This is why we need everyone to help us protect them by recognising the signs that something is wrong and not turning a blind eye.

"It could be your grandparent, another elderly relative or neighbour. Their behaviour may have changed in some way; they could have outstanding bills, or an unusually high credit card balance; these are all signs of potential crime or abuse.

"The person taking advantage of the vulnerable adult could be a relative, carer, neighbour, or someone they consider as a 'friend'.

"We will take all reports seriously and fully investigate. Those found committing crimes frequently get jail sentences because the offences often involve a breach of trust."

Think twice before jumping into open water this summer

Would you jump into a river, lake or any other open waterway on a hot sunny day? Do you know what hazards lie beneath the water? Or how cold the water is?

Your fire service has pledged to deliver water safety education to every school in Cambridgeshire following the tragic death of a teenage boy last summer. But there is only so much we can do and we're calling on parents, carers and peers to talk each other about water safety.

Remember, you do not know what hazards lie beneath the surface of rivers, lakes, canals, etc and strong



undercurrents can be tough to conquer, even if you know how to swim.

Cambridgeshire's waterways are cold – even on the hottest days of the year – and this has a dramatic effect on your body's ability to swim and get yourself out of trouble, should you get stuck.

Ground nesting bird recording on Crow Hill has started to yield results. After the slow start to the spring we are now managing to find nests and the first skylark chicks were ringed. Thank you to the dog walkers that are keeping their dogs under control and staying on the paths.

Hedgehogs

One Cambourne resident recently emailed with the news that they had seen a hedgehog in their garden again after several years without. But they were concerned about the ability of hedgehogs to move through Cambourne. The green spaces are well connected with Greenways linking formal and informal areas. Gardens are also a very good resource for hedgehogs, and they are useful to the gardener in eating slugs and snails. A simple thing house owners can do to help is make a small hole (13cm/5 inches wide and high) in your garden fence. Hedgehogs will range 1-2km in a night and visit many gardens, they cannot survive in just one garden.

Other things you can do to help include:

- Making ponds and sunken areas safe by ensuring there is a way out, a shallow edge or ramp at less than 30 degree angle and at least 20cm wide.
- 2. Keep netting taught or tie it up when not in use so that hedgehogs don't get tangled.
- When it is hot, put out water (not milk) for them to drink in a shallow dish.
- 4. Avoid using slug pellets.
- 5. Leave a scruffy corner in your garden over winter so hedgehogs can nest.
- 6. Check bonfires before lighting and before strimming any rough areas.
- 7. If you want to put food out, mealworms or meaty cat or dog food are best.

The People's Trust for Endangered Species has a project called Hedgehog Street

which encourages neighbours to work together to improve their street for hedgehogs.

Over the next few weeks, we will be moving to a new website provider called 'My Surgery' so our site will be having a long overdue make-over!

You will notice lots of changes and new interactive features, which we hope will improve your online experience. Our address will remain the same:

Registering for Online services

In line with all GP practices, we have made changes to the registration process for access to online services (such as ordering repeat prescription and booking appointments) in order to keep your details as secure as possible.

It is imperative that we have a robust process in place as you may now also request online access to your medical records (currently you will only be able to view your 'Summary Care Record' showing repeat medications, allergies and adverse reactions, but in future access to your full record may be possible). To register for these services you will need to come in person to the surgery to fill out an 'online services' registration form - you will need to provide 2 forms of ID, one being photo ID and one showing address - for example a

passport & driving license or recent utility bill. The registration form will be passed to a GP for approval, the application will then be processed and a unique username and password will be created -you can then collect these in person from reception (with ID) or we can post them to you if you prefer. Please note that this process may take up to 2 weeks.

N.B. - parents/carers may request access to their children's records up until the age of 14 (this has been lowered from 16) and access by the parent will automatically cease on the child's 14th birthday. From 14 years old, the child will need to request access themselves.

Pastoral Thoughts

Dear Friends,

This has been an interesting time with me doing increased preaching times both here and also at New Testament Baptist Church in Kenny Hill, Suffolk on Sunday nights. It is easy to get fatigued dealing with the extra workload, but just because it is harder does not mean we give in.

We have seen some new folks come to visit over the past few weeks. Some from England and some from Germany, Russia and Singapore. We are a small church, but our impact is worldwide.

This month we will be having our usual Father's Day service. Although I have not

yet decided on the gift for the men that day. I have done lights, hammers, mini tools, safety equipment, and magnifying glasses. All accompanied by a relevant message for men and fathers in particular. So, who knows what it will be, maybe rachet straps or duct tape but something for men.

Being a father though is the bigger challenge. Men we must be prepared to be the "Bad Guy". In a two parent family there usually is one. The one who will say NO and mean it. The one to make the hard choices and stick by them. The one who is more concerned with the protection and provision than the pleasure of the child. We need to

understand we cannot always be our child's best friend. They can have many friends, but they need parents.

Fathers need to be consistent in their word. Promises should be rare, but when given they should be kept, even when it is uncomfortable. Be the type of man you want your son to grow into or your daughter to marry. Honesty and responsibility and even dependability should be synonomous with your life. Commited relationships to your spouse and children are vital. The best way I have found to achieve that is by first committing yourself to the Lord, and following his plan for family. *Pastor Donavan Bangs*

Have you ever wondered what a dinosaur would eat at a picnic? This is a question that our Reception children had no problem in answering herbivore and carnivore sandwiches of course! Not only did the children produce some delicious examples of these sandwiches, they also explored the type of habitats dinosaurs would prefer and created examples of these using a range of natural materials found in the outdoor environment.



The children in Year 1 and Year 2 had a truly magical experience when they visited Cambridge Arts Theatre for a performance of 'Room on the Broom'. This wonderful adaptation of the much loved story by Julia Donaldson enchanted all the children and adults with its special effects and energetic storytelling. Since returning to school the children have been inspired to create their own stories full of imagination and their own unique brand of magic.

In Key Stage 2, Year 4 have been learning about what life was like for children in World War 2. They have done lots of problem solving involving rationing, have constructed their own Anderson bomb shelters and have even designed and made rag rugs, which was much harder on the fingers than the children had anticipated. This is all part of the preparation for their forthcoming visit to Stibbington Education Centre where they will be spending the day living as children who were evacuated to the Cambridgeshire countryside from London in the summer of 1940.

Meanwhile, Year 5 transported everyone back to Ancient Greece with their glorious rendition of 'Troy Story'. In this musical extravaganza the audience was introduced to many famous characters from Greek mythology as they followed the adventures of Achilles, Helen of Troy, Paris and a very large wooden horse. The children really gave a superb performance with everything an audience could wish for in a musical. Even though summer is beginning Year 6 have remained in much chillier climes as they have continued their study of Sir Ernest Shackleton, the great polar explorer, and his incredible exploits during his expeditions to Antarctica. The children were lucky enough to have a visit from a real life Polar explorer who gave them an insight into the hardships faced by those who continue to explore this inhospitable environment today. The children have used these experiences to produce some

fantastic pieces of writing ranging from information texts on how global warming is changing the polar environment to non-chronological reports and diary entries, in addition to analysing the leadership skills Shackleton demonstrated in the extreme circumstances he and his crew found themselves in.

As the weather has improved our green fingered horticulturists in Year 3 are beginning to see the rewards of their hard

work in the KS2 courtyard. They have been investigating how to keep a garden green by studying the life cycle of plants. Everyone has been delighted to see that their plants are growing rapidly and we look forward to some beautiful blooms very shortly. Chelsea Flower Show look out!


