Less than two years after opening, Cambourne Village College has been rated as 'Outstanding' by Ofsted

Cambourne Village College has been rated 'Outstanding' by Ofsted since opening as the first new village college in Cambridgeshire for 30 years, in September 2013.

Inspectors found that 'teaching in the school is outstanding, and consistently effective' and that 'the progress of pupils is rapid and sustained'.

The report describes the pupils as 'unfailingly polite and courteous' and their behaviour in lessons as 'exemplary'. Amidst a culture of high expectations, 'academic success and education in its broadest sense are



highly valued by the school community'. The judgement is all the more remarkable since it is highly unusual for a new school to attain an 'outstanding' rating before any public exam results have been published.

Claire Coates, Principal, said: "It's hugely rewarding to see the phenomenal skill and dedication of our teachers and support staff, governors, trustees and volunteers acknowledged throughout the report, and we're incredibly proud of our students, who have always risen to our very high expectations since the day the College opened. We're delighted to have achieved this outcome for

the community of Cambourne."
The College, part of the Comberton
Academy Trust, currently has a total of
316 pupils in Years 7 and 8, and will
admit a further year 7 cohort in
September 2015.

Dog Fouling

Dog fouling continues to be a major issue on Cambourne's public open spaces including in the Country Parks, children's play areas, sports fields and on the paths and verges. Cambourne Parish Council is working in conjunction with Cromwell Veterinary Group to tackle this issue and to raise awareness of the associated health hazards.

Cromwell Veterinary Group is campaigning to highlight the health risks that can result from dogs and cats that are not wormed or given regular flea treatment.

The biggest risk of dog fouling to human health is worms – did you know they can spread to people? Children, the elderly and immune deficient people are most at risk. These parasites can cause serious problems including blindness and cysts on the internal organs.

- Always pick up after your dog and clean litter trays regularly
- 2. Give monthly flea treatment to all cats and dogs in your household.
- 3. Give worming treatment AT LEAST every 3 months to all pets.
- Always wash your hands after handling soil or sand from any environment.

To encourage dog owners to pick up after their pets, Cromwell Veterinary Group are providing free poo bags, available from Cromwell Vets and from the Parish Office. Stickers highlighting the health issues associated with worms will be put on all dog bin and posters will be put up around Cambourne.

Currently there are more than 40 dog bins throughout Cambourne plus numerous litter bins which have a domed roof, making them suitable for the disposal of bagged dog poo.

A particular cause of concern for the Parish Council is the exercising of dogs on the Sport Pitches and the fouling that occurs in this area as a result. This is an area where both adults and children come into close contact with the grass surface and therefore are particularly

vulnerable to the dangers of parasites left by dog excrement; even that which has been picked up will leave residue. The Sports Pitches are NOT a suitable area to exercise your dog.

We hope residents of Cambourne will support us in protecting Cambourne.

Health News



Keeping healthy in the sun

Taking a few steps when out and about in the summer sun will help to protect you from sunburn and the risk of skin cancer. Wear clothing, including a hat, t-shirt and UV protective sunglasses. Spend time in the shade between 11am and 3pm when it's sunny. Use a sunscreen of at least SPF 30 (SPF 50 for children or people with pale skin). Keep babies and young children out of direct sunlight. Sunscreens are not an alternative to clothing and shade, but offer additional protection. No sunscreen will provide 100% protection.

As skin cancers vary, you should tell your doctor about any changes to your skin including bumps, lumps, sores that do not heal, new moles or changes to existing moles. If in doubt, check it out!

When checking your moles look for:
Asymmetry - the two halves of the area may differ in shape. Border - the edges of the area may be irregular or blurred, and sometimes show notches. Colour - this may be uneven. Different shades of black, brown and pink may be seen.
Diameter - most melanomas are at least 6mm in diameter. Report any changes to your doctor. For further information visit www.bad.org.uk or email nurse@cambournechurch.org.uk Catherine Price RN

Swimming with sharks

They may not have fins or killer jaws, but loan sharks - illegal moneylenders - are every bit as dangerous and predatory as their name suggests. Victims are not only charged astronomical rates of interest, but very often face violence, intimidation or blackmail. Great news - a specialist Trading Standards team is helping to hunt down the illegal money lenders. A loan shark is someone who lends money without the permission required by the Financial Services & Markets Act 2000. One of the things that has become apparent is that there are lots of myths around loan shark activities: MYTH – There's nothing you can do about loan sharks

FACT – It is illegal to operate a money lending business without permission from the Financial Conduct Authority MYTH – You have to pay back what the loan shark says you owe FACT – A loan made by an illegal money lender (without a license) is unenforceable without permission from the Financial Conduct Authority. This

means that you cannot legally be made to pay it back.

MYTH – If you borrow from a loan shark, you commit an offence FACT – It is the loan shark who is behaving illegally. Reporting the loan shark's activity will not get you into trouble with the authorities.

MYTH – Loan sharks provide a reasonable priced service FACT – The average cost of borrowing from a loan shark is three times the price of the highest cost of legal credit. The highest interest rate the team have come across so far was 131,000% APR.

One victim was receiving benefits of £74 per week. The loan shark took £50 a week, leaving them just £24 to live on

How can you help?

- 1. Talk to your friends and family about loan sharks ask them if they know of any operating in your area.
- 2. Tell us! You don't have to give us your name or sign an official statement if you don't want to. If you or someone you know is a victim of a loan shark contact Trading Standards Illegal Money Lending Team: call the 24 hour confidential hotline 0300 555 2222 or visit www.gov.uk/stoploansharks

Free smoke and CO alarms for landlords

Landlords of privately rented properties in Cambridgeshire can pick up free smoke and carbon monoxide alarms at upcoming distribution events.

New safety laws make it compulsory for all landlords to fit smoke alarms in rented homes and are expected to come into effect from October 2015. Under the new laws smoke alarms must be fitted on every floor of the property as well as carbon monoxide alarms in properties which burn solid fuels.

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service has a limited number of free alarms to give out to relevant landlords and will be doing so at distribution events at its fire stations on the first Monday of July, August and September.

Wildlife Review July 2015

Starlings are a familiar sight around Cambourne. They can often be seen in noisy flocks feeding around Crow Hill or nesting in some of the boxes put up for them on the sides of houses. At the Manor House (the Wildlife Trust office) all five starling boxes have been used this year, some more than once. Sadly they are red listed in the UK for conservation concern as their numbers have dropped by more than 80% in the last 50 years.

At nearby Grange Farm in Knapwell (aka RSPB Hope Farm) they have been carrying out a project to colour-ring starling chicks so they can track where they disperse to in the surrounding countryside. Some of them may soon start to appear in Cambourne.

About 40 starlings have had dark blue colour rings fitted to make them easy to

identify, as well as the standard BTO metal ring on the other leg. The colourrings have a white three-letter (or number) inscription, starting with "A". There are other studies using similar rings, including projects around Biggleswade/Sandy in Bedfordshire and in Lincolnshire.

As in previous years they have instantly dispersed away from the breeding colony and disappeared. The RSPB think that the parent starlings escort their young to favoured feeding areas, which they would like to know more about. Some will have gone down onto the Ouse floodplain – there is already a sizeable flock building up at Fen Drayton. Others seem to gather around areas of mown grass and oilseed rape fields. Most of the time, the flocks are too distant or mobile, but

occasionally it's possible to get close to them and check large numbers of juveniles for rings in a short time.

Registering for online services

We have made changes to the registration process for access to online services (such as ordering repeat prescription and booking appointments) in order to keep your details as secure as possible. It is imperative that we have a robust process in place as you may now also request online access to your

medical records (currently you will only be able to view your 'Summary Care Record' showing repeat medications, allergies and adverse reactions, but in future, access to your full record may be possible).

To register you will need to come in person to the surgery to fill out an 'online services' registration form - you will need to provide 2 forms of ID, (one photo ID and one showing address). The registration form will be passed to a GP for approval and a unique username and password will be created - you can then collect these in person from reception (with ID) or we can post them to you if you prefer. Please note that this process may take up to 2 weeks.

Parents/carers may request access to their children's records up until the age of 14 - access by the parent will automatically cease on the child's 14th birthday. From 14 years old, the child will need to request access themselves.

Enjoying donuts at the Vine Archery Club

Each Vine Archery Club lasts for half a term, with 10 children coming along to each session.

To begin with, we had to learn how to hold our bow, load an arrow, how to stand and finally how to draw the bow correctly and simply let the arrow go without moving anything except the fingers holding the string.

We got used to waiting to hear that satisfying 'thunk' as the arrow hit the wooden target!

We learnt such terms as nocks, fletchings, hen and cock feathers, full draw, shooting line, dry fire and finding our anchor point (that's the part of the archer's face which you touch with your draw hand before you release.

And did everybody hit every target every time? No, of course not. That's one of the good and bad things about archery; every arrow is a new beginning. If you hit a gold (it's not a bullseye, that's darts) with one arrow,



you may miss the target completely with the next arrow! What we learnt most was to celebrate when someone had had a tough time not getting their eye in but simply carried on and didn't get cross with themselves, and to say a little 'never mind, have another go' when it didn't go to plan.

We also played several games: Henry V is a team game where we do shuttle runs whilst our partner's arrows are being collected.


Breaching the Gap involves converting scores on the archery target to beanbags which are then thrown into hoops at varying distances.

And Donuts ... you simply name the colours on the target (we had variously, white surround = the plate, black = chocolate, blue = blueberries, red = jam, gold in the middle was custard).

We decided what our donut should taste like and shot only those colours - easier said than done!!
