The Community Car Scheme provides door to door transport for residents of Cambourne, Caxton and Papworth who



are unable to use public transport. The service is provided seven days a week by local volunteers in their own cars. We are friendly and helpful and our aim is to take the stress out of your journey. Preference is given for appointments at doctors, hospitals, dentists and opticians but we welcome requests for visits to social clubs and outings. Typical costs for single or return journeys from Cambourne are: Addenbrookes £9 and Cambridge / St Neots around £7. Taxi card scheme

Warning after caravans stolen in South Cambs

Police are alerting residents to a significant rise in the theft of caravans across South Cambridgeshire villages.

In the early hours of 24 June, a caravan was stolen from a storage site in Cambridge Road, Newton.

At about 3am unknown people entered the farm via a rear field, lifting one fence out of the ground and smashing a second one. Thankfully the caravan had a tracker installed which was activated and alerted the tracker company. The caravan was later recovered in Bournbridge.

Between about midday on 26 June and 6.30pm on Sunday 28 June another caravan was stolen from a storage site in Hunts Road, Duxford.

Intruders cut a hole in a high hedge surrounding the site, partially filled a ditch with soil and placed boards to bridge the gap to allow them to remove the caravan. At about 1pm on 29 June a third caravan was stolen from a caravan site in Church Street, Steeple Morden. The caravan was unhooked from its power source and stolen using a white flatbed truck.

Between 6pm on 14 May and 7am on 15 May a caravan park in Earith Road, Willingham, was broken into. The fence was broken down and a fence post removed to gain entry, along with power cables being cut.

A Sterling twin-wheel Eccles touring caravan and an Acer Firestart caravan with a blue and grey striped design were stolen from the tourist park.

Crime Reduction Officer for South Cambridgeshire, Rachel Carr, said: "This is an unusually high number of caravan thefts in a short space of time and we are asking members of the public to be vigilant.

"There are a number of simple measures caravan owners can take to reduce the risk of theft such as installing a tracking device and a caravan alarm. In addition, hitch locks, plus wheel and axle locking devices, can deter opportunist attacks."

Hayfever Top Tips

Hayfever is caused by an allergy to pollen which can occur from early Spring through to Autumn.

Tips to reduce hayfever symptoms: • Try to avoid large grassy areas or cutting grass.

• Keep indoors as much as possible with windows and doors shut.

• Sunglasses that wrap around may help stop pollen getting to the eyes.

• Keep car windows shut (pollen filters can be added to car air vents).

• Don't dry bed linen outside on days of high pollen count.

• Putting vaseline under your nose will trap pollen.

• Wash hair at night and shower if you've been in the countryside.

• Next year, start your antihistamines one month before the hayfever season.

Medications

It is usually not necessary to see a GP for hayfever as a pharmacist will be able to suggest a combination of medications. These will be an equal strength to most of those available from the GP and cheaper to buy at a pharmacy than pay for a prescription. Antihistamine tablets, nasal spray and eye drops can all be used together and are likely to work better together rather than just one of these on its own. Solar Photovoltaic Panels Group Discount Scheme

Back in 2011 a group from Coton got together to form a solar PV panel bulk purchase scheme. The resulting eCoton scheme allowed 75 residents from South Cambs to install solar panels at a reduced price. Now, in 2015, a group of volunteers from the Sustainable Parish Energy Partnership1 are organising a second scheme, 'eCoton Solar Savers', open to all property owners in South Cambs.

Prices of PV panels have come down significantly since the first eCoton scheme. In fact, they are now around half the price that they were in 2011!

The largest domestic system is around £6,000, although eCoton Solar Savers (2015) hope to negotiate a lower price. Financial returns are partly through savings on electricity bills and partly through the Feed-in-Tariff (FIT), the government payment scheme to homeowners. This has been reduced



since 2011 but the 'payback period' is still about 7 years, and panels can be expected to last for 20–25 years. If you would like to register interest in this scheme, send an email to <u>ecoton.solarsavers@gmail.com</u>

When prices are arranged, you will receive details and then be invited to attend an information meeting on Wednesday 23 September in Haslingfield, where you can meet the SPEP volunteers running the scheme and the solar panel installation company.

Following this, the installers will arrange for an assessor to visit your property to establish its suitability for solar panels.

Should your property be suitable for solar panels, then it is only at this point that you would need to decide if you want to proceed. All contracts and payments will be made between you and the installer – the role of SPEP volunteers is to set a price with the installer and set up the scheme.

eCoton Solar Savers is open to anyone with a property in the South Cambridgeshire area, so if you are interested in reducing your carbon footprint and making a sound investment then register and save with solar!

Stay fire safe and enjoy the summer

What lovely weather we have seen across Cambridgeshire – and long may it continue! Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service hopes you have all been staying fire safe with your latest outdoor activities, but just in case, here are our firefighters' top tips:

When out camping or using a tent, never use candles inside or nearby and always discourage smoking nearby. Never cook inside a tent either.

If cooking outdoors, keep barbeques on level ground, never pour accelerant on it and use it well away from fences, sheds and foliage.

If you have a bonfire, build it well away from buildings, tents or other flammable objects and make sure it is properly out when you leave.

When out in the countryside, extinguish cigarettes properly and dispose of them responsibly – never throw a lit cigarette into a field or wooded area.

Heidi Allen MP



On 4 June, Heidi was successful in a Private Members ballot, which has given her the opportunity to put forward new legislation, requesting transparency of university fees. This is particularly apt for Cambridgeshire as one of the leading academic centres of the world. In the autumn, Heidi's "Higher Education Information" Bill, will have its second reading and be debated.

In addition Heidi was recently elected to serve on the House of Commons' Work and Pensions Select Committee which will enable her to scrutinise and influence areas such as welfare, employment and pensions. Heidi said: "I want to use my position to ensure our social safety net is there to support the people who need it and that government policy does not inadvertently allow the vulnerable to fall through the cracks. I'm acutely aware that there are real people, not statistics behind every policy decision."

On the Chancellor's Summer Budget, Heidi said, "As a new back bencher, I was in the dark as to what would be in the budget. So I was absolutely delighted by the unexpected features [continued freeze on fuel duty, introduction of a new National Living Wage and increases in the Personal Tax Allowance thresholds] which in my opinion will continue helping people on low incomes."

27 September to 8 November 2015 The Uncanny Valley

Wysing Arts Centre

A group exhibition exploring the phenomenon of "the uncanny valley" through computer generated imagery, computer game design, video, photography and kinetic sculpture.

The Uncanny Valley is a phrase that was coined by robotics professor Masahiro Mori as a way to describe an emotional response that can be measured when encountering objects that are hyper-real; where there is a moment of intellectual uncertainty about what is being viewed that gives way to a feeling of discomfort or disorientation. More recently the term has been applied to computer game design and CGI in the film industry.

This group exhibition aims to explore the phenomenon, alongside contributing to the discourse around screen based and digital works, by exploring the aesthetics of the uncanny through computer generated imagery, computer game design, video, photography and kinetic sculpture.

The majority of the artists selected for the exhibition have an already existing relationship to Wysing through having participated in residencies, retreats, exhibitions and the annual festival of experimental music.

booking appointments) in order to keep your details as secure as possible. It is imperative that we have a robust process in place as you may now also request online access to your medical records (currently you will only be able to view your 'Summary Care Record' showing repeat medications, allergies and adverse reactions, but in future, access to your full record may be possible).

To register you will need to come in person to the surgery to fill out an 'online services' registration form - you will need to provide 2 forms of ID, (one photo ID and one showing address).

The registration form will be passed to a GP for approval and a unique username and password will be created - you can then collect these in person from reception (with ID) or we can post them to you if you prefer. Please note that this process may take up to 2 weeks.

Parents/carers may request access to their children's records up until the age of 14 - access by the parent will automatically cease on the child's 14th birthday. From 14 years old, the child will need to request access themselves.

Pastoral Thoughts

Dear Friends,

Our church anniversary picnic went well with many folks gathered and we were able to reflect on God's blessings over the past year. New people, new opportunities to minister and a new year in which to grow. But growth must be done in the right way to be effective.

We have studied about truth recently in Galatians and Hebrews and its importance in life. We do not find truth in what comes out of Hollywood or in video games. It is dubious if we find real truth in what comes from many politicians.

We cannot seek real truth from the writings or surmisings of men for all the sons of Adam have that sin nature within, regardless of their job title or position. Certainly in Christianity if you want truth you need to go to the Bible. Not any extra books or feelings or visions or images you see on a piece of toast. For Christianity you ask is it in the Book? If not then if it is to do with doctrine it is suspect.

I tell my people if someone comes to you and says Christians need to change the teaching to this new thing or viewpoint. Ask that person to show you from the Bible where that new thing is located. If it is not there then the new thing needs to be rejected. Paul said in Galatians 1:9 As we said before, so say I now again, If any man preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be accursed. We are not to try to alter God and his message to accommodate man-made philosophy or social opinion or even idolatrous tradition, but rather allow God and his message to change us for the better.

We will be gearing up for some more literature distribution as there are lot of homes that simply did not exist last time we went through and some folks have moved in as we live in a very transitional area. Though this sometimes makes for sad farewells as careers and circumstances move people away it also gives place for more folks to be ministered who come upon our happy dwelling of Cambourne.


