In memory of Madison Sells

A new bench has been installed on Hudson Road in Upper Cambourne in memory of Madison Sells, who tragically died of an asthma attack earlier this year, aged just five years old.

Neighbours Kim Bowyer, Marie Easey and Lorraine Fitzpatrick came up with the idea of the bench, to give Madison's sisters Abigail, Emillia and Charlotte somewhere to sit and remember her.

The bench and a plaque in Madison's memory were unveiled at an event attended by more than 100 friends and family. The celebration of Madison's life also included a bouncy castle, bbq, facepainter, disco and a raffle - which raised £400 for Asthma UK.

"The bench means so much to Madison's family - it's somewhere for her sisters to go and sit with her," said organiser Kim Bowyer. "We as a community wanted the memory of this beautiful little girl to live on. We couldn't possibly forget her but it's lovely to look

out and see the bench sitting there and all the kiddies playing.

"I wish we didn't have to do this and could have Madison here with her family but it was not meant to be. I don't want this little girl's passing to have been for nothing - we need to raise awareness of this illness and just how serious it is."

The bench was paid for by CHS Group and the plaque was engraved and paid for by Terry Easey of TAD Ltd. Many local and national businesses provided raffle prizes, including Tesco, Morrisons, Woks Wagon, The Monkfield Arms, The Coffee Shop, The Beauty Cabin, Fish n Chickn, Eden Flowers, Toft Stores, Quy Mill, C&M Hair and Beauty, Su's Cakes, John Lewis, CHS Group, Home Bargains and Wembley Stadium.

"We're very grateful to everyone who came along to the opening of Madison's memorial bench and for all the donations which helped us raise so much money for such a good cause," said Kim.

The Community Car Scheme provides door to door transport for residents of Cambourne, Caxton and Papworth who



are unable to use public transport. The service is provided seven days a week by local volunteers in their own cars. We are friendly and helpful and our aim is to take the stress out of your journey. Preference is given for appointments at doctors, hospitals, dentists and opticians but we welcome requests for visits to social clubs and outings. Typical costs for single or return journeys from Cambourne are: Addenbrookes £9 and Cambridge / St Neots around £7. Taxi card scheme

Health News

Antibiotics - what you need to know.



Antibiotics are a group of medicines used to treat infections caused by bacteria and some parasites. They will not work against viruses (e.g. colds or flu) or fungal infections (e.g. thrush) so doctors are not likely to offer you antibiotics for these types of problems. Only ever use antibiotics prescribed for you and always follow the instructions from your doctor and on the leaflet to make sure they work as well as they can.

Antibiotic Resistance

IAfter a few days of antibiotics you may feel better. However, it is likely that some bacteria may still be in your body. If you stop taking the antibiotics too soon, there is a chance these bacteria can change and stop responding (become resistant) to the antibiotic. As the bacteria are passed on from person to person and move around the community, it may be that antibiotics no longer work.

Because antibiotics have been overused in the past and not taken properly some bacteria have become resistant and are harder to treat (e.g. MRSA and other 'superbugs'). For this reason, doctors are unlikely to suggest antibiotics unless absolutely necessary, and it is incredibly important to take the antibiotics correctly for the full number of days you were told (complete the course).

Parliament may be in recess but that hasn't meant South Cambridgeshire's Heidi Allen has taken a break! From supporting local innovation through to the opening of a local fete near you, life as an MP goes on for Heidi. A week before Parliament's recess Heidi was presenting prizes at the Girton Feast. Taking in the atmosphere, and a wonderful display of baking by the Cambridge Ladybird WI Heidi said "It was a lovely display of community spirit and fantastic to see so many young children getting involved with the WI baking".

The 18th July may have been an escape from the dizzying heights of Westminster but not from those of the Helter Skelter as the Duxford Village Show was opened by Heidi making the short trip from the top of the tower to the recreation ground below.

However, the easy goings of village fetes have been broken up by the more serious side of an MP's work. A parliamentary reception saw Heidi sponsor South Cambridgeshire based Alzheimer's Research UK as they looked to MPs from all parties for help in identifying desperately needed funding for research.

Following on from July's article, Heidi's work on the House of Commons' Work and Pensions Select Committee has begun to take shape. Flu Clinics

As usual, we will be running 2 or 3 Saturday Flu Clinics during October and November. All eligible patients will receive a letter inviting them to one of the clinics in due course. Once again, all 2, 3 & 4 year olds will be called and we plan to run clinics for this age group during normal surgery times (within school hours) - again, your child will receive a letter inviting them to one of these clinics. It is imperative that you bring your invitation letter with you to whichever clinic you are invited to as this will serve as both your proof of eligibility and your consent.

Please remember - No Invitation, No Immunisation!

Practice Closure

We have made changes to the registration process for access to online services (such as ordering repeat prescription and booking appointments) in order to keep your details as secure as possible. It is imperative that we have a robust process in place as you may now also request online access to your medical records (currently you will only be able to view your 'Summary Care Record' showing repeat medications, allergies and adverse reactions, but in future, access to your full record may be possible).

To register you will need to come in person to the surgery to fill out an 'online services' registration form - you will need to provide 2 forms of ID, (one photo ID and one showing address).

The registration form will be passed to a GP for approval and a unique username and password will be created - you can then collect these in person from reception (with ID) or we can post them to you if you prefer. Please note that this process may take up to 2 weeks.

Parents/carers may request access to their children's records up until the age of 14 - access by the parent will automatically cease on the child's 14th birthday. From 14 years old, the child will need to request access themselves.

Summer Wildlife Wonder





Have you noticed the wildlife all around this summer? It has been a busy time for many birds, butterflies, and dragonflies as they gave birth to and then cared for their young. On Crow Hill, there still are ground-nesting birds like skylarks and corn buntings, sheltered in the long grassland area. The wildflower meadows were alive all through the summer months with butterflies and other insects, and you might even have spotted a badger in the woods if you were out in the evening. Flowers have been blooming in the wetland areas and ponds, too, along with rushes and waving reeds. How many species did you spot on a single walk? A great prize. In aid of a great cause. In memory of a great man.

As the very first County Councillor for Cambourne, Lister Wilson's contribution to our community was significant. He helped plan and secure funds for many of our public facilities including the church and primary schools. Sadly, Lister lost his fight with cancer earlier this year and many tributes have been paid by his former constituents. Fundraising is now being conducted in his memory to raise vital funds for The Arthur Rank Hospice Charity, which cared for him in his final weeks.

A flight over Cambridge is being offered for the price of a £5 raffle ticket. The charity hopes the sky high prize worth £300 will raise a significant amount of money, in order to help fund their essential end of life care, counselling and support services.

The prize has been donated by Councillor Paul Bullen - a qualified pilot keen to share his passion for this mode of travel - who contacted the hospice to discuss the proposition, after his friend and fellow Councillor, Lister Wilson required the hospice's care over the Christmas period, sadly passing away at the hospice in January 2015.

The raffle aptly named 'The Lister Wilson Wings of Time Flight' will offer the winner and two guests a thirty minute flight in a Pierre Robin, DR400, in September of this year and will take off from Marshalls airport in Cambridge, possibly passing over the winner's home.

The aircraft is a four seat touring aeroplane which can cruise at 135 knots (approximately 150 mph) and has an



endurance of five hours. The prize includes a safety briefing and an opportunity to have a tour of the craft and its features. The winning ticket will be drawn at Bridge the Gap on Parkers Piece on 13th September 2015, in the cake tent at 2pm.

Yes it may annoy them for a moment but it is far less annoying than a fine from the environmental agency. The same is true in spiritual matters. If we want to be a good neighbour we take time to point them in the right direction now before they get too far down the road and get into serious trouble. As I said on Sunday I would rather annoy someone into heaven than to comfort them into the lake of fire. If we care for people we need to be ready to risk relationships to give them the info they need. Just like with kids you love them enough to tell them if they are doing something dangerous even if they do not like you for it.

My family have lived in Cambourne for over 2 years and I work as a TA and MDS at Monkfield Primary. If elected, I will become fully engaged in the issues concerning residents in our Ward and will work hard on their behalf. The Cambourne West and Bourn Airfield proposals cannot deliver essential services and infrastructure and I will strive to protect the needs of all the villages in Bourn Ward affected by these proposals. Monkfield Medical Practice is overstretched and further increases in numbers will add pressure to this service.


