How would you improve Cambourne?





Following the success of the "Ideas Wall" consultation at the Community Fete, where more than 400 people suggested one way in which Cambourne could be improved, the Parish Plan Steering Committee has been analysing what you had to say.

The Cambourne Parish Plan will aim to set out how we as a community want Cambourne to develop over the next 10 years and the actions needed to move towards that vision.

For younger people (under 16), the overwhelming improvement suggested was the provision of a swimming pool which accounted for 32 per cent of the ideas put forward on the day. Twentyone per cent wanted more outdoor play areas/sport facilities and 9 per cent wanted more shops, restaurants and cafés. A post office (8 per cent) was a popular idea, while other ideas ranged from a cinema, animal shelter and theme park, to mediation and more availability at the GP practice.

Among adults, 19 per cent suggested a swimming pool, 16 per cent a post office, 6 per cent more high street shops, 5 per cent better GP provision, 4 per cent better bus/public transport links and 4 per cent another pub.

Thirteen per cent of the ideas suggested transport should be improved - including better links to train stations in St. Neots, Cambridge and Huntingdon; for Cambourne to have a train station; cheaper bus fares and better cycle links

ADULTS

19% suggested a swimming pool 16% would like a post office 6% want more high street shops 5% said better GP provision 4% would like better bus / public transport links 4% want another pub to Cambridge. Eight per cent commented in relation to activities and facilities for children such as soft play, a lido-type paddling pool and a venue for young people. Five per cent referred to more pedestrian crossings, yellow lines, resident parking and exit roads. Finally, 3 per cent of the ideas concerned "no more housing" and keeping a village feel to Cambourne along with building infrastructure first, before housing.

Cambourne Community Car Scheme

The Community Car Scheme provides door to door transport for residents of Cambourne, Caxton and Papworth who are unable to use public transport. The service is provided seven days a week by local volunteers in their own cars who have undergone police checks and carry identity badges. Preference is given for appointments at doctors, hospitals, dentists and opticians but we welcome requests for visits to social clubs and outings. Typical costs for single or return journeys from Cambourne are: Addenbrookes £9 and Cambridge / St Neots around £7. Local journeys within Cambourne are £2.50 and for those unable to walk we are happy to provide transport to the medical practice and dentist.

Taxi card scheme

If you have difficulty getting around, are unable to take a bus and have no access to a car, the developer-funded Taxi Card scheme is a little used benefit to Cambourne residents. It gives access to a taxi at 30 per cent of the normal fare. Buying vouchers in advance, they are used in the same way as cash. Building work has commenced on two new Parish buildings.

The new Parish Offices adjoining The Hub and the new Cricket Pavilion on Great Cambourne Cricket Wicket.

Both buildings have been funded by s106 monies from the developers and are due to be complete in February 2016.

The Parish Offices will provide the Parish Council office staff with purpose built accommodation after ten years in a temporary office. The accommodation comprises offices, a meeting room and storage, as well as much anticipated windows!

The Cricket Pavilion will provide Cambourne Cricket Club with a much needed building at the Great Cambourne Cricket Wicket and it will become their home base.

HEALTH NEWS



Movember: Men's Health

If you are seeing lots of men with moustaches in November they may be supporting the Movember Foundation, a charity dedicated to men's health. Two of their key focuses are on: **Prostate cancer:** The prostate is a gland only found in men located below the bladder. Risk of prostate cancer increases with age and in those with a father or brother with the disease. Early on, prostate cancers may not cause problems. However, symptoms can include problems in passing urine such as going more frequently, pain, trouble starting or stopping or weak flow. Some of these problems may occur in normal ageing but should still be reported to your doctor. There may also be difficulty or pain in normal sexual function or abnormal bleeding.

Testicular cancer: Testicular cancer is most common in young men aged 15 to 40 years, in particular those with a brother or father with the disease. There may be no symptoms, however signs to watch for include changes or pain in the testicles or the scrotum including change in size or shape or a swelling or lump which may be painless. There may be other causes but these symptoms should always be reported to your doctor. Regular self-examination of the testicles is important in identifying what is 'normal' or if something is out of the ordinary.

The Big Draw 2015 draws big crowd





WILDLIFE TRUST



Bedfordshire Cambridgeshire Northamptonshire

The Greater Cambridge City Deal (a partnership between three local councils, the Local Enterprise Partnership and Cambridge University) has published options for improving bus journeys between Cambourne and Cambridge.

The Wildlife Trust supports moves to encourage more public transport and cycling. However, we were dismayed to see the consultation document includes routes that threaten three nationally important areas for wildlife.

These Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) include two ancient woods and a number of other locally important wildlife sites could also be under threat.

The routes at this stage are indicative but Option Area 2 South appears to go through Caldecote Meadows SSSI and our own Hardwick Wood nature reserve, an ancient woodland and SSSI.

Option Area 1 North and the potential re-location of Madingley Park & Ride site threaten Madingley Wood SSSI, also an ancient woodland. The Trust will be strongly objecting to these two route options and demanding that the City Deal partners properly consider the impacts on wildlife and the natural environment before selecting any preferred options.

We know that many local people will have strong views one way or another, but we ask that as many people as possible object to the options which could damage a SSSI or ancient woodland.

Please take action by responding to the consultation before 23 November with the following points:

• Strongly object to Options Area 1 North and Area 2 South because these routes directly threaten ancient woods and SSSIs

• Ask that the City Deal Executive Board consider impacts on important wildlife sites before they select any preferred options

Pastoral Thoughts


Dear Friends,

Within the book of Leviticus we read: "The Foreigners residing among you must be treated as your native born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt. I am the Lord your God." Leviticus 19.34

The plight of the migrants fleeing from Syria and other regimes to the shores of Europe has caught our minds in a way many other profound news items have failed to do. It seems that this is an issue which has reached beyond the arena of political debate about capacity and economic vs genuine migrants (often a flawed distinction) and witness a response based on seeking to value the intrinsic worth and dignity of all people. Whatever our political perspectives might be, the risk taking of those crossing treacherous seas putting life in jeopardy is for me a powerful vindication of what they are leaving behind and an indication of the hope of a better future. Hope is such a powerful life force.

And as thousands of migrants arrive in makeshift boats on the shores of Europe or gather in camps in Calais, I find myself wondering what their perspective might be and where God might in their outlook. John in the book of revelation was granted a vision of the new heaven and earth that is to come. I wonder what a migrant's vision of life is having fled violence, persecution and conflict, I wonder if amidst the unsettlement, hope remains their driving force.

Perhaps what has encouraged me most has been the response of many, of vicars acting as chaplains in Calais to the migrant camps, of doctors and dentists travelling to provide care and of the general public responding by supplying clothing and hygiene products in significant numbers. Is it beyond the scope of God's purpose that crises like these may break down the cultural barriers that so often divide us and welcome people in love and acceptance. *Matthew Trick, Minister of Cambourne Church*






Fun continues at Jeavons Wood Primary School






