# **Cambourne Community Car Scheme**

The Community Car Scheme provides door to door transport for residents of Cambourne, Caxton and Papworth who are unable to use public transport. The service is provided seven days a week by local volunteers in their own cars who have undergone police checks and carry identity badges. Preference is given for appointments at doctors, hospitals, dentists and opticians but we welcome requests for visits to social clubs and outings. To request transport please either email cambournecarscheme@gmail.com or call (07858) 933230. Typical costs for single or return journeys from Cambourne are: Addenbrookes £9 and Cambridge / St Neots around £7. Local journeys within Cambourne are £2.50 and for those unable to walk we are happy to provide transport to the medical practice and dentist.

# Taxi card scheme

If you have difficulty getting around, are unable to take a bus and have no access to a car, the developer-funded Taxi Card scheme is a little used benefit to Cambourne residents. It gives access to a taxi at 30 per cent of the normal fare. Buying vouchers in advance, they are used in the same way as cash. 

# Decembeard -Bowel Cancer Awareness

Following on from 'Movember' is 'Decembeard' - a campaign to raise awareness of bowel cancer. Sometimes called colon or rectal cancer, it is one of the most common types of cancer in the UK affecting about 1 in 20 people. The main symptoms are blood in poo, a change in your normal bowel movements lasting for several weeks (such as looser poo and needing to poo more often) and abdominal (tummy) pain. However, these symptoms are very common and there are many other causes. The risks of bowel cancer are increased if you have a close relative with the condition and are linked to high levels of alcohol, red / processed meat, smoking and obesity. Usually bowel cancer affects those over 60 but it can affect younger people, so anyone should report the symptoms above. All healthcare professionals are used to dealing with bowel problems and you should never be embarrassed about talking to them.

Bowel cancer can be detected early making it much more likely to be curable. Everyone aged 60-74 is invited to do a FOB (faecal occult blood) test at home every two years. Bowel scope screening is being rolled out nationally, offering a bowel camera test at the age of 55, to identify cancerous changes before symptoms develop. Taking up offers of bowel cancer screening has an enormous impact on reducing the risk of developing or dying from bowel cancer. # Thank you for your support!

I made my official maiden speech in Parliament on 20 October and challenged the Government's approach to tax credit reform, requesting that the pace be slowed down and the impact reconsidered. I would like to say thank you for the overwhelming support I received from South Cambridgeshire constituents. I was literally inundated with emails, letters, tweets and phone calls. It was a challenging time for me with my party, so I am so grateful for your backing. The most pleasing result is that the Chancellor agreed to look at mitigating the effects of the reforms and we will hear his plans in the Autumn statement.

Also in October I was delighted to help open Cottenham's new £640,000 sports pavilion, alongside three-time Paralympic medallist Dan West and later in the month, I met with representatives of the student bodies of Homerton and Girton colleges. Students were concerned about the thought of having more debt as maintenance grants are changed to loans, despite the fact that they would be unlikely to have to pay it back. On the same day I met with a group of Junior Doctors from Addenbrooke's hospital in light of the proposed changes to contracts. It is vital any new contract is fit for purpose so I will continue working with them to ensure their voices are heard.

# Stay well this winter

In the past year as many of one in four residents in Cambridgeshire visited A&E when they could have used an alternative service or looked after themselves at home.

Each visit to A&E costs the local NHS £87, even before any treatment is given. This costs the local NHS over £4m a year. This is the equivalent cost of 677 hip replacements, or 287 liver transplants or 115 more dementia nurses.

Busy A&E departments resulted in 500 cancelled operations / procedures and longer waiting and referral times. But you can help:

- Stay healthy – get a flu vaccination if you are eligible

- Look after others – check on elderly friends, relatives and neighbours especially in spells of cold weather, help them to keep warm and have the medication they might need

- Be prepared – get your prescriptions in early before the holidays and see your pharmacist or GP for any issues you might be putting off

- Choose the right service – your local pharmacy can provide confidential, expert advice and treatment for a range of common complaints.

# **Operation Hunter tackles burglary**

Residents are being urged to check their home security to help prevent a rise in burglaries over the winter months. Dwindling hours of daylight and the Christmas period often combine to result in more break-ins at homes in the county.

The force is prioritising burglary as part of a new campaign called Operation Hunter and is using all tactics available to reduce the number of crimes through prevention work and catching and putting offenders before the courts.

However, as part of the operation, detectives are also urging members of the public to do their bit by taking precautions and making their homes unattractive to burglars.

Residents are urged to:

\*Always keep doors and windows closed and locked or in a ventilated but locked position, even when they are inside the house. Always check and lock doors with a key - never assume that just pushing up an internal handle will lock the door. \*Remove keys from window and door locks, but keep them in a familiar and safe place where all members of the family know where to find them in the event of an emergency.

\*Never leave items such as keys, bags, presents and money on show through a window.

\*Consider the position of key racks or shelves next to a door and ensure that they cannot be reached through the letter box.

\*Use timer switches to turn on lights and radios when you are going to be away from your house at dusk.

\*Consider the use of lights at the front and rear of your property that are activated when someone approaches.

\*Consider the use of bolts and padlocks on side gates. Place the bolts at the top, middle and bottom of the gate, as just a top bolt might be easy to reach and open.

\*A visible intruder alarm box can prove to be one of the biggest deterrents to an opportunist burglar, so consider installing a DIY or supplier installed system.

# Great times at Monkfield Park

There is never a dull moment at Monkfield Park. The children have been working hard in preparation for the Spelling Bees. There was a real buzz of excitement as children had to solve anagrams, complete spelling tests and learn tricky words.



Reception children celebrated the festival of Diwali by taking part in a special Diwali dance, making clay divas and discussing the traditional activities that take place during this special festival.





# 'All About Me' week at Jeavons Wood

Wow! What a very busy first half term we have had back at Jeavons Wood. Year 2 have been busy with our All About Me topic, and we were all very excited to share our 'special something' with each other.

In Maths we have been discussing what we already know about numbers, addition and subtraction, including solving lots of tricky word problems. Then we spent one week learning about shapes. The children were able to identify and describe lots of 2D and 3D shapes from memory. Our next task was to find out lots about measuring, which involved length, weight and capacity. In English we have been busy talking about The Ugly Duckling. We talked about the moral of the story and discussed why people called him 'ugly'. This helped us to understand what we needed to include in our own traditional stories.

In Science this half term children have been finding out about animals. We started by looking at the characteristics of living things and using these to decide their existence. Next we talked about offspring, researching which animals have different babies, for examples kittens, foals and chicks. We decided it is important for us to find out how to care for animals, as our Year 2 hamster Herbie needs looking after.

As part of our topic, we have been learning about our local area and we went for a walk around Cambourne to find out more about the features we have in our own environment. We have also learnt a lot about mapping, and have created maps of our walk to school, imaginary worlds and treasure maps, ensuring we included a key.




