# CVC urgently seeks funding for new Cambourne performance venue

As part of the planned expansion of Cambourne Village College to provide more pupil places, the staff have been working with the Design team to investigate the possibility of including a community performance facility into the development.

"We've been able to include an additional hall to give us more meeting, dining and examination space in the current plans," explained Claire Coates, Principal, "but the education budget of the County Council can't stretch to building us a professional-quality performance venue. So we're designing the new hall, at the far end of the College and adjacent to the new Music suite, with the capacity to be extended at some point to become a full-size performance venue, with tiered seating for an audience of 500. There is ample parking already provided in the plans. This would fulfil our ambition of providing the best possible Performing Arts facilities for our students, but also provide an ideal venue for Community cinema, large conferences, and community and professional Arts and theatre events.

"Of course, it would be ideal to build this facility within the next phase of planned building works for the College, to minimise planning and building costs. At this point, to build the shell of such a hall, with necessary services, would cost something like an extra £550 000. To fit it out to professional theatre standards would cost at least the same sum again, but we could look to grants and further funding opportunities for the fit-out."

The College Principal and the Cambourne Arts Development



Manager, Richard Brown, presented the proposal for a Community Performance Hall on the College site to the Parish Council in November, with the request that funding from the Community Infrastructure Levy from the Cambourne

West Development might fund the first phase of building.

"I understand that the Parish Council are willing to consider funding the initial building costs," said Richard Brown, "but there will be many demands on that funding – not least the provision of two new primary and one secondary schools..."

For the development to go ahead this summer, the College needs to commit £550,000 to the development, by March.

"Sadly this cannot be found within the College budget," the Principal said.

"We are wondering if anyone in Cambourne has any contacts, if there are any local businesses, or if there are any generous and philanthropic individuals, who might like to support our fundraising? If so, we would love to hear from them!"

The New Year is a good time to reflect on the work of the Parish Council during 2015. Some of the work includes:

# Public open spaces and play areas

2015 saw the opening of the popular sand and water park and zip wire at the Upper Cambourne Play Area. The addition of a new dimension of play has proved very popular. The water to the area is switched off over the winter and will remain so until any danger of frost has passed. In March we were able to celebrate the opening of the extension to the Skatepark. The project was instigated and led by a group of young skateboarders who sourced the equipment and produced evidence to support an application for a grant.



# Alcohol awareness & dry January

Drinking too much alcohol can cause damage to the liver and is also linked to cancers, accidents, obesity and mental health problems. Guidelines recommend that everyone should have at least 2 alcohol-free days a week; women should drink no more than 2-3 units per day (14 units a week maximum) and men no more than 3-4 units per day (21 units a week maximum). But what is a unit? On a bottle '% abv' or '% vol' stands for the 'percentage of alcohol by volume' which is the amount of alcohol it contains. Beer containing 4% abv has 4 units in one litre (therefore 2 units in 500ml - just under a pint). Wine containing 12% abv has 12 units in one litre, so a large glass (250ml) contains 3 units. A standard 750ml bottle of this wine would be 9 units.

Alcohol also contains a surprising number of calories. The average pint of beer contains around 200 calories. and a bottle of wine around 600 calories. Alcoholic drinks are empty calories which means they have very little nutritional benefit but still cause weight gain. 'Drinkaware' have a good App if you want help identifying the number of units or calories you are consuming (www.drinkaware.co.uk). Last year over 2 million people took on the challenge of 'Dry January' when giving up alcohol for the month. Some people find abstaining from alcohol can improve their sleep, general energy levels and finances (www.dryjanuary.org.uk). # Sweet triumphs in the budget

On 25th November, the Chancellor unveiled his Autumn statement and there were two especially sweet triumphs. Firstly, the decision to scrap the planned changes to tax credits. I dedicated my maiden speech to this issue so I was delighted to hear the Chancellor's acknowledgement that this was the right thing to do.

There was also the commitment to deliver a fairer funding formula for our schools by 2017. For years, Cambridgeshire has been one of the very lowest funded authorities in the country – for some time, we were right at the bottom.

In early December, I also spoke in the Commons on the subject of mental health. In my first few months as an MP I received a letter from a constituent from Meldreth, Steve Mallen, about the tragic suicide of his son Edward. Following the death of his gifted and wonderful son, Steve set up the MindEd Trust, and with the support of schools, charities and world leading academics, Steve's ambition is to roll out a wellbeing programme in schools to help with young people's mental health. Steve and I have met with Government ministers to enlist their help and the Rt Hon Alistair Burt, the Minister for Care and Support has agreed to attend the launch conference in Cambridge on 18 March 2016. # **Situational Awareness**

"Let's be careful out there," was a repeating line from an old show called Hill Street Blues. It stayed with me and was resonated one day in a briefing. It was at an operational security briefing at my induction to the 1st special operations group. The crux of the briefing concerned situational awareness and some of the ideas might help even in times of crisis such as crime, accidents or disasters.

At these times people have a tendency to panic. However, panic does not help but what does, is planning. What do I mean by that? It is the marriage between situational awareness and planning that will enable you to continue to function despite emotional stresses. Simply being aware of your surroundings is key.

When you enter into a building you take note of where the exits are and any potential hindrances as well as alternate paths to them. You learn to spot emergency items like fire extinguishers or first aid kits almost subconsciously. In that you also soon learn to see potential hazards. So within three or four seconds in a new building you already have planned how to get out or help with firefighting or first aid. So if a threat arises be it human or natural you would be able to follow your plan instead of panic and confusion.

The same is true in your home. You should have more than one exit plan. This includes if you are upstairs and cannot get down the stairs. Plan a way out, escape ladder or a knotted strap. Bed sheets may work ok in the movies but do you actually know how to tie the knots that will hold? Have a fire extinguisher and battery powered torches.

What about walking around? Still be aware. Remember criminals, like scavengers, will look for the easier targets. The young, the old or the distracted. Walk with purpose, know where you are going before leaving the house. Be alert, know who is around you, and with a quick confident glance they will know you see them. In the same way that you look for cars crossing the street as potential hazards, notice other things. People, animals or even weak trees in the wind are all worth a glance to see if there is a possible problem. This is not a glance of fear, but classification. This also enables you to see to be able to help others - many is the child I have stopped running into the road simply by being aware.

Remember this is our community and we look out for one another. If you see something, say something, even indirectly to the relevant authorities. Because living in a constant daydream is not a good option. So let's be careful out there Cambourne.

Happy New Year! The pied wagtail roost has been spotted again in the tree in front of the Wokswagon takeaway. The photo below, from Robin Bailey, of the roost last winter, clearly shows their long tails and their small bodies fluffed up to keep warm. During the day they can be seen scurrying about the car parks and pavements looking for insects, their tails wagging up and down as their name describes.

According to the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) "natural roost sites are generally in reed beds, where the water below the reeds helps to keep the birds warm and also means that ground predators are kept away." So why would they be using trees on a busy street? Well for much the same reasons. The temperature will be slightly higher next to a large building and tarmac road and the street lights will put off most

predators from coming close. The BTO also says roosting together can lead to information exchange between the birds: "Birds which are having difficulty in finding food simply follow the birds that are in better condition in the morning."

# Seven tips for interviewing well

Everyone will have an interview at some point in their life, be it for a new job, university or any other position which is competitive.

As terrifying as they can be, there are definitely some things you can do to try to make sure they are as successful as possible, and here they are:

- 1. Smile! No one wants to accept a grumpy looking person who doesn't look warm and friendly would you want to hire someone who looked like they were never going to be cheerful?
- 2. Eye contact is a must, yes it can be tricky sometimes and especially if you're a naturally awkward person; but it makes such a difference if you're having a conversation with someone and you look them in the eye. If you struggle with eye contact, try looking at the bridge of your interviewer's nose so that it seems as if you're looking straight at them.
- 3. Do your research. This is especially important if you're applying to a company with a specific motto or function as they may ask you questions that are reliant upon you knowing what the company is. Also with university interviews it's vital that you read up on your chosen subject so that you can take your reasoning further in a discussion.
- 4. If you're asked a challenging question, don't reject it straight away. Think out loud and work through it your interviewer may be trying to push you and see how you deal with a difficult question.
- 5. Don't fidget too much, you'll look distracted. Also, no one likes a fidgeter in the workplace.
- 6. Dress appropriately ask your interviewer beforehand if there is any specific dress code. If they tell you to wear whatever you feel comfortable in, do so, as long as it is appropriate. Be prepared to dress smartly if required.
- 7. Think carefully about what you say before you say it, don't simply blurt out the first thought that comes to mind. If you need time to think, try using time fillers such as taking a sip of water, taking a deep breath, or saying something like "OK, let me just think about this for a second".

# Police visit homes at risk

Police are visiting homes at risk of being burgled as part of a crime crackdown in the county.

Officers are seeking properties left unsecured or otherwise vulnerable to burglary as part of Operation Hunter. The operation has been launched to reduce the number of burglaries in Cambridgeshire, which last year rose during November, December and January.

Burglary prevention activity is taking place across the county with officers patrolling hot spot areas and visiting residents to offer home security surveys.

Residents whose homes are at risk, for example due to open windows or being obviously unoccupied, will be given advice and crime prevention material.

Crime safety officer Carol Aston said: "Detectives are working hard to identify burglars and bring them to justice but the other main strand of our work is around prevention. Our main aim is to raise awareness of what can be done to make your home uninviting to burglars."

Burglary is a top priority for the force because it leaves victims and whole communities feeling vulnerable and can have a massive impact on their lives.



# Y4 gymnastics at The Vine

BY MRS KENNY

This half term in PE we have been learning about Balancing in Gymnastics. We have thought about the 3 principles of balance and how to make balances easier through lowering the centre of gravity, covering a larger surface area and increasing the number of contact points.

We are learning to perform a conditioning phrase which includes many balances. These include a foot stand, a side knee balance, a front support, an arch, a straddle and pike as well as a V –sit and linking these balances together. We must perform each balance with straight arms and legs and hold for at least 3 seconds.



We are beginning to think about how we can perform our balances on apparatus with a partner or small group as well as change our levels within our performances. We also need our transitions to be smooth where we link one balance to another.

We have been recording ourselves on ipads and then watching it back so it is clear how we can improve our balances and positioning.
