Air Cadets In Big Blue Parade for 75th Anniversary



HEALTH NEWS



Gut feelings: Heartburn, Acid Reflux and GORD

Heartburn is very common and refers to a burning feeling or pain behind the sternum (breast bone) which can spread to the ears or jaw. It is usually caused by acid rising (or refluxing) from the stomach into the oesophagus.

Acid reflux (also known as Gastro-oesophageal Reflux Disease or GORD) does not always cause heartburn and there can be other symptoms such as a cough, hoarse voice, sore throat or even damage to tooth enamel.

Acid reflux is strongly linked to diet and lifestyle. It tends to be made worse by caffeine, chocolate, fatty foods, wine, spirits, citrus fruits, fizzy drinks and smoking. Avoiding large meals, not going to bed on a full stomach and losing weight if you need to, are all likely to help.

Over the counter medications taken after meals create a barrier stopping the reflux, but if you are needing them regularly there are other medications that can help and this should be discussed with your doctor.

Acid reflux should be taken seriously as it may lead to more serious problems such as changes in the cells which can need regular monitoring due to an increased risk of cancer of the oesophagus. Most importantly, any difficulty in swallowing where food feels stuck in the throat or chest must be reported urgently. This may occur with or without the feelings of acid reflux but it can be a symptom of a serious problem and must never be ignored.

GP funding, policing and broadband

In January, one of the founding partners of Cambourne GP surgery and I met with Alastair Burt, Minister of State for Care and Support. GP surgeries in new settlements such as Cambourne face even tougher funding challenges than established GPs and I am pleased to say Alistair listened intently and promised to go away and review the way the funding model works. Watch this space!

The safety and security of the residents of South Cambridgeshire is a top priority of mine and that's why on 15 January I met with the Chief Constable of Cambridgeshire, Alex Wood. It is clear policing challenges are very different across the County, but I am confident Alex is in tune with both our rural and city challenges.

One of the key irritations for residents in some of our rural villages is broadband provision. Over the last couple of months I have been working with district and parish councillors to try and identify any "cold" spots around the constituency where provision is simply not good enough. On 22 January I took my hit list to Noelle Godfrey, Programme Director of Connecting Cambridgeshire so she can ensure these areas are not forgotten. I am confident over time we will be able to provide decent broadband to everyone.



March will be a busy month for us. First there is Mother's Day.

Usually we have a gift for all the mothers in the church and a topical message.

After that is Easter, or as some refer to it, Resurrection Sunday. The time in the Christian calender when we remember specifically the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is a solemn time of reflection as we are reminded that Christ came to pay the



In September 2015 the *Independent* ran an article about the lived experiences of three refugees, one of whom was Hassan Ayo a refugee from Syria.

During the journey across northern Syria surviving aircraft strikes and shifting from one refugee camp to another, Hassan and his wife Fatima's 14-year-old daughter Sozdar died of a heart complaint.

The family settled in Britain under the Vulnerable Persons Resettlement Scheme now live in Coventry.

Compassion is at the heart of the Easter message which tells us of a saviour, Jesus Christ who came to heal, restore and set free. Jesus himself became a refugee when Herod attempted to kill him, his family escaped to Egypt.

So many of the refugee stories tell us of journeys from death to life which is the story of the Gospel, Jesus died to and came back to life to usher in God's Kingdom where compassion wins.

A prickly new pet

Children often find going to school a prickly situation, but for the students of the Sunflower Nursery in Camborne this took on a different meaning when they were introduced to the nursery's new pet – Rufus, an African Pygmy Hedgehog.

The children were delighted to find the new member in their classroom and were given a lesson in how to care for Rufus by Peter Cope from the Cromwell veterinary surgery. The children were fascinated by Peter's knowledge of hedgehogs and gasped when he told them they can travel up to five miles per night. "Having Rufus in the classroom is a great tool for teaching children all manner of subjects and life skills. We can help them understand responsibility, respect for life and it offers them access to nature that they might not be receiving anywhere else," explained Danielle Main from the Sunflower Nursery.

African pygmy hedgehogs can weigh as little as 0.5lb and grow between five and eight inches, similar to a guinea pig – albeit a spiky one! Rufus loves cat food, scrambled eggs and dried mealy worms.



During the day he sleeps in his hedgehog sleeping back and gets his exercise on his treadmill in the evenings.

Here are some interesting facts about African Pygmy Hedgehogs: They are hybrids of the four toed hedgehog and the Algerian hedgehog – it has four toes on its back feet and five on the front. They are the most popular species of domesticated hedgehog in the world and as domesticated pets they can live for as long as 10 years. African pygmy hedgehog has also been known to eat poisonous scorpions without any ill effect to his health.

We hope that our new pet will bring great joy to our children at Sunflower Nursery.

Arrrggh! The Vine's Ocean Adventures

The Reception children at The Vine have been busy Ocean Adventurers this half term! We started the term exploring what we can find under the sea. In our role play area we went deep sea diving in the submarine amongst the dangling jellyfish, cereal starfish and number squid which we made in class.
