Gut feelings: Indigestion & Dyspepsia

Following on from last month's article on acid reflux is the condition of 'dyspepsia'. Technically this means problems related the stomach itself or close by. However it is more commonly used as an umbrella term to describe symptoms of indigestion including nausea (feeling sick), vomiting, pain in the upper abdomen, feeling full, bloating, loss of appetite and can also include symptoms of acid reflux.

Dyspepsia may be caused by a variety of issues such as inflammation (or less commonly ulcers) in the stomach itself, but also gallstones, irritable bowel syndrome, food intolerances and stress. As outlined last month, it can also be affected by poor diet and lifestyle factors. Any medication you take (particularly if you use anti-inflammatory drugs such as ibuprofen) should be discussed with your doctor or pharmacist to see if this may be aggravating the problem. A simple stool (poo) test can identify whether the problem may be caused by a bacteria infection.

Persistent symptoms should be reported to your doctor particularly in those aged in their mid-fifties or older.

Similarly, losing weight without obvious explanation, significant loss of appetite, difficulty swallowing, persistent vomiting or any signs of blood in the vomit or the stool (this may be dark red /black) should be reported urgently as they may be a sign of something more serious. What goes in your green bin?

Residents in Cambridgeshire are asked to make sure they are putting the right material in the household green bin that takes food and garden waste so that we can make it into compost that can be used by local farmers or on gardens.

Unfortunately, there have been many items in the green bin recently that should be recycled elsewhere such as plastic bags, biodegradable bags, parts of garden furniture and tools, clothing, plant pots and even metal items.

This means that some of the compost cannot be used by farmers and residents and has to be disposed of, costing the council $\pounds 220,000$ a year

Your green bin can accept any kind of food waste, meat or vegetables, cooked or uncooked, tea bags and coffee grounds and any type of organic material from your garden, such as grass cuttings, weeds, dead flowers, leaves and bush trimmings, twigs and mouldy vegetable plants and potatoes.

Never put food or garden waste in plastic or biodegradable bags and then place them in your green bin. Instead wrap your food in newspaper, put it in paper caddy liners or loose in your bin.

Coppicing

Coppicing (cutting trees down to ground level and allowing them to regrow) has been carried out over the winter in many of our woodland Nature Reserves.

Nearby Hardwick Wood is one of those and we have some of the hazel poles harvested from the wood available to buy for all sorts of uses in gardens and allotments.

They are a sustainable and local alternative to buying bamboo canes from the garden centre, which may have been grown many thousands of miles away.

It also supports our work to make the woods suitable for a range of wildlife (pictured: some woodland wildlife – black hairstreak butterfly, chiffchaff).

During National Beanpole Week, 9th to 17th April www.beanpoles.org.uk, we will have some hazel poles available to buy from our office at the Manor House, Broad Street.

There will also be an event at Hardwick Wood on Saturday 16th April, where you will be able to see where the coppicing has taken place and talk to the volunteer wardens who carry it out.

As I write this I am preparing for my father's funeral. He was 72 years old and died of lung cancer. I have been tasked with taking care of many things and this as usual results in much research. All of the forms that must be filled out and the people and companies informed. Trying to comply with the last wishes of the deceased, but unfortunately much information was never given such as songs and place of desired internment. What to do about certain things. He had no will which could have made things difficult, but since he also had no real property it has not been bad, in that respect. Thankfully he had a standard funeral plan which made some things easier. But in all of this some obvious conclusions I will share with you.

I don't know if you, like me, find yourself, looking back at your past, reflecting on situations, relationships and asking how life might have turned out if...

One of the realities of life is that we can look back but not go back. Our past will for ever unalterably remain our past.

There's a story, told by J John a Christian minister and author who tells of a guy who returns to his hometown and sees a picture he has painted in a shop.

The picture needs work as some of the colours are faded and the frame is damaged. But to get the painting back he will have to buy it back and only then can the painting be restored to its former glory.

The story is analogous of Easter where Jesus takes the faded colours, the broken frames of our past and dies on the cross. Then something incredible happened, death could not stop Jesus and he rose from the dead.

And though these events happened thousands of years ago, Jesus is still alive and transforming people's lives today. Jesus invites us all to know him and to be transformed by his love and mercy. The bible says "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." (John 10.10)

SCHOOLS

Monkfield Park Primary School - Reception

The children have began their term by learning about the amazing people that they are surrounded by. They began by looking at the amazing people and services we have here in Cambourne and wrote thank you cards to show their appreciation. Our local supermarket, Morrison's, was also used to inspire children to create their own supermarkets in the classrooms. As part of their Maths learning, they enjoyed using money to buy different food items and children made their own purses to store their coins in.

The children has a visit from two paramedics who brought along their ambulance vehicle and medical bags. The children were very excited to be inside a real emergency vehicle and had many questions to ask about the different buttons in the vehicle. After the visit, the children created their own stethoscopes and made their own emergency vehicles using cardboard boxes.

To deepen their understanding about the story behind their first ever play of 'The Litter Muncher', the children explored the concept of 'Reduce, Reuse, Recycle'. They made posters to remind others of what to recycle, reused recycled materials to make their own imaginative models, and were encouraged to help with recycling at home. The children can now be heard, reminding each other of where to put their different types of rubbish.

It goes without saying that all other year groups have been busy as well. Years 1-4 have been developing their biking skills with weekly Bikeability sessions, meanwhile, Year 5 recently showcased their creative side at the Comberton Village College 'Dance Share' and Year 6 have become experts in how light is reflected in a mirror. They have been creating their own periscopes using two mirrors so that they can see above or around an obstacle.





Year 5 and 6 Discussion Time at the Vine

Friday afternoon sees a small intrepid band of noisy thinkers congregating in Tanzanite classroom. There is often a strip of tape on the floor - carefully avoided - never, ever stood on. This is our 'Electric Fence'. So, on one side we may have 'dolphins' and the other side 'sharks', or 'rich your whole life /superhero for a week'. Don't sit on the fence - for fear of an imaginary electrocuted bottom! You MUST decide ... it's surprising how many decide, listen, then change their minds by jumping over the fence!

One of our longest discussions was the Evilometer: we investigated the nature of evil by ordering 10 statements of evilness. Now that was a noise as everyone had opinions which had to be heard! We have also investigated the nature of loneliness by asking which is preferable – to be stranded on a deserted island or always surrounded by people.

So, two of our questions for you: if you had to teach the world one thing, what would it be? And what is the opposite of cheese?

The children thoroughly enjoyed their experience singing for all they were worth the whole evening, not to mention performing some pretty nifty dance moves. (The adults didn't do too badly either!)

We were so proud of the children for their fantastic enthusiasm and energy during the rehearsals and then performance and of course for their impeccable behaviour throughout the day. They really did represent the school brilliantly, so well done Jeavons Wood choir, you were fantastic.

For those that could not make it on the day an assembly will be held at 2.30pm on 26th April to showcase some of the songs the choir sang during the concert.



Big events in Jeavons Wood

Year 5 has been very busy this half term with their Narnia topic. On the first day back after half term they had to enter their classroom through a wardrobe which lead to a Narnia wonderland where we watched the film. This got all the children very excited and interested in their new topic.

In English, the children wrote their own fantasy stories based on Narnia where they innovated parts of the story.

In Maths, we have been working hard on fractions and now we are all experts. The children can convert, multiply and even recognise equivalent fractions.

In Science, we have been doing lots of experiments;



looking at separating materials from each other, solubility, reversible and irreversible changes.

In our topic work, we have produced some fantastic winter themed paintings based on Narnia. These look exceptional on our Narnia display board.

In PE, we have been working with David Bridges (FA skills coach). The children have gained a lot from the lessons and their confidence in playing football has really improved over the last weeks.
