COMMENDATION

Cadets awarded First Aid Commendations

Just over a year ago three cadets from Cambourne Detachment ACF administered immediate first aid to a runner who was injured in 2015's Cambourne 10K run.

Cadets Cpl Simon Mead, Cpl Jacob Dunn and Cdt Harrison Reynolds were at a remote marshalling point at the back of the lake during the Cambourne 10k run. A lady collapsed near them and they quickly sprang into action using their knowledge of 1st Aid taught within ACF.

It was a very cold and windy April morning. All three cadets helped enormously by removing their combat jackets to provide a wind break to try and keep the injured race participant warm. They called for an ambulance and quickly established that she had an injury to her ankle.

The ambulance took an hour and 45 minutes to reach them. Meanwhile the cadets supported her and kept her calm by talking to her and reassuring her and keeping her as comfortable as possible until the ambulance arrived.

On arriving at the hospital it transpired that the lady had not fallen due to her ankle, as the cadets had first thought, but



due to an undiagnosed heart condition. She then spent a further two weeks in hospital receiving lifesaving treatment.

The cadets each received a rare and prestigious Certificate of Commendation from St John's Ambulance and a Humanitarian Citizen Award from the British Red Cross.

HM Lord Lieutenant Sir Hugh Duberly KCVO CBE presented the cadets their awards and congratulated them individually, talking to them about what they had done.

Thanks to the skills these cadets are taught within the ACF, they were able to help save a life.

Well done to all three of them.

Annual Council Meeting

The Annual Council Meeting was held on 17th May 2016. At the meeting Cllr Simon Crocker was elected as Chairman for the forthcoming year with Cllr Joe O'Dwyer as Vice Chairman.

The Committee Chairmen were elected as follows: Planning Committee – Cllr Patrick Gavigan; Leisure & Amenities Committee – Cllr Mrs R Poulton; Finance & Policy Committee – Cllr Simon Crocker. At the meeting the Council's Standing Orders, Financial Regulations and Terms of Reference & Delegated Powers were reviewed amended where required and re-adopted. The Council also re-confirmed its right to operate under the General Power of Competence.

Graffiti Removal

Earlier this year the Parish Council, supported by funding from MCA Developments, resolved to form a community group of volunteers to tackle graffiti issues within Cambourne. After completing insurance policies, risk assessments and procurement of materials, the group has now completed an initial graffiti removal session focussed on the High Street bus shelters. Graffiti has also been removed from a playground.



This is entirely a voluntary initiative and the group will operate on an ad hoc, best efforts basis going forward. As it stands volunteers have come forward from community action groups such as Cambourne Timebank and the Cambourne Volunteers R Us. Additional volunteers are of course welcome, to help with either graffiti removal or the brilliant work done by the existing litter pickers (or both!).

Cervical Screening Awareness

Cervical Screening Awareness Week runs from 13-19 June. Cervical screening (also known as 'smear tests') are offered to all women aged 25-64 every three to five years depending on age. The cervix is the entrance to the womb from the vagina. Cervical cancer affects around 3,000 women a year in the UK mainly in those aged 30-45. In the early stages it often has no symptoms but can be a cause of unexpected vaginal bleeding. Being screened regularly means abnormal changes in the cells of the cervix can be identified early. Although at times these cells will go back to normal, sometimes they need treating to stop cancer developing.

Screening makes a significant difference in reducing cancer rates but there has been a gradual fall in the numbers women taking up screening over several years. Cervical screening is surprisingly quick and does not usually cause discomfort. It is best done during the middle of your menstrual cycle, usually 14 days from the start of your last period. Intercourse, spermicide, barrier contraception or lubricants should be avoided 24 hours beforehand as they may affect the test. Although it may feel embarrassing or you may struggle to find the time, cervical screening is an important part of caring for yourself. It is usually done by practice nurses who do this on a very regular basis but you can choose to go to a sexual health clinic if you'd prefer. 
Heidi Allen seeks site for post office in Cambourne

As always, it has been an exceptionally busy few weeks with meetings with Ministers about Primary school testing and opening post offices!

During recent visits to Swavesey and Hauxton Primary Schools, I chatted at length to staff, governors and Headteachers about Key Stage 1 and 2 testing. They expressed concern about the potential for excessive stress on the children and the appropriateness of some of the English grammar tests. Consequently, Nicky Morgan, the Secretary of State for Education kindly agreed to meet me and I left the meeting feeling positive and encouraged that the Secretary of State had listened. Indeed, I am delighted that in the same month, Nicky has reviewed proposals to force academisation on high performing schools. I am encouraged to believe that the Primary school testing regime may thus be reviewed too.

There were more reasons to celebrate as I opened the new post office in Cottenham and refurbished village stores and post office in Oakington. Post Offices provide a vital lifeline so I work on a regular basis with Post Office UK to ensure we keep ours going. I am currently working with councillors in Cambourne to try and identify a site there.

Patient Participation Group

Our Patient Participation Group (PPG) met on 13 April and topics covered included GP recruitment and retention, transition between GP surgery and hospital care, missed appointments, communication with patients and pecialist skills required within the practice due to high number of under 10 year olds. Registering for online services

This will enable you to have more control over your appointments, manage your repeat prescriptions requests and also have access to your summary care records. To register you will need to come to the practice to complete a registration form. You will need to provide two forms of ID, one being a photo ID and one showing your address. The registration will then be passed to a GP for approval. This process may take up to two weeks. Parents/carers may request access to their children's records up to the age of 14 and access by the parent will automatically cease on the child's 14th birthday. www.monkfieldmedicalpractice.co.uk

Prescriptions

The practice has a 48 hour turnaround time for prescription requests. It is very important that you monitor your medication levels, in order not to run out. If your doctor has authorised repeat prescriptions you may order them using the tear off portion of your last prescription. Simply tick the item(s) required and forward to the surgery. You can also request your repeat medications online if you have a username and password.

Missed appointments

On average there are **232 patients a month** who do not attend their appointments. It costs the practice an estimated **£2,172 per month**; and has a significant impact on the availability of appointments for other patients. We can now send your appointment as text messages - to sign up to this, please speak with our reception team.

Appointment availability

If you need to be seen urgently on the day, we are now releasing on line appointments each day at 7am.

Practice Closure

The practice will be closed on Wednesday 8 June from 1pm – 3pm for staff training. If you require urgent medical care during this time, please call the usual surgery number and your call will be diverted to the out of hours service.



WILDLIFE

Have you spotted a flycatcher?

Spotted Flycatchers are attractive little migrant birds which are summer visitors to UK village gardens and churchyards.

Although they breed here, they spend ten months of the year travelling between here and their wintering grounds in Southern Africa. This is an increasingly dangerous journey for them, and sadly they are in deep decline. Only some fifty pairs remain breeding in Cambridgeshire, so it's now quite a rare bird. The Cambridge Bird Club is running a survey this year to find and monitor nesting



pairs, so if you have flycatchers in your garden please let the Bird Club know by emailing spofl@cambridgebirdclub.org.uk with any information you have, including records of single birds between now and September. CVC students' 'All About Me' project with care home

Staff at Home Meadow Care Home in Toft are working with local students in an exciting initiative to help residents living with dementia.

The sixth form students, who are based at Comberton Village College, have created the 'All About Me' project with Home Meadow's Activities Coordinator Joe Ballard, to help residents unlock treasured memories from their past.

As part of the project, the students, who are learning about various aspects of health and social care, interview the residents to help capture a potted history of their past, bringing out poignant memories from years gone by. This information is then brought together in a pictorial story-board that is displayed in the residents' rooms and used by the staff as part of their care plan. Comberton Village College Sixth Form teacher Richard Waller and Joe



Ballard began working together two years ago. Their aim was to help the students learn more about dementia and the care setting, and to allow the students to contribute towards the home and the work of the team. The 'All About Me' project takes place every Wednesday, with around 15-20 students visiting Home Meadow as part of their 'enrichment sessions'.

Projects such as 'All About Me' allow the students to work with the residents by focusing on different mental and sensory skills. Memories are often confusing and out of sequence when you have dementia, so with skilful questioning, the students can help residents articulate their stories and capture this for them to use as a lasting tool. Many of the students are interested in employment in the social and healthcare industry and the project enables them to see first-hand how the

care setting operates. A key focus for the students has been understanding dementia, and seeing how this can affect individuals and their daily life.

The 'All About Me' project is just one part of a raft of initiatives led by Joe at Home Meadow, which aim to provide support to those living with dementia and for those who care for people with the condition. Joe runs a 'Community Dementia Awareness' group on the last Wednesday of every month, at which guests can hear from expert speakers and take part in workshops. He is also launching 'Walks to remember' from Friday 24th June - bi-weekly guided walks for residents around the village. which friends, family and carers from the local community are welcome to participate in. 


