HEALTH NEWS



What is your blood pressure?

When the heart contracts it forces blood into the blood vessels around the body creating blood pressure. Blood pressure can be checked and two readings provided: the systolic (top number) is the pressure on the blood vessels as the heart contracts; the diastolic (bottom number) measures the pressure on the blood vessels when the heart is at rest.

Everyone over 40 should have their blood pressure checked at least every five years up to 80 years old and at least every year after 80. Around a third of people aged 50 and two thirds of people over 75 have high blood pressure (hypertension). Often high blood pressure does not have any symptoms but it can be easily checked. Many pharmacies (including Lloyds in Cambourne) offer this, as does the Parish Nursing Service or the Medical Practice.

It is important to know if your blood pressure is high as it means the heart is working harder, putting both the heart and blood vessels under strain. It is also linked to strokes, kidney problems, heart problems and dementia.

Although medications are available to lower blood pressure, you can also take steps to keep blood pressure in a healthy range. These include losing weight if needed, reducing the amount of salt you eat, exercising regularly, eating a healthy diet, avoiding too much alcohol, cutting down on caffeine and stopping smoking.

WILDLIFE REVIEW JULY

As summer creeps on in between the showers there are lots of things to spot out and about around Cambourne Nature Reserve



now. This is the peak time for colourful insects like butterflies and dragonflies.

In the woods I have seen speckled wood butterflies dancing in the dappled shade. They are chocolate brown with pale yellow spots. If you see two twirling up together these will be two males battling for dominance to claim a territory. Out around the ponds and lakes there will be many large dragonflies, such as emperors, black-tailed skimmers or red darters, but also the more delicate and numerous damselflies, including large red, blue tailed and hopefully the rarer white-legged damselfly.

Binoculars can be quite useful when watching dragonflies as you can see them in detail from further away rather than scaring them off if you get too close.



Cambourne Church is currently following a series exploring the four Christian denominations that form Cambourne Church as an ecumenical Church. It's quite exciting to delve into the history and heritage of Christian denominations who have been faithfully worshipping Jesus Christ for centuries.

But what excites me more, as we following this new teaching series, is the history of Cambourne Church where we've seen a diverse group of Christians come together to worship God. The bible has quite a lot to say about unity but Paul perhaps put's it most strongly in addressing the Corinthian Church:

"I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another in what you say and there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly united in mind and thought."

1 Corinthians 1:10

Events in Orlando and other countries across the world demonstrate that the world is not united in 'mind and thought' but is actively engaged in hostility and conflict. It's not at all that difference is feared in itself, but that difference is feared when it impacts on the way I feel things ought to be. Paul also reminded followers of Jesus that "we have the mind of Christ" (1 Cor 2.16) and that mind is for unity around the Gospel of love and grace. This is what the church has to offer an often fractious world: that through prayer and being God's prophetic voice of unity and peace the world can have hope of another way of handling difference



BRONZE MEDAL FOR ELLENA





Some of the conversations we've been involved in recently include Hinchingbrooke Hospital merger, care at Addenbrookes and the Rosie, the future of older people's health care and adult community services, children and young people's mental health, crisis mental health care, NHS 111 and out of hours GP care.

We have also published Thriving, our report into children and young people's mental health, which is being used to redesign children and adolescents' mental health services.

We need to know how health and care is working in Cambridgeshire for you. We will listen to your experiences and share them with the people who make decisions about local services, without identifying you. We also provide an Information Service and can help you find out about health and social care services, what to do if you have a concern or complaint, organisations that can give you help or advice.
