Harriet Lee wins Silver medal in Rio!

Cambourne's very own local hero Harriet Lee has won a Silver medal at the Rio Paralympics!

Harriet, 25, who lives in Cambourne and went to Long Road Sixth Form, clinched silver in the SB9 100m breaststroke. She already has a World Championship Gold and Silver to her name from 2010 and a Paralympic Bronze from London 2012.

Harriet suffers from a rare growth disorder called Beckwith-Wiedemann syndrome and has had a tough few years since she won Paralympic bronze in 2012 in London. She was in intensive care four months before London 2012 but managed to fight back to come third in the SB9 100m breaststroke and walk away with a well-deserved medal.

Harriet continued to suffer from health issues in the years that followed but this year she has proven she is back on

form, recording a new personal best time of 1 minute 16.87 seconds in Rio!

"Rio has been an incredible experience for me," says Harriet, "and after six years of some very tough roads and journeys, to walk away with the Silver medal, PB time and new British record feels incredible." Congratulations Harriet! By Carla Greenwood

Dual Litter and Recycling Bins

Some new dual purpose litter and recycling bins are in the process of being installed in various locations around Cambourne. This will help us reduce the amount of waste being sent to landfill. Please help us by using the correct half of the bin for your waste.

Dog Fouling

Dog fouling continues to be a major issue on Cambourne's public open spaces including in the country parks, children's play areas, sports fields and on the paths and verges. A particular cause of concern for the Parish Council is the exercising of dogs on the sport pitches and the fouling that occurs in this area as a result. This is an area where both adults and children come into close contact with the grass surface and therefore are particularly vulnerable to the dangers of parasites left by dog excrement - even that which has been picked up will leave residue. The sports pitches are **NOT** a suitable area to exercise your dog.

Currently there are over 40 dog bins throughout Cambourne in addition to the numerous litter bins which have a domed roof therefore making them suitable for the disposal of bagged dog poo. There is no excuse for not picking up after your pet.

Cycling in Cambourne

Please make use of the extensive network of cycle paths, designated by red tarmac, rather than cycling on the footpaths, black tarmac. There are particular issues on Eastgate and Lancaster Gate at school run times where cyclists are causing difficulties for pedestrians on the footpath when there is a cycle path on the other side of the road. Please be mindful of pedestrians and make Cambourne a safer place for all.

HEALTH NEWS



Sugar is not just bad for your teeth

We all know that sugar is bad for your teeth but there is more to it than that. When we eat sugary foods, if we don't need the energy right away, then our body stores the sugar to use later on but can also convert it to fat. Therefore, eating too much sugar can cause weight gain which increases the risk of developing Type 2 diabetes, heart disease and various other medical problems.

Sugar does occur naturally in foods such as milk and fresh fruit and the problem is not with these but with 'added sugars'. These may appear on food labels as glucose, dextrose, fructose and syrups etc.

It is recommended that adults have no more than 30g (about 7 sugar cubes) of added sugar per day and school children no more than 19-24g (5-6 sugar cubes) depending on age.

Clearly sweets, cakes and biscuits have a lot of added sugar, but there are many less obvious foods such as cereals, sauces and ready meals and some foods, (such as some yoghurts) which claim to be low-fat but contain high levels of sugar. Fizzy drinks can be a particular problem with some cans of cola containing up to 9 cubes of sugar.

Both Change 4 life and NHS choices have advice on recipes, identifying added sugar and alternatives, which could help much more than your teeth.

Visiting our local NHS and Social Services Centres

I recently took the opportunity to spend time with some of our local healthcare providers. Conscious of the pressures on our NHS, I wanted to understand first hand how we are coping with workload locally.

The day I spent shadowing GPs at Comberton surgery highlighted to me the challenges facing the profession. The working day for a GP is very long, with limited time available for each patient, but the work they do in keeping patients away from hospitals is absolutely critical.

I also wanted to see how morale was amongst the wider junior doctor community, so I joined all the trainees at Addenbrooke's hospital. We are lucky to attract such a diverse and thoughtful group of individuals who care passionately about safeguarding our wonderful NHS.

My visit to the newly opened 'Sanctuary' in Cambridge also highlighted the importance of providing mental health services during times of crisis. The centre was welcoming, calm and staffed by an exceptionally dedicated team.

Similarly I saw the Women's Refuge Centre in Cambridge and was impressed by the absolutely vital work they are doing for women and children in distress. These centres provide support for the most vulnerable in our society and deserve our unwavering support.



The closure of 4Children on 30 August 2016 and Kids Company at the same time last year has caused some high profile children's charities to come under close scrutiny by the authorities and public alike. The undisputed challenge faced by both charities was that of funding.

So where does the responsibility for charitable funding lie?

With economic downturn, Government statutory funding for charities is inevitably reduced and society is encouraged to look increasingly to its own. Social responsibility suggests that both organisations and individuals are obliged to act for the benefit of society at large.

- FTSE 100 companies donated £2.1 billion to charity in 2015 which was actually their lowest level since 2009 reflecting their own economic and financial pressures (Corporate Giving by the FTSE100 March 2016 report, Charities Aid Foundation).
- The UK public is enormously generous and gave £9.6 billion to charity in 2015 alone (UK Giving 2015 report, Charities Aid Foundation). For the first time, children and young people has been reported as the most popular cause to give money to.

Between 1 April 2015 and 31 March 2016 the charity supported 80 families and 156 children through their unique home visiting service. **She also brought community fundraising to the top of the agenda**, encouraging everyone to utilise the power of their own personal and family networks; spread the word about the work of the charity and increase local fundraising, both individual and corporate.

Inherent in local fundraising is a strong belief that the community, individuals, local businesses, trusts and foundations will support charities such as Home-Start whose work directly impacts their friends, neighbours and workforce. **Undoubtedly, at the end of the day, we are all responsible.**

Exiles kick off with a bang



an inspiration she is. The greatest love of her life is her daughter Annie who is 6. The family is currently in the process of raising funds to adapt their house to create a downstairs bedroom and wet room for Rebecca. Without these new facilities they will have no choice but to put Rebecca into a care home. This would be disastrous for Rebecca, Mike and Annie as it would split the family up.

So far, through fundraising and friends, the family have raised almost £5,000 but there is currently a shortfall of £10,000. The building work can't be started until all the money has been raised.
