Alternatives to Accident & Emergency

Accident and Emergency (A&E) departments are under enormous pressure at this time of year and waiting times can be very long for those who do not have an emergency. Priority will always be given to those with life threatening conditions such as a suspected heart attack or stroke, chest pain, severe breathing difficulties or head injuries.

If you're not sure if A&E is the right place to go, advice can be found by calling 111. This is a free-call service open all day, everyday and you will be asked questions by an advisor which will help the decision of what to do and support you in getting the right help.

For those with less severe problems there are a number of other options available. Pharmacists are highly trained and can offer confidential support with issues such as medicines advice, diarrhoea, hay fever, allergies, skin conditions and flu jabs without needing an appointment.

A well stocked medicine cabinet can also provide much of what you need to treat minor illnesses and injuries. If you do have an illness or injury that won't go away or long term conditions make an appointment with your GP or telephone for advice.

Outside normal GP opening hours support can be found at St Neots walk in centre (open 8-9am, 6-8pm weekdays and 9am-4pm at weekends) or by calling 111.

Any budding teachers out there?

This month, we're once again in uncharted waters, both nationally with regards to Brexit and also locally in terms of the City Deal.

I have been vocal about my opposition to the City Deal plan for Busway 3 and 3A (Cambourne to Cambridge route via the Westfields.) I believe a more creative and workable solution is possible which offers better value for money than the £140million partial route currently on the table.

My other focus continues to be education. I'm not letting up on the fairer funding issue for our schools and championing a campaign to recruit more teachers into Cambridgeshire. If we have any budding teachers out there, this is your chance to find out how you can make a real difference to our children's futures.

I met more of our extraordinary talent this month when I visited The Technology Partnership in Melbourn, with the Prime Minister's new advisor on Industrial Policy. TTP flagged up a need to support British companies through sustained local growth that builds on R&D work, rather than outsourcing innovation to foreign suppliers. I'm proud of the work our local research is producing and will do everything I can to keep South Cambridgeshire as one of the brightest stars in the research, technology and science cluster.

Spook-tacular Halloween disco raises more than £500 for Tommy's charity





On Friday 28th October a spook-tacular Halloween disco, organised by local resident Louise Kirk, raised more than £500 for Tommy's Charity.

The sell-out event, held at Cambourne Hub, was hugely popular with the little ones who were treated to glitter tattoos, home-made cakes and hotdogs, alongside a disco provided by Goldmine Disco. There were also prizes given out for the best Halloween costumes.

Louise Kirk has been raising money for Tommy's charity, who fund research into miscarriages and stillbirths, for over a year now - with more than £4200 raised so far.

Louise said: "This charity is very close to my heart, having very sadly experienced five miscarriages myself. The funding for miscarriage research is just so lacking, that families who experience this, like ourselves, are told to just keep trying or it's not meant to be but it's still unknown why many miscarriages happen. This, I feel is unacceptable."

Louise's fundraising mission all began at the end of 2015 as she needed to raise £2000 to run a marathon for Tommy's. She started off by making personalised Christmas stockings and sacks which soon became very popular.

Since then she has exhibited at craft fairs, run the Cambridge half marathon and even participated in a group skydive with work colleagues and family.

Yet Louise's fundraising isn't stopping there! She is now preparing to take part in the 2017 London marathon and will continue to raise money in her local community. How secure is your home?

Burglaries are happening regularly across villages in South Cambs, usually happening in the day when properties appear to be empty, with cash and jewellery being the common things stolen.

Have you considered how secure your property is? If not, you may be interested to know that there is an online quiz designed to confirm how safe your property is.

Chief Inspector James Sutherland from South Cambs Policing team created the quiz and once completed it tells you how safe your home is.

The "bad-wolf test" takes just two minutes to complete and tells you how safe your home is from burglars. You get a score of bricks, twigs or straw.

Anyone who gets the STRAW rating is given an email contact address and encouraged to get in contact with Cambs Police so that they are given the opportunity to have an officer from South Cambs Police come out and do a free full home security survey. Try the quiz yourself to see how safe your home is: http://tinyurl.com/bad-wolf-test



Another option to consider is the Bobby Scheme.

The Cambridgeshire Bobby Scheme is a local charity which provides a service to older or vulnerable people by improving home security to reduce crime and the fear of crime.

The Bobby Scheme works with a number of partner agencies, including the Police, Fire Service, Local Authorities, Age UK and other charities.

The trained staff come out and fit a range of security devices to help people feel safe in their own homes. Devices such as window locks, door chains, personal attack alarms, window and door alarms etc.

They also provide other security advice and reassurance.

On average it costs the Bobby Scheme £130 to work at each home, so they do ask people to consider making a donation so that they can continue to provide such a great service.

This is how the scheme works: - If you have been a victim of crime and you are over 60, you can receive a free visit. - If you are 65 and over or disabled and would like a visit from the Bobby Scheme to reduce your chance of becoming a victim, they ask for a contribution of £30 towards their costs.

- Key safes supplied and fitted from £50 and £80.
- Other specialist products are available to be purchased.
