Cambourne Parish Council would like to wish the residents of Cambourne a happy and prosperous 2017.

A look back at 2016

The start of the New Year is a good time to reflect back on the work of the Parish Council during 2016. 2016 has been a year of growth with the addition of new buildings and facilities, more events taking place and expansion of the volunteer schemes. Some of the work undertaken includes:

New Buildings

At the beginning of the year the office staff were finally able to move, after 11 years, from their 'temporary' office into their purpose built accommodation giving them much needed space and storage. In April the new Cricket Pavilion on the Great Cambourne Cricket Field was completed. This new facility, as well as being the new base for the Cambourne Cricket Club, has proved to be a very popular venue for private parties and community groups and classes. The Parish Council also took over the Blue School and the hall and classrooms are available to rent.

Public open spaces and play areas

The Grounds Team carry out regular inspections on the play areas to ensure that they are safe to use and they have continued to keep Cambourne's open spaces maintained to a high standard.

Sports

2016 saw the opening of the new 3g pitch and 3 additional tennis courts. This has been fully funded by S106 money for the 950 additional dwellings in Upper Cambourne that was required to provide additional pitch facilities and grant funding from the FA, the Premier League, the LTA, Cambs LTA and the Cambourne Parish Energy fund.

Burial Ground

The Burial Ground on the High Street was opened in 2016 with the first two burials taking place. Plots are also available to pre-purchase.

Events

The Cambourne Community Fete was once again organised by the Parish Council. Despite the best efforts of the weather to put a damper on proceedings the event in September was a success attracting large numbers of people who enjoyed live music, food from around the world and various attractions. Two new events also took place in 2016. In April the first trade fair 'A Celebration of Business in Cambourne' was held to promote small businesses operating in Cambourne; members of the public that came along enjoyed a variety of discounts, free prize draws and free samples. In November the Parish Council hosted the first 'Volunteers Fair', an event that matched residents who were interested in volunteering in the community with various local voluntary organisations. Both events proved a great success and will become annual fixtures in the calendar.

The Parish Council once again organised successful visits from both the Fun Fair and the Circus and has supported both the Fireworks and Light Up Cambourne Committees to provide firework and Christmas lights displays for all to enjoy, and provided support to the Cambourne & Cambridge 10K.

Councillors

At the beginning of 2016 four councillors left the Council for a variety of personal reasons and we thank Ruth Betson, George Cooper, Sean Masters and Suzanne Smith for their contribution to the Council during their time in office. Following an uncontested election in May, Cllr Dr Shrobona Bhattacharya, Cllr Peter Hedges, Cllr Simon Krintas and Cllr Kevin McIntyre were co-opted and welcomed to the Council.

Staff

This year we have said goodbye to some staff and welcomed new ones. All the Parish Council staff have undertaken a variety of training courses during 2016 to enhance their skills and maintain their Continuing Professional Development.

This is just a small sample of the work undertaken by Cambourne Parish Council during 2016 and we look forward to continuing this work and rising to the challenges that 2017 will bring.

HEALTH NEWS



Looking after yourself

There are a number of items you can have as part of a medicine cabinet or First Aid kit which can help you treat many everyday illnesses and minor ailments.

Pain relief medications (such as paracetamol and ibuprofen) are available from pharmacies, can be used for both adults and children and are effective at treating aches, pains and colds. Antihistamine creams or medicines are useful to treat minor allergies, insect bites and hay-fever.

Medication to treat diarrhoea, constipation and indigestion can also be very useful. Pharmacists can give expert advice on which medications are suitable for you or your family, depending on any health issues you may have.

Always keep medicines out of the reach of children and only give them medication which has been specifically formulated for children. However, if symptoms do not settle, then seek further advice from a pharmacist or GP. It is also important to always take medicines as directed on the packaging as well as checking they are in date.

A supply of different size plasters, sterile dressings, bandages and medical tape, a basic thermometer and tweezers for removing splinters is a good start for your First Aid Kit.

Keeping Cambs moving

May I wish all readers a very prosperous New Year.

I was delighted to welcome the Prime Minister to Hinxton in November for her visit to the Sanger Institute Wellcome Genome Campus. Theresa May was impressed by the world-leading research taking place and announced the launch of a £2bn fund intended to keep Britain at the forefront of research and development in science and technology. I was so proud to show off our constituency!

South Cambs is now part of a 'Growth corridor' from Cambridgeshire to Oxford. Cambridgeshire received a massive infrastructure boost with the announcement of £27m for the Oxford to Cambridgeshire Expressway (£10m of which will specifically explore options within South Cambs); £110m of funding in East West Rail and a grant of £1.5m to repair our roads and potholes.

This will deliver further infrastructure improvements similar to the A14 upgrade which is *finally* underway. The next phase of upgrade works was officially started by Chris Grayling, Transport Secretary. I also met with other local MPs and Highways England at the A428 Member's Forum to ensure we keep the dualling project on track.

Community groups encouraged to apply for £5,000 funding boost

COMMUNITY groups in the area are being urged to get their applications in to try and scoop up to £5,000 in funding.

Central England Co-operative is issuing a plea to clubs, charities and schools across the area to take part in its Community Dividend Scheme.

Grants of between £100 and £5,000 are handed out every three months to a wide range of applicants.

The fund guarantees that at least one per cent of the Society's trading profit is reinvested in local communities in a bid to help projects to thrive across its trading area of 16 counties from the Midlands to the east coast.

Martyn Cheatle, Chief Executive of Central England Cooperative, said: "We handed out over £140,000 to projects in our communities in 2015 and over £2 million since the scheme was established in 2007. Our latest round of funding saw 30 groups share £70,224.

"The scheme helps to benefit a wide variety of projects, raising from a £100 boost to a £5,000 cash injection, that will make the communities that we serve a better place for our members to live, work and visit.

"I would like to urge all of our members to get in touch and put forward a community cause close to their heart for the Community Dividend scheme."

People can apply for funding by visiting

https://communities.centralengland.coop/ or heading in store to pick up an application form.

Potential applicants have to have been a Central England Co-operative member for six months, the project should be in the trading area of a Central England Co-operative store and all applications will need a referee.

So what if there was someone who came to make your life happy and enable you to flourish? 




