Don't swallow up your NHS

.....

Health Chiefs in Cambridgeshire are urging local residents to buy basic medications from pharmacies instead of getting them on prescription.

Last year your local NHS spent over £4 million on prescribing medicines that can be bought easily from local pharmacies or supermarkets. This includes £1.5 million on prescribing pain relief (paracetamol), £1.2 million to treat upset stomachs, £550,000 on antihistamines and £320,000 to treat heartburn and indigestion.

All of these medicines can be bought at local pharmacies or supermarkets for less than it costs the NHS to prescribe.

Sati Ubhi, Chief pharmacist, said: "We want the public to really think before they visit the GP, is this something that I can treat myself? Is there a medication I

can buy for this over the counter? A packet of paracetamol can cost as little as 25p for 16 tablets at a pharmacy. But if you go to your GP with your ache or pain and get a prescription, the total cost to your NHS is approximately £45*. We all have a responsibility to look after our own health and look after our NHS.

Keeping a selection of essential medications at home can help you treat common conditions at home such as colds, coughs and flu and avoid unnecessary trips to see your doctor." For further information on self-care visit http://www.cambsandpeterborough choosewell.co.uk/

*The £45 the NHS spends on a prescription if you see a GP is made up of the GP consultation time, the cost of the medication, and the dispensing fee.











BE SELF-CARE AWARE

By keeping a selection of essential medications at home you can treat common conditions in a timely manner, and avoid unnecessary trips to see your doctor and/or visits to the A&E department.

The following medications can be bought from pharmacies or your local supermarket and are generally cheaper than buying them on prescription. Speak to your local pharmacist about stocking up on

medicine cabinet essentials to treat common conditions for you and your family.

- Simple pain killers like paracetamol and ibuprofen
- Sore throat, cough, cold and flu medications
- Heartburn and indigestion remedies
- · Anti-diarrhoea medication
- · Rehydration salts
- Allergy medicines
- Pile (haemorrhoid) treatments
- First aid kit including plasters and bandages

Councillor on the run for Children with Cancer UK

Cambourne resident and Parish
Councillor Jeni Sawford is running the
Brighton Marathon for Children with
Cancer UK in memory of her sister.

"I'm lazy, hate going out in the dark, and am scared of dogs off their leads, so when I rashly decided to enter the Brighton Marathon, I soon realised that I'd set myself a whole host of challenges," said Jeni.

"I am also not a morning person, and dragging myself into my running gear and out onto the pavements of Cambourne is proving to be the hardest part so far. And yet, it's worth it. I remind myself of the disproportionately harder challenges children with cancer are facing daily – fighting the dreadful disease that still takes so many.

"I am utterly in awe of their courage and the strength of their parents and



family. My parents faced the same challenges when my eldest sister was diagnosed with childhood leukaemia.

She was 6, and had an inoperable Neuroblastoma (cancerous brain tumour). There was nothing they could do but care her for until she died. This was 43 years ago, and the world of medical science has come on leaps and bounds, but there is still so much to do.

"I feel fortunate that I have experienced the joy of running round the beautiful lakes: waving to other runners, seeing the community at play. It makes the challenge so much more bearable.

"So if you see me around Cambourne wearing brightly coloured leggings, give me a wave. And even better, if you can donate to this cause, that would be amazing too. Thank you."

Food intolerance or allergy?



We often hear about food intolerances or allergies. Food intolerances relate to difficulty digesting certain foods which then go on to cause symptoms such as bloating, abdominal pain, wind and/or diarrhoea, which usually come on a few hours after consuming the food.

The easiest way to identify the cause of a food intolerance is to keep a food and symptom diary, then exclude 'suspect' foods from your diet, one at a time, for a few weeks and see if your symptoms improve. You can then reintroduce each food gradually to see if symptoms return. Often, you can tolerate a small quantity of a food before developing symptoms. Dairy and wheat products are the biggest causes as well as food additives, preservatives and chemicals.

A food allergy is where the body mistakenly treats proteins in food as a threat which brings on a rapid, allergic reaction (e.g. rash, wheezing and itching). These symptoms can develop after eating tiny amounts of the food and be very serious. Common food allergies in adults are to fish, shellfish and nuts, and in children to milk, eggs, nuts and fish.

If you have problems with food it is useful to discuss this with a GP or a registered dietitian. A GP can also assess whether there may be another cause of your symptoms particularly if you have problems with gluten-containing foods or diarrhoea or are losing weight. 
Investing in young people



Our schools are our future and I continue to raise the issue of fairer funding in the House of Commons and directly with the Education Secretary. Cambridgeshire has been historically under-funded and is now experiencing unprecedented growth. The Government is now consulting on new national funding formula proposals and your contribution is important. I have concerns, shared by all our schools, that the proposed formula is still not quite right, so please do join me in feeding this back. For information on the changes we need, please contact my office or go to https://consult.education.gov.uk/funding-policy-unit/schools-national-funding-formula2/. The consultation needs to be submitted before the closing date of 22nd March 2017.

I'm also committed to supporting initiatives that improve mental health, particularly in our youngsters. I've been following the progress of an innovative partnership developed with the Melbourn schools cluster and an organisation called Allyance. This scheme works on early intervention strategies to support young people with mental health issues in their own school environment. The project has been so successful that Cambridgeshire County Council have approved an extension to their funding for the next year. Furthermore, I hope Allyance will be asked to roll out their initiative all across the county.

Community Listener volunteers needed for Healthwatch

HEALTHWATCH CAMBRIDGESHIRE:

This is Lizzie, she is a local Healthwatch Cambridgeshire volunteer and is helping with a new project to look at how health and care services communicate with people who have a sensory loss.

Lizzie's said: "I am a service user myself and have disabilities, so I rely on good healthcare and support, such as having a good relationship with the GP."

Listener volunteers are people like you who live or work in Cambridgeshire. You know the place you live and the people in your community. Your help is needed to talk to more people about Healthwatch and find out what care is like for them.

 You will listen to people within your local community who have used health or social care services. This may be your family, neighbours and friends, or people you meet within your local networks.

- You may visit local groups, chat with people and record what they have to say.
- You might talk to people about Healthwatch Cambridgeshire. This may involve giving a short presentation, or working on a display stand.

Healthwatch Cambridgeshire will give you training and support, as well as paying agreed out of pocket expenses.

As a Community Listener, you could also train to take part in 'Enter and View" visits to local health or care services. This is Healthwatch's legal right to visit places that provide publicly funded health or care services, to see and hear how people experience care.

CAMBOURNE VILLAGE COLLEGE:

The first half of this Spring term has been focused on staff recruitment as we prepare to admit our final cohort of 210 Year 7 pupils into the College this September. This group of pupils will complete the school, giving us year groups 7 – 11, and we have a need for further members of staff to teach them all.
