Three elections to take place on 4th May

HAVE YOU REGISTERED TO VOTE?

On Thursday 4th May 2017, we will be electing our first Mayor, our next County Councillor and also a new District Councillor.

• The Mayor, elected for a four-year term of office, will chair the newly created Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority, which will make decisions about travel, infrastructure and housing.

Having a mayor will give the Combined Authority a focal point and this person will be the contact for Central Government, working hard to ensure the organisation works closely to deliver the best results for local people.

• The 2017 Cambridgeshire County Council election is part of the 2017 local elections around the UK. The County Council looks after a budget of around £550 million to run vital services that make a real difference to people's lives: from roads and transport, social care and looking after the most vulnerable to

public health and supporting business. Boundary changes to the electoral divisions will take effect at this election after a review of the county by the Local Government Boundary Commission for England reducing the number of county councillors from 69 to 61, and electoral divisions from 60 to 59.

• Our next District Council elections were due to be held in 2018, however a by-election for Bourn ward was triggered on 15th March when Cllr Mervyn Loynes resigned due to ill health. The Bourn ward covers the villages of Bourn, Cambourne, Caxton, Croxton and Eltisley. Whoever is elected on 4 May will represent the ward

for one year, as all South Cambridgeshire District Council seats are up for election next year due to ward boundary changes.

In case you're wondering what the differences are between County Council and District Council: the district council provides services such as waste collection and recycling, local planning and housing services, environmental health services and council tax collection.

Village parking problems

CHIEF INSPECTOR JAMES SUTHERLAND, AREA COMMANDER, SOUTH CAMBS, WRITES:

I am aware from the many emails South Cambs officers receive and from Neighbourhood Panel meetings that parking is a constant concern for many residents in villages across South Cambridgeshire.

Many of you may know that I cannot prioritise parking patrols over investigating and preventing crime and responding to calls for service. In light of this, it means that my officers might not do as much parking enforcement as many of you would like.

I have been giving some thought on how we can meet your expectations on parking enforcement and I have decided that we are going to try something new. I have therefore set up an online webpage where you can report concerns about parking.

The information that you give us will go directly to me and will help us build a picture of the exact hot-spots for parking issues. I will then use this information on targeted 'crack-down' days. There is some good evidence that crack-downs work in other areas of policing so we are going to try it for parking.

For obvious reasons I will not be publicising the dates of the crack-downs in advance, but updates will be sent to you by e-cops, twitter and facebook once we have completed a crack-down day.

I am not pretending that this will solve all parking problems, however, I do think that it strikes the right balance between dealing with parking concerns and the other important work we do.



Recent media coverage about policing in villages

Some of you may have seen recent media reporting regarding our policing of villages. I would like to emphasise that we do prioritise policing of the villages but what I do ask is that my officers prioritise the 'hottest' areas within our villages. This does mean that certain areas in some villages get more attention than those villages with very low crime.

I believe this is a sensible approach to policing which most of you would agree with. The main benefit of our local policing structure is that you have your own, dedicated local resources that are responsible for policing South Cambs rather than the City.

I have sought to put as much time and effort as possible over the last three years into crime prevention events in the villages (first Op Oaklands and more recently Op Hunter). Your local officers and I work hard to give you the best, most intelligent policing service we can but if you do have any concerns please do get in touch - or come to our next round of neighbourhood panel meetings where you can join in the discussion.

Parish Council appoints community development officer

Community Development Officer

The Parish Council is pleased to announce the appointment of Liz Pinchen as Cambourne Parish Council's first Community Development Officer as of 1 March 2017.

Annual Parish Meeting

Cambourne Parish Council will be hosting its Annual Parish Meeting on Tuesday 2 May 2017. The Annual Parish Meeting is a meeting that Town and Parish Councils are required to hold as part of their accountability to the local electorate. The meeting is open to anyone but only the electorate of Cambourne may participate by asking questions and raising issues with the Parish Council. The Parish Council and its Committees will present reports on their activities over the last 12 months and local organisations, clubs and societies are invited to present reports on their activities.



Dogs off leads

We have received reports of incidents involving dogs that are off their leads, in particular in the Country Parks. One incident involved a large dog jumping up and grabbing the person by the arm with their teeth. Clearly if this had been a small child and not an adult the situation could have been far more severe. The dog's owner was some distance away and appeared unconcerned as the dog was 'only being friendly'.

We ask that if you are out walking your dog off the lead that you are mindful that not everyone is a dog lover and that dogs are kept close enough to you to be able to be recalled.

Under the Dangerous Dogs Act 1991, if a dog is dangerously out of control in a public place or private place where it is not permitted, the owner and the person who was in charge of the dog at the time is guilty of an offence. Dangerously out of control means "any occasion on which there are grounds for reasonable apprehension that it will injure any person, whether or not it actually does so." The dog does not have to have injured anyone. If you see a dangerous dog that you believe is a threat to the public please contact the police on 101.

Coeliac disease



Coeliac disease is neither an allergy nor a food intolerance but is an autoimmune condition.

In someone with coeliac disease, gluten (found in wheat, barley and rye) causes the body's immune system to attack its own cells leading to damage to the small intestine.

This can stop it working properly and means the intestine no longer effectively absorbs nutrients from food. As a result, anaemia (low iron) or low levels of other nutrients may develop. This can also cause weight loss (although not always) or poor growth in children.

Coeliac disease occurs in around 1% of the population (more commonly if family members are affected) and can develop in childhood or adulthood.

Other symptoms include gut problems, tiredness, headaches, mouth ulcers and skin problems, but it may not cause any symptoms at all.

Coeliac disease can be tested (while gluten is still in the diet) with a blood test and may require an endoscopy to check for changes to the lining of the intestine. Those who have coeliac disease must follow a lifelong gluten free diet, as eating even tiny amounts of gluten can cause severe symptoms and there are risks of long term health issues. Therefore using separate chopping boards, toasters and utensils etc is necessary to avoid contamination.

I recently met the new chief executive of the City Deal, Rachel Stopard and shared my concerns about the Cambourne to Cambridge busway proposal which would cut across green belt north of Coton. We must find an effective public transport link, but spending upwards of £140m on a guided busway that cuts through the green belt and doesn't even connect with the city centre is sheer madness to me.

I also want us to bid for some of the Government's Autumn statement money for a number of local improvements. I'm interested principally in upgrading the A505 from the M11 to the A11 including the bridge at Whittlesford and the well overdue Foxton level crossing. I've also held meetings to understand progress on plans for the A428 upgrade and Oxford-Cambridge rail link. I have also pulled together a programme board to really move things forward with a new train station at Addenbrooke's hospital.

It is almost a year since we tragically lost Jo Cox, my colleague at Westminster. On June 17/18 this year, her legacy charity will be promoting "The Great Get Together", a weekend long event celebrating friendship and community. How can we be happier?

We started this series of articles back in January and recalled the words of Jesus: "I have come that they (that's you and me) may have life and have it to the full." John 10.10.



So, our question in this 6 part series of articles exploring how we can live this 'full life' is, how can we be happier? In the past two Criers we've reflected on gratitude and act of kindness. This month is the challenging and difficult question of 'Learning to Forgive'.

It's one of those difficult realities that we as human beings must face into: that others hurt us, we hurt others and we also hurt ourselves. Various studies have shown that not forgiving has a profound physical effect on our bodies and makes us unwell.

One trap we often fall into with forgiveness is to think that in the act of forgiving we are saying to ourselves or others that what happened that cause us hurt was 'ok'. However, the act of forgiveness is actually about releasing the burden of the hurt we experienced so that a season of life, a happier season of life, may be entered into.

And this reality is at the heart of the Easter story and the Christian Faith where Jesus, knowing that the hurt we cause ourselves, others and God is too much for us to bear, took the burden of hurt away from us on the cross, allowing us to enter the fullness of resurrection life.

Allow yourselves to forgive others and yourself and grow in happiness.

They promise kids' activities like egg hunts and bunnies or Santa and elves (depending on the season); all of which are completely unbiblical and have nothing to do with the message of the time, either of Christ's birth, or death and resurrection.

We at Peacehaven do not do any of that mixing in pagan fertility stuff (bunnies, eggs etc.). We teach what the Bible says about the birth, life, death and resurrection of Christ; why it happened and what it means to you today.

Year Two at Jeavons Wood investigates the Great Fire

JEAVONS WOOD: In Year Two the children travelled back in time to 1666 to find out all about 'The Great Fire of London.'

The children started by looking at London in the present, finding landmarks and learning about the buildings. They then compared these to those of the past.
