After serving 45,000 hot drinks and cooking 11,000 bacon rolls, Jacqui Huckle is hanging up her apron as comanager of 19 the coffee house. Jacqui had no idea what she was taking on 7 years ago when former Church Minister, Rev Peter Wood, approached Jacqui with a vision of starting a café in the Church centre as a place of welcome and hospitality.

There have been many highlights over the years - one in particular was running the 19 marquee, with full menu including bacon rolls, at the 2012 Cambourne Youth fest in a deluge of rain. Despite this experience the 19 marquee continues to appear at community events, come rain or shine, throughout the year.

Rev'd Matthew Trick, the Minister of Cambourne Church, said, "The legacy Jacqui leaves at 19 is huge; she has shaped the coffee house as a place of warmth and welcome since it opened,

supporting many thousands of customers and approximately 80 volunteers.

Use of Footpaths

A gentle reminder to all that when cycling around Cambourne please make use of the extensive network of cycle paths, designated by red tarmac, rather than cycling on the footpaths (black tarmac).

Scooters should not be used on narrow or crowded pavements, or where they will cause inconvenience, fear or danger to pedestrians, especially elderly or disabled ones.

Mobility scooters should always give way to pedestrians and by law, when on the pavement, be limited to 4mph to ensure that they can adjust to other pavement users quickly enough. Please be mindful of all users of Cambourne's footpaths and make Cambourne a safe place for all.

Due to wanton vandalism by a small minority in Cambourne the toddler tower and slide at the Great Cambourne Green Play Area has been put out of action and it will take a few



weeks for the replacement parts to be manufactured. Until it can be repaired a large number of children will be prevented from enjoying the use of this play equipment.



CATHERINE PRICE Mental Health Awareness (Part 1.)



Mental Health Awareness Week is from 8th-14th May and they suggest ten tips to support your mental health. These will be covered in both this issue and next month:

 Talk about your feelings. This is not a sign of weakness but helps you take charge of your wellbeing. It doesn't have to be a 'big' conversation but practicing makes it easier.
 Keep active. Exercise can make you feel good and also aid sleep, concentration and general health. Do something you enjoy which may be going to a gym but walking, gardening or housework also count.

3. *Eat well.* A diet that is good for you physically may also be good for your mental health. Following a healthy diet with plenty of water and not too much caffeine or sugary drinks can help your mood and body.

4. *Drink sensibly*. Alcohol can be used in response to low mood but any effect this has is very temporary. As with drugs or smoking, alcohol doesn't solve problems but is more likely to create them.

5. *Keep in touch*. Connecting with people is good for you and your mental health. Other people can help support you and help you understand issues you face. Keep people around you who care for you and make you feel valued. Reference/ further information: www.mentalhealth.org.uk


well as individual lessons on a wide range of instruments.

New for 2017 was the two-leg relay (2 x 5K) - the winners






were Team 9, Reece Millard and William Dales of BRJ Run and Tri, in 37 minutes 37 seconds.
