# It's official: Cambourne residents want a swimming pool and a post office!

It was great to see so many residents attend the official launch of the Cambourne Parish Plan; there was a fantastic range of attendees from right across the community, keen to see how the community had decided Cambourne should develop over the next 10 years.

The Cambourne Parish Plan event was officially launched by newly elected Parish Council chairperson Joseph O'Dwyer, who spoke about this community led Parish Council initiative, and the hard work put in by the Steering Committee and the team of volunteers

Monkfield Medical Practice responds to Parish Plan feedback over the past two and a half years.

Ian Bavin, chairperson of the Parish Plan Steering Committee, gave a sneak preview of the summary report including details of some of the 80-plus actions that the Parish Council has adopted. Highlights included the fact that the majority of respondents to the community-wide survey (completed in summer 2016) love living in Cambourne, and in particular enjoy the numerous green areas and outdoor spaces. As expected, more entertainment options in the evenings and at weekends were popular requirements, as of course were a swimming pool and a Post Office.

### MMP: "determined to ... continue to provide excellent medical care by working more responsively and effectively"

Our practice, in line with most practices in Cambridgeshire, received a £100,000 budget cut over 4 years which commenced in 2015. This has meant that despite an increase in our patient population, we are unable to increase our staffing levels to provide the number of appointments to meet the demand.

We are however, determined to work within our financial constraints, to continue to provide excellent medical care by working more responsively and effectively. Subsequent to the survey and prior to receiving your feedback, we had identified, addressed and taken steps to improve our service which we would like to share with you:

#### **Reception team**

• Our reception team have all received training to assist in signposting calls/ appointments appropriately.

• We welcomed 3 new members to our reception team and now have a full team to manage reception duties.

#### **Clinical team**

Dr Koo, our senior partner, has returned from maternity leave and is once again at the helm of our practice,
We have welcomed Dr Cowee as a new GP partner.

• We have successfully recruited three new doctors, decreasing the need for locum doctors, ensuring continuity of care and fostering good relationships. **Communication** 

• Improved communication via text and email messaging, for example reminders of appointments etc.

• A quarterly e-newsletter alongside a monthly Cambourne Crier article to improve patient communication and promote health campaigns.

• Improved information on waiting times at the log-in screen.

• Online access for repeat medications, access to summarized patient records and appointment bookings.

• Increased availability of online routine and on the day appointments.

• A new telephone system to help direct callers to the relevant teams and increase access to the reception team.

• Our wonderful purpose built practice is a hub for community services such as physiotherapy, midwifery, podiatry, ultrasound, disability assessment, speech and language therapy, Specsavers hearing, vasectomy, continence clinic, child and family team and health visitors. This allows Cambourne residents access to these clinics within walking distance.

• Our practice has a Patient Participation Group (PPG) that meets quarterly to listen to feedback, understand patients' perspectives and how best to work together to improve our service. We warmly welcome new members - please register your interest on our website. **The future** 

We have to work together with the Cambourne community in order to provide the best possible service to all.

# **Cambourne Zipcar trial launches**

South Cambridgeshire District Council has attracted pay-as-you-go hire car scheme Zipcar to the village for their officers to use during the day - but the deal will mean that the local community can use the car in the evenings and weekends.

The Zipcar trial in Cambourne will begin on Monday 3 July and its primary focus is to see what savings the council can make using pool cars rather than paying mileage rates to its staff for using their own vehicles. It is also hoped that it will encourage staff living nearby to walk or cycle to work as they will no longer need their own cars for visits about the district.

The initial trial will be for six months with one car, but if it proves to be a success then a second car will join it for a further six months. If the trial proves to be a success then the council will look to hire

additional cars, which would then also be available for public use outside of work hours. Similarly, if there is a good take up of the public use of the cars then Zipcar may look to provide more vehicles in Cambourne for public use during the working week. ### **Additional** secondary school provision for **Cambourne West**

The Cam Academy Trust is working with the Local Authority on plans to build a further campus of Cambourne Village College, to open in September 2019. This provision is designed to meet the local need for further secondary school places.

### **CATHERINE PRICE Be active!**



"If exercise was a pill, it would be one of the most costeffective drugs ever invented," according to Dr Nick Cavill.

At any age, exercise can make you not only physically healthier but mentally healthier too. Exercise can reduce your risk of major illnesses such as heart disease, stroke, Type II diabetes, bone fractures and some cancers by up to 50%. Research also shows that physical activity can increase self-esteem, mood, sleep quality and energy, while reducing levels of stress and depression.

Everyone should try to be active every day and adults should aim to achieve at least 150 minutes of physical activity a week. This doesn't mean you need to join exercise classes or a gym but instead, making activity part of your everyday life, like walking or cycling instead of using the car.

To benefit your health, you need to be moving quickly enough to raise your heart rate, breathe faster and feel warmer. This level of effort is called "Moderate intensity activity" and you can tell if you're achieving this if you can still talk but you can't sing the words to a song. Taking part in some vigorous intensity activity (when you won't be able to say more than a few words without pausing for breath) can bring even more health benefits.

# Orchids in bloom in Cambourne Country Park

#### WILDLIFE TRUST:

JULY 2017

Cambourne Nature Reserve continues to mature and improve, and there are still new species popping up. In June orchids have been blooming in the grasslands, with bee orchids still occurring in clusters on road verges and more disturbed ground, while common spotted orchids have increased in number around the EcoPark. We



also had our first marsh orchid (pictured), also in the EcoPark on the banks of one of the seasonal ponds.

Birds have been busy nesting in the long grass on Crow Hill. Thank you for keeping your dogs under control in these areas and sticking to the paths during this sensitive time. They will be nesting up to the end of July, which is why we don't start cutting the grass in these areas until August to give the chicks time to develop and get out of the way.

We will have to start cutting some of the other areas in July, just so that we can get round them all, but we try to rotate which areas get cut first each year. It is important to cut the grass and remove the cuttings, so that the grassy areas stay as grass and don't get covered in bushes and brambles, and to help reduce the nutrient levels so that the tougher grasses don't dominate over the more delicate wildflowers. It is great to see the wildflowers spreading through all the grasslands around Cambourne and giving the butterflies, bees and other insects lots to feed on.

Do remember to let me know if you see any interesting wildlife around Cambourne, or if you need help identifying something you have seen.

# **Coping strategies** for life's challenges



This is the last in my present series of articles

exploring how you can live a happier life. As a Christian, I hold onto the promise of Jesus that He came to bring "Life in all its fullness" (John 10.10). Being happy is part of God's plan for your life and this series has been exploring practices which promote such 'happiness'. I hope you've found these articles helpful and I hope you're happier as a result.

A friend recently reminded me of the term 'life hacks', those things we can do to make our lives easier and/or better. It occurs to me there's a life hack in the bible when we're told to "cast all our anxiety onto God because he cares for us" (1 Peter 5:7). For Christians, this is a foundational coping strategy, primarily expressed through the practice of prayer. But it also has relevance for non-Christians too: 'a problem shared is a problem halved' and I'm sure beyond pithy phrases, you've experienced the renewed ability to cope from just having coffee with a good friend. So, to conclude this series, here are some strategies for coping 'well' through the challenges life throws at us: Tell Someone - Don't try and bottle up your problems, find a friend, colleague or family member you can trust. Keep perspective - Remember that you are not defined as a person by your thoughts and emotions around present challenges. Your life is broader than the present.

Be humble - There are some challenges we simply can't face without the support of doctors and counsellors, don't let pride prevent you from seeking this help.

stove in the courtyard, team building games in the playground, singing songs around the campfire and making a sleepover photo frame.

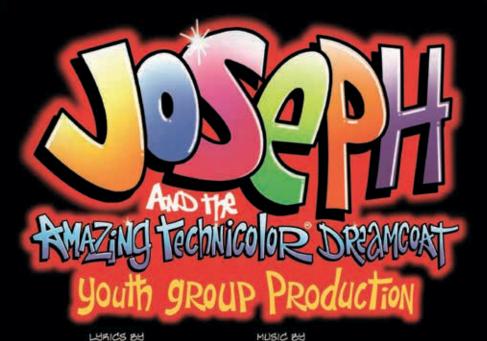

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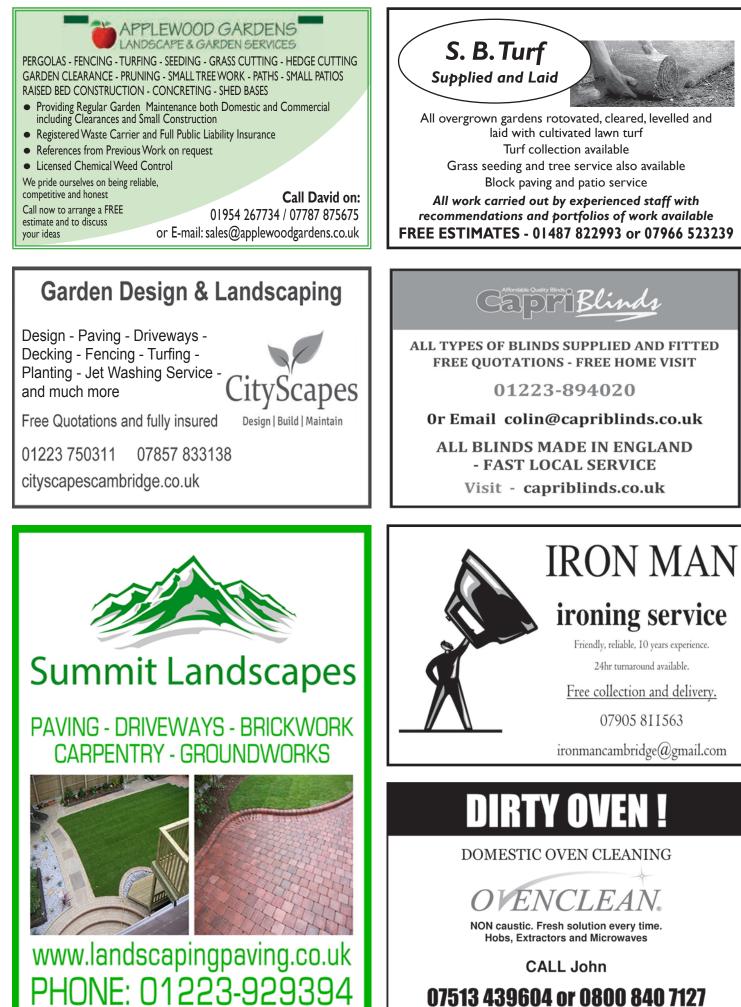

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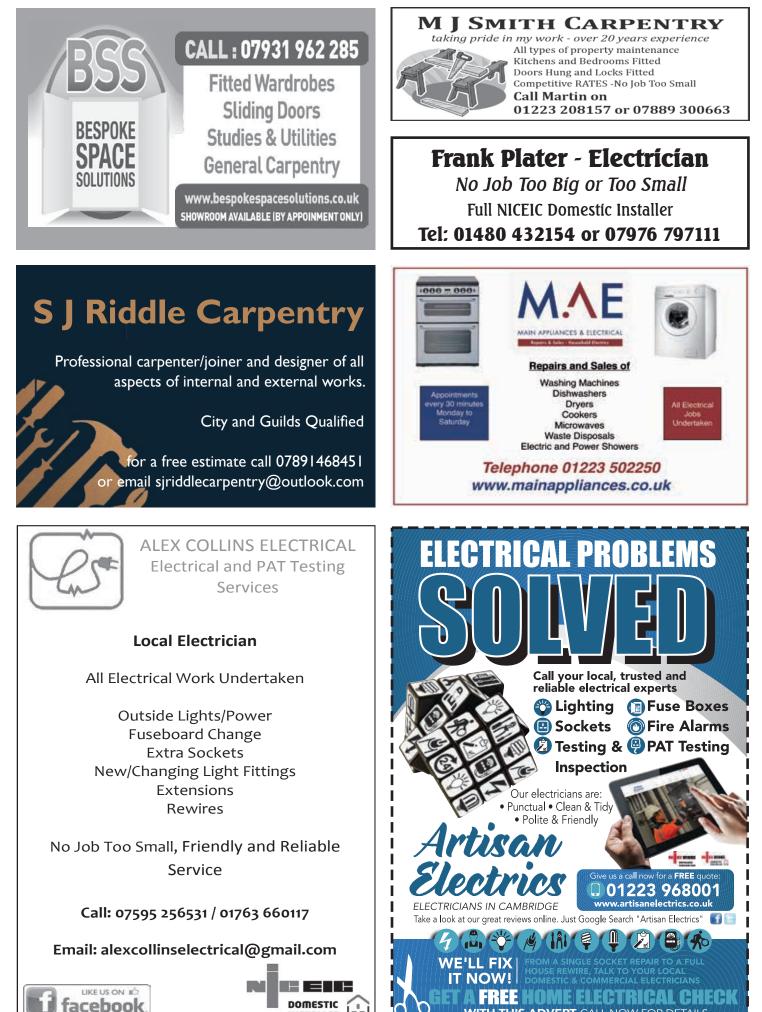
