Green spaces are safe from houses

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR RUTH

BETSON has addressed local concerns that certain green spaces in Cambourne are to be 'deleted' from the Local Plan and housing potentially developed in those areas. "None of the areas in question have been removed from the Local Plan," she said. "They were never in the Local Plan because Local Green Space (LGS) is a new designation.

"A list of green areas was proposed by the Parish Council, supported by both the District Council and the developers, but the sheer acreage involved is too much for LGS designation." (See p2 for more details)

"However, all the green space is or will be owned by either the Parish Council or the Wildlife Trust and various covenants applied mean that no houses can be built on these spaces."

Cllr Betson added that the golf course which was originally proposed has not been developed because, so far, "no business has found it commercially viable."

Protecting our green spaces

South Cambs District Council recently commenced a consultation on the modifications to the Local Plan. The main issue is the new designation of Local Green Space (LGS). The Parish Council (with the support of the developers and District Council) had tried to get a large number of open spaces designated as LGS, but the Planning Inspector was concerned that too large an area was being designated and was looking at removing most of them throughout the district.

The Parish Council and District Council argued and were able to get 8 out of the 19 sites within Cambourne agreed as LGSs. Some of the other sites have been designated as a Protected Village Amenity Area which has its own protection against development.

SC-MM268g and SC-MM268h (the western valley between Great and Upper Cambourne) were two of the areas removed as these had not been developed as a country park/ golf course yet and were of an excessive size. The two largest areas are not down to be developed and have a planning condition on them that states that if the area is not developed as a golf course it has to be laid out as a Country Park. These areas, like all the other areas, are or will be in the ownership of the Parish Council or the Wildlife Trust.

The new Local Plan will start to be reviewed in 2019 and the Parish Council can try and get the LGSs extended to further areas as part of the review and would not request any designated areas to be removed.

Play Area Update

The works to provide accessible swings at the play areas will be starting mid March. At the same time, the outdoor gym will be installed close to the play area on Great Cambourne Cricket Green.



The post office service could be extended

The mobile Post Office has proved a useful service and although there have been a few technical issues, it has been well used and often has queues. The Parish Council is installing a shelter to give refuge to customers during inclement weather. We are lobbying to have the service extended further.

Informal MUGA

The new informal basketball and football court to be constructed between Cambourne Soul and the skatepark will commence mid March 2018.

Skatepark

Following the removal of sections of the skatepark, the Parish Council is looking at applying for grants to replace the sections removed and will be holding a meeting for skatepark users to get their views on the replacement. Cambourne Crier supporting the local community

THE FIRST INFORMAL ISSUE OF **CAMBOURNE CRIER** was photocopied, stapled and distributed by community development at South Cambs District Council for the Christmas issue 1999, and followed by a few more issues at three month intervals.

There were no more than a few homes at this time. A small grant to cover 6 months of funding (£400) was awarded by the District Council to a group of residents who voluntarily produced the start of the more formal Cambourne Crier - and ultimately the magazine we have now.

Not many adverts were required to cover initial costs, as only eight pages or so were printed each month. In the years since, the magazine has seen significant growth in size and numbers distributed - now up to 32 pages and 4,400 copies.

Cambourne Crier has never failed to appear in all those years, although the odd hiccup has caused delays now and then!

This production has required significant amounts of advertising to cover costs, and during the first seven or eight years before costs escalated a reserve fund was established and community donations were provided. Community donations continue to take place to this day even though printing costs have increased.

The Crier team remain committed to donating money to local groups and

organisations. We are proud of the fact that since January 2007 we have donated well over £25,000 to local groups and causes.

A daytime community Classical Yoga and Relaxation class is the latest project to be awarded a Cambourne Crier Community Fund grant. The money will enable essential mats block and blankets to be purchased and cover insurances too.

In partnership with the registered social landlords, children's services and the Parish council, there will soon be a free to all yoga class at The Blue School suitable for all abilities. More information will be available in our next issue.

Cambourne Crier is produced every month by a group of volunteers and delivered by a team of young people who live in the three villages.



Cambourne resident teams up with police to call time on knife crime

POLICE IN CAMBRIDGESHIRE held an amnesty in February as part of a national initiative to tackle knife crime.

Starting on Monday 12 February, members of the public were able to hand in knives without prosecution as part of Operation Sceptre, a week long amnesty.

A bin was located at the police station in Cambourne, among other locations.

Figures released by Cambridgeshire Constabulary show that recorded knife crime within the county has risen by more than 25 per cent which is in line with a national increase.

Between 1 September last year and 30

January there have been 87 recorded crimes where a knife or sharp instrument has been used.

There has also been a 16 per cent increase in the

number of crimes of possession of a knife from 167 in 2016 to 194 in 2017.

Cambourne resident Helen Frazier's son, Andrew Hasler, 28, died on 8 January, 2017 after he was stabbed 17 times at his home in St Ives.

She said: "Think about the parents, brothers, sisters, family, friends, the whole community. No parent should ever have to bury their child. I know it happens through illness but something that's as needless as this, it shouldn't happen.

"You can carry a knife and never use it but how do you know you won't."

Andrew had previously lived and worked in Cambourne - he has left his mark with his installations of broadband.

Helen added: "When I was approached by the police this year, I felt there was something I could contribute to the campaign against the increased trend of knife crime. It was time to act."

The last amnesty was held in October and resulted in 90 bladed items being

recovered.

Chief Inspector Marcia Pringle said: "People carrying knives, particularly young people who carry knives, do so without understanding the

real consequences of using them, the devastation it can cause to those who are seriously injured or fatally wounded, nor the impact on the families who have lost loved ones. Helen's story illustrates the heartbreak and overwhelming grief they experience every day and will do so for the rest of their lives. A grieving mother who would never have experienced this if

it wasn't for the fact that the perpetrator was in possession of a knife.

"This knife amnesty was an opportunity to protect our loved ones from serious harm or a life changing conviction.

"If you have a son or a daughter, brother or sister, have that conversation with them, ask them if they carry a knife and encourage them to stop. Encourage them to hand their knife in. That one conversation could be life changing and could be enough to save a life."

The surgery has been doing its very best to keep up with demand and patients have, on the whole, been very understanding, thinking carefully about how urgently they need to be seen and making use of their local pharmacy and 111 for advice.

We are now coming into spring time again which, along with the longer, warmer days, brings other issues such as hay fever and asthma. Did you know that your local pharmacy can offer advice on dealing with seasonal allergies and medication can be bought over the counter? There are lots of different treatments for allergies, such as eye drops, nasal sprays and tablets. There are also many different types of tablets depending what works best for you. A pharmacy will have all the information for the effective treatment of hay fever.

If you are asthmatic, do attend regular asthma reviews so that you make the most of your asthma medications. If you're finding you have to use your reliever more often then it may be necessary to review your preventer with our asthma nurses.

We'd like to thank everyone for welcoming our new staff, we've had quite a few new starters this winter and we look forward to the new shape of our surgery family.

Please don't forget that your surgery appointments are precious, we are still getting a lot of patients failing to attend their booked appointments. If you can't make your scheduled appointment, please do remember to call in and cancel.



X3 bus service and law court changes

I recently met with the Whippet bus company regarding concerns about the reliability of the X3 bus which serves Papworth, Cambourne and surrounding area. Whippet reassured me that the issues of reliability passengers experienced towards the end of last year had been resolved. But they also indicated that the service costs more to run than the revenue it generates, so it is vital people use the service to ensure its future.

As Royal Papworth Hospital will be relocated to Addenbrooke's later in the year, there must be a win-win situation: staff will need to get to the campus and the bus needs more customers!

The Ministry of Justice has launched a consultation on the closure of Cambridge Magistrates' Court. There is a proposal that the work of the Court would be transferred to Cambridge County Court, Huntingdon Law Courts, Peterborough Magistrates' Court or Cambridge Crown Court. Antibiotics and Antibiotic resistance

Antibiotics are a group of medicines used to treat infections caused by bacteria and some parasites. They will not work against viruses such as colds or flu, or fungal infections such as thrush. Therefore doctors are not likely to offer you antibiotics for these types of problems. Only ever use antibiotics that have been prescribed for you and always follow the instructions from your doctor and on the leaflet to make sure they work as well as they can.

After a few days of antibiotics you may feel better. However, it is likely that some of the problem bacteria may still be in your body. If you stop taking the antibiotics too soon, there is a chance these bacteria can change and stop responding (become resistant) to the antibiotic. As the bacteria are passed on from person to person and move around the community, it may be that antibiotics will stop being effective. Because antibiotics have been overused in the past and not taken properly some bacteria have become resistant and are harder to treat for example MRSA and other 'Superbugs'. For this reason, doctors are unlikely to suggest antibiotics unless absolutely necessary, and it is incredibly important to take the antibiotics correctly for the full number of days you were told (in other words complete the course).
