

New pub and hotel could open in 2019

DIRECTOR OF NEWCREST

ESTATES, Duncan Mason, has confirmed that a major planning application has been submitted for the prominent 'Gateway Site' in Cambourne - for a McMullen family pub/restaurant overlooking Lake Lambert and a 134 bedroom hotel behind it.

Newcrest have worked closely with both operators and the hotel has been specifically designed with only a basic food and beverage offering to encourage its guests to use the wider 'town centre' dining and drinking outlets. The application is due to be determined in May and, if successful, these new facilities should be open for business in late 2019.

The boost in customer footfall this will bring has enabled Newcrest to progress with its High Street plans and, in February, it acquired the two acre site to the south of the highway to add to the prominent site they already owned to the north of the road. Newcrest is now in early discussions with South Cambs District Council to design a comprehensive mixed use development of their combined land-holding to include some 10-15 new shops in a traditional high street format, with more

than 100 residential apartments above and around these.

The development would necessitate the relaying / widening of the High Street road surface.

The formal pre-application process is expected to commence in 8-12 weeks.

Separately, Newcrest has confirmed that building work on the new Co-op in Upper Cambourne should be completed by mid-June. Allowing 8-10 weeks for the internal fit-out by Co-op, the store is expected to open some time in August, or early September.

Cricket club wins Cambs' Best Kept Wicket trophy

CONGRATULATIONS TO CAMBOURNE

CRICKET CLUB and the Parish Council's Ground staff on winning the Best Kept Wicket trophy. Awarded by Cambridgeshire Cricket Association for the best kept ground in the CCA Senior League (which includes 30 clubs from across Cambridgeshire). This has been a team effort lead by Warren Bourne Head Groundsman, Kevin Taylor Groundsman, Chris James and Danny White (both volunteers for Cambourne Cricket Club) who ensured the ground and wicket were at their best before every match. The award of the trophy is important as it is the result of the visiting teams and umpires assessing the quality of the ground when they play in Cambourne.

Playground Improvements

The installation of the accessible swings in all the play areas commenced on the 19th March 2018. At the same time an accessible roundabout is being installed in the Great Cambourne play area next to Greenhaze Lane. On the 2nd April, they should have started the construction of the informal MUGA which will be marked for football and basketball. All the works should be completed (subject to weather) by the end of April.

Swimming Pool

The S106 for West Cambourne has a provision of £3.5m for indoor sport. This includes the possibility of a swimming pool. The Parish Council is keen to provide a swimming pool in Cambourne as it recognises the need and desire of the residents, but has to take into account not only the capital cost of building the pool, but also the ongoing maintenance, running and replacement costs. Swimming pools throughout the country are subsidised by the Council that owns them - from £100,000 per year upwards. Even with a £100,000 subsidy this would mean an additional £26.50 per year (Band D) on every household's Council tax. If we also set aside the replacement cost over 10 years this would add a similar cost each year. The S106 funding is due to be provided by the developers prior to the occupation of the 1000th dwelling in West Cambourne. This is anticipated to be in 6-7 years' time. The Council will be working on the viability of the swimming pool at the Sports Centre to see if we can make it financially feasible.

2018 District Council Elections: Revised ward boundaries to see Cambourne elect three councillors

SOUTH CAMBRIDGESHIRE

RESIDENTS will be able to vote on 3 May 2018, electing 45 District Councillors to represent 26 newly revised wards.

Bourn Ward, of which Cambourne was previously a part, is splitting three ways. Bourn will be part of Caldecote ward; Caxton, Croxton & Eltisley will be part of Papworth Ward; and Cambourne becomes a ward in its own right - with three councillors.

The new boundaries reflect the growing population of Cambourne.

Nominations to stand for one of the

councillor positions must be submitted by 4pm on 6 April. A district council hustings

has been arranged for 7pm on 24 April, in the Hub meeting room, where you will be able to hear from all candidates in attendance.

6 April is also the deadline for nominations for Cambourne Parish Council. If more than 19 nominations are received then there will also be a Parish

Council election on 3 May. If fewer than 19 nominations are received, then all of those standing will be automatically elected and the council will co-opt to fill the remaining vacancies.

You must register at least 12 working days before the poll. Visit www.gov.uk/register-to-vote to find out more.

If you are going to be away at the time of an election, you can choose to vote by post or proxy. You must already be

New phone system launched at Monkfield Medical Practice

MONKFIELD MEDICAL PRACTICE launched a new phone system on 14th of March. The phone lines had to be disconnected for a couple of hours but patients were very understanding about the short hiatus.

The new phone system is designed to help streamline your calls and take you to the most appropriate person to resolve your query. Calls will be answered more quickly and wait time should dramatically reduce.

The new system will have five options to choose from, each leading to an appropriate desk which will be open at certain times of the day.

Option 1 will take you to Prescription Queries which will be open between 9:30am and 12:30pm.

Option 2 will take you to Test Results which are open 12:30pm to 2:30pm.

Option 3 will take you to the Choose and Book E-Referral helpdesk which will be open from 10am – 12 noon & 3-4pm. **Option 4** will take you to the Forms and Fees, private letters helpdesk which will be open between 10am and 5pm.

Option 5 is your Appointments line which is open 8am – 6pm.

This system, when brought into practice at other surgeries, was found to reduce waiting times, filter urgent calls and reduce the number of calls needing to be made to the practice.

Infrastructure changes for a thriving region

I continue to focus on promoting infrastructure improvements in our region. This includes the new railway station at Addenbrooke's, the A428 expressway and the East West Rail link. I am determined to ensure these improvements are brought about as quickly as possible.

Motor Neurone Disease

Motor neurone disease (MND) describes a group of diseases affecting nerves called motor neurones in the brain and spinal cord that tell your muscles what to do. Messages from the nerves gradually stop reaching the muscles, causing them to become weak and stiff.

MND affects everyone differently and people may develop problems with mobility, muscle weakness, stiff joints, communication problems, swallowing difficulties, breathing problems and changes to feelings or behaviour. However not all symptoms affect everyone, or in the same order or at the same speed. The senses are not usually affected so people can continue to see, hear, taste and smell. and feel sensations.

MND is not common and it is unclear what causes it to develop but there is considerable research so knowledge about the disease is constantly advancing.

MND is life-shortening but there is much that can be done to manage symptoms to help achieve the best possible quality of life: "However difficult life may seem, there is always something you can do and succeed at. It matters that you don't just give up." (Stephen Hawking).

Exciting developments at Cambourne Village College

CAMBOURNE VILLAGE COLLEGE: Our primary focus throughout the spring term has been on ensuring that our Year 11 pupils, the first cohort at CamVC to sit any public examinations, are as well prepared as possible for their GCSE examinations this summer. Alongside this, there has been a great deal of further activity, which you can read about in News@Cam, accessed via our website www.cambournevc.org. There are also developments taking place as the College continues to expand to meet growing local demand.

We are working with the Local Authority on a design for a second campus for Cambourne Village College, which is expected to open in September 2023. We are looking for the best model to run an enlarged and integrated school across two adjacent campuses. In the meantime, a further wing of the school is being planned to open in September 2019, to accommodate the local demand for more secondary places. In the future, we hope to use the new wing to open a Sixth Form for Cambourne, to be run in conjunction with that at Comberton VC. This plan is still in its early stages.

Alongside these developments, ways to improve vehicular access to the College and Cambourne & Hardwick Primary School are under review. As always, we are working hard to uphold the highest educational standards in an environment of constant development.

FOODBANK (CCFB) is held in The Old Blue School every Thursday 10am to midday. CCFB is part of the Trussell Trust network of foodbanks which offer emergency food boxes for individuals and families. Each box is designed to feed a family for three days. CCFB can also offer gas/electricity top ups for clients with a pre-payment meter in their homes.

For clients to access the Foodbank they must be in receipt of a food voucher.

In the Cambridge area there are 140 professional agencies able to issue such vouchers. These include

GPs, schools, children's centres, Housing Associations, SCDC, Cambourne Church etc. Each client is limited to three vouchers in a six month period as the Foodbank is designed to help people out of crisis situations. We also give advice on where to obtain longer term support. Clients get a warm (nonjudgmental) welcome, time and space to talk if they'd like to, and also refreshments.

If you know of someone who is struggling with food/fuel poverty, do urge them to speak to a health/social professional who will be able to help by issuing a food voucher. For more info visit cambridgecity.foodbank.org.uk or come by the Old Blue School on a Thursday morning. The CCFB website has a list of particular items that it is short of, so refer to that if you'd like to donate food. All food must be in date and in unopened packets/tins; we are unable to take donations of fresh food. Donations of toiletries are also very welcome. Thank you very much!
