# Cambourne Parish Energy Fund

The Solar Panels installed using the funds from the s106 for the 950 extra dwellings in Upper Cambourne have been in operation for six years now and have produced 1,300,440 kWh of electricity which has reduced the running cost for 14 community buildings. It has also reduced the CO2 emission by 741,245 kg (741 tons). The installation generates an average of 216,740 kWh per year - enough to produce electricity for 55 dwellings each year.

OWL Bikes will be offering minor repairs and services as well as having a range of second hand bikes with them. # New outdoor gym opened in Cambourne vandalised within days

#### A NEW OUTDOOR FITNESS AREA

was unveiled in Great Cambourne last month, but within days of its opening, one of the pieces had been set on fire.

The 11 new pieces of fitness equipment have been installed by All Play next to the Great Cambourne Cricket Wicket, either side of the path to the play area.

There are information boards explaining how to use each piece of machinery. To get the best enjoyment out of the equipment, users can download a free fitness app from www.norwelloutdoorfitness.com.

Speaking about the vandalism, a spokesperson for Cambourne Parish Council said: "Unfortunately, one of the

new pieces of outdoor gym equipment was set on fire making it unusable until it can be repaired.

"This particular piece of equipment is worth

around £3,000 and was only opened a few days before. A very small minority has ruined the enjoyment for many children as the piece of equipment damaged is the 'Junior Strider'."

The Parish Council would like to thank the emergency services for their quick response and putting the fire out.

# Digging Deep to climb Mount Kilimanjaro and raise £3,000

Matthew Moore, an 18-year-old resident of Cambourne and a student at the University of Birmingham is planning to climb Mount Kilimanjaro in Tanzania this August in a bid to raise £3,000 for charity.

"In November 2017, shortly after I had started my first term at University, I was given the

opportunity to work with the charity Dig Deep," said Matthew.

Dig Deep works predominantly in

Kenya, digging wells, building toilets, and providing health education to poor families. They provide a rough template for the donations they receive, suggesting that a donation of £25 could provide a child with a hygienic toilet in a school, or £100 could give health education to the population of a small village.

Since their founding in 2007, Dig Deep has directly influenced the lives of 27,000

people in Kenya, and their training in the use of clean water has spread even further.

"My goal is to raise £3,000 for the work they do, and by climbing Mount Kilimanjaro with them I hope to help raise awareness of this work," Matthew added.

"I am very excited for this opportunity as I

have thoroughly enjoyed previous charity trips I have been on, such as a mission trip to Romania, and I also have a passion for

hiking and being in the mountains.

"I hope this article will bring attention to the charity and promote my fundraising page - every donation is appreciated and can make a huge impact somewhere else in the world. Thank you for your generosity!"

#### Ramadan: a month of fasting and introspection

**CAMBOURNE CRESCENT:** Muslims in and around Cambourne will be observing Ramadan from 16th May. Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar, and a time when Muslims across the world will fast during the hours of daylight.

Fasting is intended to help teach Muslims self-discipline, self-restraint and generosity. It also reminds them of the suffering of the poor, who may rarely get to eat well.

Cambourne Crescent will be making an extra effort during Ramadan to help the needy locally through the food bank operated by the Church. The donations in March and April have been gratefully received.

During Ramadan, special evening prayers known as Taraweeh are performed in congregation. The prayer can be very long (well

over an hour), during which one stands upright to read from the Qur'an and perform many cycles of movement (standing, bowing,



prostrating, and sitting). This year Taraweeh prayers will be performed at the Hub Community Centre every night from 10:30pm onwards. There will also be a communal breaking of the fast on the 26th May 2018 at Cambourne Village College as well as an Eid prayer and Eid party.

All are invited to attend in these celebrations.

## Going abroad? Plan ahead

......

MONKFIELD MEDICAL PRACTICE: Summer is fast approaching and many of you will be setting off on your travels. You should start thinking about travel health at least six weeks before you go. There is a shortage of certain vaccinations which means you may well have to attend the travel clinic in town, so give us as much notice as you can. Please contact the surgery at least 6 weeks before you travel, sooner if possible. You will initially be offered a telephone consultation with a nurse followed by a consultation for the required vaccinations and holiday advice.

For the most recent health and safety advice for the country you're travelling to, please visit <a href="www.gov.uk/browse/abroad">www.gov.uk/browse/abroad</a> and <a href="travelhealthpro.org.uk">travelhealthpro.org.uk</a>. Find out in advance what travel vaccinations apply and remember that if malaria is a risk you will need to start treatment well in advance of your travel date.

Prepare a travel health pack which includes pain relief medication, sunscreen, antiseptic and plasters. Consider taking condoms to avoid the risk of buying fake, potentially unsafe brands abroad.

Sun protection is extremely important. The label should always have the letters UVA and at least four-star protection. The SPF should not be lower than 15.

Travel insurance is essential, make sure your policy covers your destination and the duration of your stay as well as any activities you might do. When travelling in Europe, make sure your EHIC insurance card is valid.

Travelers who are on a strict medication timetable, such as diabetics, should seek advice from a pharmacist.

The festival is marked by family time, preparing colorful auspicious items and viewing these as the first thing on the Vishu day (Vishukkani). Vishukkaineetam is the first gift given to children on the day of this festival.

The event started at 6:30pm with Vishukkanifollowed by cultural programs. Some great performances from kids and adults. The event was a great success in terms of participation/performance and all of them enjoyed the cultural programs. A Three course meal was served at the end. Indian students from Cambridge University also participated through out the celebration and they really enjoyed their first Vishu celebration in Cambridge.

# Youth Work makes a difference

Cambourne Youth Partnership supports young people in our community to overcome challenges and live fulfilling lives. We engage with around 100 young people each week through a variety of activities, but I would like to share two stories to show that youth work has made a difference in the lives of our young people.

- "When I moved here I didn't have any friends. I found new people and had a chance to socialise through the youth club. The club gives me a chance to have a breather from the outside world. You can talk to youth workers about anything.

I don't feel scared about saying stuff to them, because with youth workers you can get thoughts out that you don't normally get out."

- "I was bullied a lot, and the youth club helped me to rebuild my confidence and make more friends. I can be be myself and relax. The youth club allows you to forget about the stress and work. A lot of my friends built up their confidence because they've all struggled through the same things as me. The mentoring I received helped to get things off my chest."

# **Mental Health Awareness - Stress**

Mental Health Awareness Week is the 14th-20th May and the focus is on stress.

The body's stress response is a survival strategy to keep us safe when we feel under threat. Although this is helpful in a genuinely threatening situation, if our bodies continue to produce this response on a very regular basis it can make us unwell.

Chronic stress increases risk of addictive and destructive behaviour, of developing anxiety, depression and other mental health problems. It can also increase risk of physical health problems

including heart disease, insomnia, muscle pain, raised blood pressure and problems with our digestive and immune system.

The Mental Health Foundation promote various community events to encourage mutual support and to break down stigma by talking about mental health. Tea & Talk and Curry & Chaat are events that can be arranged by anyone keen to help and more details can be found on their website.

Much can be done to combat stress: exercise, talking to someone you trust, helping others, allowing yourself to take some 'me time' and being creative in your own way can all help.

#### **CAMBOURNE ELECTRONICS AND ROBOTICS**

**CLUB (CERC)** was started in November 2017 and the first demonstration of the projects based on BBC Micro:bit was made by the first batch of 7- to 14-year-olds on 14th April, in the Old Blue School.

The CERCians completed around 30 different projects like automatic street lighting, automatic braking, flood detection and direction finding.

The event provided an opportunity for the CERCians to communicate science, create new projects, improve their creativity and gain confidence. All participants received a certificate of

CERC has now started a second batch to accommodate more members. The club is free and open to all. The sessions are held alternate Sundays in the Old Blue School where the CERCians learn how basic electronics components work, how different sensors can be used to design various projects, learn to communicate science and do group projects. Admission is free of charge and it will give a rare opportunity to learn about Cambourne's history and examine the significant archaeological finds that were discovered.

The museum has been designed and curated by the students and will not only provide explanations of Cambourne's archaeological history, but will also include several interactive activities. The students will be on hand to showcase the artefacts on display and explain the role they played in the excavation. Artwork inspired by the excavation from Jeavons Wood Primary School students will also be on display.

# Fairtrade sale at the Vine Primary School



**CAMBOURNE CHURCH:** April has marked the end of an era for Cambourne Church. Its long term

church warden, Ian Jarvis, is "retiring" from that particular role at the age of 85.

Ian and his wife Jill moved to Cambourne in 2001. They were visiting the concept centre when they had a chance meeting with Peter Wood (Cambourne Church minister at the time). They had a discussion about wanting to be part of the church in Cambourne and three days after moving in Peter approached lan about being part of a team to help create the first temporary church and community space in Cambourne (later known as The Ark).

From the very beginning of his time in Cambourne, Ian knew God had brought him here for a reason. The way his experience as a civil engineer was put to use in helping to build the early community in Cambourne was no coincidence.

lan says that one of the joys of serving as church warden over the years has been working closely with so many people in the community to put down strong roots and to create a great community spirit.

He is passionate about the church being very much part of the community and remembers fondly the days when the Ark needed to be fitted out in order to be able to be used as a community space. A team of people offering so many varying gifts and skills came together at the right time.

To lan, gaining more experience in a particular area always means sharing that expertise for the benefit of others. When the Cambourne Hub Planning Group was set up in preparation for hiring out the newly built Hub Community Centre, Ian was happy to volunteer. Once the Parish Council took over the running of The Hub, lan enjoyed working closely with John Vickery and others.

As well as his strong links with others in the community, Ian has been such a gift to those at Cambourne Church in his role

as church warden. His dedication, on a more or less daily basis, has been awe-inspiring. From the days of The Ark onwards lan has been the person who has turned his hand to most fixing,

fitting and maintaining matters. He sets up for church services every Sunday morning and has done for 17 years! In addition to this he was instrumental in working with the church architects, planners and builders in the lead up to the present church building and continues to be so.

For those who have worked alongside lan over the years it has been a huge privilege and a humbling experience, and we wish him well in everything.
