Meet your new Cambourne Councillors

There are different layers of Local Government working for you in Cambourne and each has different responsibilities. If you're confused about who does what, here's a quick guide.

The Parish Council looks after Cambourne's assets (including community buildings and play areas) and provides these amenities and services using the Parish part (the precept) of the Council tax you pay. Parish Councillors are volunteers who are elected every four years.

cambourneparishcouncil.gov.uk

The District Council looks after environmental services, housing, benefits, planning, etc for South Cambs. These are the services that impact residents on a personal and daily basis. scambs.gov.uk Cambourne has three District Councillors. The County Council looks after the highways (including potholes, lighting and flooding), school admissions, adult social care, libraries, etc for Cambridgeshire.

Cambourne's newly elected district councillors are Gavin Clayton, Ruth Betson and Shrobona Bhattacharya - we asked them to introduce themselves...

Brownies raise more than £500 with 'Walk for Water'

2ND CAMBOURNE BROWNIES raised an amazing £522.50 by participating in a sponsored Walk for Water on Thursday 3rd May to raise awareness and funds for the charity WaterAid.

Brownies, leaders and parent volunteers braved a 2.2km round trip to a pond in the nature reserve near Crow Hill, each collecting a full 4 pints (roughly 2kg) plastic bottle at the half-way point and walking the remaining 1.1km back to base.

In some developing countries, many women and children walk long distances, to the nearest well, carrying water weighing as much as 20kg (equivalent to the average airline allowance). One in nine people in the world do not have clean water close to home.

In highlighting their plight and experiencing just a small fraction of the journey many children face each day to collect water, the Brownies have learned to appreciate how important access to clean water is to all of us.

We would like to thank Cambourne Parish Council for their help in transporting all the water to the collection point and to all the parents, sponsors and of course, Brownies for their generosity for this incredibly worthwhile cause.

WaterAid works in 28 countries, providing clean water, decent toilets and good hygiene to communities in need. They are rolling out their Walk for Water in 2018 and would be delighted to hear from other community groups who are interested in setting up their own walk. 

The sun and skin cancer

It is lovely that the summer is here but keeping safe in the sun will also help to protect you from sunburn and the risk of skin cancer. Advice includes wearing protective clothing and sunglasses, keeping in the shade between 11am and 3pm, using UVA sunscreen and keeping babies and young children out of direct sunlight.

There are three types of skin cancer which all look different but melanoma is the deadliest type.

Always tell your doctor about any changes to your skin including bumps, lumps, sores that do not heal, new moles or changes to existing moles including itching, bleeding or crusting. The

following changes to a mole are warning signs that can suggest a problem:

Asymmetry - two halves of the area differ in shape.

Border - the edges of the area may be irregular or blurred.

Colour - this may be uneven with different shades of black, brown and pink.

Diameter - most melanomas are at least 6mm in diameter but they can be smaller.

Elevation or Enlargement - a melanoma may often change size or shape and may become raised above the skin's surface.

If you notice any of these changes please talk to your doctor. If in doubt, check it out!

Alzheimer's Research UK currently has more than 60 research projects and they are determined to tackle this Himalayan problem today's society faces.

"Besides having completed the event and the fundraising, I thoroughly enjoy long distance running, trail running," Daniel added.

Year 2 nurtures chicks at Monkfield Primary School

MONKFIELD PARK PRIMARY SCHOOL: Key Stage 1 had a really busy start to the Summer term.

Year 1 commenced their new topic 'Dinosaurs and Darwin' and went on an exciting trip to Cambridge to visit the Sedgwick Museum. There they learnt all about dinosaurs and fossils. Did you know that a T. Rex's brain was smaller than its teeth? They also looked at a model of an enormous fossilised spider, a hippopotamus skeleton and a room full of crystals.

In Key Stage 2, lots of children have also been making healthy foods including reduced sugar fruit muffins and fruit smoothies – delicious!

Are you interested in children's education?

Each year we here at
Peacehaven celebrate
Father's day. Now it is not a
Biblically mandated holiday but
we feel that fatherhood is an
important thing. Study after
study shows the massive
effect a good father can have
within the home.

The behaviour of children and their understanding of the world is greatly affected by the presence or absence of a good father figure. I know it is not politically correct but it is a fact that men and women are different and we have different approaches to parenting.


