

Plans unveiled for new Soul building

CAMBOURNE PARISH COUNCIL has received Planning Consent for the new Cambourne Soul Youth Building.

There are no immediate plans to start work however as the bulk of the funding -£500,000 - is coming from the s106 for West Cambourne (contributions to local infrastructure and facilities made by the

developers) but this is not due until 2-3 years into the build out of West Cambourne. The Parish Council is exploring how it can be brought forward.

Parish Clerk, John Vickery, told Cambourne Crier: "The Cambourne Youth Partnership trustees and Parish Council have been working with users and stakeholders to provide a permanent building for some time. The current accommodation limits the opportunities that can be given to young people."

The new building will feature a large hall, social spaces, music/recording studio, kitchen, storage, quiet rooms, meeting space and office space.

Plans to leave A428 at Girton single carriageway branded 'idiocy' by councillor

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR Ruth Betson has told *Cambourne Crier* she is shocked that the Highways England (HE) A14 project team intend on keeping the A428 as single lane at the Girton interchange permanently.

Initially reduced from two lanes to one to allow for working space during the construction of the new bridge over the A428 at the junction with the A14, HE now say traffic modelling shows the capacity of the A428 can be met by a single carriageway.

"Obviously this is ridiculous," said Ruth. "I brought it to the attention of the HE A428 project team and they will look into it. I also raised it at the Scrutiny & Overview Committee meeting on 21st June. The dualling of the A428 from Caxton Gibbet to the Black Cat roundabout will create more traffic, as will plans to create an expressway corridor between Oxford and Cambridge. It is inconceivable to have the A428 as single lane at Girton and we will be doing everything we can to stop this idiocy!"

How's your broadband speed?

Broadband

We often hear anecdotally that people in Cambourne suffer from poor or low speed broadband. We would really like to hear from you if you do. We are trying to compile a map to help us understand if there are particular problem areas, and what kind of speeds people are getting. Please could you email us with your address and postcode, and the broadband speed you are getting (visit speedtest.net or download the Speedtest app). Additionally your broadband provider name would be useful but not essential.

We will not pass on any personal information to any third party, but we will share an anonymised map showing approximate speeds across Cambourne. If there is enough interest, and it looks technically viable, we will set up a public event in conjunction with a wireless provider to discuss how they work with local communities and typical costs and speeds.

Parking on verges

Parking continues to be a major issue with a number of vehicles parking and driving on the verges in Cambourne. The damage this causes to the grass and kerbs, especially in wet weather, contributes to the delay in transferring the roads to the County Council. If the situation continues after the verges are transferred to the County and Parish Council it will be you as Council Tax payers of Cambourne who will have to pay for their repair.

Parking on the verges causes inconvenience to neighbours and residents using the footpaths and is a safety issue for children.

Cambourne Community Fete Baking and Produce Competition

MONKFIELD MEDICAL PRACTICE: We will soon be losing our Contraception Nurse Practitioner and will no longer be able to offer coil fittings, implant fittings or diaphragm fittings. We are hoping to replace this service as soon as we can but this may not be for some time.

If you need advice about contraception and sexual health go to www.fpa.org.uk - the family planning association. You may also want to look at www.patient.co.uk and put in the name of the contraceptive you want to read about.

If you wish to see someone to discuss family planning or to have a coil, implant or diaphragm fitted then the best contact is www.icash.nhs.uk or call 0300 300 3030.

The clinic for Cambridge is in the Lime Tree Clinic which is in Brookfields Hospital, 351 Mill Road. (Monday to Friday and Saturday morning. Closed Bank Holidays. Phone lines: Monday to Thursday 8.30am - 7.30pm, Friday 8.30pm - 4.30pm, Saturday 9-11.45am)

To make an appointment for Contraception and Sexual Health please call 0300 300 3030. Please arrive 10 minutes before your appointment time to complete the registration process.

Walk in for 24 and under - Mondays Only.

Please note there is no walk-in session on a Saturday; this clinic is appointment ONLY and will run from 9am to 12pm. However, If you are 24 or under you can drop in to our Contraception and Sexual Health session on Mondays between 2-4pm. This clinic has limited capacity and although they will do their best to see you they cannot guarantee this, so we advise you to arrive by 1:45pm.

If you need emergency contraception you can go to icash, the surgery or to the local chemist.

If you need a coil removing please do not have sex (unless with a condom) as you will otherwise risk pregnancy once the coil is removed as some sperm can live for 7 days.

The FPA and the loash website have leaflets in several different languages.

LIGHT UP CAMBOURNE: For the benefit of newer residents and for anyone still unsure we thought it would be a good idea to explain a little about Light Up Cambourne. Yes, we know it is July, but we think about Christmas all year round!

Light Up Cambourne was formed in 2013 by a group of residents with the idea of lighting up Cambourne for Christmas.

Working closely with and supported by the Parish Council we were able to light up 19 trees around the junction, which were turned on quietly one Friday afternoon at the end of November.

Each year since then more and more trees lit and last year we achieved our goal of lighting the whole of Broad Street. We have also held four Switch On events which have become bigger and better

each year; the last two years have been hosted by JezO's events and involved live music, magic tricks, snow machines, free mulled wine and mince pies and even a Santa in his grotto!

All this doesn't come cheap. Each year we have raised and spent in the region of £6,000. The main costs are the hire of a cherry picker which the Parish Council grounds team use to install the lights, the installation of sockets on lampposts to power the lights, the light strings and

extension cables and the costs associated with the Switch On event.

Our team of dedicated volunteers hold fundraising events throughout the year which have include, an Afternoon Tea, Community BBQ, Craft Fair, Car Boot Sales and Quiz & Bingo nights. We have also received sponsorship from local businesses and we benefit from the funds raised at the annual Cambourne Community Fete organised by the Parish Council. The support of the Parish Council is crucial, and we are very grateful to them. AS THE WEATHER BRIGHTENS UP and the sunshine starts brightening our weeks we welcome the longer, brighter nights and the opportunity to enjoy summer days and nights in the garden. When powering up your BBQs and putting out the garden furniture for the summer season, be sure to take note of our top tips below to ensure you have a fun and safe summer in the garden.

If cooking outdoors, always check BBQs over after winter storage. Keep them on level ground and ensure they are sited away from sheds, fences, overhanging foliage and property. Keep children and garden games well away from the cooking area and never leave the barbecue unattended.

If you have a bonfire, build it well away from buildings, tents or other flammable objects and make sure it is properly out when you leave.

When out in the countryside, extinguish cigarettes properly and dispose of them responsibly – never throw a lit cigarette into a field or wooded area.

Don't forget to stay safe around our county's waterways and if you see someone in trouble in water, call 999 immediately with clear details of your location.

When out camping or using a tent, never use candles inside or nearby and always discourage smoking nearby. Never cook inside a tent. More information: www.cambsfire.gov.uk


Cambourne U3A launch meeting

Cervical screening awareness

June saw the annual Cervical Screening Awareness Week. Cervical screening (also known as 'smear tests') are offered to all women from 25 to 64 years old every three to five years, depending on age.

Cervical cancer affects over 3,000 women a year in the UK mainly in those aged 30 to 45. In the early stages it often has no symptoms but can be a cause of unexpected vaginal bleeding.

Being screened regularly means abnormal changes in the cells of the cervix can be identified early and if necessary treated to stop cancer developing. It does make a significant difference

in reducing cancer rates but unfortunately there has been a gradual fall in the numbers women taking up screening over several years.

Cervical screening is surprisingly quick and does not usually cause discomfort.

It is best done during the middle of your menstrual cycle (usually 14 days from the start of your last period) to ensure the best sample.

Cervical screening is an important part of caring for yourself.

It is usually done by practice nurses who do this on a very regular basis but if you prefer, you can choose to go to a sexual health clinic.

Tough start to league campaign for bowls club




