SOUTH CAMBS DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

Cambourne's district councillors fight A428 plans and introduction of Universal Credit

CAMBOURNE COUNCILLOR Ruth Betson is continuing her campaign against plans to leave the A428 a single carriageway at Girton, as revealed in last month's *Cambourne Crier*.

Interviewed by That's Cambridge TV she said: "It's very important that Highways England listen to the residents of Cambourne and surrounding parishes and revisit their traffic modelling plans.

"I have had lots of Cambourne residents contact me since the article in *Cambourne Crier* asking how they can help," Cllr Betson added, "Please retweet my posts on Twitter (@RuthBetson) using the hashtags I've created and email me your concerns so I can collate them and tell Highways England (cllr.betson@ scambs.gov.uk).

"I particularly want to hear if you are a local business impacted by this."

Separately, South Cambridgeshire
District Council (SCDC) has passed a
proposal by Cambourne Councillor Gavin
Clayton to write to the government
requesting that the rollout of Universal
Credit in South Cambs be halted until
issues which have arisen in other regions
are addressed.

"The Universal Credit system was proposed as a way of making benefits both easier to understand and access with an increased likelihood that claimants will find work as a result," said Cllr Clayton.

"A recent National Audit Office report shows however that none of these aims are being met, nor can they be proven within the current monitoring system."

Universal credit is due to be introduced for new claimants in South Cambs from October this year.

Educating 'otherwise' in Cambourne

SUMMER HOLIDAYS can mean seeing more children out and about on weekdays. But you may also have spotted some children around during term time because there are now more than a dozen families in Cambourne who choose home education rather than school.

Section 7 of the Education Act 1996 requires that 'the parent of every child of compulsory school age shall cause him/her to receive efficient full-time education...either by regular attendance at school or otherwise.' 'Otherwise' can include home education (HE).

Each family's approach to HE is specific to their children's ages, abilities, aptitudes and needs. It varies in terms of choices, structure and autonomy. One HE mum in Cambourne, Darcy, said: "For us it involves nurturing our daughter's intrinsic desire to learn, through her own curiosity and interests, and providing the resources and life experiences for her to do this at her own pace in a way that is meaningful to her."

Her daughter, Flo (11), said: 'I remember things because I ask questions when I want to learn about something." Another home educated child, Karl (11), who has created his own computer operating system, said: 'I like home education because I have more freedom."

Some HE families from the Cambourne area have been getting together for a number of years for Multisports, now organised by HE mums Annette and Kirsten, and run by Cambourne Fitness and Sports Centre.

The weekly sports include football, capture the flag, dodgeball, rounders and cricket. "These brilliant sessions enable home educated children to enjoy a variety of sports together for fitness and fun and give the parents good opportunity to sit and chat while their children are occupied," said Annette.

Last year two other HE mums, Kez and Natalie, set up a Facebook group for Cambourne home educators and created a weekly Discovery Club.

Kez said: 'We started Discovery Club as we wanted to provide an opportunity not just for HE children to meet and learn but also for parents/carers to develop support networks.'

"Sometimes there are 30+ at Discovery Club. It works particularly well when there is a broad range of ages. The activities are generally set up so that children are free to access and enjoy them as they please. There's no pressure to do any particular thing. Often the learning evolves with the different questions and ideas of the individual children and some may choose to read a book, play outside, chat with a friend or play a board game."

"Activities have included pond dipping, making and flying kites, foraging for elderflowers, making cordials with fruits and herbs, making willow lanterns, pizzas, paper rockets, a midwinter indoor 'campfire', exploring fossils borrowed from the Sedgewick museum, building junk boats and testing them out in water, walks enjoying the different habitats in Cambourne, pressing flowers and using them to make suncatchers, and building shelters in Monkfield Wood."

Kez added: 'Real friendships have been made, both for the children and adults, and it's been so lovely to watch the children learn and grow together."

Neighbourhood policing team

commenced a Local Policing Review (LPR) in 2017 which was implemented in April this year when we moved to a simplified two Command model, namely 'North' and 'South'. The LPR defined three policing pillars for our organisation as Response, Investigations and Neighbourhood Policing. You may have noticed the reduced number of vehicles moving in and out of the station and might well wonder what this means for Cambourne, so I thought it would be helpful to clarify some of these points.

Response officers in Southern
Command have been brigaded at three stations – Huntingdon, Ely and Parkside-based on our historic demand patterns for calls for service. This simply means that these officers start and finish their duties at these locations, whilst maintaining the same response to calls for service from Cambourne and other residents across South Cambridgeshire. CID officers have similarly relocated alongside their response colleagues.

However, under the LPR your local Neighbourhood Policing teams have

remained at the three South Cambridgeshire stations (Cambourne, Histon and Sawston) with the PCSO teams retaining their geographical responsibilities as before, working alongside myself and Sgt Emma Hilson at Sawston. Our partnership work with the District Council, Education and Social Services, housing providers and other emergency services remains similarly unchanged with fixed, monthly meetings and other, bespoke, priority work to address vulnerability and local concerns as they arise. Our efforts in these forums are predominately focused on problem solving and crime and demand reduction within our communities.

One of the massive gains this new model brings to your neighbourhood team is that we are able to call on resources from PCSO and Response teams from across the Command, including the newly formed Community Action Team at Histon, rather than having to rely on those solely allocated to previous South Cambs Command. This provides us with a much more flexible response to locally raised concerns.

What do we need from residents to assist us? It is vitally important for me, as your local Sergeant, to know what concerns and issues you are experiencing. You will invariably be the first to hear or see something which is of concern within your community and early notification to your local team gives us the best chance of solving the problem.

Recent changes to <u>cambs.police.uk</u> have revolutionised the ways you can communicate with us 24/7. You can now access web chat, report crime, concerns, road collisions and crime prevention amongst many other things. The specific page for ASB concerns can be accessed via <u>www.cambs.police.uk/information-and-services/Anti-social-behaviour</u>

101 and 999 remain unchanged for routine and emergency telephone calls respectively. It goes without saying, when you see one of the team out and about, please also stop and tell them in person. We look forward to hearing from you!

CREST Teacher Advisory Network and outlined the process required to gain the CREST award; the only nationally recognised accreditation scheme for STEM project work.

The children then presented and demonstrated their projects, explaining the aims, functions and coding. All participants received a certificate of recognition and will now move on to the next level of coding in Micro:Python.

CERC is now running in batches to accommodate more children. The sessions are held on alternate Sundays in the Old Blue School where the children learn how electronics components work, and how different sensors can be used to design various projects, learn to communicate science and take part in group projects.



Sepsis and how to spot it

Very rarely a condition called sepsis can develop as a complication of an infection. The body overreacts to the infection which can lead to damage to major organs which can be fatal.

Knowing signs and symptoms of sepsis and acting on them quickly can be life saving. Sepsis can occur at any age and symptoms may be slightly different.

In young children (under 5s) warning signs may include: Mottled/bluish or pale appearance; lethargic or difficult to wake; skin feels unusually cold to touch; very fast breathing rate or finding it hard to breathe; a rash that does not fade on

pressing (non-blanching); a fit or convulsion: no urination for over 12 hours; refusal to drink or feed for several hours (when awake); a floppy baby: a bulging soft-spot on a baby's head: an older child who is confused or who has a stiff neck.

Symptoms of sepsis in older children and adults are similar with particular concerns about cold or mottled skin, extreme shivering, extreme muscle pain, not passing urine, slurred speech or confusion and extreme breathlessness.

Although a high temperature can be a symptom of sepsis so too can an unusually low temperature, therefore if there are other concerns seek urgent medical help.

Call for parents to make children aware of knife danger

CAMBOURNE RESIDENT Helen Frazier has been presented with a posthumous bravery award as a tribute to her son who was murdered in St Ives in January 2017. Andrew Hasler, 28, was stabbed to death as he fought to save the life of a female visitor to his home who had already been stabbed by the knifeman.

The Royal Humane Society award was personally approved by Princess
Alexandra, the Society's President, and was presented to Helen at the Society's Annual Court at Haberdasher's Hall in London.



Since her son's death, Helen has become an anti-knife crime campaigner. "No parent should have to go through what I had to go through," she said. "Knife crime is on the rise and everybody needs to be fully aware - parents in particular must do all they can to make their children aware of the dangers knives pose. Children must be warned that there are people out there carrying knives, and they are prepared to use them. They must also be warned that carrying a knife themselves won't protect them and that it is a criminal offence."

"Everyone reads in the papers about the rise in knife crime in London but in this part of Cambridgeshire there have in recent times been four knife murders.





FIRE RISK: residents urged to remain vigilant

FOLLOWING INSTANCES OF FIRE BREAKING OUT in the Country Park around Cambourne, the Parish Council, Wildlife Trust and Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service have urged residents to remain vigilant.

Parish Clerk John Vickery said: "The Parish Council requests that residents take care around the village and follow the advice of the Fire Service and Wildlife Trust. We would also request that if anyone is aware of people setting fires it be reported to the police via 999 as well as the fire service."

The Wildlife Trust's Jenny Smith added: "We would urge people to look out for

smoke and fires and ring the fire brigade immediately if they spot anything on fire before it can spread. Fires of any sort, including BBQs, are not allowed in Cambourne Nature Reserve. If you do report any fires on the Nature Reserve to the fire brigade or police please also let the Wildlife Trust know."

Cambourne resident Gary Newland saw a fire on the footpath near the Brace Dein allotments on Saturday 21st July - "Thankfully it was noticed early on and the fire brigade was called quickly by a number of us," he said. "This was the fourth fire I'd heard of or seen up close, in the previous 24 hours."

Group Commander Kevin Napier, head of community fire safety at Cambridge-shire Fire and Rescue Service, said: "High temperatures and dry areas of land can be perfect conditions for a fire to spread. Something as simple as not stubbing a cigarette out properly, or using a disposable barbecue on grass, can start a fire that can develop quickly."

He added that glass bottles should not be left lying around as they could start fires by reflecting the sun's rays and that parents should talk to their children about the dangers of starting fires.
