19 The Coffee House: a thriving community café

19 THE COFFEE HOUSE was started by Jacqui Huckle in 2010 and was named after the unusual speed limit of 19 mph which was in place during the early development of Cambourne.

The not-for-profit café in the church serves a valuable role in the community and attracts around 25-30 customers per day. There are some groups that gather there regularly, like Knit & Natter, Cambourne Timebank, a Bible Study Group, ladies from Darwin Manor and working groups.

Children are actively welcomed and there is a defined secure play area with books and toys so parents can feel at ease while they drink coffee and chat.

"We have a lot of regulars who we know well and frequently have new customers which are lovely to welcome. Some people come from quite a long way to visit as they enjoy the relaxed atmosphere and the fact we remember their regular orders!" said Maria, who started working in the café six years ago.

The café is run solely by volunteers - there are currently around 18 in total with 4-5 working per shift.

Cilla, who joined in December 2011 and became sole co-manager last year, said: "We've got a lovely team of volunteers here who work together well but more pairs of hands would be really good! We do struggle to keep the café running on a daily basis, especially when our regular

volunteers are on holiday or off sick. More volunteers would make it more comfortable and could mean we could open one Saturday a month as well."

Tasks include cooking, making hot and cold drinks, serving customers, washing up and cleaning. General training is given at the start then extra training is offered if specifically needed.

Cilla added: "Anybody can join in. Volunteers can do as few or as many hours as they like. You can have any

train up as a new daily manager. She said: "Working here with people who I don't know and do know has built up my confidence so much. I used to feel shy!"

One of the current daily managers, Garry, joined two years ago through Timebank and earns time credits for his hours. He said: 'I volunteer because I'm semi-retired and I wanted to get out to meet new people and give something back to the community'.

Geoffrey, another Timebanker, said: "It's friendly and there's a nice bunch of people who work here."

Maria struggles with anxiety and depression and finds that volunteering at 19 prevents isolation and helps with a weekly routine. She said: "I enjoy meeting and serving a variety of

customers. Working with other volunteers is uplifting; we work well as a team and have become good friends. You can always guarantee on each shift that you will have fun and laughter. I enjoy being part of Cambourne community and giving something back. Volunteering is of mutual benefit to me and the café. I definitely get as much out of it as I put in!"

■ *19 is open on weekdays during term time only. Breakfast is served 8.45am-11am and lunch 11.30am-1.30pm. In between you can buy snacks and drinks. The café shuts at 2pm on Mon-Thurs and 12pm on Friday.*

background and fit volunteering around your daily life. It's flexible. You could use it as a stepping stone to get back into work or to gain confidence. There's not the same pressure here as there is in paid employment. People do whatever they feel confident and happy with."

Some come from Cambourne Village College for work experience in Year 10 and carry on afterwards - like Michael who started last year and aims to tie it in with his part-time college course in September. "I like volunteering because Cilla makes me laugh and it gets me out of the house," he said.

Singin' in the summer in Cambourne



WHILE SUMMER SONGBIRDS trilled on the country park other lively voices were heard around Cambourne in various singing groups, including Cambourne Community Gospel Choir (CCGC) and Singaround.

On 4th July the Monkfield Arms pub was graced with the presence of CCGC and their band, who carefully avoided a World Cup game in order to sing and play to regulars and visitors.

The evening included a range of gospel styles including gospel classics like 'Happy Day', African-American spirituals, contemporary gospel songs, African style praise songs and other songs they've picked up along the way.

This performance in the Monkfield Arms has become a regular summer gig for CCGC together with a winter one that includes an opportunity for a communal singalong of favourite Christmas carols.

Steve Gaze, musical director, said, "CCGC was set up nearly 3 years ago with a dream of 'igniting community spirit through music that celebrates God's love

for everyone' and we've found the choir members have an infectious enthusiasm in their rehearsals and performances. It is difficult not to tap your feet or clap along once the choir get going - it doesn't take a lot of encouragement and it's even easier on well-known songs like 'Lean on Me'.

"Talking to people after the gig there were comments like 'life-affirming', 'uplifting', 'fun', 'joy' and 'we need more of

'Hullabaloo Balay' and pop songs such as 'The Lion Sleeps Tonight' by Tightfit, 'So Strong' by Labi Siffre and 'Only Time' by Enya.

The group was created as an opportunity to learn simple songs by ear and sing together purely for fun.

Singarounder Fee said, "It's a great way to meet new people. We laugh when we get it wrong, we are chuffed when we get

it right, we learn new music which can be a challenge and we remember old faithfuls. What's not to like!"

Friends complete 32-mile walk in aid of 3-year-old Oscar's cancer fight

ON SATURDAY 28 JULY a group of 19 friends walked over 32 miles from Alder Hey Children's Hospital to Manchester Children's Hospital to raise funds for Oscar Lymer, 3, from Cambourne, who was diagnosed with neuroblastoma, an aggressive childhood cancer at the age of 20 months.

He endured an intensive 18 months of treatment at Addenbrookes Hospital which involved chemotherapy, invasive surgery, stem cell transplant, radiotherapy and immunotherapy. He also underwent treatment as part of a UK clinical trial but tests in February showed the trial was not working and his parents were told that Oscar had relapsed. Oscar's family are now aiming to raise funds to pay for treatment abroad.

Oscar's mother, Lucy, said: "It's heartbreaking as a parent watching your child endure such gruelling treatments. We are so proud of him and how he tackles everything head on. He is a lovely, happy little child and a little fighter and we will keep fighting for him to get the chance to grow up like he deserves."

Oscar's dad Phil, uncle Tommy and aunty Jenny also took part in the walk which has now raised more than £5,000.

Train service disruption

I have been taking to constituents about the appalling train service being provided by Govia Thameslink Railway (GTR). Since then, I have continued to keep the pressure on GTR and the Department for Transport – I have raised further questions in the House, including raising the issue at Prime Minister's Questions and questioning the Rail Minister again about the chaos.

Details of the compensation being offered to passengers is now being announced. Along with other MPs, I have written to GTR and I am also in touch with the Office of Road and Rail about this ongoing issue.

I am very sorry that GTR's failures have

resulted in so much inconvenience for so many people.

On a separate note, I'm working hard to find a way to amend the law to strengthen police powers to deal with hare coursing. This crime is abhorrent for those affected and the current legislation is out of date and no longer fit for purpose.

If there is anything you would like to discuss with me, my next surgery will be on 7th September between 3 and 5pm at Barrington.

National Eye Health Week

National Eye Health Week runs from the 24th to 30th September and supports those affected by sight loss and promotes good eye health.

In the U.K. around 2 million people have sight loss that significantly affects their daily lives.

Tragically in many cases this may have been avoidable. Early detection and treatment of problems such as diabetes, high blood pressure and some eye conditions can limit the damage to eye sight and therefore regular checks of your eyes and general health are important.

Problems with vision can have a dramatic impact on all aspects of life but thankfully there are

several organisations that can offer support to empower and encourage independence for people who are affected. The Royal National Institute of Blind people (RNIB) is the national charity who can provide a huge amount of information about a wide variety of eye conditions and resources that are available. More locally is the wonderful Camsight who offer invaluable practical and emotional support and life changing hope to those in our area.

Learning Mandarin

EDUCATING OTHERWISE:

European languages are often taught in schools and studied by many home educators across the UK. However my younger brother and I, having not been keen on either French or German, decided to try Mandarin Chinese.

When we were on holiday in Austria we met a couple from Taiwan at the top of Untersberg Mountain and we were so excited to be able to speak a little Chinese with them. Learning Mandarin was a worthwhile choice for me and my family.

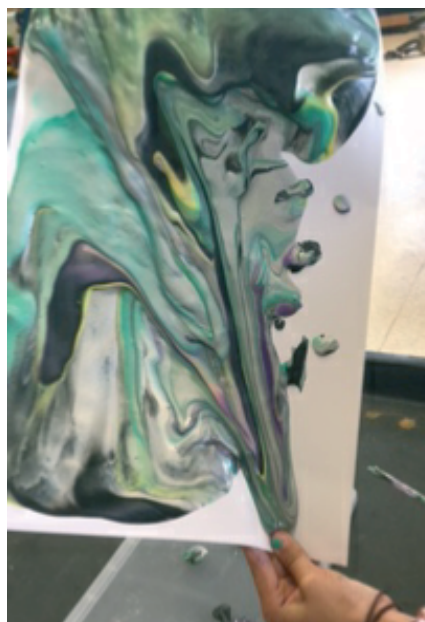
Young pirates arrive in Cambourne

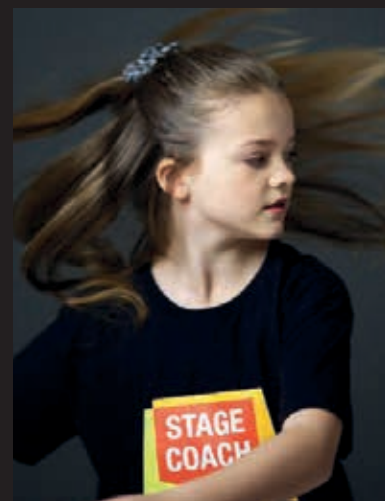

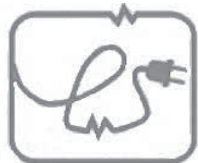

Harvest at Cambourne Church

Autumn, which John Keats described as the 'season of mists and mellow fruitfulness', is my favourite time of year. After the heat of summer, the turn of the weather to coolness is a relief, and I have a particular fondness for the smell of wood fires, the feel of soft, mizzly rain and the gloomy romance of the twilight in late-afternoon.

Christians spend early autumn celebrating harvest - a word derived from the Old English for 'autumn'. It is a time for appreciating God's abundant provision and, in the past, was tied to the agricultural work which gave most people their living. But as the population began to move away from farming, these festivities came to centre not so much on our own abundance but more on those who are less fortunate.

The ancient Hebrews were commanded to 'not reap to the very edges of your field...[but] leave them for the poor and for the foreigner' (Leviticus 23:22). In celebrating harvest (not to mention beginning to look ahead to Christmas!), verses like this challenge us to consider how best to use the resources we have. God has provided; the question is what would He have us do with His provision?

Encounter is an evening church event that takes place on the 4th Sunday of each month. The aim is to provide an informal event focused on Worship and Teaching, aimed at all ages. Each event carries a theme that aims to link Real life issues we face as Christians with Biblical values and Spiritual experiences. The next Encounter is on: Sunday 23rd September 6.30 pm

into the greatness of the love of God and the agony Christ endured to pay the price for our sin it gets a little distracting when the mylar balloon of Mickey Mouse picks that moment to descend from the ceiling right in front of you.

Although admittedly that was a lighter moment. Really it is just people dealing with people. Just like Jesus did, dealing with what comes when it comes. Sometimes a person needs a sermon, sometimes they need a sandwich.

Sometimes we deal with errant sheep and other times wolves and serpents, but it is the shepherd's job to spot the differences. It is the same stuff all believers should do, spreading that message of hope and forgiveness in a world where it is rare. If you have questions or just need to chat let me know.
