CamBedRailRoad proposal

A COMMUNITY-BASED voluntary think tank has proposed an alternative to the southern C2-2 rail route from Cambridge to Bedford. CamBedRailRoad (CBRR) aims to "design, develop and champion the optimal route for the Oxford to Cambridge missing link, the section from Bedford to Cambridge."

Its proposed route would include stations at St Neots, Cambourne and Northstowe.

The current C Corridor proposal would run further south - passing between Sandy and Biggleswade and running via Shepreth and Foxton.

"Current rail proposals do not serve and sustain the high density of new and existing settlements along the East West Expressway," said the group. "The CBRR Route Proposal is the solution."

Volunteering in Cambourne through Timebank

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR FOR CAMBOURNE Shrobona Bhattacharya helped to launch the rollout of timebanking in South Cambs at a presentation at SCDC's offices last month.

It is part of a proposal to help parish councils start their own local schemes based on several years' experience of Cambourne Timebank, which was founded in 2012.

Timebanking is an exchangebased volunteering system in which hours are the currency.

It also helps to build social networks of people who give and receive support to and from one another, enabling those from different backgrounds, who may not otherwise meet, to come together and form connections and friendships. Generating 'social capital' in this way can be important to peoples' health, wellbeing and resilience and can prevent 'needs' from arising.

Members can be part of a team or offer their own practical help, such as looking

> after someone's pet while they are away or giving an elderly neighbour a hand to sort out their cupboards. Other examples from Cambourne include being sociable – organising weekly coffee mornings, an annual Christmas lunch and holding a film night.

Cllr Bhattacharya is the founder of CamCare UK – a local registered charity. She said: "We run more than 15 community projects engaging people of all ages and work closely with Cambourne Timebank as an

organisational partner."

"As a member of Timebank I've picked up many jobs and visited elderly people, fixed computers or mobile phones and taken patients to the hospital for appointments." Anyone volunteering through

Cambourne Timebank can earn credits for others to help them, or vouchers which can be used at selected leisure and entertainment venues.



Flu season is upon us!

Flu is an extremely infectious viral illness that spreads in droplets of moisture from coughs and sneezes. Symptoms of flu usually include fever, chills, headaches and aching muscles and often a cough and sore throat. Although anyone can get flu there can be more serious complications for pregnant women and those over 65 and it can make existing medical conditions worse. A flu vaccine is recommended for women at any stage of pregnancy and people (including children) who have longterm medical conditions (such as heart, lung, neurological or kidney problems, diabetes or reduced immunity). Those with other ongoing health problems may also

benefit from being vaccinated; your doctor or nurse can advise if this is recommended. The nasal flu vaccine is available for children from the age of 2 up to those in school year 5. Flu vaccination clinics start in October and as the flu virus changes all the time, a new vaccine is necessary each year. The flu vaccine does not cause flu; some people notice a mild temperature or aching muscles which usually only lasts a couple of days. Although no vaccine is 100% effective, those who have had the flu vaccine are much less likely to get flu or have milder symptoms than those who have not been vaccinated.

Preserving memories with Past Connect



More than £1,600 raised for Kerala flood victims

MORE THAN 150 PEOPLE turned up and donated money at Cambourne Indian Club's (CIC) Kerala Flood Relief Fundraising Event held at Papworth Village Hall on Sunday, 9th September.

The four hour event started with a one minute silence, remembering the Kerala flood relief victims and their families.

Heavy monsoon rain and flooding in Kerala, the southern state of India, had stranded thousands of people in the Flood relief

camps and killed more 400 hundred people, it was the worst flooding the state had observed in 100 years.

CIC, alongside other local groups including CamCareUK, CIC, Cam Spice, Indradhanush,

Nutrition2wellness, ICS - Cambridge, Cam Harmony and CCS, raised a total of £1625 from all fund raising initiatives including this event, a cake sale and an Indian stall at Cambourne Fete . The cash was transferred to Kerala Chief Minister's Distaster Relief Fund.

Mathew Sam, representing Cambourne Indian Club, inaugurated the fundraising event in Papworth at 12:30 pm. He delivered an excellent speech, welcoming guests who came over from different places.

Chief guest, Mark Howell, Councillor from South Cambridgeshire County Council, presided over the event and delivered a speech about the flood crisis in Kerala. He came along with his wife to express solidarity to the flood victims. Councillor Jeyur Patel and family were also present.



District Councillor for Cambourne, Shrobona Bhattacharya, who initiated the initial fundraising - co-ordinating five associations in Cambourne - handed over £600 raised from the cake sale event to Cambourne Indian Club 's management committee.

Cllr Bhattacharya said, "In the time of solidarity, people of Cambourne showed their high respect towards the humanity. Mrs Shireen Khaliq, who is originally from Pakistan, made a wonderful

> cake for India which was itself an example of the unification of people in Cambourne. This symbol of love is a big step towards the community."

The club's management committee - Mathew Sam, Shaju

Thomas, Prasanth Nair, Ranjit Padmanabhan and Vivish Georgeworked tirelessly to make this event a great success.

Treasurer of the club, Vivish George, whose immediate family in Kerala was affected by the flood, also initiated a personal fund raising campaign to support relief camps in Kerala.

Shyney Sara Mathew, a member of the club, also raised £1,000 on a personal level to help flood victims. She arranged to supply clothes to relief camp members in Kerala.

Jakir Chowdhury of CamSpice also donated $\pounds100$ towards the cause.

A homemade vegetarian meal with 26 dishes was the major highlight of the event. A raffle draw was also conducted. CIC would like to thank everyone who donated to this noble cause and supported various fund-raising initiatives.

Smooth start for CVC

CAMBOURNE VILLAGE COLLEGE: The Autumn term has started remarkably smoothly. 12 new teachers and a further 5 support staff have joined us, as our pupil roll is at 1,045 and still growing. After achieving a strong set of exam results, our first ever intake of pupils has now left to continue their journey.

Comberton, Hills Road, Long Road and Cambridge Regional College were popular destinations. We hope that they'll continue to come back to see us, and tell us of their future successes. Our Year 11 pupils have returned with a creditably strong work ethic and are throwing themselves into the rigours of GCSE preparation, while at the other end of the spectrum, our new Year 7s are establishing themselves confidently and enjoy the many extra-curricular activities on offer. Community use of the building remains active, with almost all week-night slots on the 3G pitch now taken.

Planning is underway for the next wing of the College – Phase 3A. This latest stage of the school's development is being designed to accommodate the immediate increase in pupil numbers expected from September 2019, and will be in use until 2023, when our second campus, Phase 3B of the College, for 900 pupils, is intended to open. At that point, we hope that wing 3A will be substantially enlarged and converted into Cambourne Sixth Form – Phase 3C – to open from 2024.

Monkfield pupils showcase 'movement in nature' artwork

MONKFIELD PARK PRIMARY SCHOOL:

What a wonderful start to the school year it has been at Monkfield Park. Across the school, children have beamed as they entered their new classrooms and met their class teacher, fully engrossed in curricular learning opportunities.

Year 2 have been focussing on Isaac Newton and have been on a nature walk.

Year 3, through a history 'WOW' day, have been taking on the role of ancient Egyptians, as they dressed as Egyptians and mummified dolls.

Year 5 have been exploring the world through art, music and dance and have been using their own 'special suitcase of wonder' to inspire their learning.

Reception children have been full of enthusiasm and eager to learn. This has shone through in their learning in relation to their topic of 'Magical Me'. There's plenty to do in Reception at Monkfield Park and the excitement on the children's faces when they enter the classrooms is evident of how much they are enjoying their new journey at school.

This start of the school year has also been an opportunity for the children in all year groups to showcase their own art masterpieces through the 'Monkfield Park Art Gallery'.

The whole school was given the theme of 'Movement in Nature' and children completed individual pieces of work which were truly amazing. The work was displayed in the school's art gallery and was available for children and their parents to purchase, raising funds to redevelop the school library. It has been a fantastic start to the new school year.







First Farmers for the day

EDUCATING OTHERWISE: We visited Sacrewell Farm to find out how the first farmers lived.

Our first activity was comparing crops. Two were modern day crops - oats and wheat and two were wild grasses that they would have used in the Stone Age.

We found out how, over time, the biggest seeds were chosen to grow more plants which, in turn, grew the big seeds.

They did this as they could get more flour from the bigger seeds. We then had a go at crushing the seeds to make flour.

We put them on one rock and then rubbed them with a smaller one. This was a time consuming and difficult way to make flour. Next we looked at how farmers began to domesticate animals. They used sheep because they give milk, meat and wool.

The sheep got very excited when they saw we had food for them. We clipped the hooves of a sheep. The hoof was very hard and we had to make sure we only trimmed a little bit so we didn't hurt the sheep.

Our final activity was to make flatbread. We used flour, water and oil. We mixed it together and cooked it over the campfire. In the Stone Age they would have cooked on stones but we used a pan over the flames. It was hot and very smoky. We ate the bread with honey and it tasted delicious. By Ellis (10) and Max (8)
