# Schools call on parents to curb illegal parking

LOCAL POLICE and Cambourne Parish Council representatives attended a meeting at Monkfield Park Primary School at the end of last year to discuss the ongoing issues around vehicles stopping and parking illegally outside the school entrance to drop off or collect children.

PC John Coppard told *Cambourne Crier*: "Parking on zig zag lines and double yellow lines is an offence and a fixed penalty notice will be issued to anyone caught parking in these areas. Parking on grass verges is down to the district council to enforce and the parish council have kindly placed some cones on the grass area to stop the parking - which blocks the view of passing motorists coming around the corner close to the school.

"We will work with the school and road safety team to involve the children in highlighting the dangers of parking so close to the school entrance and crossing to parents and drivers. Since the meeting I have patrolled the area of concern and found no one committing an offence."



Parish Clerk John Vickery added: "We share the concerns about parking outside all the Cambourne schools which is why the Parish Council originally obtained the Transport Regulation Orders and paid for the yellow lines to be installed outside Monkfield Park, The Vine and Jeavons Wood schools and have now supplied cones to be placed on the verge outside Monkfield School.

"We all agreed to work with the school and outside bodies on getting the message to parents and other visitors to the school to park responsibly." Sarah Jarman, head of Monkfield Park Primary School, said: "Unfortunately schools across Cambourne are all equally facing similar issues on the public highways, which is presenting an extremely dangerous situation for many families and children. I'm grateful for the recent meeting with local police and the parish council to look at further ways in which to tackle this ongoing issue."

Blue badge holders are entitled to use the accessible parking bays in the Monkfield Park school car park.

# Jeavons urges children to walk or bike to school

Continued from front cover... Sue Wright, headteacher at Jeavons Wood Primary School, echoed the concerns of Monkfield Park. "We are constantly reminding parents to park responsibly and have had support from the community police as well," she said.

"When they are on patrol, parents usually choose to park in a sensible place. Unfortunately we cannot patrol the front of the school every day and I am very worried that there will be an accident or a death before people think before they park.

"I am also concerned that parents who understandably are frustrated with the illegal and dangerous parking are beginning to approach the cars themselves which can lead to conflict in front of children.

"As a school we are campaigning for a zebra crossing as we currently do not have a crossing of any kind. This adds to the danger, as some cars stop to let children cross but others don't. I am very concerned that children are beginning to think cars will stop for them which is not the message we want them to have.

"We would urge all parents to either walk or bike to school but if you have to drive to park away from the school in a safe place. The Church kindly allows parking for drop off and pick up."



MORRISONS CAMBOURNE is to hand out free fruit to children in its Broad Street store, to prevent unsold fruit being thrown away and to offer young people one of their five-a-day.

Every week Morrisons expects to give away 40,000 pieces of fruit that is within its 'sell by' window but is at risk of not being sold.

A range of 'child friendly' fruit – including bananas, apples, pears, sweet clementines, and satsumas – will be located on a wooden stand at the front of the greengrocery area.

Every morning the greengrocers will replenish the free fruit stand with produce that otherwise has a chance of being binned.

# Cambourne Parish Council looks back on 2018

#### Public open spaces and play areas:

This year, the new outdoor gym was installed next to Great Cambourne Cricket Wicket. The Parish Council also installed accessible play equipment at several play areas including accessible swings and a roundabout. The Grounds Team carry out regular inspections on the play areas to ensure that they are safe to use, and have continued to keep Cambourne's open spaces maintained to a high standard.

**Sports:** The new informal MUGA opened this year which can be used for football and basketball. There is no need to book, just turn up and play. The wealth of sports facilities in Cambourne continue to be maintained to a very high standard by the Parish Council Grounds Team. These include all the football and rugby pitches, two cricket wickets, the 3G and MUGA, the tennis courts and the bowls green.

**Events:** The 4th Annual Cambourne Community Fete took place in September. The event was a great success, attracting large numbers of people who enjoyed live music, food from around the world and various attractions. A large number of community groups, sports clubs and local business took part, bringing the community together. Funds raised were donated to Light Up Cambourne and Cambourne Scouts, Army and Air Cadets.

On May and August Bank Holiday Monday, we organised Cambourne Food Market which consisted of a variety of local food vendors and market traders. Both days were well attended, and we look forward to repeating them in 2019. The Parish Council also organised Cambourne Community Clean-Up Day in association with South Cambs District Council. Residents brought unwanted recyclable items to the Hub to be disposed of correctly. We also held a community litter pick and recruited more volunteer litter pickers on the day which means we now have 30+ volunteers keeping Cambourne litter free. Many residents took advantage of this free service and we will look to hold it again in 2019.

The Parish Council once again organised visits from the Fun Fair and the Circus and has supported both the Fireworks and Light Up Cambourne committees. We have also provided support to the Cambridge Cambourne 10K Run, Remembrance Parade, Sports Festival and numerous community and charitable events.

#### Councillors

In May, Council numbers grew from 13 to 19 Councillors. 11 existing Councillors were re-elected, but we said goodbye to



Ghazala Mehboob and Sudhir Shivananjappa. The Council expresses its thanks to them both for their contributions. We welcomed eight new Councillors: Afted Ahmed, Nishat Akhter, Daniel Beck, Andy Fisher, David Jones, Asad Rana, Divya Sharma and Evelyne Spanner.

This year we have welcomed a new office administrator, Kirsty Empson, to the team. We will temporarily be saying goodbye to our deputy clerk, Heather Nigbur-Day, as she starts maternity leave in the New Year. We wish Heather all the best. # Mission to Mars: Ryan McDonald touches down in Cambourne



**IN DECEMBER 2018**, an inspirational talk was presented by Ryan McDonald at the Cambourne Hub meeting room.

Ryan is one of the one hundred scientists to be selected from all over the world to travel to Mars with a one-way ticket in 2031. That means he is not coming back to Earth, ever!

The mission is going to be launched as Mars One, with the aim being to build a liveable human habitat.

He explained to the audience why Mars is perfect for colonisation after Earth but also detailed how it will involve decades of relentless experimentation and dedication by the scientists. Ryan also discussed the challenges they will have to combat before they can start inviting people to live on Mars.

Ryan shared some interesting videos on how the first landing on Mars will look and presented some interesting facts related to the selection procedure of the scientists who are now grouped in teams of four.

The session also included a competition for the participating children, firstly building a model Mars colony and secondly designing an advert inviting people to shift to residence on Mars. Ryan shortlisted the winners in each category and praised all the hard work. Cambridge University Press had sponsored six prize vouchers for the winners.

Cambourne Robotics Club also presented a model robot that the young members had designed and programmed.

Gifts of money enabled us to purchase additional festive items as needed.



### Alcohol Awareness and Dry January

Last year over 4 million people took on the challenge of 'Dry January', giving up alcohol for the month.

Drinking too much alcohol can cause damage to the liver but is also linked to cancers, accidents, obesity and mental health problems. Aside from reducing the risk of serious illness, some people find abstaining from alcohol can improve their sleep, general energy levels and finances.

Guidelines for alcohol intake recommend that everyone should have several alcohol-free days a week and both men and women should drink no more than 14 units a week maximum.

But what is a unit? For example, beer containing 4% abv has 4 units in one litre (therefore 2 units in 500ml - just under a pint). Wine containing 12% abv has 12 units in one litre, so a large glass (250ml) contains 3 units. A standard 750ml bottle of this wine would be 9 units.

Alcohol also contains a surprising number of calories. The average pint of beer contains around 200 calories. A bottle of wine contains around 600 calories.

Alcoholic drinks are called empty calories which means they have very little nutritional benefit but still cause weight gain.

# Raising the bar at Monkfield Park

MONKFIELD PARK PRIMARY SCHOOL: Happy and positive pupils and dedicated staff and leaders were highlighted in a recent Ofsted inspection of Monkfield Park Primary School, which has maintained its Good judgement and been praised for its excellent progress in areas identified in the 2014 inspection, including driving up writing standards.

Inspectors recognised the passion and aspiration of pupils to achieve the best that they can in all aspects of school life.

Attainment in writing at the end of key stage 1 and key stage 2 and the proportion of children assessed as being at the expected level in writing at the end the early years have consistently been above the national average.

The report said, "Pupils develop knowledge, skills and understanding in a broad range of subjects. The curriculum supports pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development well. As a result,

pupils enjoy learning and show a very good understanding of others' beliefs and cultures. They know why it is important to respect the views of others and treat everyone equally.

"Opportunities to elect members of the school council and 'eco-warriors' help pupils to understand the democratic process and provide opportunities for their views to be heard. Pupils are prepared well for the next stage of their education and for life in modern Britain."

Eighty-nine parents shared their feedback on the Ofsted ParentView page for the school with 92% saying they would recommend the school to another parent.

Headteacher Sarah Jarman said, "We are proud to be inclusive of all families and children and welcome the diversity and tolerance that this brings. The good progress and challenge for all of our children was particularly noted and this is a feature we are delighted to celebrate.



"I am extremely proud of all of our staff who absolutely came together to be the very best showcase of what we have achieved since our last inspection. We are so very lucky to have such committed staff who work in the best interests of all of our children and families and this should be celebrated. The children also demonstrated the exemplary learning and behaviour that we are lucky enough to encounter every day."

# History heats up at Monkfield Park

MONKFIELD PARK PRIMARY: Flames engulfed a small part of the school field this week as Year 2 re-created the Great Fire of London. The children have fully immersed themselves in what life was like for the inhabitants of London in 1666, including a study of the building techniques used in the seventeenth century. Everyone constructed a house using traditional wattle and daub which we then used to make a replica of Pudding Lane. It was astonishing to see how quickly the fire engulfed our model



buildings and to imagine what it must have been like for the residents of London as the fire spread.

This year the children in Year 1 are performing Born in a Barn, while the combined choirs of Year 3 and Year 4 will be entertaining their families and friends with a festival of traditional carols and much loved Christmas songs.


So far we have joined in with two of the sessions, the first of which involved the children playing some matching games






