Cambourne robotics team wins FIRST LEGO tournament

A TEAM COMPRISING 10 CHILDREN

from local schools has won the regional IET FIRST LEGO league championship and has progressed to the UK and Ireland finals. The children are all members of Cambourne Electronics and Robotics Club (CERC).

The competion was held on 15th January 2019 at the Engineering department of the University of Cambridge and the teams were required to complete missions to score points with programmed autonomous LEGO MINDSTROMS.

They also had to present a project solving a physical or social problem faced during long space exploration - the CERC team performed a rap to showcase their ideas on how to prevent asteroids crashing into spacecraft and the earth.

The teams were further tasked with demonstrating a set of Core Values - celebrating discovery, innovation, impact, teamwork, and fun.



The team did very well on all the three aspects of the competition: the Robot Game, the Project, and the Core Values to win overall.

Vijay Acharya, one of the children's parents who coached the team, said: "All the participants from CERC demonstrated incredible levels of enthusiasm, creativity, ingenuity and teamwork."

Dr Sujit Bhattacharya, the mentor and co-founder of CERC added, "We are excited to see many CERC members now participating in various national and international competitions with a huge enthusiasm to engage with science, technology, maths, and engineering projects. We are proud of their achievements and confident that they will shoulder the responsibilities as young STEM ambassadors to make a difference for themselves and the community."

Parish Council Budget 2019-20

CAMBOURNE PARISH COUNCIL had to consider the budget for the next financial year and submit it to the District Council at the end of January. This was a challenging process as Cambourne continues to grow and the Council always strives to maintain or improve the services it provides to Cambourne residents.

Skate Park and Pedestrian Crossing

The Council has to consider carefully how it spends money on new projects like Pedestrian Crossings and the Skate Park replacement as it has an impact on the Parish "Precept" (total amount to be collected). The second crossing equates to £6.25 per year per household and the Skate Park £6.51 per year, totalling £12.76 per year per household.

Maintaining Service Level

When considering the budget for 2019 to 2020, it became apparent that if the Council wanted to maintain current service levels plus the above improvements, it would have to look at increasing the current Band D (for Council Tax).

Increase in Band D Point

After reviewing the ongoing costs of maintaining the new and existing services, it has had to increase the Band D point by 3% to £134.07; an increase of £3.90 per year (32.5p/month). Therefore, Cambourne Parish Council will be levying a precept of £514,120.00 on South Cambs District Council. Setting the Band D rate at £134.07 will allow the Council to continue to maintain or improve the level of service it provides for the Community.

Further Pedestrian Crossings

The Council will be working with the County Council to provide further Pedestrian Crossings in Cambourne.

Guide to the Calculation of the Precept and Band D Charge

The expenditure should be the amount of

money required by the Council. The total income should be a reasonable estimate of the monies that will come in for the use of facilities and services provided. It is important not to over inflate this income as it can put a large hole in the budget if something changes.

Estimate - Total Expenditure for the year:

£1,205,365.75. Total income for the year: £285,750. Less contribution from reserves: £405,495.75. Net Precept to be levied on SCDC: 514,120.00. To calculate the Band D charge you divide the Precept by the District Council's estimated Tax Base (the estimated number of dwellings in Cambourne).

The Tax Base is supplied as part of the Notification and Consultation sent out by South Cambs District Council in November/December each year: £514,120.00 divided by 3834.7 = £134.07 The Band D cost is assumed to be the average cost for all dwellings that pay Council tax.

THIS YEAR'S WILDLIFE TRUST BCN Photography Competition is now open and closes on 15 April (much earlier than last year). Children's art group set to launch

There is now a Children's Art Group which takes place on Friday afternoons from 4-5.30pm in the new cricket pavilion.

It will follow the school term, with either 8 or 10 sessions, yet to be decided, and we will have four teachers, who will take it in turns to run the sessions, sharing their

Girton to keep single lane for now - but could be revisited

COUNCILLOR RUTH BETSON has told Cambourne Crier that Highways England have confirmed that, for the moment at least, the single lane on the A428 at Girton is there to stay as the A14 is 60-70% done, on budget and on target to complete as planned in 2020.

However, because the traffic modelling was done in 2014 - before the OxCam arc project was devised and its potential traffic increase could be taken into account - it is "not off the table to look at the Girton end of the A428 again".

The A428 dualling project between Caxton Gibbet and Black Cat, which was delayed because of the OxCam discussions, will go out to consultation again this year, with construction expected to start in 2021.



Sands is the leading stillbirth and neonatal death charity supporting hundreds of parents every year. We work nationally to reduce baby deaths through promoting better maternity care and funding research.

We have a programme of training and a wealth of resources to support professionals to improve the bereavement care they provide following the death of a baby.

We provide a comprehensive bereavement support service nationally through our FREE helpline and locally through over 100 regional support groups across the UK including your own Cambridgeshire Sands.

Losing your much longed for baby in late pregnancy or shortly after birth is the most traumatic and devastating trauma any parent can experience. A whole future is taken from that family. Sadly that happens only too often. Currently 15 babies a day die in the weeks just before or after birth. Sands aims to care for those families with practical and emotional support for as long as they need it.

Cambridgeshire Sands is currently looking for new committee members to help them run the group and people to train as befrienders. Sands support groups are run on a voluntary basis by people, many of whom have themselves experienced the death of a baby. However not all Committee members have to be


bereaved parents. As long as you have an empathy and interest in our work we would urge you to get involved.

Befrienders, most of whom are bereaved parents, grandparents or close relatives or friends, are also needed to provide support to anyone affected by the death of a baby, over the phone and in person at group meetings.

The new befrienders must successfully complete Sands' befriender training, and a minimum of two years must have passed since their baby died.

CERC members get hands on with 3D modelling

CAMBOURNE ELECTRONICS AND ROBOTICS CLUB

(CERC) organised its first hands-on 3D-Mechanical CAD workshop on Sunday, 9th December at the Sports Pavilion, for children aged 7-14.

More than 40 children attended the workshop, which was coordinated by club mentor Dr Sujit Bhattacharya and delivered by senior mechanical engineer, Sophie Sladen, along with Dylan Krakowski. The workshop focused on various design aspects of mechanical designs based on TinkerCAD software.

The children made a cardboard model of the robot that they are developing in the club. Future advanced 3D modeling workshops are planned to train the kids to make 3D-models and use a 3D-printer.

These initiatives have broadened the scope of the club to STEAMD by including Art and Design in the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Maths (STEM).

■ The new batch of CERC will start in March. CERC provides opportunities for children to communicate science, create new projects, improve their creativity and gain confidence and appreciation from parents, friends and members of the community. Since its inception, the club has served more than 120 children aged 7 to 14 years with STEM-related activities.

The club runs on alternate Sundays throughout the year. Initially, all children start with the BBC Micro:bit to present their projects publicly and receive a certificate of recognition then move on to the next level of coding based on Micro:Python.

CERC has organised workshops on Design and Innovation and Machine Learning, a 3D-Printer workshop in Makespace and a 3D-Mechanical CAD Hands-on workshop. The members of the club are taking part in the First Lego League competition at the University of Cambridge, the PiWars 2019 competition and Micro:bit Global Challenge and also participate in large numbers at the Cambourne Science Festival. The club is also providing volunteering opportunities for local college students of 14 - 16 years. The next intake of children will commence from 3rd March 2019. New children's hospital for Cambridgeshire

At the end of 2018, South Cambridgeshire received some fantastic news - Addenbrooke's is to get a new children's hospital. The need for a dedicated children's hospital in our region has been talked about for longer than I have been on the scene, so it is wonderful that it will now be delivered. The Health Secretary, Matt Hancock, confirmed that up to £100million will be contributed by the government.

We all know Addenbrooke's is a centre of excellence and this new children's hospital will enable them to continue to provide first class care in a new purpose built hospital and free up valuable space in the existing building.

Looking ahead, 2019 promises to be a big year for Addenbrooke's as the Royal Papworth Hospital moves to the site and plans for a train station pick up pace!

Cambridgeshire County Council has also received a funding boost, with an increase in core spending power of 5.7%, taking the Council's funding allocation to £386.5million. This increase in core spending power is more than double the average increase in England and is a welcome boost to spending on services in South Cambs.

Falls and how to prevent them

Falls are costly with an annual cost to the NHS of over £2 billion. The human cost can be enormous too, with loss to health, independence and self confidence. Many factors can contribute to why people fall and much can be done to reduce the risk of falling. Wearing well fitting shoes, removing mats or other trip hazards and having good lighting (including at night) can all be helpful.

Some medication can cause people to feel unsteady so regular medication reviews are important. Having regular eye checks and glasses of the correct prescription can also significantly reduce risk.

One of the most important things you can do is strengthening and balance exercises. Regardless of your health or mobility there is likely to be some form of exercise you can do, often whilst sitting in a chair.

"Everyone Health" is a Council funded organisation which provides free one to one clinics for older adults around the region (including sessions in Cambourne) which aim to reduce the risk of falls. If you have had a fall or ever feel unsteady you can refer yourself or be referred by a relative or health professional. It really could make a huge difference. 

CAMBOURNE VILLAGE

COLLEGE: The second term of this academic year is well underway. Year 11 pupils are working very hard on completing their GCSE courses, while Year 9 pupils are choosing their options for Key Stage 4.

Unfortunately, the construction of the first wing of the new Cambourne Sixth Form has been delayed, after great crested newts were found within the designated building area, with completion due January 2020 - temporary classrooms will hopefully be in use for no more than a term.

As we plan for next year, we are encountering acute funding difficulties and it will not be possible to maintain our current levels of service to

pupils next year. Despite our very best efforts, we are looking at increasing some class sizes, cutting some courses, and making some very hard decisions as we look at staff recruitment for next year.

These difficulties are particularly acute in Cambridgeshire, and the government funding expected to begin to redress this issue is minimal this year.

Getting back to the fundamentals

Now some of you know that Peacehaven is a fundamental independent baptist church. By this it means we are independent, not beholden to any larger organisation or structure. By baptist we are indicating our stance on baptism for believers. These would be individuals who have recognised their position as sinners and come in repentance to Christ, seeking and receiving forgiveness. Their decision, and never for those who had not first

professed faith. The baptism is an outward symbol of an internal change. It possesses no saving power of its own, but it is a step of obedience and shows your wish to follow Christ. I often explain it like a wedding ring - it is an outward symbol of an internal commitment.

But what do we mean by fundamental? In some areas a fundamental religion sounds bad. But it is really getting back to the foundations of faith. Now if the foundations of your faith are not good then yes, adherence to them will not be good. Like the idolaters

who worshiped Molech, requiring the sacrifice of children. Or others with immoral practices or such. However, if your fundamentals are based on forgiveness and love and redemption, that is a good start. If your method of letting others know is by

reasoning, speech and prayer even better. In our studies we show the realities of the state of man. Sin and its consequences without a lot of sugar coating. But also the love and sacrifice and forgiveness available. We are a fallen people living in a fallen world, but we share the faith of the restoration to the Lord provided by the Lord which we receive by faith and not by works. That is what we teach and it may seem a little old fashioned, but it has worked for thousands of years and might be what you have needed.
