District Council won't invest in High St plans

SOUTH CAMBS DISTRICT COUNCIL has confirmed it will not be investing in current proposals to develop Cambourne High Street.

The Council had been looking at how it could help support the development and the feasibility of investing with the

landowners, Newcrest, but decided it was not viable.

It said the current proposals would not have allowed it to achieve "all the objectives in its investment strategy" including "delivering local benefits whilst also generating a moderate return for the Council ... to pay for some

of the core services people in the area need."

Duncan Mason from Newcrest said of the decision: "It hopefully only represents a short delay in delivering a much needed scheme for the High Street and we are already holding detailed discussions with other potential investors." MCA DEVELOPMENTS has given advance notice of extensive roadworks to be carried out in Cambourne to completely resurface Back Lane, Sterling Way, Lancaster Gate and Mosquito Road. There will also be more limited resurfacing in Sackville Way, De La Warr Way, High Street, New Hall Lane, Brace Dein, Eastgate and Osier Way, as well as many areas of work on footway and cycleway. 

Have your say: Consultation on Cambourne to Cambridge Better Public Transport

Plans for the next phase of a new public transport link and Park & Ride site between Cambourne and Cambridge were unveiled on 4 February 2019.

Proposals for phase two of the Greater Cambridge Partnership's Cambourne to Cambridge Better Public Transport Project between the Madingley Mulch roundabout and Cambourne have been set out in an eight week public consultation that closes on 31 March 2019.

The scheme will introduce a reliable public transport link connecting Cambourne with the city to offer sustainable travel and support growth. By 2031, 8,000 new homes are planned for development in the Cambourne to Cambridge area and more than 44,000 new jobs will be created in or around the city.

The three potential options put forward in the phase two consultation for a new public transport link between Madingley Mulch roundabout and Cambourne are:

- Option 1 an entirely off-road public transport route that only interacts with other traffic at junctions.
- Option 2 an entirely on-road public transport route, with public transport vehicles mixing with general traffic, along with basic junction improvements.
- Option 3 an entirely on-road public transport route, with dedicated public transport lanes.

People are also invited to have their say on two potential options for a new Park & Ride site on the route. The options are:

· Scotland Farm - with vehicle access off Scotland Road.

· Waterworks - with access off the Madingley Mulch roundabout.


Printed consultation materials are being delivered to households and businesses in the area.

Caroline, who has been donating for 17 years, said: "I find it shocking that in this modern day there is a shortage of blood due to a lack of donors. Currently only 3% of people living in England are regular blood donors. The donation process is quick, the staff ensure that you are comfortable and it doesn't hurt! I would love to encourage more people to donate if they feel able to do so." She welcomes the new system that sends donors a text message following their donation, informing them where in the country their blood has been sent.

To donate you must be reasonably fit and healthy, aged 17 to 66, and weigh 50-160kg. Men can donate every 12 weeks (4 times a year) and women every 16 weeks (3 times a year) Addenbrookes Donor Centre is open Mon - Sat, and the Mobile Blood Donation Unit will next be visiting the Hub on Friday 8th March. 
Parish Council supports proposed CamBed RailRoad route

CAMBED RAILROAD is a Community based voluntary think tank that is proposing that East West Rail consider an alternative route that takes in the areas in South Cambridge that are taking the lion's share of development in the District.

The CBRR proposal includes a railway station at Cambourne.

Cambourne Parish Council has agreed to the CBRR proposal.

A statement by CBBR said: "The Government is planning to complete a railway between Oxford and Cambridge via Bedford. We feel strongly it should run reasonably close to the A428, including providing a station at Cambourne, to serve as many people as possible. The aim would be for this project to be sustainable, eco' friendly and with low carbon emission by providing easy connectivity to the station for Cambourne residents."

East West Rail was established by the UK government as a non-departmental public arms-length body in late 2017, to accelerate delivery of the Oxford to Cambridge rail link. East West Rail have launched a consultation on alternative routes - these can be viewed at www.eastwestrail.co.uk/haveyoursay

Two of the route options (B & E) indicate the provision of a station at Cambourne. If you support that there should a station in Cambourne, please take the time to respond to the consultation which closes on the 11 March.

The work is anticipated to take 38 weeks, commencing 11th March 2019, and will work its way along the road network in a rolling programme.

We try to be compassionate, understanding and approachable, we are here to help you.

The NHS is overstretched at the best of times, and sometimes patients can become frustrated, scared or angry and the receptionist is the person in front of them. Sometimes the things that are said or I read on social media really hurt, this job is not easy and those encounters can stay with you, on other days we get thanked and praised for the effort we put in and we go home feeling worthwhile.

I didn't come in to this profession for the glamour or the money but I love my role within the surgery and I hope that the patients I see and speak to each day know that. I am proud of the work I do and working for the NHS in particular. "

Heidi Allen - MP for South Cambs - resigns from Conservative Party

HEIDI ALLEN, MP for South
Cambridgeshire, resigned from the
Conservative Party alongside
Parliamentary colleagues Anna Soubry
and Sarah Wollaston on 20th February
2019 and joined the new Independent
Group of MPs. Ms Allen will remain as MP
for South Cambs, but no longer as a
Conservative MP.

In their letter to the Prime Minister, the three stated that they believed the party had abandoned its core principles and allowed itself to be controlled by the ERG and DUP. They said the government's 'disastrous handling of Brexit' had been the final straw. "We now feel honour bound to put our constituents' and country's interests first... We will continue to work constructively, locally and nationally, on behalf of our constituents," they said.

In a speech on the day, Ms Allen spoke of her pride in her constituency and the people she represented, but of her former party she said: "I believed I was part of a party who worked collaboratively, welcomed knowledge and had the empathy to feel. But I have



slowly but surely realised that I am not.

"I can no longer represent a government and a party who can't open their eyes to the suffering endured by the most vulnerable in society. Suffering which we have deepened whilst having the power to fix."

Increase in Council Tax for Empty Homes

South Cambridgeshire District Council Cabinet has recommended an increase in Council Tax on properties that are left empty. This is scheduled to be decided by the full Council on February 22nd. There is currently a 50% Council Tax surcharge on properties that are left empty, which will be replaced by:

From 1 April 2019, double tax on homes that are empty for two years or more. From 1 April 2020, triple tax on homes that are empty for five years or more. From 1 April 2021, quadruple tax on homes that are empty for ten years or more.

Many of our housing problems are caused by 'land banking', where developers get planning permission and then wait many years before building the houses. Householders who apply for planning permission must start building wit hin three years or lose their permission, but developers are allowed to delay indefinitely.

Fixing that problem would have a much greater impact on our limited supply of housing than increasing these penalties much further.

Depression and the help available

Everyone feels down now and again but when these feelings are persistent or affecting normal life this may be a sign of depression. Loss of interest in things, changes in appetite or sleep habits and poor concentration can all suggest depression. It is also common to have physical symptoms such as loss of energy, moving more slowly or unexplained aches and pains.

Depression is incredibly common. The causes can be complicated but may be related to difficult life experiences and changes in chemical balances in the brain. Postnatal depression can

occur up to a year after giving birth and can affect more than 1 in 10 women and also affects men.

Things that help depression vary from person to person. Being kind to yourself is a good start. Connecting with other people, physical activity and eating and drinking healthily can all help. Medication may be useful, as may talking therapies both of which your GP can support you with. Depression is not a sign of weakness. Going through it alone makes it much harder and sharing how you feel with those close to you and your GP/ health visitor is definitely a step in the right direction.

CAMBS POLICE have ceased to take reports of lost property and are accepting only certain types of found items. The changes took effect nationally from 1 February as a way of reducing non-essential demand and the associated costs and bureaucracy.

Lost items can be reported on sites such as: <u>lostbox.co.uk</u>; <u>immobilise.com</u> and <u>reportmyloss.com</u>.

The following categories have been created for found items: *Accepted:* Items capable of containing data e.g. mobile phones and computers; cash and wallets that are identifiable; unidentifiable cash; identity and personal documents. *Not accepted:* bicycles; personal but unidentifiable items; clothing; keys; jewellery.

For non-accepted items, with some exceptions, the finder can retain the property. They are under no legal obligation to hand it in providing they have made a reasonable attempt to return it to the owner.

Most of my child's primary school was normal traditional education in the great schools around here but as I saw him developing and researched the course of what was to come both my wife and I realised we could do better.

We have courses of curriculum that cover the fundamentals of education. It is self paced and as long as a child can read they can progress.

This really can speed up learning in our child as we understand how he thinks and can explain things to him in a way tailored to his mindset. What I really like about home education is the flexibility to teach based on current events and practical skills needed for life. It's all well and good knowing the lifecycle of the dung beetle, but if you do not know how to use a washing machine or change a tyre you could have problems.

It is a joy as I see the principles that are taught taking root and growing.


The winning poster is shown here and the runners up will be displayed around school.

Our global theme of exploring the world continued with an insight into the Chinese New Year, the Year of the Pig, from a visit




from a setting's parent. This involved participating in traditions such as banging on the drum to scare away the dragon,

Back to Basics

In a recent message we covered the 10 commandments. This was a brief overview and we will be expanding it over the next few weeks. In the initial stage it was pointed out that in this day and age of fluid moral relativism with everything a matter of opinion, some absolutes still are needed.

Despite some saying 'oh they are so obsolete and old fashioned', the fact remains is that they work. They form the basis for all western law and if applied will result in a better, more contented life for the individual; signposts to guide

to what is needed and away from dangers. The first 4 deal with our relationship with God and the rest with our relationships with people. They are in order and build upon each other. If you get the first one right, the next three will naturally follow. And if you have those then the fifth, honouring our parents, should be a simple matter.

If an individual can get the relationship with the Lord and the parents right then the chances of getting the others better are increased. The motivating factor is then not fear but love. If I love God I will try to avoid messing up my


