

The Cambourne Crier says farewell to its editor

THE CAMBOURNE CRIER is saying goodbye to its editor, Tim Nash, after four years.

Tim Nash joined the Cambourne Crier team four years ago, as one of the volunteer editorial staff when the Crier was good but lacked precision.

Since then, under his expert leadership and with founder Pam Hume and editorial colleagues, Tim's knowledge and expertise led the way to the Crier becoming the professionally produced magazine we see today.

When Tim joined the Crier team, Cambourne was a relative dot on the map, with about 7,000 residents living in the three villages which make up Cambourne. Since then the villages have been amalgamated to create the town of Cambourne, with over 10,000 residents.

As a result of this rapid expansion, the Cambourne Crier had to change to cope with the increased demand from clubs, associations and individuals, and has evolved into the 'first stop reference point' for"What's On" in Cambourne.

Pam Hum said, "We are very sorry to be losing Tim from the editorial team, he has been a tremendously positive influence. We are very grateful for the time Tim committed to the

Cambourne Crier and the leadership he showed, and we all wish

him every success for the future".

Donavan Bangs, another member of the team, said, "Tim was a catalyst for excellence in our production of the Crier. The Crier will continue to be the premiere printed source for local events and groups for the people of Cambourne, by the people of Cambourne."

Top tips for summer fire safety

AS THE WEATHER BRIGHTENS UP and the sunshine starts brightening our weeks, we welcome the opportunity to enjoy summer days and nights in the garden.

When powering up your BBQs and putting out the garden furniture for the summer season, be sure to take note of our top tips below to ensure you have a fun and safe summer in the garden.

If cooking outdoors, always check BBQs over after winter storage. Keep them on level ground and ensure they are sited away from sheds, fences, overhanging foliage and property.

Keep children and garden games well away from the cooking area and never leave the barbecue unattended.

If you have a bonfire, build it well away from buildings, tents or other flammable objects and make sure it is properly out when you leave.

When out in the countryside, extinguish cigarettes properly and dispose of them responsibly – never throw a lit cigarette into a field or wooded area.

Don't forget to stay safe around our county's waterways and if you see someone in trouble in water, call 999 immediately with clear details of your location.

When out camping or using a tent, never use candles inside or nearby and always discourage smoking nearby. Never cook inside a tent.

Special thanks go to HPR Cambs, Ziki Souvlaki, 400 Degrees Pizzeria and Kerief Catering, who all made donations.



Save Lives through Blood Donation

14th June is World Blood Donor Day and highlights the vital contribution made by blood donors. Blood or the components of blood are used to treat patients with medical conditions such as anaemia or cancer blood disorders and those having surgery, after childbirth and also to improve quality of life in some people towards the end of their life.

Blood comes in four types (A, B, AB & O) and a specific antigen makes it either 'positive' or 'negative'. All blood is made up of a number of components, including red blood cells, platelets and plasma. Each of these can be used to treat

many different conditions. After donation the blood is usually separated into its individual components which means one unit of blood (or one donation) can be used to treat several different patients.

Men can give blood every 12 weeks and women can give blood every 16 weeks. You can usually give blood if you are fit and healthy, weigh between 7st 12lbs and 25 stone (50kg - 160kg), and are aged between 17 and 66 and in some cases older. Sometimes it is taken for granted that the right blood will be available; however there is an urgent need for more male blood donors, Afro Caribbean blood donors and O -ve blood donors. 



JUNE 2019 CAMBOURNE CRIER Tales from the farm this summer

RSPB Hope Farm sits between Elsworth and Knapwell, about 450 acres in size, managed with the aim of demonstrating wildlife-friendly farming. At the moment, it is full of birds singing, bees buzzing, and flowers bursting into bloom. For those who walk along the footpaths, you will know how the wheat, barley, oilseed rape, and beans are shooting up with the sun and welcomed occasional rain. As well as these crops, though, the farm is one of the most exciting places to be to watch wildlife.

Breeding farmland birds are in full swing, with our thirteen starling broods hatching 44 chicks this spring across the farm. They have been foraging on the green pastures around the farm and even as far as Elsworth to feed their chicks, with an incredible 40 chicks fledging and now joining the ever-increasing flock. To add to the list of new arrivals are a few broods of lapwing that you can see with an eagle eye from the tracks and footpathcs. They will fly with a signatory pee-wit to distract any predators from the precious chicks. Whilst they shouldn't be disturbed, do keep an ear and eye out to see if you can spot them! For the lapwings, it is important to provide insect food in a-plenty. Our wildflower margins are fantastic for providing a home for bugs that in turn give these species every opportunity to breed on the farm. Nothing has been quite as special as finding these chicks in the middle of our field, having hatched a couple of days previously.

The birds are always fantastic to hear and see out on the farm, but the flowers are what fill farmland with colour at this time of year. Last month saw the start of flowering season with cowslips decorating our wildflower and grass margins. Next were the clovers and now the oxeye daisies bursting into bloom. Every week, a new colour is added to the mix that will provide a different kind of food resource for the bees across the farm that will in turn pollinate our crops. With these kind of habitats in place, it is much easier to work with wildlife, look after the ecosystem, and aside from helping us to enjoy a more exciting place to work on the farm, they help us to grow crops as well.


The airfield entrance is on the B1046 between Little Gransden & Longstowe, opposite Gransden Lodge Farm (enter SG19 3EB into your SatNav).
