Plans for Cambourne High Street are open for consultation

Plans for new shops and homes on the vacant land to the North and South of Cambourne High Street are available for consultation prior to the submission of a planning application later this year. Details of the emerging plans can be viewed at www.cambournehighstreet.com

The developer, Newcrest, have been involved with Cambourne for a number of years and the delivery of a vibrant and thriving High Street is the final phase of developing the vacant sites at the centre of Cambourne. The consultation runs until 16th September and seeks views on how to shape the proposals.

To enable the delivery of the proposed 554sqm of retail space the High Street needs to be widened and Newcrest have secured the land to the south of the High Street to ensure a comprehensive development of the area.



Shops will be accommodated on the ground floors of three of the new buildings with flats above. To the East of the site there will be more flats and a terrace of townhouses.



In addition to the new shops, the scheme includes 112 flats and 17 townhouses. Whilst the division of the retail spaces will be led by market demand, the physical layouts of the buildings mean that the shops will be similar in size to the existing High Street shops.

On 19th August around 90 people attended a drop-in event at the Hub to view the proposals and talk to the team. There was support for the new shops with some attendees expressing views on matters relating to design, parking, traffic, etc. Newcrest will be taking on board as many of these comments as possible, alongside comments received from the District and Town Councils in preparing their final plans. Once a planning application is submitted it will be the subject of further consultation by the District Council.

Water systems have also been installed in the Great Cambourne Cricket Pavilion which also offers hot water as well as cold for the users of the buildings. Although we encourage the use of reusable bottles, in addition we have also switched our plastic cups to biodegradable paper cups. Cambourne Electronics and Robotics Club (CERC) new beginners' batch for 7-14 years kids will start on Sunday, 15th September 2019 at the Old Blue School. CYP and Romsey Mill celebrating

Cambourne Youth Partnership and Romsey Mill Celebrating Achievements During The Past Year: At the end of July, Romsey Mill's Youth Development Team held their annual Presentation Evening, celebrating the achievements of young people and recognising the valuable work taking place amongst young people across Cambridgeshire. Romsey Mill partners with Cambourne Youth Partnership to support young people in Cambourne, and we were able to celebrate the work that has taken place locally throughout last year. 223 young people have engaged with the youth work in Cambourne, through the support of 3 youth workers, 10 volunteers and 5 young leaders, across 8 open access groups, 9 trips, 1 residential and a few targeted projects. We celebrated several young people, young leaders and volunteers for their achievements with Home Cooking

Skills, Level 2 Award in Youth Work, Red Cross Childminding and commitments to boxing and supporting friends. From September 2019, we will be extending our provision of open access youth groups across the week. These youth groups are free for young people to attend and provide a range of activities such as pool, board games, games consoles, PC games, baking and listening to music. They are a space to hang out with friends, build new friendships and access the support of youth workers and volunteers. Young people can simply turn up to a group and sign in when they arrive; they are then given a consent form which can be brought back the next time they attend so that we have a record of contact and emergency details. The groups will start during the week beginning 9th September and will take place at the Cambourne Soul Youth Centre on Back Lane at the following times:

This art and craft group runs on Fridays from 4pm-5.30pm for ten weeks each school term. There are four professional tutors who choose different themes and media, some of which are continued for more than one week. We are hoping to have some Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme students to help us each week as part of their award work.

The club is currently for children from 6 to 11 years, with a maximum of around 12 participants, but if there is enough interest, we could accommodate older children from 12-14 with a paid assistant alongside the tutor each week, and would then differentiate to suit the students' ability and confidence levels.

The cost of the class varies according to the number of children taking part, but is around £60 for each ten-session term, and this includes materials. Provision is available to enable children in cases of financial hardship to be able to participate in the group.

Parents/carers do not need to stay unless they wish to, but we do ask for help in setting up and putting away the tables.

Cambourne Crescent Science and Technology Club

Last year, Cambourne Crescent Technology Club was formed to serve as a platform for young kids to learn more about electronics and computer programming. It is open to children aged 8 to 17 and welcomes all regardless of their background and ability level. Kids learned about programming, sensors and communication using BBC Micro Bit. This involved motion, temperature and light sensors or communicating with other devices via Bluetooth. Making use of logic and developing simple algorithms, they created programs using Blocks. They learned how to interface the Micro Bit with other devices such as joysticks and toys cars. Kids did small projects such as using LED strips to display information, using radio to communicate between devices (Morse Code signalling), controlling robots and toy cars using remote controls, all making use of Micro Bits. The most interesting part seemed to be racing these cars that got kids really excited. Yet more exciting stuff is part of the planned curriculum, such as Python programming and Web Development.



The club has been run by volunteer teachers, all industry professionals, and with help from some of the parents. It has been free for the children who were enrolled. Only things that a child needs to bring are a laptop and a Micro Bit. The club has been supported by Cambourne Crescent.



Our High Street & the Cambourne to Cambridge Bus Route

Our high street could be just two years away. I attended the drop-in event on 19th August organised by developers, Newcrest and came away hopeful of the final outcome. Know Your Numbers Week

Know Your Numbers Week occurs each year to encourage us to know what our blood pressure is. Blood pressure is created as the heart contracts and forces blood into the blood vessels. This can be checked with an electronic or manual blood pressure machine which provides two readings: the systolic (top number) is the pressure on the blood vessels as the heart contracts; the diastolic (bottom number) measures the pressure on the blood vessels when the heart is at rest.

It is recommended that healthy adults over 40 should have their blood pressure checked at least every five years but more regularly if at risk of high blood pressure (hypertension). bureaucratic quagmire? High blood pressure puts both the heart and blood vessels under strain and is linked to strokes, kidney problems, heart problems and some types of dementia. Your blood pressure can be easily checked by your GP practice and at many pharmacies.

Although medicines are available to lower blood pressure, you can also take steps to keep blood pressure in a healthy range. These include losing weight if needed, reducing the amount of salt you eat, exercising regularly, eating a healthy diet, avoiding too much alcohol, cutting down on caffeine, sleeping well and stopping smoking. Be safe be Smart

In Cambridgeshire 83% of chimney fires occurred between September 2018 and March 2019. The highest recorded fires were in the coldest months of the year; totalling 44 chimney fires. As the UK is about to enter in to autumn, it is the perfect time to clean out your chimney.

A general tip is... (For most things in life)

READ AND FOLLOW THE INSTRUCTIONS

that came with your unit. Understand what you can burn and what you cannot. How to maintain the unit and when. How much ventilation you need when burning. How often do you inspect the whole thing. A gualified and competent engineer should install all wood/multi-fuel burners and boilers - you can also refer to

Most importantly

Fit a smoke

alarm that carries the kite mark or **British Standard** Number 5446 and test your alarm weekly by pressing the test button and know the life of your battery.

Always also install a CO alarm in the room where the burner is installed. Chimney Fires continue to be a common occurrence in home fires in the winter months.



Sweep your chimney once a year or more if you're burning wood



Do not place objects over and on the mantel that can catch fire



Only burn fuels suitable for your burner (never burn anything other than wood in a wood burner)



Nine tips to keep your home

safe all year round!

Avoid burning resinous woods that quickly build up soot



Do not bank fires too high and let them burn out well before you go to bed



Use a fire/spark guard to prevent accidental fires. Make sure it has the kite mark or conforms to British/ European standards



Do not overload the gate/ appliance



Check the hearth, floor and furnishing for sparks/embers



Inspect your chimney breast, particularly the roof space. Make sure sparks/fumes cannot escape through cracks or broken bricks.


