Anthony Browne Elected as Cambourne's New M.P.

The results of the 2020 General Election for the Cambridgeshire South constituency were declared at 3-20am on Friday morning 13th December from Cambourne Village College..

Although traditionally an unlucky day this was not the case for Conservative Candidate Anthony Browne who was elected as our new M.P.



The results on the night were a result of a close fought challenge between Mr Browne and the Liberal Democrat candidate, Ian Sollom.

The final result was:-

Anthony Browne (CON) 46.3% Ian Sollom (LD) 42% Dan Greef (LAB) 11.7%

Mr Browne previously informed voters in Cambourne that he would be honouring the results of the referendum (leaving the EU) then addressing local issues, including those which affect Cambourne such as a possible rail link, access to G.P. services and a proper High Street.

Speaking to the audience at Cambourne, Mr Brown said,
"We have now had one referendum, and two general election campaigns where the British public have voted for Brexit."
"It's time we just get it over and done with and that we move on. We need to stop the fighting and just move on as a country – reunite the country – and move on to all the other issues that we need to focus on that affect our day to day lives."

"Now is the time to bring the country back together, not to divide them. This government must be a one nation government that rules in the interests of everyone in Britain from wherever they hail from, whatever their walks of life."

Times of Change at Cambourne

A dairy-free delight

Greetings from a local intrepid cook and an idea for those amongst us who can't have dairy. This needs to be made in advance so it can set and should be eaten within a couple of days.

For the batter:

1 ½ cups soya or dairy free milk, juice of 1 lemon, 1½ cups self raising flour, ½ tsp salt, 1 ½ tsp of baking powder, ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda, 4 tsp caster sugar, water from 1 drained can of chickpeas (keep the chickpeas for a savoury dish such as houmous), 2 tsp dairy-free spread melted and oil for greasing the pan

For the icing:

3 cups icing sugar, ½ cup cornflour or custard powder, 1

½ tsp vanilla extract, 1 ½ cups Dairy-free spread, ½ cup cocoa powder

For the ganache:

2 tsp coffee granules, 1 ½ cups dark chocolate, ½ tsp salt, 2 tsp dairy-free spread, ¼ cup hot water

For the nuts (optional): 3 dsp granulated sugar, 50g pecans or preferred nuts, Pinch of fine salt.

Method:

Combine lemon juice and milk in a jug and set aside. Next mix all the dry ingredients for the batter in a medium sized bowl. Add the melted spread and chickpea water to the jug with the milk mixture and stir. Gradually whisk the liquid into the dry ingredients until smooth.

Heat oil in a medium frying pan and ladle in about half a cup of the batter and swirl around the pan to get an even coating. Leave it on the heat and gently scrape down the sides to achieve an even circle and wait for bubbles to appear on the surface. As it doesn't have egg in it the batter is more delicate so take care at this stage. Once bubbles appear gently slide your spatula underneath to loosen the bottom of the pancake. When its firm enough flip over and cook for a further two minutes to brown the other side then set aside to cool. Repeat with remaining batter which should make 6.

Meanwhile beat all the icing ingredients together and chill in the fridge. Mix all the ingredients (except the spread) for the ganache to a bowl and pour on the hot water. Once smooth, stir in the spread and leave to cool.

To assemble layer individual pancakes with the chocolate spread, covering the top and sides with the icing. Chill for about 10 minutes and then


pour over the ganache and return to the fridge.

In a frying pan gently heat sugar - don't stir until golden before adding the nuts and salt. Using a spatula coat the nuts and cook for a few minutes until chestnut in colour. Now remove from the heat and pour unto a baking tray lined with greaseproof paper; and smooth out evenly and leave to cool. Once harden cut into pieces for scattering.

Remove the cake from the fridge and sprinkle the nuts and enjoy.



CERC 2020



CERC is the regional champion of the First Lego League 2019 in which teams of up to 10 children engage in challenges which are based on a real-world scientific topics. This win has inspired more children from the community to participate in the 2020 competition. We have 30 children from CERC this year

participating in two senior and one junior team. Each team participates in the challenge by programming an autonomous robot to score points on a themed playing field (Robot Game), developing a solution to a problem they have identified (Project), all guided by the FIRST Core Values. Mr. Vijay Acharya who coached the team last year will be leading the teams this year along with Mr. Andy Fell and other parents.

As part of the project work for 2020, the team visited the Eddington site to understand how sustainable ideas can help communities in achieving and contributing to a carbon-neutral environment. In addition to solidifying the STEM principles which naturally come from participating in the program, the team members also learn valuable life and employment skills that will benefit them no matter what career path they choose.

CERC provides a unique platform for the children in the age group of 7-14 years to come together to engage in fulfilled and creative activities involving Robotics and Electronics fostering preparation for the children to participate in national competitions. Cambourne Crescent Science and Technology Club has kicked off with the school term. This year the children are preparing to participate in the First ® Lego ® League, a global science and technology challenge. The challenge invites kids from all around to undertake Lego building and programming projects to demonstrate their ingenuity. Competitions are held regionally, and top teams can then compete at international level. The challenge is designed to encourage young people to take an interest in real-world issues and develop problem-solving skills. There are three parts: the Robot Game, the Project, and the Core Values. The project is based around Robotics and Lego. It is a structured program with mentor-led activities. Teams operate under and are asked to demonstrate the FIRST signature set of

Core Values: celebrating discovery, innovation, impact, inclusion, teamwork and fun. CCST runs free of charge and is open to everyone. With the help of donations, this year's themed Lego set (named BOOMTOWN BUILD) and several WeDo 2.0 sets have been purchased and kids are busy building.

Tech Club is run by volunteers who work with different technology companies in the local Science Park bringing with them experience and knowledge. Volunteers and parents form a team to mentor groups of children with the aim to prepare young children for teamwork and develop STEM skills.



Have a Wild January

The landscapes around Cambourne can look truly spectacular in winter – from Oaks Wood to Lakes Ewart and Sirius to the heady heights' of Crow Hill. Wildlife Trust communications officer and Cambourne resident Robert Enderby took these wonderful images last winter. The nature reserve here covers 90 hectares – that's 222 acres: try the 1.5km Discovery Trail looping south from Oaks Wood car park, followed by a loop to the north, with information boards along the trail about the different areas of the reserve and the wildlife that lives here. Only about a 20 minutes walk (longer if stopping to read the signs!)

The Wildlife Trust BCN are offering half-price membership throughout January: each member receives Local Wildlife magazine three times a year, information on events, local groups, walks, talks via newsletters. Children's membership includes Wildlife Watch magazine, badge, handbook with activities, competitions, info on UK wildlife, poster and stickers. Perhaps the biggest benefit is knowing that local wildlife in the area, and all the conservation work involved, will be helped and maintained. Love your Liver Month

The liver is our second largest organ (after the skin). It has over 500 functions including breaking down of drugs and toxins, processing digested foods, fighting infections, storing vitamins, converting food into energy and making and regulating hormones.

Keeping the liver healthy is vital to the whole body and there are several factors linked to liver health. Alcohol is processed by the liver and drinking more than recommend can lead to liver damage. We are all advised not to drink more than 14 units of alcohol per week and include a few alcohol free days.

Being overweight can increase risk of fatty deposits in the liver. This is often symptomless

but can develop into more significant liver conditions which can be extremely serious. Maintaining a healthy weight, following a healthy diet and exercising are all good for your liver.

Some viruses can cause damage to the liver. Hepatitis B and C are transmitted through blood. Hepatitis A and E are usually transmitted through contaminated food or water. Vaccinations are available for Hepatitis A and B and may be advised for some foreign travel or for certain high risk professions.

Practicing safe sex, only using licensed piercing or tattoo parlours and avoiding sharing toothbrushes, razors or needles can all help to prevent risk of infection.

South Camb candidates meet families at Potluck


